 Shortbread Base  
 4oz (115g) butter, softened  
 2oz (55g) caster sugar  
 6oz (170g) gluten free self raising flour
- Caramel Filling  
 14oz (397g) tin condensed milk  
 4oz (115g) butter  
 4oz (115g) caster sugar  
 2 tbsp golden syrup
- Topping  
 8oz (225g) milk chocolate
- Method
1. Make the base by creaming together the butter and sugar until light and fluffy, fold in the flour to make a dough.
  2. Press dough into greased baking tray approx 30 x 20cm and bake in the oven at 160C, Gas 3, for about 20mins.
  3. Make caramel by putting condensed milk, golden syrup, butter and sugar into a non stick saucepan. Stir over medium heat, stirring continuously until it starts to boil and continue to boil gently for 10mins. It is important to stir the caramel continuously otherwise it will burn on the bottom of the pan.
  4. Pour the caramel over the shortbread base.
  5. Melt the chocolate, pour onto the top of the caramel and smooth the top.
