GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1. This Society shall be called "Trawden & District Agricultural Society"
- 2. The Directors of the Society shall consist of Chairperson, Vice Chairperson, Treasurer and Company Secretary.
- 3. The Officers of the Society shall consist of President, Chairman, Vice Chairman, Treasurer, General Secretary, Show Manager and Committee; five to form a quorum.
- 4. All Officers shall be elected annually at the General meeting of the Society, which shall be held on such a day and at such a place as the Society may appoint.
- 5. The affairs of the Society and the application of its funds shall be under the management of the Committee, who will settle all matters that may be in dispute.
- 6. The Society reserves the right to cancel or amalgamate any class with insufficient entries.
- 7. All exhibitors do so subject to the Rules and Regulations laid down by the Society. If a dispute arises for which no special rule is laid down, same shall be referred to the Directors and Officers, whose decision shall be final.
- 8. Show Secretaries shall not in any way disclose or make known to any person whatsoever, until the day of the show, the names of the competitors for any prizes.
- 9. All exhibits are displayed at Owners Risk. The Society will accept no responsibility for loss, damage, accident of theft.
- 10. Prize winning stock to be paraded when called upon, or forfeit prize money and/or trophy.
- 11. All entries to be presented at times stated by Section Secretary.
- 12. Any Exhibitors Assistant not in possession of an Entrance Ticket must pay the full admission fee.
- 13. All persons attending the Show do so at their own risk. The Society cannot be made liable for personal accident or liability or damage to vehicles or property.
- 14. The Committee will not be responsible for any loss or damage to any stock or exhibit on exhibition. All exhibits must be under proper supervision by the Exhibitor. All exhibitors of livestock and vintage vehicles must have adequate Public Liability Insurance.
- 15. Livestock exhibited at the Show must have been the bone-fide property of the exhibitor for at least two calendar months before the show date.
- 16. Secretaries and Stewards of each section will establish eligibility of any entry in that section.
- 17. Trophies to be held for one year unless otherwise stated. Winners are responsible for the care of the trophy during this term and for its safe return to the Society before the next show.
- 18. Parking regulations must be observed. The Society has the right to remove any vehicle which is considered an obstruction in any way or is moving on the showground between 10:00am and 4:30pm.
- 19. Competitors in all the equine classes take part entirely at their own risk and must have adequate Public Liability Insurance. It is compulsory for riding hats (to be Standard PAS 015 and above) to be worn with chine strap/safety hardness to be fastened at all times when mounted. All riders 16 years and under **MUST** wear a body protector when jumping at this Show.

Class A24 Sachertorte Recipe

Ingredients:

140g/5oz plain **chocolate**

140g/5oz unsalted **butter**, softened

115g/4oz caster sugar

1/2 tsp vanilla extract

5 free-range **eggs**, separated

85g/3oz ground almonds

55g/2oz **plain flour**, sieved

For the topping and the icing

6 tbsp apricot jam, sieved

140g/5oz plain chocolate

200ml/7fl oz **double cream**

25g/1oz milk chocolate

Method

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180C/350F/Gas 4. Grease a deep 23cm/9in round cake tin then line the base with greaseproof paper.
- 2. Break the chocolate into pieces, melt gently in a bowl set over a pan of hot water, stirring occasionally, then cool slightly. Beat the butter in a bowl until really soft, then gradually beat in the sugar until the mixture is light and fluffy. Add the cooled chocolate and the vanilla extract and beat again. Add the egg yolks, then fold in the ground almonds and sieved flour. The mixture will be quite thick at this stage.
- In a separate bowl, whisk the egg whites until they are stiff but not dry. Add about one-third to the chocolate mixture and stir in vigorously. Gently fold in the remaining egg whites. Pour the mixture into the prepared tin and level the surface.
- 4. Bake in the oven for about 45-50 minutes, or until well risen at the top and the cake springs back when lightly pressed with a finger. Leave to cool in the tin for a few minutes then turn out, peel off the paper and finish cooling on a wire rack.
- 5. To make the topping, heat the apricot jam in a small pan and then brush evenly over the top and sides of the cold cake. Allow to set.
- 6. Make the icing by breaking the plain chocolate into pieces. Heat the cream until piping hot, remove from the heat and add the chocolate. Stir until the chocolate has melted, then cool till a coating consistency. Then pour the icing on to the centre of the cake. Spread it gently over the top and down the sides, and leave to set.
- 7. For the 'icing' writing, break the milk chocolate into pieces then melt gently in a bowl set over a pan of hot water. Spoon into a small paper icing bag or polythene bag and snip off the corner. Pipe 'Sacher' across the top and leave to set.
