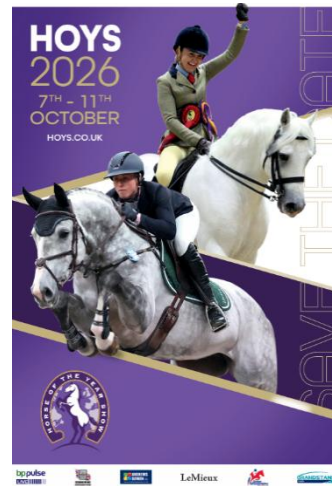

Entries

Advanced entries close: **6th July 2026** and are at a **reduced rate**.

At least 1 class must be pre-entered for Palomino and Cream Dilute classes so that exhibits can be catalogued. Additional entries can be made on the day for the same animal. Non Members/Classes for Any Colour can be entered on the day.

Advanced entries fee: £18 per class

Additional on the day entries where at least 1 class pre-entered £20 per class

Other On-The-Day entries will be accepted at £30 per class (preferably cash or bank transfer with card). Pre-entries to be online at: www.showingscene.com

Stabling

Stabling is available for the nights of Friday 10th July and Saturday 11th July 2026. Why not stay for two nights and enter the BPS National Championships on both days? Make a weekend of it and join the fun - you pay for stabling, but your camping is free! N.B. A stable booked for Saturday night (11th) may not be occupied before 5pm.

The charges are as follows:

£45 plus VAT per stable with 1 bale of straw

The second night in the same stable will be £38 plus VAT (no extra straw)

Where competitors bring more than one horse, any additional horse will have discounted stable of £43 plus VAT for first night with 1 bale straw. Second night £38 plus VAT (no extra straw)

Day Stable available at £38 plus VAT. No bedding to be used in day stables.

Additional straw may be purchased for £7 a bale (straw price correct at going to press)

Electric Hook up £30 plus VAT per hook up for 1 night, £60 plus VAT for 2 nights. Hook ups are limited so first come first served.

Qualifiers

PRICE SUPREME IN-HAND HORSE OR PONY OF THE YEAR SEMI FINAL

The following Championship Class (CH28) is a qualifier for the Supreme In-Hand Semi Final at the National Pony Society Great British In-Hand Show, 13th September 2026 at Vale View Equestrian Centre. Which is a qualifier for Horse of the Year Show, NEC, 7th – 11th October 2026.

The objective of the competition is to find the supreme light horse or pony in-hand champion of the year, irrespective of breed or type (excluding heavy horses). The Champion horse or pony from the following classes will be eligible to compete in the Supreme In-Hand Semi Final, provided it has not already won a Supreme In-Hand qualifier in 2026.

- **Winner of CH28 - the PRICE Supreme In-Hand Semi Final Championship** (Winners of CH3, CH4, CH6, CH9, CH12, CH13, CH14, CH15, CH17 and CH20 to compete)

If the Champion has already qualified for Horse of the Year Show 2026 or is ineligible, then the Reserve Champion may come forward to The NPS Great British In-Hand Show, provided it has not already qualified and is eligible. If both Champion and Reserve Champion have already qualified for Horse of the Year Show 2026 or are ineligible then the Semi-Final will not be represented at the NPS Great British In-Hand Show.

Foal champions and geldings four years old and over are not eligible to compete or eligible to qualify for Horse of the Year Show.

In the event of a horse/pony having been awarded more than one section Championship at this show, that horse/pony will represent both/all sections and the Semi-Final qualification will not pass down to the Reserve Champion in the 2nd and any subsequent sections. ***All classes are open to Yearlings, 2 year olds, 3 year olds, Stallions, broodmares and barren mares only.*** Broodmares must be with foal at foot or a relevant certificate of pregnancy. Mares which have not yet foaled or that have lost their foals are eligible to enter with a relevant certificate of pregnancy for the following year.

There will be no direct entry into the Supreme In-Hand Championship Semi Final, all animals must be a section champion or reserve champion (as applicable). Judges need not be registered on any society Judge's panel but must possess sufficient experience to judge. **VETERAN CHAMPIONSHIP OF THE DAY
VETERAN HORSE SOCIETY (VHS) GOLDEN TICKET.**

The VHS has offered the Veteran Championship 2 Golden Tickets to attend the Supreme Veteran Horse of the Year 2026 Final.

Those who receive a 'Golden Ticket' for the 'Veteran Horse Society Supreme Finals, in accordance to the relevant age section. Arena UK, Lincs. 4th August – 6th September 2026.

Qualifying rules apply, turnout Rules in accordance with the 2026 Rule Book and National Championship Rules 2026. To enter the VHS Supreme Final, you will need to enter within 21 days from qualification and become a member of the Society. Full information is available on their website or by contacting the VHS directly.

The Qualification is only presented to an amateur rider/handler and also not to those with foals at foot. If a Professional Producer or a mare and foal are placed Champion, the placing will remain, but qualification is to be handed down the line no lower than 4th place.

As this is a breed or Championship show at the Directors discretion, the winning competitors will represent the breed at the Supreme Final and therefore ***only BPS registered cream dilute or palomino horses may be presented with the Gold ticket.*** Therefore a non VHS judge may judge the class. www.veteran-horse-society.co.uk. email: info@veteran-horse-society.co.uk Tel: 01239 881300 / 07789 514004

This Show offers qualification for the **CONCOURS D'ELEGANCE OF GREAT BRITAIN NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP**. First, second and third placed horses/ponies not already qualified in **Class 41 in the evening performance** will qualify for the Champion of Britain Title classes to be held at Onley Equestrian Centre, Willoughby, Rugby, Warwickshire on Friday 25th and Saturday 26th September 2026.

Each qualified horse/pony will receive a qualification card in the ring which will enable the owner to enter the Championship Show, provided the owner and rider/handler are, or become registered with the Concours d'Elegance Society of GB **within 21 days** of the qualifying show.

- 1. Palomino/Dilute M&M Lead Rein;** Ponies must be registered with the relevant M&M breed society. Mare or gelding not to exceed 12.2hh. Rider not to have attained their 10th birthday by the 1st January 2026, to be shown in a snaffle bit, and led from the nose band. Rosettes to all competitors.
- 2. Palomino/Dilute Welsh A&B;** Ponies must be registered with the breed society. Rosette to highest Junior BPS member in classes (eligible riders to wear white armbands).
- 3. Palomino/Dilute Welsh C&D;** Ponies must be registered with the breed society. Open to all ridden Welsh C & D's. Rosette to highest Junior BPS member in classes (eligible riders to wear white armbands).
- 4. Open M&M excluding Welsh;** Open to all registered mountain and moorland ponies excluding Welsh. Rosette to highest Junior BPS member in classes (eligible riders to wear white armbands).

All 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 1- 4 to compete for the M&M Ridden Championship. **DEWBAR PERPETUAL CHALLENGE TROPHY TO THE WINNER**

All ridden exhibits in classes 1 - 4 deemed the Best Turned Out/Best Style and Appearance will receive a BTO rosette and these individuals qualify for the **Ridden Style and Appearance Championship (CH8)** which forms part of the Saturday Evening Performance (NB 6pm)

Registered Palomino & Cream Dilute Open Ridden Classes NB. 10 am

Open to all palominos & cream dilutes that are registered with the BPS. Exhibits must be 4 yrs+. Exhibits may be stripped. No exhibits will be ridden by the judge. Rosette to highest Junior BPS member in classes (eligible riders to wear white armbands).

Judge classes 5 – 7 Lisa Chambers; Classes 8 – 15 Dawn Duffy

- 5. Ridden Young Horse or Pony;** To be aged 4, 5 or 6 years old, to be shown in a snaffle.
- 6. Ridden Novice Horse or Pony;** To be ridden in a snaffle bit. Horse not to have won an affiliated ridden showing class before 1st January 2026. Winner to receive the **MERLINIS MEMORIAL TROPHY**
- 7. Ridden First-Time Exhibitor;** Exhibitor to not have previously entered the Registered Ridden classes at the BPS Championships. Highest Placed Palomino to receive the **LEGEND MOON EMPRESS PERPETUAL SALVER.**

8. Ridden Not exceeding 14.2h. Open to stallions, mares and geldings of any breed and type. Highest placed registered Palomino to receive **KINGRICK CUP** . * *Best Junior qualifies for the Junior Ridden Championship in Ring 2 (CH5) (eligible riders to wear white armbands).*

9. **Ridden Home produced;** Horse not to have been in a professional yard since 1st January 2026. A professional is defined as someone who earns their main income from horses. **Best Junior qualifies for the Junior Ridden Championship in Ring 2 (CH5) (eligible riders to wear white armbands).*

10. **Ridden Sport Horse or Pony;** Winner to receive **ELECTRUM PERPETUAL SALVER**
These classes are for athletic horses & ponies that have the conformation and movement to go to the top of their sphere.

11. **Ridden World Breeds including Part Bred;** To be entered in a recognised breed register (other than UK M&M). Breed to be stated on entry form. Winner to receive **ALADJA TROPHY**.

12. **Ridden Part-Bred Arab;** Must be entered in the AHS part-bred register. Highest placed Palomino to receive **THE JOHN COLDICUTT MEMORIAL TROPHY**. ** Winner also qualifies for the PBA championship on Sunday in Ring 2 CH14*

13. **Ridden Part-Bred** excluding Part-Bred Arab; Must be registered in a recognised breed register. Breed to be stated on entry form.

14. **Ridden Exceeding 14.2h.** Open to stallions, mares and geldings of any breed and type. Highest placed registered Palomino to receive the **REISS CUP**

15. **Ridden Veteran;** Exhibits to be 15 years or over. **Rosette for all exhibits.** Winner and 2nd place to compete in **Overall Veteran Championship CH18** on Sunday. Highest placed registered Palomino to receive **OSCAR CUP**. Oldest registered Palomino to receive the **SPIRIT OF GOLD CUP**. Highest Placed Members with Palomino or Cream Dilute in CH18 to qualify for **VHS Golden Ticket**.

CH2. Ridden Palomino and Cream Dilute Championship

1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 5 - 15 to compete for the Ridden Palomino and Cream Dilute Championship. Winner to receive the **BPS SALVER**. Best Palomino ridden mare to receive **MOONSHINE TROPHY**.

All ridden exhibits in classes 5-15 deemed the Best Turned Out/Best Style and Appearance in their class will receive a BTO rosette and these individuals qualify for the **Ridden Style and Appearance Championship** which forms part of the Saturday Evening Performance (NB 6pm)

Open to members and **all cream dilutes (excluding palominos)** that are registered with the British Palomino Society. Those not expected to exceed 14.2hh at maturity to wear a white armband.

16. **Cream Dilute Yearling**; Any breed. Colt, filly or gelding. Highest placed colt to receive **Special rosette**. Highest placed filly to receive **Special rosette**

17. **Cream Dilute Two Year Old**; Any breed. Colt, filly or gelding.

18. **Cream Dilute Three Year Old**; Any breed. Colt, filly or gelding

CH3. Cream Dilute Youngstock Championship

All 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 16 - 18 to compete for the Cream Dilute Youngstock Championship.

1st place class winners to qualify for In Hand Youngstock Champion of the Year (CH10) as part of the Saturday Evening Performance for the **GRASSENDALE GOLDEN MONARCH PERPETUAL CHALLENGE CUP**. SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Exhibitors in the registered palomino and cream dilute classes must be BPS members.
2. Exhibits in the registered palomino and cream dilute classes must be BPS registered.
3. Registered exhibits must be exhibited by the BPS registered owner or recorded lessee. Written notice of any such lease must have been lodged with the BPS by the lessor prior to or with the class entry.
4. Age of all exhibits will date from January 1st of the year of birth.
5. Exhibitors who are likely to have horses or ponies in more than one ring at the same time should provide additional riders and or handlers.
6. Classes and championships subject to height restrictions - It is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that youngstock are entered in the correct class. Animals may be required to be measured before the start of the class.
 - 6.1 Adult height not to exceed 14.2hh - yearlings should measure no more than 13.3hh; 2 -year-olds no more than 14.0hh; 3-year-olds no more than 14.1hh.
 - 6.2 Adult height not to exceed 13.2hh - yearlings should measure no more than 12.3hh; 2 -year-olds no more than 13.0hh; 3-year-olds no more than 13.1hh.
 - 6.3 Adult height not to exceed 12.2hh - yearlings should measure no more than 11.3hh; 2 -year-olds no more than 12.0hh; 3-year-olds no more than 12.1hh.
7. No make-up, false hair or any other falsification of markings will be allowed.
8. Registered Palomino In Hand classes. Plaiting and hogging/partial hogging is allowed, but you will not be eligible for any of the colour awards or colour championships.
9. Registered Palomino Ridden classes. Plaiting is optional. Hogging is allowed.
10. Any class may be cancelled, amalgamated, or split if the number of entries warrant.
11. Chifney bits are not allowed in any circumstances. Any animal not sufficiently under control will be asked to leave the showground.

Health, Safety and Welfare

12. The BPS will follow the Showing Council Equine Welfare and General Best Practice Guidance and Unified Rules including:
 - 12.1 Competitors will be discouraged from removing sensory hairs from ears or whiskers unless specified in breed standard. No competitor will be disadvantaged for non-removal of sensory hair.
 - 12.2 Horses should have a healthy body condition score
 - 12.3 Ridden horses should carry no more than 20% of their body weight.
13. If the conduct of any exhibitor is such as shall in the opinion of the committee be injurious to the character or interest of the show or shall an exhibitor cause cruelty or unnecessary suffering to or neglect of an animal then the Council may refuse their entry.
14. No horse/pony to be left unattended when tied outside the horsebox/trailer
15. No mare under 4 years old with foal at foot will be eligible for any class.
16. No foal under one month old to be brought to the showground. Foals must be led at times.
17. Any exhibit deemed to be unsound will be asked to leave the ring.
18. ALL entire males aged 2 years and over MUST be bitted and led from the bit. Children 16 years-of age or under will not be permitted to handle entire males (excepting foals).
19. Correctly secured current British Standard skull caps/riding hats must be worn at all times when mounted on the showground.
20. Handlers aged 12 years or under must wear correctly secured current British Standard skull caps/riding hats when showing in In-hand classes. No competitor will be disadvantaged by wearing riding hats in in-hand classes
21. All competitors must wear long hair neatly in plaits or bun on health and safety grounds and to present a professional image.
22. Competitors should not wear jewellery, earrings or piercings that could present a health and safety risk.
23. Whips – show canes only – max 30" (76 cm) with no attachments - this applies to all classes.
24. Any competitor using a mobile phone whilst competing in a class will be disqualified

Judges

25. The judge's decision is final. Judges have been asked to take behaviour and temperament into account and not to judge exhibits whose behaviour they consider to be a danger to either its handler/rider or other competitors. Such an exhibit will be asked to leave the ring.
26. The judge may withhold prizes if in their opinion any exhibit does not merit an award.
27. The Council shall have the power to refuse entry or suspend membership of any exhibitor conducting themselves in an improper or offensive manner.
28. Protests lodged by any exhibitor and must be made in writing to the secretary with a deposit of £20 within one hour of the award or matter to which exception has been taken. Objections will not be entertained from any person not exhibiting in the same class as the animal to which the objection is raised. If possible, the Show committee will decide the case before the conclusion of the show; otherwise, it shall be referred to the Council. The decision of either body is final. When an objection is heard both the objectee and objector shall have notice. The deposit shall be returned if the original complaint is upheld. No committee or council member shall take part in the settlement of a disputed prize for which they are a competitor.
29. DOGS – must be kept on a lead and must be under control at all times.
30. Should any animal be found to be suffering from any contagious or infectious disease it shall be removed from the showground and stables immediately at the request of the Veterinary Surgeon
31. The Society and Show Committee shall not be liable for any claim in respect of any damage to any person horse or property of any kind howsoever it may be caused. It is an express condition of entry that each competitor shall hold the committee harmless and that he or she shall indemnify the committee against any legal proceedings actions expenses costs claims demands or damages whatsoever arising from any accident or other incident which may occur.
32. In accordance with recommendations outlined by the British Equestrian Federation it is brought to exhibitors notice that no animal entered in classes at the Shows affiliated to Show and Breed Societies shall receive any drug which might offer an unfair advantage. Full details available on the FEI website.
33. No entry fees will be refunded unless a veterinary certificate is presented
