A Day at the Races

Class 1 “A day at the Races” Group Class

A table exhibit. Space allowed width 180cm, depth 76cm, height optional, staged on individual tables, Height of table 75cm from the ground. To be judged and viewed all round. Restrained decoration of the sides but must not touch the ground. Exhibitors can use their own drape if required. There are no restrictions on pre done work. Staged by maximum of three competitors. NO ARTIFICIAL GRASS to be used.

Class 2 “Ladies Day”

A hat exhibit. Space allowed width 60cm depth 60cm height optional, judged and viewed from the front, on black drapes. May be brought ready assembled.

Class 3 “Blaze of Glory”

An exhibit. Space allowed width 60cm, depth 76cm, height optional. Judged and viewed from the front.

A meadow style exhibit, Space allowed width 60cm, depth 76cm height optional, judged and viewed from the front. |
| Class 7 | “Winning Rosettes”
A suspended exhibit. To hang from a hook 180cm from the ground, width 50cm, depth 30cm. maximum drop 1metre. To include loop. Against a cream background. Judged and viewed from the front. May be brought ready assembled |
| Class 8 | “Gold Cup”
An exhibit. Space allowed width 60cm, depth 76cm height optional, Judged from the front. |
| Class 9 | “Parade Ring”
An exhibit, staged on individual round table with black drapes, 60cm in diameter, 61cm height from the ground height optional, Judged all-round. |
| Class 10 | “ Lucky Charm”
A petite exhibit, Space allowed width 25cm, depth 25cm height 37cm, judged and viewed from the front, on black drapes, may be brought ready assembled. |

Information to Assist Exhibitors

In all exhibits, plant material should predominate. The cut ends of the living plant material must be in water or water-retaining medium, exceptions air plants, cacti, fruit, grass turf, lichen, moss, succulents, vegetables and long-lasting plant material (including strong fibrous stems) which will remain turgid for the duration of the show. All space dimensions are approximate. No artificial plant material may be used in any exhibit unless stated in the schedule.

Except where stated exhibits **must** be arranged in the marquee.

Classes 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, are staged on tabling. The staging tables are 76cm deep & approximately 75cm high covered in black drapes

There is no restrictions on pre done work.

Regulations

1. No competitor may enter or stage more than one exhibit per class.
2. Exhibits may be staged at any time from 8.00 to 19.00 hours on Wednesday 14th May. For the purpose of staging exhibits the only access will be from the Flower Show Trade Exhibitors gate.
3. All entries **must** be made online only, fees are not refundable. Entries close on **1st April 2025**.
4. The entry fee for classes 2-10 is £3.00 per entry, (including vat) NO entry fee for Class 1. Exhibitors in Class1 will be provided with three admission tickets for any one day of the show.
5. **Exhibitors entering three or more classes will receive one free admission ticket to any one day of the show.**
6. Exhibits will be judged according to the NAFAS Competition Manual 4th Edition 2023. The Judge's decision is final. Judging will be held on Thursday 15th May 2025 at 8am.
7. Exhibits **will be maintained** by the Committee and Stewards throughout the duration of the Show.
8. All exhibits and competitors' property remain in the marquee at the risk of the competitor, and the Devon County Show (DCAA) will not be liable for loss or damage from any cause whatsoever.
9. The Devon County Agricultural Association (The Devon County Show) operates to a high Health and Safety standard. All Show exhibitors are expected to meet that standard and comply with the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974, which is held in the Association's office.
10. All Exhibitors and other persons admitted to the Showground shall be subject to rules, the orders, regulations (including Health and Safety) of the Devon County Show and the Council of the Devon County Agricultural Association.

11. Force Majeure

If an event defined hereafter as Force Majeure occurs the DCAA will not be responsible for the financial consequences or any losses or any actions claims or demands caused to or made by an exhibitor or their servants or agents caused by the failure of the Devon County Show to be held on one or more of the days but for the event of Force Majeure on which it would otherwise to be held. Force Majeure means for the purposes of this clause exceptionally inclement weather; flooding of the whole or any part of the Devon County Showground or the whole or any part of the car parks associated with it; an act of God including but not limited to fire, flood, earthquake, windstorm or other natural disaster; act of any sovereign including but not limited to war, invasion, act of foreign enemies, hostilities (whether war be declared or not), civil war, rebellion, revolution, insurrection, military or usurped power or confiscation, nationalisation, requisition, destruction or damage to property by or under the order of any government or public or local authority or imposition of government sanction embargo or similar action; law, judgment, order, decree, embargo, blockade, labour dispute including but not limited to strike, lockout or boycott; interruption or failure of utility service including but not limited to electric power, gas, water or telephone service; failure of the transportation of any personnel equipment, machinery supply or material required by DCAA to run the Devon County Show; breach of contract by any essential personnel; any other matter or cause beyond the control of DCAA.

12. Photographs and/or film footage will be taken at this event. These images may be used by the Devon County Agricultural Society, its subsidiaries (including but not limited to Devon County Show) and show sponsors in the following ways:

- Printed publicity
- Online publicity (including but not limited to Facebook, Instagram & Twitter)
- Website use – (DCAA, its subsidiaries or sponsors)
- Any other fair use in marketing and promoting the Devon County show by ourselves and our sponsors

They will be stored securely and will not be kept for longer than they are needed for the purposes listed above. If you would prefer for you or your child not to be photographed, please speak to the photographer on the day or contact the show office. 13. In the interests of security, the Floral Art Section of the Marquee will be cleared of the General Public at 1600 hrs on Saturday 17th May. Exhibitors may enter this section to remove exhibits between 1600 hrs and 1700 hrs, when the Stewards will begin to dismantle. For the removal of exhibits, access will be provided from the Yellow Car Park.

14. All Exhibitors are reminded of the legislation that smoking is banned in temporary and permanent structures along with public places.

15. A NOVICE is an exhibitor who has not won a first in a County or Area show.

16. Prize money to be paid by BACS within 4 weeks of the show.

Trophies must be returned to the Devon County Show Office by 1st March 2026 for engraving.

Health and Safety for Features Exhibitors

Devon County Show takes pride in welcoming both exhibitors and visitors to the Show. In order that we provide a safe environment for all parties we ask that you comply with the following when on Show Site. For some Feature Sections additional rules may apply. In the event of a query please speak to your Section Stewards.

Children: If you bring children on site during set up and breakdown you must ensure that they are supervised at all times. There are a number of moving vehicles and equipment on site during set up and breakdown.

Dogs: We strongly recommend that you do not bring your dog onto site during set up or break down. Any dogs on site must be on a short non retractable lead and under your control at all times. Please do not leave your dog in your car.

Drones: The use of drones is strictly prohibited on the Showground and car parks during Show week.

Fire: In the event of a fire please follow the instructions of the Feature's Steward who will know what action to take in the event of an emergency. Fire extinguishers are available in all marquees and these are located near to the fire exits or at a central fire point

First Aid: Our medical centre is available on the Wednesday before the Show and this is indicated on our site maps (near the Lime Tree Café) and until 8pm on the Saturday night.

General: If you see something that you think is unsafe or wrong then please report this so that we can do something about it.

Electrical Equipment: Any electrical equipment being plugged into the Show's electrical installation (paid for in advance) must be PAT tested.

Slips, Trips and Falls: Please ensure that you keep walkways clear of your belongings, cables or any other objects. Exhibits must be secure and displayed so that they will not topple over during the Show.

Smoking: Smoking of any type is not permitted in any of our buildings, marquees, or temporary structures

Vehicles: Please drive slowly and stick to the designated roadways. Your vehicle must be off site and parked in the appropriate car park by the time advised by your Section. At the end of the Show please do not move your vehicle until permission is given to do so. Quad bikes and motor bikes (other than those in displays) are not permitted on the Show Site.

Waste: Please ensure that any waste is placed into the appropriate waste skip provided.

Working at Height: If you are building a display then appropriate working at height equipment should be used (as identified in your risk assessment). Climbing on boxes, chairs or staging is not acceptable. Anyone using tower scaffolding must be suitably trained in its erection and use (PASMA).
