RING 1 – RIDDEN CONCOURS D'ELEGANCE CLASSES

Commencing at 10:00am

Judges will be appointed according to entries to avoid conflict of interest as far as possible

Class 1 Mountain & Moorland including Welsh

Kindly sponsored by Rebecca Rawlinson of RJR Costume Designs Judge:

Class will be split if there are sufficient entries. Any horse to fit the description of Mountain & Moorland and rider combination in costume or traditional attire. Rider any age. Need not be registered, part-breds. welcome.

Class 2 Veterans

Kindly sponsored by Old Smokey's Forge

Open to horses from 15 years to 20 years in Section A and Horses over 21 years in Section B. To enter the arena together.

Class 3 Part Bred

Kindly sponsored by Lafond Browbands Judge: Miss Beth Ridgeway-Martin

Part bred horse or pony any, type, any breed.

Class 4 Homemade Costume

Judge: Miss Rebecca Rawlinson

Home made costume and accessories to be home made and not by a professional. Purchased jackets may be used as part of the costume. The criterion for this class is the elegance of the picture presented by horse/pony and rider, and the way of going of the horse/pony. Safe tack must be used. Detailed inspection of the rider's period costume is not required. Fancy dress is not permitted.

Class 5 Juniors

Kindly sponsored by Sally Lines Tolcher of S & P Elegance Open to riders aged 16 years and under.

Class 6 Traditional Attire

Judge: Miss Rebecca Rawlinson

Riders any age, to be dressed in traditional (regular) riding clothes, uniforms are permitted – but no period costume to be worn

Class 7 Coloured & Cobs

Kindly sponsored by Taira Technology Judge: Miss Kirstie Haley Open to all types of coloured horses and ponies and all types of cob including traditional, show and native

Class 8 Open Horse or Pony Kindly sponsored by Park Lady Costumes Open to all types of horse and pony. Junior and seniors.

Class 9 Side Saddle

Kindly sponsored by The Knights of Middle England Judge: Miss Beth Ridgway-Martin Any combination of side saddle horse & rider/handler in costume or traditional habit.

Class 11 Lead Rein

Plaited or native, 4 years old and over. Riders not to have attained their 10th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Unicorn rosettes for 1st to 6th. Commemorative rosettes to all entrants.

Class 12 In Hand Coloured & Cobs Kindly sponsored by Taira Technology Judge: Mrs Taira Raza Open to all in hand, coloured horses/ponies and cobs of all types.

Class 12A Gracious Ladies & Gentleman

Open to mature riders over the age of 45 years. Class will be split into age groups if sufficient entries

Class 12B In Hand Homemade Costume

Costume and accessories to be home made and not by a professional. Purchased jackets may be used as part of the costume. The criterion for this class is the elegance of the picture presented by horse/pony and rider, and the way of going of the horse/pony. Safe tack must be used. Detailed inspection of the rider's period costume is not required.

Class 13 In Hand Part bred Kindly sponsored by Allen Tree & Garden Services Judge:

In hand class for all part bred horses and ponies

 Kindly sponsored by Roger Smith Photography Judge: Miss Beth Ridgway-Martin Mountain & Moorland including Welsh - Class will be split if there are sufficient entries. Any horse to fit the description of Mountain & Moorland and rider combination in costume or traditional attire. Rider any age. Need not be registered, part-breds welcome.
Class 15 In Hand Veteran Kindly sponsored by Beth Ridgway-Martin in memory of Aran Strider Open to horses and ponies between 15 - 20 years in Section A and over 21 years in Section B

- Class 16 In Hand Open Horse or Pony Open to all In Hand Competitors. Any age, any type
- Class 17 In Hand Junior Open to all juniors showing In Hand and aged 16 years or under
- Class 18 In Hand Traditional Attire Judge: Miss Rebecca Rawlinson Handlers any age, to be dressed in traditional (regular) riding clothes, uniforms are permitted – but no period costume to be worn)

Competitor numbers will be available to collect from the Show Secretary, however we recommend that competitors wear bridle numbers as not to detract from their costume.
