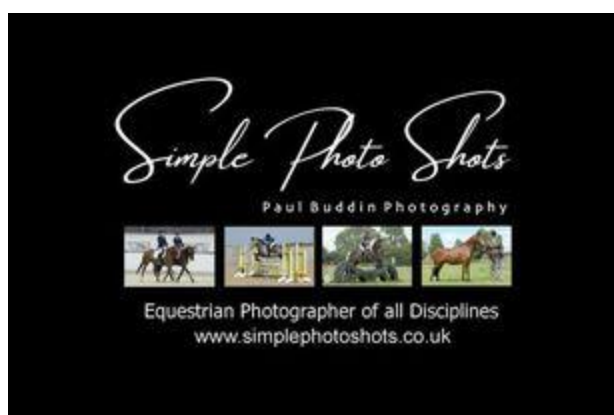

Veteran Horse Society – AREA QUALIFIER 2021.

First round qualifier for the Veteran Horse Society Supreme Final:

VETERAN HORSE OF THE YEAR 2021

Kindly Sponsored by Allen & Page.

Open to members and non-members. All competitors and grooms must adhere to VHS Rules in all circumstances. Failure to do so may result in immediate disqualification.

VHS Regional Final qualification. All competitors placed 1st to 4th in each age category will qualify for the corresponding class at VHS Regional Finals. Members must carry their cards in the ring and have their showing card signed by the judge in the ring as proof of qualification. Non-members will receive a red qualification card which can be exchanged for signed showing card when applying for VHS membership. It is the competitor's responsibility to present their Showing card to the judge. **Regional Finals are open to members only.**

All competitors are eligible to enter open classes at the National Veteran Championships, to be held at Arena UK Lincolnshire on 1st - 3rd October 2020. No qualification or membership necessary. See VHS website for schedule.

A message from Emma Richardson-Steele – Show Organiser:

I am extremely grateful to all the companies and individuals that kindly sponsor classes at my shows. This show could not take place without their generous support, and I would like to thank you all. Thank you to all my family, friends, judges, stewards and helpers for their loyal support, I couldn't do it without you!

Competitors, Parents and Guardians must abide by the Rules & Conditions of Entry

1. In all cases the Judge's decision is final. Judges may be substituted to avoid any possible conflict of interest. Entry is taken as acceptance of these rules
2. Save for death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the organisers, or anyone for whom they are in law responsible, neither the organisers at this event, Marlake Equestrian Events, nor any agent, employee or representative of these bodies, nor the landlord, accepts any liability for accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, spectators, land, vehicles, their contents and accessories or any other personal property whatsoever, whether caused by negligence, breach of contract, or in any other way whatsoever. Entries are only accepted on this basis.
3. Correct dress and safety attire must be worn in the arenas and on the Showground.
4. Age is at the date of the Show.
5. It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure they arrive in good time for their class and may not enter the arena when the 'go round' has started trotting.
6. No horses or ponies under the age of four years to enter the showground. No stallions allowed.
7. All competing horses must have had a flu vaccination not more than 12 months and not less than 7 days from the competition date. Random passports checks in operation.
8. For lead rein classes, lead rein to be attached to the noseband and pony led for the entirety of the class.
9. Entry fees will only be refunded on production of a medical/veterinary certificate.
10. The organisers reserve the right to cancel, amend or add to any of the classes as they see fit. The organisers reserve the right to refuse entry and no reason need be given.
11. There must be no galloping on the Showground, outside of the rings.
12. Health, Safety and Welfare. The organisers have taken all reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. Everyone must take all reasonable care to avoid and prevent accidents, and obey instructions given by the organisers, officials and stewards.
13. **Dogs must be kept on a lead and in close proximity of your vehicle**
14. The Show Committee has a **zero** tolerance policy towards any competitors, or their associates being abusive in anyway whatsoever to any other competitor, official or steward. Equally, no abuse towards any horse will be permitted, including excessive use of whips or spurs. Appropriate action as necessary will be taken by the Committee in these circumstances and you may be asked to leave the show ring.
