1. Arrival

For Public Camping

Follow signs for Newark Showground, NG24 2NY. As you approach the showground, follow signs for “Public Camping” and then access the showground through White Gate. Continue following “Public Camping” signs. On arrival, please ensure that your vehicle pass is clearly displayed and report to the Camping Office and Stewards on Brown Gate prior to entering the parking area. Only vehicles displaying an appropriate pass will be admitted.

Public camping passes will be posted from mid-October onwards to the name and address supplied at the time of booking.

Your vehicle and caravan/camping label should be clearly displayed for the duration of your stay along with **your emergency contact telephone number**.

Access for public camping with a “Weekend Experience” pass will be from 2pm Friday, 6th November 2026. Any campers arriving before this time will not be admitted.

For Exhibitor Camping

Follow signs for Newark Showground, NG24 2NY. As you approach the showground, follow signs for “Trade / Exhibitors” and then access the showground through Blue Gate. Camping passes need to be collected from the Show Team Cabin along with the rest of your exhibitor pack, please ensure that your camping pass is clearly displayed before moving your vehicle. Follow the “Camping” signs to Brown Gate and report to the Camping Office prior to entering the parking area. Only vehicles displaying an appropriate pass will be admitted. Camping Stewards will direct you to your camping pitch, do not move your motorhome/caravan/tent from your allocated camping pitch.

Your vehicle and caravan/camping label should be clearly displayed for the duration of your stay along with **your emergency contact telephone number**.

Commercial or Military Vehicles – Camping passes are required if you intend to sleep overnight in a commercial or military vehicle. Please display this pass clearly.

Exhibitor camping, caravans, mobile homes and campers will only be admitted from 8am Friday, 6th November 2026.

Please plan your journey as there will be no access before these times and **for Friday arrivals there will be no entry into the Showground after 7.30pm**. Please do not arrive early as you may cause congestion in the car parks as you wait.

Camping is not permitted inside the Showground including car parks or behind / at the side of a trade stand, building or marquee or any other structure which is in an enclosed area or confined space and provides no safe means of an immediate escape in an emergency.

The security team are authorised to dismantle and remove any caravans, mobile homes or tent structures that are erected in contravention of these regulations if the owners are not present.

2026 Access Map



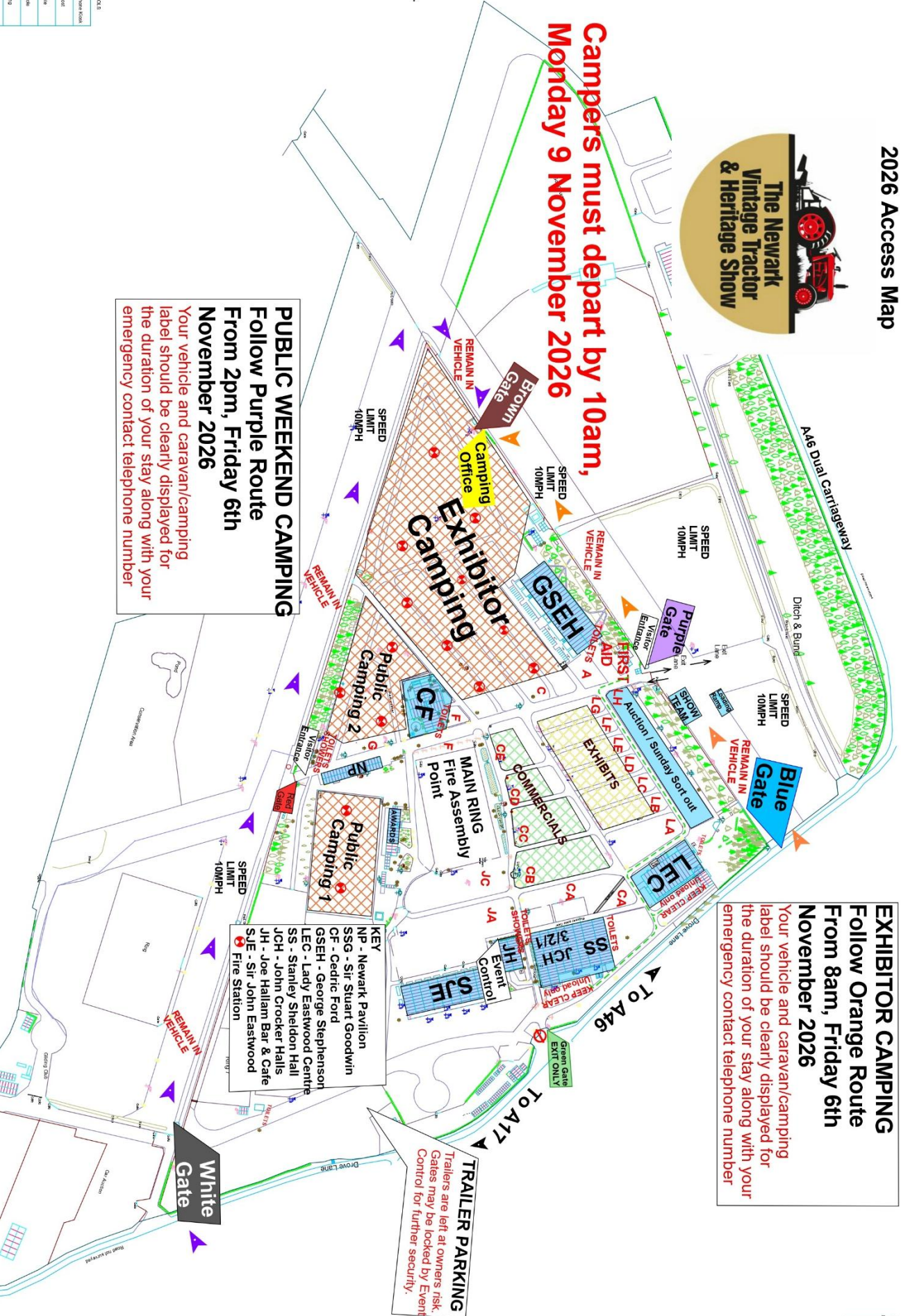

2. Vehicles

Vehicles must be parked within your allocated pitch or in the case of campers in an area designated for your vehicle and vehicle movements must be kept to a minimum for safety. Only one vehicle is permitted per pitch, if you have an additional vehicle, you will be directed to an overflow parking area and advised of its location on site.

Vehicles must **not be moved** when the Show is open to the public between 9am and 5pm (unless directed otherwise by Site Stewards or Security staff). Consideration should always be given to other residents and the safety of visitors particularly at night.

Outside of show hours, and once Blue gate is closed (normally 2 hours after show closes), access to and from the showground will be through GREEN gate which is manned for the majority of the time. When it is not manned, please follow the access instructions left at the gate. Please wait for the gate to close before driving off to stop tailgating and allowing unauthorised visitors entering the showground. Please ensure you have appropriate passes displayed in vehicles to gain access back inside the showground.

Newark Showground operates a maximum speed limit of 10mph which must be observed at all times.

Only motorhomes or vehicles towing a caravan, or a trailer tent are permitted in the caravan or camping areas. People are not permitted to sleep in cars overnight and no camping is permitted within any of the Car Parking areas, anyone found camping in any Car Park will be asked to vacate the site by security.

Overnight sleeping is only permitted in commercial vehicle cabs where there is a specific self-contained sleeping compartment within the exhibit. It is your responsibility to inform the organiser's that individual/s will be sleeping in the exhibits (at point of entry) and are displaying the correct vehicle passes.

Any separate living unit / caravan or trailer adapted for camping purposes will be required to be within the Exhibitor Camping area and display the correct vehicle passes.

Please conform to all instructions given to you by Site Stewards and security staff.

3. Departure

Please plan your departure time carefully and follow internal direction signs or instructions given to you by Site Stewards or Security staff and have a safe journey home. We recommend that Brown Gate should be avoided on Sunday afternoon between 3.30pm and 4.20pm as exhibitor and trade traffic will be exiting the Show through Brown gate and there is likely to be congestion.

Caravans and campers must vacate their area by 10am Monday, 9th November at the very latest as the camping area is being used to set up for another event.

4. Emergencies

In the event of an emergency, dial 999 and give your exact location. If you are unfamiliar with your location look out for the nearest building, entrance gate or other landmark close to you. All Nottinghamshire and Lincolnshire emergency services accept what3words locations for

emergencies, so if you use the app, this can be passed to the call handler. **What3Words for Green Gate is 'trendy.globe.slopes'**. Keep calm and in the case of a tent or caravan fire, get everyone out as quickly as you can and alert others by using the fire bell at your nearest fire station.

Security will be on site throughout the show and their contact number will be published outside the

Camping Office should there be any localised problems. Security staff will routinely patrol the caravan and camping areas and are authorised to remove anyone whose conduct is unacceptable. The camping area is stewarded from Friday, 6th November to Sunday, 8th November.

The Camping Office is open for enquiries from:

- Friday, 6th November **8am – 2pm** (exhibitor camping only) **2pm – 7.30pm** (exhibitors and public)
- Saturday, 7th November **7am – 9am**
- Sunday, 8th November **1pm – 4pm**

If you require assistance outside these hours, please contact the onsite security team.

5. First Aid / Medical Facilities

First Aid assistance is available from 8am Friday, 6th November until 10am Monday, 9th November. If you require First Aid, the Newark Community First Aid point is situated next to **Purple Gate**, please note that during silent hours (10pm – 6am) first aid will not be immediately available.

6. Noise Nuisance / Anti-Social Behaviour

Please always consider your neighbour's especially during the hours of darkness. **Noise must be kept to a minimum between 10pm and 6am** and any persistent offenders will be removed from the Caravan or Camping areas.

7. Use of Generators

Portable generators are a means of providing an alternative to **mains hook-ups** which are available – but it is important to use them with due consideration to fellow campers. Noise along with emissions and safety, is one of the key considerations when using a generator – especially if there are other campers or caravanners in the vicinity. On the Showground, generators are not to be used between 10pm and 6am.

Keep your generator in good order and have it serviced as recommended by the manufacturer. However, it should be checked regularly – ideally annually for high usage generators. Most 'leisure type' generators use unleaded petrol (but check the user instructions). The fuel must be carried in approved containers carrying the British Standard mark and be a maximum of 10ltr capacity, stored safely away from the generator.

8. Open Fires / Barbecues / Fireworks

For your safety, the safety of other residents, pets, livestock and exhibits at the Show, open fires (including fire pits), barbecues and fireworks **are strictly prohibited** on the Showground. Fire Stations are indicated on the map.

Anyone lighting a fire, barbecues or letting off fireworks will be removed from the site immediately and excluded from the Show.

9. Toilets / Showers / Standpipes / Elsan Points

Toilets, showers, standpipes and Elsan Points are located at:

- **Red Gate**
- **Purple Gate**
- **Joe Hallam Building**

Please take care in the shower blocks as floors may be slippery and chemical toilets must only be emptied at the disposal points provided and not in the toilets.

When using toilet facilities, please follow all guidance, be patient and considerate towards other users, and wait your turn to avoid toilet areas becoming crowded.

Always maintain good hand hygiene whilst at the Show – use the sanitiser dispensers provided and avoid touching your face or handles and fences whenever possible.

10. Rubbish & Waste Recycling

Waste disposal facilities will be located around the Showground including in Caravan and Car Parks. Please place your waste in the appropriate bins/ containers provided and leave your pitch in the condition you found it. Anyone abusing this condition will not be allowed back in the future and subject to a waste disposal fine of £100 / pitch.

Newark Showground follows the Simpler Recycling regulations and asks that all campers segregate their waste into either general waste, dry mixed recycling (paper/ card, plastic and metal) and food waste. Appropriately designated bins/ containers will be sited around the camping areas.

Newark Showground has a strict no glass policy, and campers should not bring with them any beverages/ products in glass bottles/ jars for disposal on the showground.

11. Badges / Wristbands / Tickets

You must display an appropriate wristband, badge, or have a ticket to access the Showground at all times. Wristbands must be fixed around your wrist. Residents do not have an automatic right of entry to the Showground once the Show has closed to the public and entry may be refused. Anyone checked on the Showground after closing without the appropriate accreditation will be removed by security staff.

Please note that the Show does not open until 9:00am on Saturday. We kindly ask that members of the public arriving for camping from 2:00pm on Friday remain within the camping area until the Show opens, and do not walk around the showground while exhibitors are unloading and positioning tractors or exhibits. This is for your own safety and the safety of exhibitors.

12. Dogs

NNAS welcomes well-behaved dogs on site and can accompany you through our exhibition halls, although not in food areas for hygiene reasons. Dogs are not permitted, however, within the Cedric Ford Pavilion or Sir Stuart Goodwin. All dogs should be kept on short leads. Dogs with long retractable leads are not permitted. Please be a responsible dog owner and clear up after your dog and put dog waste in the general waste bins provided. Please do not leave your dog unattended in a vehicle at any point. If your dog shows any sign of aggressive behaviour, you and your dog will be asked to leave the Showground.

13. Tastes Cafes Opening times

All cafes on site will be open during Show open times.

For the benefit of campers, a number of cafes and restaurants are open with extended hours on Friday and Saturday evenings. These times will be circulated with camping passes and wristbands.

14. Personal Possessions

The Newark and Nottinghamshire Agricultural Society (NNAS) accepts no liability for any loss or damage to your personal possessions or property during your stay and a condition of booking is that you agree to this condition. Please look after your property and do not leave valuable items unattended or in view. Lost or found property enquiries should be directed to the Show Office.

There is no cash machine onsite. The nearest cash points are:

- Esso Petrol Station and Shell petrol station, A17 Winthorpe Roundabout, Newark NG24 2NY.
- Lincolnshire Co-op Collingham Food Store - High St, Collingham, Newark NG23 7LB
- Lincolnshire Co-op The Bridge Food Store - The Bridge, Lincoln Rd, Newark NG24 2DQ

15. Smoking

Smoking and the use of e-cigarettes (vaping) are not permitted in any building or temporary structure, including marquees. Smoking and vaping are only permitted in open areas of the Showground. Please dispose of cigarettes carefully and ensure they are fully extinguished before placing them in bins.

Exhibitors who smoke or vape in breach of this regulation may be excluded from future Shows.

16. Alcohol and glass on the Showground

Personal alcohol may only be consumed within your caravan, motorhome or tent, and any alcohol brought onto the Showground must be for your own consumption only. The Showground operates a no-glass policy outside cafés and bars, due to the risk that broken glass poses to people, livestock and vehicles. Visitors and exhibitors must not walk around the Showground, including car parks and caravan and camping areas, carrying alcoholic or soft drinks in bottles or glasses. Any bottles or glasses found in these areas may be confiscated. If you do drink alcohol, please do so responsibly and be considerate of others.

17. Access to the Showground

The Show is open to visitors from:

- 9am - 5pm Saturday, 7th November
- 9am – 3.30pm Sunday, 8th November

Access for exhibitors and officials outside these times is on production of appropriate badges and passes.

18. Caravan & Camping Safety

Your safety while on the Showground is of paramount importance to us. To help keep you safe during your stay, please follow the advice below:

- Caravans must not be used to accommodate more people than the number of berths installed by the manufacturer, except for a child under the age of three sleeping in a cot.
- Tents must not exceed their maximum occupancy.
- We recommend fitting dual-sensitivity smoke detectors in all caravans and mobile homes, as they provide an effective means of early fire detection.
- Consider fitting a carbon monoxide alarm.

- Caravans and mobile homes should carry an approved fire extinguisher positioned by the entrance and conforming to BS 4626 (minimum capacity: 1kg for dry powder or 4.5 litres for water).
- Make sure any gas pipe connections inside your caravan are secure.
- Keep a torch handy for emergencies.
- Check where the nearest mobile signal can be found, as coverage around the Showground may be limited.
- Never cook inside a small tent.
- Do not smoke inside tents or use candles.
- Turn off all appliances before going out or going to bed.
- Remove litter and rubbish from around your caravan or tent.
- Ensure that tents and caravans are pitched at least six metres apart to help prevent the spread of fire.
- Take special care when cooking and never leave pans unattended.
- Always keep a bucket of water nearby when cooking.
- Do not smoke inside your caravan. If you smoke, do so outside and make sure cigarettes are fully extinguished.
- Make sure ashtrays are made from non-combustible material, and never smoke in bed.
- Do not dry clothes over the stove.
- Ensure your caravan is well ventilated and never block air vents, to avoid a build-up of poisonous gases.
- Keep flammable liquids, such as petrol and gas cylinders, outside and out of reach of children.
- Only change gas cylinders when they are completely empty, and store them away from caravans and vehicles.
- If you suspect a gas leak, turn off the main cylinder valve immediately.
- Never smoke while changing a gas cylinder.
- Do not run electrical supplies from one mobile home to another.
- Do not overload sockets.

In the event of a fire:

- Keep calm and get everyone out as quickly as possible.
- Raise the alarm by shouting “Fire, fire, fire” to warn others in your area. A fire station with a fire bell should be within 40 metres of your pitch.
- Call the Fire and Rescue Service and give your exact location.
- Inform Security staff so they can guide the emergency services to the scene.
- Go to the fire assembly point in the Main Ring, where duty personnel will confirm that everyone is accounted for.
- If you are camping in Public Camping Area 1, exits from the rings are located at each corner, with one central exit on the south side and two exits to the north by the building.

19. Safeguarding Children

The Society has a duty of care to safeguard the welfare of children and young people who are visiting, working, or taking part in the Show. A child is defined as a person under the age of 18 by The Children Act 1989 and 2004.

Children are always the responsibility of parents and carers whilst on the Showground including the caravan and camping areas. Children should not be unsupervised at any time whilst on the

showground, particularly within the exhibitor areas regardless if the child is an exhibitor themselves. Children under 12 must not be left unaccompanied in a caravan or tent at any time.

Any children found unaccompanied by or reported to a member of staff on the showground, in a caravan or tent after the Show has closed may be taken to the Show Event Control until the parent or carer is located. In these circumstances the Society reserves the right to pass on information regarding safeguarding concerns to statutory agencies and/or other organisation's in line with our safeguarding procedures and information sharing guidance.

Children's identification wristbands are located at the Red gate (main public entrance) or in the Camping Office. They are free of charge and we encourage all young children to wear one as a means of being able to contact parents should they become lost or separated from parents and carers.

No child or young person will be removed from the Showground if the person responsible for their care is still present.

20. Code of Conduct

The Newark and Nottinghamshire Agricultural Society (NNAS) looks forward to welcoming you to the Newark Vintage Tractor and Heritage Show. In line with government guidance on the admission of visitors and exhibitors to the Showground, this Code of Conduct acts to principally guide and advise you of the protocols in place during the event. The organiser's of the show, NNAS, have put in place a range of procedures, including counter terrorism preparedness to ensure the safety of all to the Show. However, it is vitally important that everyone plays their part in making the event safe and enjoyable and we need your continued support and cooperation to achieve this. Visitors and exhibitors are therefore kindly reminded of the requirement to adhere to this Code of Conduct, and follow all safety requirements, to assist staff and stewards, and to help protect you and your fellow visitors.

- **As per the Society's ticket terms & conditions** visitors are reminded if purchasing tickets on behalf of others, you are required to provide names and contact details for each individual ticket holder and tickets must not be passed on to anyone else.
- Plan your journey in advance and arrive at the Showground in plenty of time. Due to the volume of visitors, please expect delays on the local road network at peak opening and closing times of the Show.
- Please be patient when leaving the Showground and listen to the advice from stewards. It may take longer than normal to leave due to the procedures in place to allow visitors to exit safely and efficiently.
- The Society reserves the right to exclude any visitor that fails to comply with this Code of Conduct.

If you are feeling unwell before you visit the Show, please stay at home. If you feel unwell, whilst you are at the Show go straight to the First Aid points on the Showground (please refer to Section 5)

Please stay alert, follow these guidelines, and help us all enjoy the Show safely.
