BYE-LAWS OF THE BORDER UNION AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY

- 1. All Animals shown to take their ages from 1st January, if not otherwise stated.
- 2. Cattle and Goats: the age of animals **must** be given on the Entry Form.
- 3. Animals must be the bona fide property and in the possession of the Exhibitors from 1st July (the last day of entry).
- 4. All Entries must be made on the appropriate forms and submitted to the Border Union Agricultural Society, Kelso, not later than 5.00 p.m. on Monday 24th June. If completing a paper application form please fill in your entry form, taking care to write legibly, completing all the necessary details such as animal name, breeding, registration numbers, date of birth and so forth. Alternatively, application can be submitted online via our website www.borderunion.co.uk. No late entries or telephone entries will be accepted at any time.
- 5. Exhibitors who have not paid their Entry fees shall not be entitled to compete.
- 6. There can be no substitution of named entries in any Section. If there should be such a substitution the animal will be disqualified.
- 7. Any animal not entered may not be shown. If there should be such a case, at the Discretion of the Directors, all the animals from the Exhibitor will be disqualified.
- 8. All Animals, Machinery and Equipment admitted to the Showground will remain entirely at the risk of their Exhibitors who must take charge of their property at all times.
- 9. All Exhibits must be in the Showground at least one hour before judging is due to commence on Friday 26th July and by 8.30 a.m. on Saturday 27th July.
- 10. Exhibitors must remain in charge of their exhibits until the end of the Show.
- 11. Admission tickets will be sent to Exhibitors prior to the Show. Attendants CANNOT obtain free admission to the Showground unless such a ticket is produced. The number of tickets allocated to exhibitors will be based, pro rata, on the total number of entries.
- 12. The Judges shall have the power to withhold any prizes should they think the Exhibits are not deserving of them. The Judges are particularly requested to satisfy themselves, as far as possible, regarding the soundness of all Horses before awarding the prizes, and to avoid giving preference to animals showing symptoms of hereditary diseases. Judges may consult the Society's Veterinary Surgeons if they deem it expedient. **No protests on veterinary grounds will be considered.**
- 13. During the judging of stock, no person will be allowed in the Ring except Judges, Stewards and Attending Members of the Class being judged. Attending Members will enforce this Bye-Law.
- 14. Judges who wish the assistance of another Judge shall have the power to choose one, and it is the duty of the Attending Member to see that the Judge so chosen has no personal interest in the exhibit to be judged. Judges shall not place animals that they have bred or owned at any time.
- 15. All disputes and any objections to the decision of the Judges, shall be referred to the Society Directors, by whom they shall be finally settled, without appeal. Any dispute or objection must be lodged with the Secretary, in writing, within 24 hours from the date of the Show, accompanied by a deposit of £50.00, which is liable to forfeit if the objection is not upheld.
- 16. All Cups and Trophies offered for competition at the Show are the property of the Border Union Agricultural Society and are awarded annually in perpetuity. They must be returned to the Secretary not less than three weeks before the Show.
- 17. All animals, except horses, shall remain in their pens or stances until at least after the Parade on Saturday 27th July.
- 18. Prize-winning Horses, Cattle and Goats must take part in the Grand Parade on Saturday 27th July.
- 19. Judges have the authority to ask for the removal of any animal from the Show Ring.
- 20. Long Service Medallists will be given free Admission. Tickets on application in writing to the Secretary.
- 21. The Trustees, of the Border Union Agricultural Society accept no responsibility whatever for loss, injury or damage to any person, animal or property on the Showground or the approaches thereto.

PLEASE NOTE THAT IN THE INTERESTS OF HEALTH AND SAFETY, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF GROOMS <u>WHEN REQUIRED</u>, ONLY BUAS OFFICIALS ARE ALLOWED TO ENTER THE RINGS DURING JUDGING

Correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats that meet one of the following current Safety Standards as of 01/01/2024 MUST be worn by all Riders: – SNELL E2016 onwards, EN1384 2023, ASTM F1163 2015 & 2023, AS/NZS 3838 2006 onwards, PAS015 2011, VG1 (BS).

NOTES FOR GUIDANCE

- ALL HORSES AND PONIES MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY THEIR PASSPORT AT THIS SHOW
- Foals must accompany Mares in the Ring and be <u>at least four weeks old</u> on the day of the Show
- All Horses and Ponies MUST be fully vaccinated against Equine Influenza within the last 12 months prior to the Show, Passports will be spot checked by Vets.
- Exhibitors must abide by the Registration & Stallion Licensing rules of their individual Breed Society.
- All Registered Horses and Ponies must be registered in their Breed Society Stud Books and the number given on the entry form
- No Spurs to be worn in Ridden Classes (according to Society rules)
- The Directors reserve the right to cancel, amalgamate or divide classes according to the number of entries forward.
- Judging times are approximate. Variations may occur according to the number of entries forward.
- Handlers of Ponies in In Hand Classes aged 14 years and under must wear correctly secured current British Standard skull caps / riding hats.
- No horses or ponies to be left tied to the side of a vehicle and NO corrals allowed.

MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND CHAMPIONSHIPS

Lauderdale Challenge Cup presented by Hon. G. Connolly-Carew for the Champion Mountain and Moorland In-hand Pony.

NPS Qualifying Rounds: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in any of the British Riding Pony studbook sections or the Ridden Register; the GSB; the AHSB; the AASB, or registered in the main body of their respective M&M Stud Book. Part-breds are not eligible unless overstamped into one of the British Riding Pony Studbook sections. or the Ridden Register. Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS Qualifying or Life members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern from 6th – 8th August 2024. The highest placed pony, if owned by an NPS member, in each class will qualify for the final. Qualification may pass down to third place if the first and second ponies are already qualified.

NPS/Corscaron Horse Essentials Home Produced Ridden Championship - Riders of Home Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rules Book) can wear a white arm band in classes where this is indicated. These ponies, if owned by NPS members, are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show. The Owner's Membership cards MUST be produced in the ring when requested or the qualification will be forfeit

NPS Silver Medal Rosette Championships: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the owner of the champion pony is a Qualifying or Life member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the rider's/handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the owner of the Champion pony is not a member, or the owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette, but the qualification card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the owner of that pony is a member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the qualification card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve (third). Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Championships. Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the final of the Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show 6th – 8th August 2024.

THE NATIONAL PONY SOCIETY - SCOTLAND AWARDS

NPS Scotland/Townhead Pet n Pony In Hand Mountain & Moorland Championship. The Champion & Reserve Champion in all Mixed, pure-bred M & M, or Breed Championships will qualify for the Final which will take place at the Blair Castle International Horse Trials on 23rd August 2024. Qualification may go to 3rd in the Championship (i.e. 1st Reserve Champion).

NPS Scotland / Kilmannan Stud Novice Ridden Mountain and Moorland Championship

A pony is not eligible to compete if, before 1st January in the current year, it has done any of the following:

Won an open affiliated mixed M&M Ridden class

- Qualified for Horse of the Year Show, BSPS Lemeiux Final or RIHS Open M&M Ridden classes

Friday 23rd August 2024. Qualifications to go no lower than 4th place.

NPS Scotland / Maggie May Junior Open Ridden Championship

The highest placed Junior Ridden pony, in each Open Ridden Class not already qualified, will qualify for the Final which will take place at the Blair Castle International Horse Trials on 23rd August 2024. Qualifications to go no lower than 4th place.

NPS Scotland / Kingfisher Building Products Mountain & Moorland Open WHP Championship The Stallions, mares and geldings five years old or over, registered in the main body of their respective Breed Society stud book. The 2 highest placed ponies, in each class not already qualified, will qualify for the Final which will take place at the Blair Castle International Horse Trials on Friday 23rd August 2024. Qualifications to go no lower than 4th place.

NPS Scotland / Kilgraston School M&M Lead Rein & First Ridden Championship

The 2 highest placed ponies in the Lead Rein Class not already qualified will go forward to the final which will take place at the Blair Castle International Horse Trials on Friday 23rd August 2024. Qualifications to go no lower than 4th place.

NPS Scotland / NFU Mutual Insurance Open In-hand Riding Pony/Hunter Pony Championship. The highest placed pony, in each open in-hand Riding Pony or Hunter Pony Class (foal classes excluded) not already qualified, will qualify for the Final which will take place at the Blair Castle International Horse Trials on 23rd August 2024. Qualifications to go no lower than 4th place

THE ABOVE TO BE RUN UNDER NPS SCOTLAND FINALS (BLAIR CASTLE) RULES 2024 which are on the NPS Scotland website www.npsscotland.co.uk These rules clarify areas particular to NPS Scotland. We also run to the Rules of the NPS and again these can be found on our website.

Exhibitors are deemed to be conversant with these rules.

These classes are a qualifier for **The National Welsh Championship Show 2024 - National Ridden Welsh Part Bred Championships.** All 1st & 2nd placed WPCS registered Welsh Part Bred exhibits in each class (not already qualified) qualify to enter. Unregistered qualifiers with 12.5% Welsh blood may retrospectively register with WPCS prior to entry.

These classes are qualifiers for **The National Welsh Championship Show 2024 - National Gelding In-Hand Championship** sponsored by Sarum Investments Ltd. All 1st & 2nd placed WPCS registered WPBR geldings in all relevant classes (not already qualified) qualify to enter. Unregistered qualifiers with 12.5% Welsh blood may retrospectively register with WPCS prior to entry.

This Show is Affiliated to the British Show Pony Society and all persons entering, competing, showing or otherwise taking part in the B.S.P.S. Classes, whether or not Members of the B.S.P.S. are subject to the Constitution and Rules of the B.S.P.S., including disciplinary procedures, and shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the B.S.P.S.

Body Protectors MUST be worn when jumping in any WHP and WH classes Including practice rings at B.S.P.S. affiliated shows. (Including Tiny Tots, Cradle and Nursery Stakes, WSP, LRWSP and Training Stakes). Riders must wear a body protector when working in (practice jumps) and the jumping phase in all B.S.P.S. organised and affiliated events. A British Equestrian Trade Association (BETA) approved and appropriately labelled "Level 3 body protector" 2018 (Blue and Black) shown on the label. BETA recommends body protectors are replaced at least every three to five years, after which the impact absorption properties of the foam may have started to decline. All types of Air Jackets are not allowed.

Correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats Nos. PAS015 2011, VG1, (BS) EN1384 2023, ASTM F1163 2015 and 2023, SNELL E2016 and E2021, AS/NZS 3838 2006, MUST be worn by riders at all times when mounted. Hats should have a plain cover, either Black, Navy Blue, Brown, Grey or Green. Velvet covers are encouraged. The B.S.P.S. encourages members to have their hats tagged through the B.S.P.S. scheme or via the Pony Club Scheme. Tagging indicates that the hat meets the accepted standards, no check of the fit or condition of the hat is implied. It is considered to be the responsibility of the members/guardians to ensure the hat complies with the

current standards and is tagged before they compete. Members/guardians are responsible for ensuring the manufacturer's guidelines with regard to fit and replacement are followed. Hat Tagging in B.S.P.S. classes is compulsory at BSPS Winter, Summer and Heritage Championship shows, Royal International Horse Show, London International Horse Show, Burghley Gold Cup and lead rein WSP final. (We are accepting British Eventing, British Riding Club and Pony Club tags)

- IV. If a pony qualifies for Horse of the Year Show, LIHS, or RIHS in this second year it is immediately de-noviced and cannot compete in the Picton Final.

Ponies must be shown in a snaffle bit.

NPS / SIMONS FAMILY & MARBETH STUD WORKING HUNTER PONY TRAINING STAKES NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP (M & M and Plaited)

Open to mares, geldings and stallions four year old and over, in possession of an equine passport, but no specific registration or breed society criteria. Plaited ponies to a maximum of 158cm. Riders may only ride one pony in each class. Ponies will enter the ring individually and jump a course designed to produce a maximum of 10 jumping efforts. Each jumping effort will be marked out of 5. 5 penalties will be incurred for each pole down or run out. Three refusals at any one fence will result in elimination. (A maximum of 50 marks will be awarded for a clear round. Fall of pony or rider will result in elimination. There will be no mark awarded for conformation but a mark of 20 will be awarded for overall impression at the completion of each round. In the event of a tie the overall impression mark will determine the final placings. Rider any age, except stallions. Ponies may be shown in any suitable bridle. The highest placed pony, owned by an NPS member, in each class goes forward to the final. Where this pony has already qualified the pony standing next in line, which is owned by an NPS member and has not already qualified, receives the qualification. Qualification goes no lower than third place. Riders any age except stallions (see NPS Rules).

Blair Castle BSPS Scotland Training Stakes Series:

Ponies placed first & second in the 60cm, 70cm and 80cm training stakes classes will qualify for the Championships held at the Blair Castle International Horse Trials & Country Fair 2024. The 2 highest placed ponies will qualify, qualification may go down to fourth place if higher placed ponies have previously qualified – only those who have jumped a clear round can qualify. **Those that qualify at all three heights may only compete in the two higher height classes at the Final**.

These classes are open to plaited and heritage M&M ponies. You do not need to be member of BSPS to enter this class or the final.

Method of Judging: Animals will be required to jump a course of fences, they will immediately be asked to give a short show including a change of rein and gallop in the same ring.

Conditions:

- No change of saddlery is allowed between phases in a class.
- Protective leg boots only may be used for Phase 1.
- No bandages, no over-reach boots or protective pads on pony / horse legs or feet are permissible.
- NO SPURS
- The NPS strongly recommends that Body Protectors are worn for the Jumping phase of all Working Hunter Pony competitions. As the use of Body Protectors is mandatory under BSPS rules, ALL Competitors MUST wear BETA approved Body Protectors for the Training Stakes Section (Level 3 2018, Blue & Black)
- Earrings and visible body studs are not allowed.

The R. Hunter Murray Challenge Salver, will be awarded for the best pony owned and exhibited by a resident of the Scottish Borders Region. White armbands to be worn in all classes. Highest placed in each class go forward to the Championship & BUAS Special Rosettes.


