41	Cherry Loaf	<p>Set recipe : 5oz margarine or butter, 5oz caster sugar, 3 eggs, few drops of almond or Vanilla essence, 4oz glace cherries (chopped), 8oz SR Flour</p> <p>Method : Toss cherries in some of the flour, cream fat and sugar, beat in lightly whisked eggs, with a little flour. Add essence then fold in remaining flour, add cherries. Place mixture in a greased loaf tin. Bake at 324-350F (electric) reglo 3-4 (gas) for 1 and a quarter hours.</p>
