Class 1 Open Walk / Trot Novice Ridden (Open to non members and any colour including unregistered palominos and cream dilutes)

Novice ridden defined as the horse/pony not having been placed 1st in any open ridden class prior to 1st Jan in the current year. Entrants will only be asked to WALK and TROT. Lead rein is not permitted. *Does not qualify for the ridden championship.*

Class 2 Open Ridden (Open to non members and any colour including unregistered palominos and cream dilutes)

Does not qualify for the ridden championship.

Class 3 Open Inhand (Open to non members and any colour including unregistered palominos and cream dilutes)

Does not qualify for the in-hand Championship

Ring 1 - NB 09:30am - Ridden Classes

All animals must be registered with, or accepted for registration by the British Palomino Society. Owner must be a current paid up member of the British Palomino Society. All animals must be 4 years old or over to compete in a ridden class.

All highest placed junior riders to compete in the **Junior Championship** - RIDERS TO WEAR A WHITE ARMBAND. (Junior rider not to have attained their 18th birthday by 1st Jan).

All highest placed Cream dilutes (to exclude palomino) to compete in the Cream Dilute Championship.
All highest placed Mountain & Moorlands to compete in the Mountain & Moorland Championship
Highest placed palomino to compete in Ridden Palomino of the Year Championship
Ridden Palominos issued with a Gold, Silver or Bronze rosette compete in the Colour Award

Class 4 Walk / Trot Novice Ridden Registered Palomino or Cream Dilute

Novice ridden defined as the horse/pony not having been placed 1st in any open ridden class prior to 1st Jan in the current year. Entrants will only be asked to WALK and TROT. Lead rein is not permitted.

Class 5 Veteran Ridden Registered Palomino or Cream Dilute

Exhibits to be 15 years old or over.

Class 6 Lead Rein Riding Registered Palomino or Cream Dilute

Open to Geldings and Mares only. Riders not to have attained their 10th birthday before 1st Jan in the current year.

Class 7 First Ridden Riding Registered Palomino or Cream Dilute

Open to Geldings and Mares only. Riders not to have attained their 12th birthday before 1st Jan in the current year.

Class 8 Junior Rider

Riders not to have attained their 18th birthday by 1st Jan in the current year.

- Class 9 Ridden Registered Palomino or Cream Dilute Exceeding 14.2hh
- Class 10 Ridden Registered Palomino or Cream Dilute Not Exceeding 14.2h (Lead Rein Permitted)

Pure bred only. Must be registered in the appropriate studbook.

Pure bred only. Must be registered in the appropriate studbook.

Class 14 Registered Palomino or Cream Dilute Exceeding 14.2hh

Class 15 Registered Palomino or Cream Dilute Not Exceeding 14.2hh

Yearlings not to exceed 13.3h, Two & Three Year Olds not to exceed 14hh.

All animals must be registered with, or accepted for registration by the British Palomino Society. Owner must be a current paid up member of the British Palomino Society.

Highest placed Mountain & Moorlands to compete in Mountain & Moorland Championship.

Highest placed Cream dilutes to compete in the Cream Dilute Championship.

Highest placed palomino to compete in In Hand Palomino of the Year Championship

Palominos issued with a Gold, Silver or Bronze rosette compete in the Colour Award Championship

Class 18 Newcomers Registered Palomino or Cream Dilute

To be owned by a member of the BPS exhibiting at the BPS AUTUMN SHOW for the first time.

Class 19 Open Palomino or Cream Dilute

Class 20 World Breeds Registered Palomino or Cream Dilute

Must be registered in a World Breed Register (including partbreds) including Arabs

Class 21 Part-Bred Arab Registered Palomino or Cream Dilute

Must be registered in the appropriate studbook.

Class 22 Owner Bred Palomino or Cream Dilute

Exhibit to have been bred by the current owner.

Class 23 Open Part Bred Palomino or Cream Dilute

Any part bred palomino or cream dilute is eligible.

Class 24 Veteran Palomino or Cream Dilute

Exhibits to be 15 years old or over.

IN-HAND CHAMPIONSHIP

1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 12-15, 18-24 and the Youngstock Champion and Reserve Champion to come forward.

Champion and Reserve to go forward for Supreme of Show.

CREAM DILUTE CHAMPIONSHIP

All highest placed Registered cream dilute (excluding palominos) from ridden and in-hand classes. Champion and Reserve to go forward for Supreme of Show.

BPS AUTUMN SHOW COLOUR CHAMPIONSHIP

All Palomino's awarded a gold, silver or bronze award to come forward for the judging of the Colour Championship.

Champion and Reserve to go forward for Supreme of Show.

MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND CHAMPIONSHIP

1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 12 & 13 as well as all highest placed Mountain & Moorland in all eligible classes.

Champion and Reserve to go forward for Supreme of Show.

Palomino of the Year Finals

Any palomino horse or pony placed 1st in any affiliated British Palomino Class since 6th September 2021 is eligible to compete in the Palomino of the Year Final, including winners from the BPS National Championships 2022/2023 and the BPS Autumn Show on the day.

GARLAND SASH to Overall Supreme of Show and Reserve Supreme

SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. Exhibits in the registered palomino and dilute classes must be BPS registered or have applied for BPS registration with class entry.
- 2. The BPS Registered owner or recorded lease must be a member of the British Palomino Society. Written notice of any such lease must have been lodged with the BPS by the lessor prior to or with the class entry.
- 3. Correctly secured current British Standard skull caps/riding hats must be worn at all times when mounted on the showground. Handlers aged 12 years or under must wear correctly secured current British Standard skull caps/riding hats when showing in In-hand classes.
- 4. Age of all exhibits will date from January 1st of the year of birth.
- 5. Exhibitors who are likely to have horses or ponies in more than one ring at the same time should provide additional riders and or handlers.
- 6. Classes and championships subject to height restrictions It is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that youngstock are entered in the correct class. Animals may be required to be measured before the start of the class.
- 6.1 Adult height not to exceed 14.2hh yearlings should measure no more than 13.3hh; 2-year-olds no more than 14.0hh; 3-year-olds no more than 14.1hh.
- 6.2 Adult height not to exceed 13.2hh yearlings should measure no more than 12.3hh; 2-year-olds no more than 13.0hh; 3-year-olds no more than 13.1hh.
- 6.3 Adult height not to exceed 12.2hh yearlings should measure no more than 11.3hh; 2-year-olds no more than 12.0hh; 3-year-olds no more than 12.1hh.
- 7. No mare under 4 years old with foal at foot will be eligible for any class.
- 8. No foal under one month old to be brought to the showground. Foals must be led at all times.
- 9. Whips show canes only max 30" (76 cm) with no attachments.
- 10. Any exhibit deemed to be unsound will be asked to leave the ring.
- 11. No make-up, false hair or any other falsification of markings will be allowed. **No trimming of sensory hairs (whiskers) around the nose or eyes.**
- 12. Registered Palomino In Hand classes. Plaiting is optional. Hogging is allowed but hogged exhibits will not be eligible for colour awards.
- 13. Registered Palomino Ridden classes. Plaiting is optional. Hogging is allowed but hogged exhibits will not be eligible for colour awards.
- 14. Any class may be cancelled, amalgamated or split if the number of entries warrant. The judge may withhold prizes if in their opinion any exhibit does not merit an award.
- 15. Any competitor using a mobile phone whilst competing in a class will be disqualified
- 16. The judge's decision is final. Judges have been asked to take behaviour and temperament into account and not to judge exhibits whose behaviour they consider to be a danger to either its handler/rider or other competitors. Such an exhibit will be asked to leave the ring.
- 17. Protests may be lodged by any exhibitor and must be made in writing to the secretary with a deposit of £40 within one hour of the award or matter to which exception has been taken. Objections will not be entertained from any person not exhibiting in the same class as the animal to which the objection is raised. If possible, the Show committee will decide the case before the conclusion of the show; otherwise it shall be referred to the Council. The decision of either body is final. When an objection is heard both the objectee and objector shall have notice. The deposit shall be returned if the original complaint is upheld. No committee or council member shall take part in the settlement of a disputed prize for which he is a competitor.

- 18. No horse/pony to be left unattended when tied outside the horsebox/trailer.
- 19. ALL entire males aged 2 years and over MUST be bitted and led from the bit. Children 12 years-of age or under will not be permitted to handle entire males (excepting foals).
- 20. Chifney bits are not allowed in any circumstances. Any animal not sufficiently under control will be asked to leave the showground.
- 21. If the conduct of any exhibitor is such as shall in the opinion of the committee be injurious to the character or interest of the show or shall an exhibitor cause cruelty or unnecessary suffering to or neglect of an animal then the committee may refuse their entry. The committee shall have the power to refuse entry or suspend membership of any exhibitor conducting themselves in an improper or offensive manner.
- 22. DOGS must be kept on a lead and must be under control at all times.
- 23. Should any animal be found to be suffering from any contagious or infectious disease it shall be removed from the showground and stables immediately at the request of the Veterinary Surgeon
- 24. The Society and Show Committee shall not be liable for any claim in respect of any damage to any person horse or property of any kind howsoever it may be caused. It is an express condition of entry that each competitor shall hold the committee harmless and that he or she shall indemnify the committee against any legal proceedings actions expenses costs claims demands or damages whatsoever arising from any accident or other incident which may occur.
- 25. In accordance with recommendations outlined by the British Equestrian Federation it is brought to exhibitors' notice that no animal entered in classes at the Shows affiliated to Show and Breed Societies shall receive any drug which might offer an unfair advantage. Full details available from the secretary on request.
- 26. No entry fees will be refunded unless a veterinary certificate is presented. In the event of cancellation of the show a proportion of entry fees may be withheld.
- 27. Riders of stallions 13.2h and under must have attained their 12th birthday by the 1st January 2022.
- 28. Riders of stallions 13.2h and above must have attained their 14th birthday by the 1st January 2022.
