# HANGING BASKET SHOW RULES

The Hanging Basket & Decorative Pot Competition is located within the Maidstone Exhibition Hall at the Kent County Show and is always an excellent addition to our floral displays. The space for this area is limited and entries will be allocated in strict rotation. If your application is not successful you will be informed as a matter of urgency.

#### Rules and Regulations

Each entrant will be allocated an area 4' square for the pot and facilities will be provided for hanging the basket above. Exhibitors are required to stage their exhibit in their own 12" hanging basket and a matching 12" terrace pot in terracotta or like material, planted with suitable summer material, to complement each other.

#### Prize Money

Prize money will be awarded as follows:

1st Prize Prize Card £50.00

2nd Prize Prize Card £30.00

3rd Prize Prize Card £20.00

The Burrows and Day Perpetual Trophy will be awarded to the winner of the Hanging Basket and Decorative Pot Competition.

### SCHOOL COMPS SHOW RULES

There are two classes open to all Primary Schools across Kent any clubs that include primary aged pupils. These are great opportunities for your school or club to show what you can produce. Your exhibit will display the young peoples work as part of the Garden Life area of the Kent Agricultural Show. Entry to both classes is free.

# WHEELBARROW COMPETITION

- ·Your description clearly is the work of several people, it can include drawings or photos of where you grew or obtained your plants.
- Judging Criteria- Your wheelbarrow will be judged using the following criteria.
- ·50% of the marks are for the planting and care of the plants that you used . Include a plant list as part of your exhibit.



# WHEELBARROW COMPETITION

•50% of the marks are for the description of your theme (book), which shows that some of your young people have written part of it. Your description needs to include a title and highlight why you chose this theme (author or book). Please keep to 500 words maximum.

# SCARECROW COMPETITION

Build a freestanding scarecrow or one that can be easily attached to fence post, which highlight an author or book that your young people enjoy. For example, celebrating stories by Jane Austen, Beatrix Potter, Harry Potter or any author.

Rules – Each exhibit will be judged using the criteria below and will follow your design brief.

The judges' decision is final. The winners will be awarded a rosette and an award card. (Each entry will be awarded a rosette for taking part.)

### Design Brief-

- ·Your finished scarecrow should not be taller than 2m and not wider than 1m.
- · Give your scarecrow a name and include the name of your school or club.
- Your can choose to use any material in your construction, but eco-friendly materials would be preferred.

It should focus on-

- ·Your chose of theme is appropriate to the age of your group.
- ·Your description should include why you chose this theme. Limit this to 500 words maximum.
- ·Your description clearly is the work of several people.

# SCARECROW COMPETITION

#### Judging Criteria

- ·50% of the marks are for the structure and look of your scarecrow.
- •50% of the marks are for the description of your theme (book), which shows that some of your young people have written part of it. Your description needs to include a title and highlight why you chose this theme (author or book). Please keep to 500 words maximum.

### INFORMATION

#### Cost of entry: -

There is no charge to enter either of the Schools Classes.

### Closing Date for Entries: -

Closing date for the 2025 show is the 30th May 2025. We have a limited number of spaces available for these classes, so we recommend that you make an early entry.

We aim to notify schools within two weeks of the 9th may and no later than Friday 23rd May.

Pre/Post show vechile passes will be given as well as tickets for show days for prize giving.
