



HORTICULTURAL AND INDUSTRIAL RULES

1. All Exhibitors with 24 entries and over will receive one ticket of admission to the Show.
2. ONE ENTRY PER CLASS, all entries free.
3. Each Exhibitor, previous to placing any article for competition, shall sign a declaration that the productions exhibited for prizes are bona-fide his own growth, and that they have been in his possession at least two months previous to the day of the Show. His garden must also be open for inspection by the Committee. If any Exhibitor does not conform to the declaration signed, or uses any deception with his flowers etc., the Committee, upon the facts being made known to them, shall have it in their power to withhold any prize that may have been awarded and such Exhibitor shall subject himself to expulsion. Any person objecting to any exhibit as not conforming to this Rule must state his objection in writing by 3:00 pm to the Secretary.
4. Competent judges will be appointed by the committee, and their decision shall in every case be final. Should the judges consider the best exhibit in any class unworthy of a prize, no prize will be awarded.
5. Exhibitors and their assistants only shall be allowed to enter the place of Exhibition during the time of setting up the flowers, etc. The Marquees to be opened for that purpose at 7:30 am and all exhibits must be staged by 10:00 am. The tent will be open as soon as the judging is finished and closed at 4:30 pm. Re-open at 4:45 pm when the exhibits may be removed.
6. Forms of entry may be had from the Secretary, and the list of entries must be returned to the Secretary not later than the Monday before the Show.
7. Every care will be taken with the exhibits but the Society will not be responsible for any loss or damage to exhibits.
8. Once an exhibit has been staged it must not be removed to another class. A whistle will blow at 9:50 am and at 10:00 am to clear the tent.
9. Definition of a Novice a competitor who has not won a 1st prize at a previous show.

Points for Cup: 1st - 3; 2nd - 2; 3rd - 1

One entry form from any one garden in any class from 1 to 133

Cups to be returned to respective secretaries by 1st August

Preheat oven to 180°C/Gas 4/Fan Oven 160°C. Grease and line base of 1kg/2lb loaf tin.

Rub flour, butter and muscovado sugar together to make fine crumbs. Reserve 5 tablespoons if mixture for the topping and mix into it the cinnamon and demerara sugar. Set aside.

Mix apple in with eggs and zest, stir baking powder into rubbed-in mixture then quickly and lightly stir in the egg mixture - don't over mix. Gently fold in ¾ of the berries, spoon into tin and level. Scatter rest of berries on top. Sprinkle over the topping and bake for 1 hour 20 minutes, testing with a skewer. After 50 minutes, cover loosely with foil. Leave in tin for 30 minutes, then cool on a wire rack.
