Stabling

Stabling is available for the nights of Friday 11th July and Saturday 12th July 2025.

Why not stay for two nights and enter the BPS National Championships on both days? Make a weekend of it and join the fun - you pay for stabling, but your camping is free!

Qualifiers

A number of our in-hand classes are qualifiers for the **SUPREME IN-HAND HORSE OR PONY OF THE YEAR SEMI FINAL** at the National Pony Society Great British In-Hand Show, 14th September 2025 at Vale View Equestrian Centre, which is a qualifier for Horse of the Year Show, NEC, 8th – 12th October 2025.

The objective of the competition is to find the supreme light horse or pony in-hand champion of the year, irrespective of breed or type (excluding heavy horses). The Champion horse or pony from the following classes will be eligible to compete in the Supreme In-Hand Semi Final, provided it has not already won a Supreme In-Hand qualifier in 2025.

- Winner of the CH33 - the PRICE Supreme In-Hand Semi Final Championship (competed for by winners of CH4, CH5, CH6, CH9, CH13, CH19, CH20, CH21, CH23, CH24)

If the Champion has already qualified for Horse of the Year Show 2025 or is ineligible, then the Reserve Champion may come forward to The NPS Great British In-Hand Show, provided it has not already qualified and is eligible.

If both Champion and Reserve Champion have already qualified for Horse of the Year Show 2025 or are ineligible then the Semi-Final will not be represented at the NPS Great British In-Hand Show. Foal champions and geldings four years old and over are **not eligible to compete or eligible to qualify for Horse of the Year Show**. In the event of a horse/pony having been awarded more than one section Championship at this show, that horse/pony will represent both/all sections and the Semi-Final qualification will not pass down to the Reserve Champion in the 2nd and any subsequent sections. **All classes are open to Yearlings, 2 year olds, 3 year olds, Stallions, broodmares and barren mares only.** Broodmares must be with foal at foot or a relevant certificate of pregnancy. Mares which have not yet foaled or that have lost their foals are eligible to enter with a relevant certificate of pregnancy for the following year. There will be no direct entry into the Supreme In-Hand Championship Semi Final, all animals must be a section champion or reserve champion (as applicable). Judges need not be registered on any society Judge's panel but must possess sufficient experience to judge. This Show offers qualification for the **VETERAN HORSE SOCIETY (VHS)** 'Veteran Horse of the Year 2025 Supreme Finals.

The VHS has offered the Veteran Championship 2 Golden Tickets to attend the Supreme Veteran Horse of the Year 2025 Final. Those who receive a 'Golden Ticket' for the 'Veteran Horse of the Year 2025 Supreme Finals, in accordance to the relevant age section. Arena UK, Lincs. 29th August – 31st August 2025.

Qualifying rules apply, turnout Rules in accordance with the 2025 Rule Book and National Championship Rules 2025.

To enter the VHS Supreme Final you will need to enter within 21 days from qualification and become a member of the Society.

Full information is available on VHS website or by contacting the VHS directly.

The Qualification is only presented to an amateur rider/handler and also not to those with foals at foot. If a Professional Producer or a mare and foal are placed Champion, the placing will remain, but qualification is to be handed down the line no lower than 4th place. As this is a breed Championship show, it will represent the breed at the Supreme Final and therefore only BPS registered cream dilute or palomino horses may be presented with the award.

This Show is affiliated to **TSR - THE SHOWING REGISTER AMATEUR OF THE YEAR FINAL**, taking place at Stoneleigh Park, Warwickshire on 29th and 30th November 2025. The highest exhibit not already qualified in each affiliated class will qualify.

1. COLOURED PONY AMATEUR OF THE YEAR – Class 39

Open Ridden Piebald/Skewbald, stallion, mare or gelding 4 years and over. Riders any age except for those on stallions who must have attained their 14th birthday by 1st January of the current year. Spurs must not be worn. Ponies under 153cms. This class may be split into Native and Non-Native at the final

2. COLOURED HORSE AMATEUR OF THE YEAR – Class 39

Open Ridden Piebald/Skewbald, stallion, mare or gelding 4 years and over. Riders any age except for those on stallions who must have attained their 14th birthday by 1st January of the current year. Spurs may be worn by adult riders. Animals 153cms and over. This class may be split into Native and Non-Native at the final.

3. MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND SMALL BREEDS RIDDEN AMATEUR OF THE YEAR – Class 41

Open to Mountain and Moorland ponies registered with their respective Pure Bred Societies of Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetland, Welsh A and Welsh B. Stallion, mare or gelding 4 years and over. Riders any age and suitably mounted. Riders any age except for those on stallions who must have attained their 14th birthday by 1st January of the current year. Spurs must not be worn.

4. MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND LARGE BREEDS RIDDEN AMATEUR OF THE YEAR – Class 41

Open to Mountain and Moorland ponies registered with their respective Pure Bred Societies of Fells, Dales, Highlands, New Forests, Connemara, Welsh C and Welsh D. Stallion, mare or gelding 4 years and over. Riders any age except for those on stallions who must have attained their 14th birthday by 1st January of the current year. Spurs must not be worn.

5. LEAD REIN MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND RIDDEN AMATEUR OF THE YEAR Class 12

Open to Mountain and Moorland ponies registered with their Pure Bred Societies of Dartmoor, Exmoor, New Forest, Shetland, Welsh A or B. Mares or geldings 4 years old and over, not exceeding 128cms. Riders must have attained their 3rd birthday but not have attained their 9th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Led by an attendant and shown in a snaffle bridle, the lead rein to be attached to the noseband only.

6. FIRST RIDDEN MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND RIDDEN AMATEUR OF THE YEAR Class 14

Open to Mountain and Moorland ponies registered with their Pure Bred Societies of Dartmoor, Exmoor, New Forest, Shetland, Welsh A or B. Mares or geldings 4 years old and over not exceeding 128cms. Riders not to have attained their 12th birthday before 1st January in the current year. To be shown in any suitable bridle.

7. PLAITED PONY AMATEUR OF THE YEAR Class 38

Open plaited pony, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, not exceeding 148cms. Any suitably mounted rider. Spurs must not be worn.

8. LEAD REIN PLAITED AMATEUR OF THE YEAR Class 12

Lead Rein Pony mare or gelding not exceeding 128cms. Riders to have attained their 3rd birthday but not their 9th birthday before 1st January in the current year. To be led by an attendant and shown in a snaffle bridle. Lead rein to be attached to the noseband only.

9. FIRST RIDDEN PLAITED AMATEUR OF THE YEAR Class 14

First Ridden Pony, mare or gelding not exceeding 128cms. Riders not to have attained their 10th birthday before 1st January in the current year. To be shown in any suitable bridle.

10. RIDDEN RIDING HORSE/HACK AMATEUR OF THE YEAR Class 42

Open to Hacks and Riding Horses. mare or gelding, 4 years old and over. Exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 160cms. Riders must have attained their 15th birthday by the day of the Show. Spurs may be worn by adult riders.

11. RIDDEN COB AMATEUR OF THE YEAR Class 40

Open Ridden Cob, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over. Exceeding 148cms. To be shown hogged and trimmed. Riders must have attained their 15th birthday by the day of the Show. Spurs may be worn by adult riders.

12. RIDDEN HUNTER AMATEUR OF THE YEAR Class 42

Open Ridden Hunter, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over. Exceeding 148cms. Riders must have attained their 15th birthday by the day of the Show. Spurs may be worn by adult riders.

Each qualified horse/pony will receive a qualification card in the ring which will enable the owner to enter the TSR Amateur of the Year Final provided the owner and rider/handler meet the TSR Amateur rules on entry to the Final.

This Show offers qualification for the **TRADITIONAL GYPSY COBS ASSOCIATION (TGCA) NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP.**

TGCA TOYS In Hand and Ridden Classes **Affiliation Number TGCA/00/00/00**

No known breeding required to enter these classes

TGCA Breed classes are qualifiers for the Best of Breed Finals at the Traditional Gypsy Cob Association's (TGCA) National Breed Championship Show "TOYS". Classes are open to all traditional gypsy cobs.

Part Bred classes, are open to all part bred traditional gypsy cobs and are qualifiers for the part bred finals at "TOYS". The exhibit must have one parent that is pure bred traditional gypsy cob.

Stallions – All stallions (pure or part bred, four years and over) in order to enter any TGCA affiliated class **MUST** be TGCA registered, have passed TGCA stallion evaluations and their TGCA stallion disc displayed on their bridle. Stallions and colts over the age of two, **MUST** be shown in a stallion bridle with a metal bit and chain lead as per the current TGCA rulebook.

Current TGCA members must present their Membership card and Qualification card to the judge in the ring for signature. Non-members **MUST** receive a qualification card from the judge and have **21 days to join the TGCA and register their horse to validate the qualification.** Please refer to www.tgca.co.uk for further details including membership, horse registration and showing **rules (contained within the members handbook). Championships**

Quest for a Star Championship - TGC - 1st, 2nd and 3rd from the TGCA classes above may go forward to the Quest for a Star Championship as per below rule.

ONLY current TGCA members and horse/pony that is already TGCA registered can exhibit in this championship. Membership card and Members qualification card (specific to that exhibit) must be presented upon entry into the ring. The Champion and Reserve qualify for the Ultimate Star Championships at TOYS.

Go for Glory Championship - PB -1st, 2nd and 3rd from the TGCA part bred classes may go forward to the Go for Glory Championship. For 2024 TOYS qualifiers, the handler/rider and exhibits (apart from stallions) do not have to be TGCA members/registered on the date of the show. The Champion and Reserve qualify for the Crowning Glory Championships at TOYS.

This Show offers qualification for the **CONCOURS D'ELEGANCE OF GREAT BRITAIN NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP**. First, second and third placed horses/ponies not already qualified in **CH11** will qualify for the Champion of Britain Title classes to be held at Onley Equestrian Centre, Willoughby, Rugby, Warwickshire on Friday 26th and Saturday 27th September 2025.

Each qualified horse/pony will receive a qualification card in the ring which will enable the owner to enter the Championship Show, provided the owner and rider/handler are, or become registered with the Concours d'Elegance Society **within 21 days** of the qualifying show.

This Show offers qualification for the **WELSH NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP**. First and second placed horses/ponies not already qualified in **Classes 58, and 59 and 49** will qualify for The Welsh National Championship Show at Three Counties Showground, Malvern on Sunday 10th August 2025

Classes 58 and 59 are a qualifier for **The National Welsh Championship Show 2025 - National WPBR In-Hand Championships** and **Gelding In-Hand Championship**. All 1st & 2nd placed WPCS registered Welsh Part Bred exhibits in relevant classes (not already qualified) qualify to enter. Unregistered qualifiers with 12.5% Welsh blood may retrospectively register with WPCS prior to entry.

Each qualified horse/pony will receive a qualification card in the ring which will enable the owner to enter the Championship Show, provided the owner and rider/handler are, or become registered with the WPCS **within 21 days** of the qualifying show.

SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Exhibitors in the registered palomino and cream dilute classes must be BPS members or have applied for BPS membership with class entry.
2. Exhibits in the registered palomino and cream dilute classes must be BPS registered or have applied for BPS registration with class entry.
3. Registered exhibits must be exhibited by the BPS registered owner or recorded lessee. Written notice of any such lease must have been lodged with the BPS by the lessor prior to or with the class entry.
4. Correctly secured current British Standard skull caps/riding hats must be worn at all times when mounted on the showground. Handlers aged 12 years or under must wear correctly secured current British Standard skull caps/riding hats when showing in In hand classes.
5. Age of all exhibits will date from January 1st of the year of birth.
6. Exhibitors who are likely to have horses or ponies in more than one ring at the same time should provide additional riders and or handlers.
7. Classes and championships subject to height restrictions - It is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that youngstock are entered in the correct class. Animals may be required to be measured before the start of the class.
 - 7.1 Adult height not to exceed 14.2hh - yearlings should measure no more than 13.3hh; 2 -year-olds no more than 14.0hh; 3-year-olds no more than 14.1hh.
 - 7.2 Adult height not to exceed 13.2hh - yearlings should measure no more than 12.3hh; 2 -year-olds no more than 13.0hh; 3-year-olds no more than 13.1hh.
 - 7.3 Adult height not to exceed 12.2hh - yearlings should measure no more than 11.3hh; 2 -year-olds no more than 12.0hh; 3-year-olds no more than 12.1hh.
8. No mare under 4 years old with foal at foot will be eligible for any class.
9. No foal under one month old to be brought to the showground. Foals must be led at times.
10. Whips – show canes only – max 30" (76 cm) with no attachments - this applies to all classes.
11. Any exhibit deemed to be unsound will be asked to leave the ring.
12. No make-up, false hair or any other falsification of markings will be allowed.
13. Registered Palomino In Hand classes. Plaiting and hogging is allowed, but you will not be eligible for any of the colour awards or colour championships.
14. Registered Palomino Ridden classes. Plaiting is optional. Hogging is allowed.
15. Any class may be cancelled, amalgamated, or split if the number of entries warrant.
The judge may withhold prizes if in their opinion any exhibit does not merit an award.
16. Any competitor using a mobile phone whilst competing in a class will be disqualified
17. The judge's decision is final. Judges have been asked to take behaviour and temperament into account and not to judge exhibits whose behaviour they consider to be a danger to either its handler/rider or other competitors. Such an exhibit will be asked to leave the ring.
18. Protests lodged by any exhibitor and must be made in writing to the secretary with a deposit of £20 within one hour of the award or matter to which exception has been taken. Objections will not be entertained from any person not exhibiting in the same class as the animal to which the objection is raised. If possible, the Show committee will decide the case before the conclusion of the show; otherwise it shall be referred to the Council. The decision of either body is final. When an objection is heard both the objectee and objector shall have notice. The deposit shall be returned if the original complaint is upheld. No committee or council member shall take part in the settlement of a disputed prize for which he is a competitor.
19. No horse/pony to be left unattended when tied outside the horsebox/trailer.
20. ALL entire males aged 2 years and over MUST be bitted and led from the bit. Children 16 years-of age or under will not be permitted to handle entire males (excepting foals).

21. Chifney bits are not allowed in any circumstances. Any animal not sufficiently under control will be asked to leave the showground.
22. If the conduct of any exhibitor is such as shall in the opinion of the committee be injurious to the character or interest of the show or shall an exhibitor cause cruelty or unnecessary suffering to or neglect of an animal then the committee may refuse their entry. The committee shall have the power to refuse entry or suspend membership of any exhibitor conducting themselves in an improper or offensive manner.
23. DOGS – must be kept on a lead and must be under control at all times.
24. Should any animal be found to be suffering from any contagious or infectious disease it shall be removed from the showground and stables immediately at the request of the Veterinary Surgeon
25. The Society and Show Committee shall not be liable for any claim in respect of any damage to any person horse or property of any kind howsoever it may be caused. It is an express condition of entry that each competitor shall hold the committee harmless and that he or she shall indemnify the committee against any legal proceedings actions expenses costs claims demands or damages whatsoever arising from any accident or other incident which may occur.
26. In accordance with recommendations outlined by the British Equestrian Federation it is brought to exhibitors notice that no animal entered in classes at the Shows affiliated to Show and Breed Societies shall receive any drug which might offer an unfair advantage. Full details available on the FEI website.
27. No entry fees will be refunded unless a veterinary certificate is presented
