Any horse which has qualified as a Grade A Show Jumper or Advanced Event Horse as at 1st January in the current year is not eligible to compete in Working Hunter classes. All Riders, Owners and Producers must be Members of the British Show Horse Association, The Showing Register or Sport Horse Breeding GB. Horses must be registered with the British Show Horse Association, The Showing Register or Sport Horse Breeding GB.

Exhibitors are required by DEFRA to carry with them Official Identity Documents for all horses/ponies when competing or travelling. Competitors are reminded that it is a DEFRA requirement that the Official Identity Documents must be in the name of the legal owner within 30 days of ownership. This must be registered with the breed society, relevant studbook or ID issuing agency, dependant on breed/type of animal. Spot checks may be carried out at qualifying shows and by breed societies.

Fences will not exceed 1.14m (3ft 9ins) in height, there should be a minimum of 8 fences and a maximum of 12 fences. The course must contain a combination and should contain a water tray. This class will be judged in two parts. Part One (Jumping) will be judged first, without a jump-off. All clear rounds and any other horses the judges may require will go forward to the next part. A rider can ride up to two horses in the jumping phase but then must select only one horse to take forward into the ride and conformation section if so required (no change of rider is allowed).



APPLE SCONES

(8 to be displayed on a plate for judging)

Ingredients:

8oz/200g plain flour

½ teaspoon salt

2 tsp baking powder

2oz/50g margarine

2oz/50g caster sugar

1 medium-sized cooking apple, peeled, cored & grated

4 tablespoons milk

To glaze:

A little milk

1 tablespoon demerara sugar

Method:

Cooking time: 20-25 minutes. Oven: 200°C/400°F/Gas Mark 6

Sieve together the flour, salt and baking powder. Rub in the margarine. Add the sugar, then the grated apple and add enough milk to give a soft but not sticky dough. Turn the mixture on to a floured surface and knead lightly. Roll out to a 20cm (8in) circle and place on a greased and floured baking sheet. Score the scone into 8 pieces. Brush all over the top with milk and sprinkle with the sugar. Bake in a moderately hot oven for 20-25 minutes or until well risen and golden brown. Display on a plate for judging.

CHEESE TARTLETS

(4 to be displayed on a plate for judging)

Ingredients:

175g plain flour

Pinch of salt

85g butter

2-3 tbsp cold water to mix

2 eggs, beaten

60g grated Cheddar cheese

2 rashers of bacon, chopped into small pieces

150ml milk

Salt & pepper

Method:

Preheat oven 200°C/Gas mark 6. Sieve the flour and salt into the bowl. Add the butter and rub it into the flour. It should look like breadcrumbs. Sprinkle on the water and stir the mixture with a knife to make it come together. Press the pastry into a ball – the bowl should be clean. On a lightly floured surface slightly flatten the pastry with your hand. Then roll out to form a rough circle about 3mm thick. Grease the bun tin. Cut out the pastry circles and place in the tin. Fry the bacon in a frying pan until crisp. Mix together the eggs, cheese, bacon, milk and seasoning. Spoon the mixture into the pastry cases. Bake in the oven for 15 minutes. Remove from the oven. Leave to cool slightly and then place on a wire rack. Display 4 on a plate for judging.

GLUTEN FREE VICTORIA SPONGE

(To be displayed on a plate for judging)

Ingredients:

225g/8oz caster sugar

4 free-range eggs

1 tsp vanilla extract

225g/8oz butter, cubed and well-softened, plus extra for greasing

250g/9oz gluten-free white self-raising flour

1 tsp gluten-free baking powder

125g/4 ½ oz Jam (fruit flavour of your choice)

1 tbsp icing sugar, sifted

Method:

Preheat the oven to 190°C/170°C Fan/Gas Mark 5.

Butter two 20cm/8in loose-based sandwich tins and line the bases with circles of baking paper.

Beat the sugar, eggs and vanilla until very pale, smooth and thick. It's best to do this with electric beaters or a food mixer for around 5 minutes: the whisk should leave a thin trail of batter when lifted from the bowl.

Add the butter, flour and baking powder and beat together for 1-2 minutes more until smooth.

Divide the mixture evenly between the prepared tins and smooth the surface. Bake on the same shelf in the centre of the oven for 20–22 minutes, or until well risen, golden-brown and just beginning to shrink back from the sides of the tin.

Remove the tins from the oven and leave to cool for 15 minutes before turning out on to a wire rack. Peel off the baking paper and leave to cool completely.

Place one of the sponges on a plate or cake stand. Stir the jam to loosen and spoon onto the cake. Spread almost all the way to the edges. Sandwich the cakes together and dust with sifted icing sugar.

VICTORIA SPONGE CAKE

(Makes 1 cake - 20cm in diameter - to be displayed on a plate)

Ingredients:

225g softened butter

225g caster sugar

4 large eggs

225g self-raising flour

2 level teaspoons baking powder

For filling & topping:

4 tablespoons raspberry jam

a little caster sugar

Method:

Preheat the oven to 180°C/Fan 160°C/Gas mark 4. Grease two 20cm sandwich tins, then line the base of each tin with baking parchment.

Measure the butter, sugar, eggs, flour and baking powder into a large bowl and beat until thoroughly blended. Divide the mixture evenly between the tins and level out.

Bake in the pre-heated oven for about 25 minutes or until well risen and the tops of the cakes spring back when lightly pressed with a finger. Leave to cool in the tins for a few minutes and then turn out, peel off the parchment and finish cooling on a wire rack.

When completely cold, sandwich the cakes together with the raspberry jam. Sprinkle with caster sugar to decorate.

Display on a plate for judging.

CRUNCHY TOP LEMON CAKE

(Makes 1 cake - 18cm in diameter - to be displayed on a plate)

Ingredients:

100g/4oz soft margarine

175g/6oz caster sugar

2 extra large eggs

175g/6oz self-raising flour

1 tsp baking powder

4 tsp milk

Finely grated rind of 1 lemon

For the Crunchy top

Juice of 1 lemon

100g/4oz granulated sugar

Method:

Preheat the oven to 180°C/Fan 160°C/Gas mark 4. Grease a 18cm/7" round deep cake tin and line the base with baking paper.

Measure all ingredients for the cake into a bowl and beat well for about 2 minutes until smooth and well blended. Turn the mixture into the prepared tin and level the surface.

Bake in the pre-heated oven for about 35-40 minutes or until the cake has shrunk slightly from the sides of the tin and springs back when lightly pressed with a finger.

Whilst the cake is baking, make the crunchy topping.

Measure the lemon juice and sugar into a bowl and stir until blended. When the cake comes out of the oven, spread the lemon paste over the top whilst the cake is still hot.

Leave in the tin until cold then turn out and remove the paper.

MANGO CAKE

(Makes 1 cake - to be displayed on a plate)

Ingredients:

½ cup milk or milk alternative

½ tbsp apple cider vinegar

1 ½ cup self-raising flour

1 ½ tsp baking powder

½ tsp bicarbonate of soda

1/4 tsp salt

½ tsp cinnamon

34 cup mango pulp

⅓ cup melted butter or oil

½ cup caster sugar

1 tbsp lime juice

Method:

Preheat oven to 200°C / Fan 180°C

Line a 2lb loaf tin with parchment/baking paper. Add the vinegar to the milk and mix, set aside for 10/15mins. This will turn into buttermilk. Sift the flour, baking powder, bicarbonate of soda, salt and cinnamon into a bowl and mix together.

Add the mango, butter, sugar and buttermilk to the flour mix and whisk together until combined.

Transfer the mixture to the prepared tin and place in the oven. Bake for 30/35mins or until golden brown and a skewer comes out clean.

Allow to cool fully.

For the icing:

Sift the icing sugar into a bowl and add the lime juice, mix until smooth. It should be at a pouring/drizzle-able consistency. You can add more juice or icing sugar if needed.

Drizzle over cake as desired.

MEN ONLY - HONEY & ALMOND CAKE

Ingredients:

150g / 5½oz unsalted butter plus extra for greasing

115g / 4oz light muscovado sugar

175g / 6oz clear honey

1 tbsp lemon juice

2 eggs beaten

200g / 7oz self-raising flour

25g / ½oz flaked almonds

Warmed honey, to glaze

Method:

Preheat the oven to 180°C/Fan 160°C/Gas mark 4.

Grease an 8"/20cm deep cake tin and line the base with baking paper.

Place the butter, sugar, honey, and lemon juice in a saucepan and stir over a medium heat, without boiling, until melted and smooth. Remove from the heat and quickly beat in the eggs with a wooden spoon. Sift in the flour and stir lightly.

Pour the mixture into the prepared tin and scatter the flaked almonds over the top.

Bake in the preheated oven for 35/40 minutes until risen, firm and golden brown. Leave the cake to cool in the tin for about 15 minutes, then turn out and cool completely on a wire rack. Brush with the warmed honey over the top of the cooled cake to glaze.

Display on a plate for judging.

LEEK & POTATO PASTRIES

(Makes 8 - 3 to be displayed on a plate for judging)

Ingredients:

1 leek, trimmed and thinly sliced

1 potato, peeled and thinly sliced

½oz (15g) butter

1 tbsp vegetable oil

Salt & pepper

2oz (50g) mature cheddar cheese, grated

12oz (375g) shortcrust pastry (use own recipe)

1 egg, beaten

1 tsp Dijon mustard

2 small sprigs thyme, leaves only

Method:

Preheat the oven to Gas Mark 7 (220°C/200°C fan).

Fry the leeks and potatoes in the butter and oil for three minutes.

Add 3 tablespoons water, cover and cook for five minutes. Season and stir in the cheese, thyme and mustard. Cool slightly. Roll out the pastry to the thickness of a £1 coin. Using a round cutter, cut out 8 x 12cm (5inch) circles.

Spoon an eighth of the leek mixture into the centre of each, fold the pastry around the filling into a pastry chape and crimp the edge between your finger and thumb. Brush with the egg and place on a baking tray.

Bake for 20 minutes until golden.

Display 3 for judging.

COTTAGE LOAF

(Makes 1 loaf - to be displayed on a board for judging)

Ingredients:

450g strong white flour 7g sachet of fast-action yeast

40g butter, melted

1 level teaspoon salt

300ml warm water

To Glaze

1 large egg, beaten

Method:

Measure all the ingredients into a bowl or electric mixer and blend until you have a fairly sticky dough. Knead on a floured work surface, adding a little extra flour if needed until you have a fairly sticky, soft dough.

Transfer to a large, oiled bowl, cover tightly with cling film and leave to rise in a warm place for 1 to $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours or until the dough has doubled in size.

Put the dough onto a floured work surface and knock back until smooth. Cut off a quarter of the dough and shape into a round ball. Shape the remaining dough into a large ball and place on a baking tray lined with parchment. Sit the small ball on top of the large ball.

Flour the handle of a wooden spoon and push the handle through the centre of the 2 balls until you hit the baking tray, then remove the handle carefully.

Slide the baking tray into a large plastic bag so the dough and tray are completely covered. Seal the end of the bag completely and leave to prove in a warm place for 35/45 minutes or doubled in size.

Preheat the oven to 220°C/Fan 200°C/Gas mark 7.

Brush the loaf with beaten egg and slide into the pre-heated oven for about 20/25 minutes until golden brown and the bread sounds hollow when tapped on the base.

Leave to cool on a wire rack.

The loaf to be displayed on a board for judging.

BUCKS COUNTY AGRICULTURAL ASSOCIATION - Conditions & Regulations

General - applicable to all

- Entries shall be sent to the Secretary before the closing dates stated on the schedule. No entry will be accepted
 without the appropriate fee. Exhibitors do not have to become Members of the Association to enter the Show but if
 they do they are entitled to reduced entry fees as specified in the individual classes. This subscription must be paid
 at the time of entry.
- 2. All exhibits must be the bona-fide property of the owner/exhibitor. All owners/exhibitors must abide by the rule of their own breed association or governing body.
- 3. All exhibits must be fully described on the official entry forms. Disputes as to age of animals shall be determined by the veterinary surgeons.
- 4. Receipts will not be sent for entries unless a stamped addressed envelope is included.
- 5. Classes:
- a. All classes are open to non-members.
- b. 'Restricted' are open to members and non-members, but are confined to the County of Bucks and/or 15 miles radius of Aylesbury Parish Church.
- 6. All ages to be calculated to date of Show unless otherwise stated.
- 7. The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry.
- 8. An exhibitor withdrawing an exhibit after the close of entries for any reason shall not be entitled to have entry fees refunded, except under British Showjumping Rule 79(4). All telephoned withdrawals must be confirmed in writing within one week of the date of the Show.
- 9. All objections shall be delivered in writing to the Secretary by 5.00 p.m. on the day of the Show accompanied by a deposit of £100. All such objections and any other objections, disqualifications or disputes shall be decided by the Management Committee, whose decision shall be final. The deposit shall be forfeited in the event of such objection being deemed frivolous by the Committee.
- 10. Any exhibitor being detected in any attempt to impose upon the Association by false certificates or otherwise, or having been expelled from any similar Association for such attempt, shall forfeit all claim to any prize awarded and may be disqualified from competing in future, and, if a Member, he/she shall be excluded from the Association.
- 11. The Association and its Management Committee will not hold themselves responsible for any loss, injury or damage to any person or exhibit at the Show, or loss of or damage to any vehicle or its contents, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Association harmless and indemnify it against legal proceedings arising therefrom. A competent person must be sent in charge of exhibits, and in case of any injury or loss resulting from carelessness or negligence the exhibitor shall make good the loss or damage therefrom.
- 12. The Management Committee reserves the absolute right to cancel any class or classes and intending exhibitors will be warned of such cancellation at least seven days before the Show. If there are less than three entries in any class the class may be cancelled, and if the number of entries does not exceed four, the third prize may be withheld. Judges are instructed to withhold prizes where the entries are of insufficient merit. The Committee reserve the right to amalgamate classes on Show date where there are insufficient animals forward or to cancel a class if no entries are forward. In the Cattle Classes if 12 entries or more are forward in any one class a 5th prize of £5 will be awarded. If 16 entries or more are forward in any one class, a 5th prize of £5 will be awarded.
- 13. All cups and trophies are the property of or in the safe keeping of the BCAA. Cups & trophies will be presented on Show day only and will not be permitted to leave the Showground.
- 14. All prize winners must present their cheques within three months of the Show or they will be deemed to have forfeited their prize money.
- 15. A challenge cup presented by the late Sir Arthur Liberty, to be competed for by Farmers who are Members of the Association, will be awarded to the exhibitor who gains most points in classes for horses, cattle and sheep. The winner to hold the cup for one year. Scale of points: Open classes 1st prize, 5 points; 2nd prize, 3 points, 3rd prize, 2 points; 4th prize 1 point. All other classes 1st, 4 points; 2nd, 3 points; 3rd, 2 points; 4th, 1 point.
- 16. There will be a special Members' Enclosure by the Main Ring.
- 17. Duties of Stewards:
 - a. Stewards must be personally responsible for the preparation of their own section and must be satisfied that everything is in order before the Show opens.
 - b. Any irregularity on Show Day is to be reported immediately to the Secretary.
 - c. If a Steward is of the opinion that an exhibit is not eligible to compete in any particular class he/she should report the matter to the Secretary without delay.
 - d. Stewards are eligible to enter exhibits in any class in respect of which they are acting as Stewards, but no Steward shall be in the ring while his exhibit is being judged unless he/she is leading it, when he/she must remove his Steward's badge.

- 18. The Organisers of this Show have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the Organisers and all the Officials and Stewards and abide by the Association's Health & Safety Policy and Regulations and for ensuring that safe working practices are followed by themselves, their employees, Agents and Contractors.
- 19. All exhibitors should hold third party liability insurance.
- 20. Unaccompanied Competitors must provide the Show Organiser a contact telephone number in case of an emergency
- 21. In the event of an injury or emergency please notify a show steward.
- 22. Should any question arise not provided for in these regulations, it must be referred to the Management Committee whose decision shall be final.
- 23. Mobile phones are strictly forbidden whilst in the showing rings.
- 24. The Committee reserves the right to replace the publicised Judge at short notice without notifying the Exhibitors.
- 25. Exhibitors must comply with the current rules and regulations on Animal Gatherings and Movements in force at the time of the Show according to DEFRA and BCMS requirements.
- 26. Where an Exhibitor cancels an entry, all fees paid will be forfeited. The Society shall not be responsible for any loss or damage, direct or consequential, if the Show in any particular year is cancelled (in whole or in part) or the period of its advertised duration curtailed due to a Force Majeure occurrence and in this instance the Society shall retain all fees. Force Majeure includes but is not limited to acts of God, fire, flood, earthquake, windstorm or other natural disaster, war, confiscation, nationalisation, requisition, destruction, government sanction or embargo, law, judgement, order, strike, riot, terrorism, invasion, interruption or failure of utility service including but not limited to electric, gas, water, telephone, failure of the transportation of any personnel, equipment, machinery or material or any other matter or cause beyond the control of the Society. The Exhibitor should have their own insurance to cover such loss or damage.
- 27. Only electrical appliances which bear a label indicating that the article has passed a portable appliance inspection and test in the twelve months preceding the Show and be in good working order and free from defects may be used at the Show. Inspections will be made at random by the show electrician and any appliance found without a Test Certificate or considered unsafe will be rendered unusable.
- 28. Generators shall be sited on a secure platform away from all flammable materials. Fuel for generators must be stored in suitable sealed containers out of direct sunlight. Quantities of fuel must be kept to a minimum. All installations must comply with relevant legislation and guidance.
- 29. Any gazebo or temporary structure must be of suitable quality and erected in line with the manufacturer's instructions and anchored or ballasted to prevent being blown away. Where it is deemed that a structure is not fit for purpose the exhibitor shall be given the opportunity to rectify the situation in a time frame as appropriate to the show, else will be required dismantle and make safe.
- 30. By entering the competition all exhibitors thereby give The Bucks County Agricultural Association express permission to do the following:
- a. store, process and retain, including electronically, all data and personal information provided by exhibitors, for the
 purpose of running the Show, maintaining appropriate records and communicating with the exhibitor in future
 concerning any of the Association's activities.
- b. publicise the names and home locations of exhibitors in the Show catalogue and on the Show website. Home & Garden exhibitors - Only the name will be printed in the Show catalogue and no details will appear on the Show website.
- c. forward exhibitor information to the press, Breed Societies and other regulatory authorities for the purposes of running the Show (excluding Home & Garden exhibitors).
- 31. Dogs must be kept on a short, fixed lead at all times and shall not be permitted on the showground before the show unless prior authorisation has been given by an official. This shall apply to exhibitor's dogs as well as those belonging to visitors. All banned breeds are not permitted on the showground.
- 32. All animals must be handled and controlled to the satisfaction of the stewards who shall have the power to exclude from the showground any animals deemed to be vicious or unruly.

Livestock

- 33. Livestock exhibitors shall be entirely responsible for the safe handling of their animals and the suitability of any such animals to be in a public space, and any equipment brought onto the showground.
- 34. Exhibitors and stock attendants must be fully aware of their obligations for the safety of the general public and fellow exhibitors and stock attendants at all times whilst on the showground. They must observe orders given and routes identified by stewards or officials when leading stock to and from the Judging Rings.
- 35. Many spectators and members of the public are unlikely to be familiar with the characteristics of animals and unaware of the potential danger which they might be in or which they might create by their own actions. As such, when animals are being handled for preparation etc., the safety of spectators/members of the public close by must be a primary consideration. Exhibitors and stock attendants must take every precaution to protect visitors to the livestock lines from injury.
- 36. In the event of a lose animal, alert the nearest show official immediately.
- 37. In the interests of safety, unauthorised movement of animals during the show shall not be allowed. All cattle must be accustomed to being halter led and at least one competent person must attend each animal during its movement to and from the Show Ring, remaining as far as possible, behind the movement barriers provided.
- 38. All bulls over ten months of age must have rings in their noses and must be led with poles, ropes or chains. Exhibitors are advised to provide two handlers for each bull for the Grand Parade and especially so in the case of senior bulls.
- 39. All exhibitors of bulls are requested to make themselves familiar with AlS35(rev1) Handling and Housing Cattle. This Guidance Note gives the following methods for handling bulls at events:
 - Two people, one using a bull pole attached to the bull's nose ring, and the other using a rope attached to the halter or head chain through the nose ring.
 - Two people both using ropes or chains, one rope or chain attached to a halter, the other either attached directly
 to the nose ring or via the nose ring to the halter;
 - One person using a bull pole attached to the bull's nose ring and a rope or chain attached to a halter or head
 chain through the nose ring with a competent person standing by able to assist in the control of the bull if
 required:
 - One person using a rope or chain attached to a halter with a second rope or chain attached directly to the nose ring or via the nose ring to the halter, with a competent person standing by able to assist if necessary.
 - Any bull over 10 months old being led on the show ground must be accompanied by two handlers at all times.
 Young persons are not allowed to handle bulls.
- 40. Cattle must be halter tied through the rails. Binder twine or string must not be used to tie cattle.
- 41. All cattle and sheep must remain on the showground until after the Grand Parade or such time as may be determined by the Chief Steward of those sections. Any exhibit required for a parade or championship and who fails to do so is liable to forfeit its prizes. Permission to be excused may be given by the Secretary or a Chief Steward in exceptional circumstances.
- 42. The use of any substance containing toxic chemicals, including sheep dips is strictly forbidden whilst on the showground.
- 43. Wherever there is likelihood of public contact with animals, hand washing and/or disinfection facilities shall be provided.
- 44. It is the policy of the Association that stewards and the Show Vet shall have the power to refuse the entry of any animal which they consider might get out of control or to ask for any animal to be removed from the show ring or the showground.
- 45. Bio-security measures must be followed at all times.

Equine

- 46. Exhibitors of horses shall be expected to familiarise themselves with any rule or guidance notes issued by the appropriate authority or society which control the particular activity and they must comply with these standards. This shall form part of the show regulations.
- 47. Equine exhibitors are reminded that many spectators/members of the public are unlikely to always be familiar with the characteristics of horses and likely unaware of the potential danger which they might be in or which they might create by their own actions. As such, the safety of spectators/members of the public close by must be a primary consideration.
- 48. Horses must not be ridden, exercised or schooled in the car parks, trade stand avenues or other areas to which the general public has access but only in the area designated. No one is allowed in the collecting ring who is not a rider or bona-fide groom or designated show official.
- 49. In the event of a loose horse, alert the nearest show official immediately.
- 50. In all Show classes substitutions are not allowed and no alterations to entries will be permitted after the closing date of entries except under British Showjumping Rule 79(3).
- 51. Horse Passports (England) Regulation 2004 requires all owners to obtain a Defra acceptable passport for each animal that they own. Please remember to bring these passport(s) to the Show and have them available for inspection if requested by Local Trading Standard Officers.
- 52. The Association requires the wearing of a skull cap/riding hat at all times when mounted whilst on the Showground. All headgear should be manufactured to the relevant current BSI or European Safety Standard or that approved by the governing body of the respective horse or pony society. All skull caps/riding hats should have a three point harness. The Bucks County Agricultural Association recommends the wearing of protective headgear whilst leading any horse or pony. All exhibitors must wear their back exhibitor number whilst mounted.
- 53. No horse or pony will be measured on the Ground. All exhibits come under the Joint Measurement Scheme and should have their current certificates. Should there be any objections; prize money will be withheld until the animal has been measured by officials of the Joint Measurement Scheme, whose ruling shall be final.
- 54. Horses must have been vaccinated to comply with the requirements of the primary course (1st vaccination and then 2nd vaccination), followed by the booster within a 12 month period and all subsequent boosters. Foals should be vaccinated for Equine Influenza at 6 months to commence their primary course. We urge all owners to adhere to strict biosecurity protocols at all times. Veterinary officers may check certificates and an incorrect certificate will mean disqualification. Exhibitors who cannot produce a certificate will be required to do so within seven days of the Show otherwise prize money will be forfeited.
- 55. Any rider falling from a horse or pony shall not be allowed to remount and shall be required to be checked over by the onsite medical team before continuing. The Association upon the advice of the medical team shall reserve the right to withdraw any competitor from further competition. No Judge or Steward has the authority to waive this rule.
- 56. No person may lead more than one horse or pony at any one time on the Showground. All people leading animals must be fully competent to do so.
- 57. Only one groom is allowed in any of the Collecting Rings per animal being exhibited.
