Caledonian Showing Championships



This show is a qualifier for the Caledonian Showing Championships, which is now fully established as the biggest and best way to end Scottish showing season

Howe EC, near Ladybank, Fife on 16/17/18 October 2026

Every horse & pony placed 1st in all Inhand, Ridden Showing classes (not fun classes) & Working Hunter/Pony classes will qualify to compete in any appropriate class at the Finals. All Champions & Reserves will qualify for the Champion & Reserves Stakes Finals. Qualification will be from placings, no qualification cards will be awarded in the ring, and no qualification can go down the line.

IRISH DRAUGHT HORSE SOCIETY - GENERAL ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

Important please read

- **ALL** horses must be registered with or overstamped by the IDHS (GB) and in the correct ownership
- New: **OWNERS** of Pure bred Irish Draughts **AND** Irish Draught Sport Horses/Part bred **MUST** now be **FULL MEMBERS** of the IDHS (GB) to compete
- **IRISH DRAUGHT SPORT HORSES/PART BRED** are horses that have a minimum of 25% proven Irish Draught breeding
- **IN HAND BREEDING CLASSES** - Mares with foals at foot, 3 years and over must be inspected and classified as Class 1 (or (RID), Class 2 or Supplementary Grade Up (or AID); Pure bred ID and ID Sport Horse/Part bred, 3 year old colts must be un-inspected; All 1, 2, & 3 year old colts must be bitted and shown by experienced handlers over 18 years of age
- **ALL PURE-BRED IRISH DRAUGHT STALLIONS** - Must be inspected and overstamped by the IDHS (GB) and be Class 1, 2 or RID (GB); Stallions must display a red, white and blue ribbon in their tails and be shown by experienced rider/handlers over 18 years of age
- **RIDDEN** horses must be 153cm (15hh) or over.

The Finals of all IDHS (GB) qualifiers will be held at the IDHS (GB) National Championship Show on 5th & 6th September 2026 at Pickering Grange Equestrian, Pickering Grange Farm, Ellistown, Terrance Road, Coalville, LE67 1EZ. All owners of

qualified horses will be contacted by a member of the IDHS (GB) Show Affiliation Team. Horses can only qualify for a specific Final once, regardless of the type or number of classes won, placed in or entered.

HATS

43. Correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats Nos. PAS015 2011, VG1, (BS) EN1384 2023, ASTM F1163 2015 and 2023, SNELL E2016 and E2021 onwards, AS/NZS 3838 2006 onwards, MUST be worn by riders at all times when mounted. Hats should have a plain cover, either Black, Navy Blue, Brown, Grey or Green. Velvet covers are encouraged. The B.S.P.S. encourages members to have their hats tagged through the B.S.P.S. scheme or via the Pony Club Scheme. Tagging indicates the hat meets the accepted standards, no check of the fit or condition of the hat is implied. It is considered to be the responsibility of the members/guardians to ensure the hat complies with current standards and is tagged before they compete. Members/guardians are responsible for ensuring the manufacturer's guidelines with regard to fit and replacement are followed.

BODY PROTECTORS

50. Body Protectors MUST be worn when jumping in any WHP and WH classes, Including practice rings at B.S.P.S. affiliated shows. (Including Tiny Tots, Cradle and Nursery Stakes, WSP, LRWSP and Training Stakes). Riders must wear a body protector when working in (practice jumps) and the jumping phase in all B.S.P.S. organised and affiliated events. A British Equestrian Trade Association (BETA) approved and appropriately labelled "Level 3 body protector" 2018 (Blue) shown on the label. BETA recommends body protectors are replaced at least every three to five years, after which the impact absorption properties of the foam may have started to decline.

Air Jackets may be worn. If a member chooses to wear an air jacket they are allowed in addition to a normal body protector, which meets BETA 2018 level 3 standard. Air jackets must not be worn under any jacket or body protector, and numbers must be fitted with elasticated fastenings.

When an air jacket inflates the sudden noise can startle horses, thereby causing difficulties for other members if used in confined areas, e.g., indoor schools and ménages. Therefore, air jackets are not encouraged to be used in those areas except for medical reasons.

SPURS

51. The wearing of spurs in ALL classes held under B.S.P.S. Rules is forbidden. Spurs or dummy spurs must not be used when working in.

WHIPS

52. In ALL classes held under B.S.P.S. Rules whips are not to exceed 75cms (30ins). Hunting Crops are permissible. This includes whips/sticks used by leaders in lead rein classes. Padded whips are recommended for WHP classes.

A whip, if carried, must be held in the hand by the handle with the handle at the top.

At all times the whip must be used; For a good reason, as an aid to encourage the horse/pony forward. At an appropriate time, namely when the horse/pony is reluctant to go forward with the normal aids of seat and legs. In the right place, namely down the shoulder or behind the leg. Never over arm. With appropriate severity. No more than twice for any incident. Riders must not hit a horse/pony before the start of a jumping course.

Excessive use of a whip anywhere on a showground will result in disqualification of the horse and rider from any classes entered on that day.

This includes, but not limited to-

Use of the whip to vent a competitor's anger is always excessive.

Use of the whip which causes injury, e.g. broken skin or weal is always excessive.

Use after elimination or retirement is always excessive.

Use on the horse/pony's head and neck is always excessive.

Using a whip from the ground after a fall or dismount is always excessive.

If the rider's arm comes above the shoulder when using the whip this is always excessive.

From 2026, in WHP and WSP classes riders must only use a baton whip.

PERTH EQUINE VETS/BHS SCOTLAND WORKING HUNTER SERIES 2026

This competition series is run under Sports Horse Breeding of Great Britain (SHB GB), the governing body of all hunter and sports horse classes. Exhibitors should be familiar with these rules; they can be found at <http://www.sportshorsegb.co.uk>.

Please be aware of the following rules for the Scone Final:

- 50 H All ridden hunters in classes where the Judge rides the exhibits must be shod all round. No pads or surgical shoes are allowed.
- 50 I No hind boots or bandages of any description are allowed in the collecting ring, warm up or in the actual class in Working Hunter and Ridden Sport Horse classes.
- 50 J The Society discourages the showing of over fat horses and Judges will take this into consideration when making their awards.

The first THREE qualify for the final, even if they did not jump clear. If one of the first three has already qualified, the qualification can be passed down to fourth place provided the 4th placed rider jumped clear.

The Course will be at least 8 and not more than 12 fences, with changes of direction, must be set in a ring large enough to permit jumping fluently at a fair hunting pace. Fences should be rustic or as natural as possible, not easily dislodged, of solid appearance, well filled and with shrubs as wings. Maximum height 3ft 6ins (1.05m), maximum spread 3ft 9ins (1.12m) except open ditch and water. The course should be set at, or near, maximum unless the judge considers that the ground makes this unsafe. Normally at least one upright and one spread must be at maximum. If there is a class prior to this class at your show, there should be a change in track made.

Judging & Marking:

The jumping phase should be judged first, followed by ride and conformation.

Jumping faults are deducted from 40 to give total jumping points; stye & presence whilst jumping 20; ride & conformation 40; Total: 100

Penalties:

Fence knocked down 10; 1st Refusal 15; 2nd Refusal 20; 3rd Refusal Elimination; Fall of horse or rider disqualification

BSPS SCOTLAND TRAINING STAKES CHAMPIONSHIP QUALIFIER - CLASSES 96, 97 & 98

The final will be held at the BSPS Scotland Finale Show on Saturday 12th September. Competitors can qualify at affiliated shows throughout the summer, and the Final will be open to both members and non-members.

YOU DO NOT NEED TO BE A MEMBER OF BSPS TO ENTER THESE CLASSES. BOTH THE QUALIFYING CLASSES AND THE FINAL ARE OPEN TO EVERYONE.

These classes run under BSPS Rules.

Fences: There will be a minimum of 8 fences up to a maximum of 12 fences, not exceeding the height of the class); they will immediately be asked to give a short show including a change of rein and gallop in the same ring.

To qualify for the final, the first two will qualify if they jump clear. Qualification can pass down to 4th place as long as the combination has been clear. If a combination qualifies in all three height sections, they will only be able to jump the two higher heights at the final.

**NPS SCOTLAND/KINGFISHER BUILDING PRODUCTS M&M OPEN WHP
CHAMPIONSHIP**

In M&M classes riders of Stallions must be 12 years old or over when riding small breeds (Shetland, Dartmoor, Exmoor, Welsh A & B). For large breeds (Highland, Fell, Dales, Connemara, New Forest, Welsh C & D) riders of stallions must be 14 years old or over.

Riders may only ride one pony in the class. The owner does not have to be an NPS Scotland member for the pony to enter this competition, but the owner must become a member to enter the final.

The course will consist of a minimum of seven fences, one of which must be a spread, a change of direction must be included. If a hazard is included, it will be numbered and judged as a fence. Ponies may be shown in any suitable bridle. All ponies forward for final judging may be stripped but this is not mandatory.

The 2 highest placed ponies, in each fence height not already qualified, will qualify for the Final which will take place at the Scone Palace International Horse Trials on Friday 28th August 2026. **Qualifications to be no lower than 4th place.**

220 Open Private Driving

For horses, and donkeys, 4 years old or over, driven to a traditional or traditional type vehicle. A traditional vehicle means a vehicle of traditional profile and identifiable type to resemble the design of a carriage built prior to the First World War. The vehicle may be made from modern materials but must have traditional style springing and carriage lamps. Pneumatic tyred vehicles, trade turnouts and show wagons are not eligible. Open to Singles, Pairs or Tandems.

221 Exercise Vehicle

For horses, ponies & donkeys, 4 years old or over. A single, pair or tandem driven to a carriage of non-traditional type design and includes those with pneumatic tyres specifically designed for carriages (i.e. not car tyres). Lamps need not be carried. Judging will include general cleanliness, safety of turnout, correct fitting of harness and vehicle suitability.

Turriff Show is affiliated to the **BRITISH DRIVING SOCIETY**. Points are awarded for the highest placed turnouts driven by a BDS member and count towards the Whitehall Cup and the Chairman's Cup.

RULES

Young Drivers:

The driver must be aged 8 years or over on the first day of the show at which they are to compete. A driver under the age of 18 must be accompanied in the vehicle by a competent and responsible person aged 18 years or over, a "responsible adult". Proof of age will be required if necessary. It is the responsibility of the owner/driver (if over 18) or (if the owner/driver is under 18) the responsible adult to ensure that his/her groom/s is/are competent for the purpose of attending to the turnout and aged 8 or over on the day of the show. When in the vehicle grooms, passenger/s and driver must have their feet firmly on the

floor of the vehicle or use a suitable fixed footrest. This regulation always applies and in all areas on the showground.

Hard Hats:

All drivers/grooms/passengers under the age of 14 years must wear a correctly fitted hard hat when in a carriage or in attendance to a turnout.

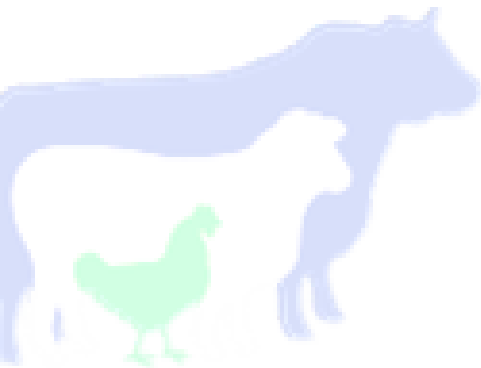
