RULES

1. The judges may withhold any award should they consider it not warranted.
2. A Third Prize will only be awarded in classes with four or more entries.
3. **Every entry must be the unaided work of the Exhibitor, having been completed within the last two years and NOT previously exhibited at Burwarton Show. Please declare that craft items are own design.**
4. In the Children's Section **please state age of child on each exhibit. Exhibits should be the unaided work of the entrant. NB Child name should not be visible.**
5. Exhibitors may enter only one article in each class.
6. Exhibits must not display names of individuals or WIs.
7. Wine and liqueur must be exhibited in clear glass bottles with a flanged cork or plastic stopper. Date on label.
8. Exhibits may be staged during the following times:
Wednesday 6 August 5.30pm - 8.00pm
Thursday 7 August 7.30am – 8.00am (WI Co-operative classes)
 7.30am – 8.30am (all other classes)
9. Judging of the WI classes will commence at 8.00am prompt. Judging of all other classes will commence at 8.30am prompt
10. Exhibits may be withdrawn from 5.30pm onwards. No responsibility can be taken for items not removed by 6.00pm. The Society will not be held responsible for loss or damage to any items exhibited or left in the Marquee.
11. **Cups will be presented at 5.00pm in the marquee.**
12. **Prize money should be collected in the marquee 5.30pm - 6.00pm.** Any prize money not collected on Show Day will be available for collection from the Show Office before the end of August. Uncollected prize money after this date will be treated as a donation to the Society. These competitions will be run under the General Rules for Burwarton Show, as printed in the Agricultural Schedule. Entries for classes 1 - 42 close on Tuesday 22 July 2025. Horticultural class entries close on Thursday 31 July 2025.

Anzac biscuit recipe

Ingredients	Method
60g butter 1 tablespoon golden syrup 45g porridge oats 40g desiccated coconut 75g plain flour 60g caster sugar 25g brown sugar ½ teaspoon bicarbonate of soda 1 tablespoon water	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Place butter and golden syrup in a bowl and microwave and heat until melted (approximately 60-90 seconds). Leave to cool for about 15 minutes.• Put oats, coconut, flour, caster sugar and brown sugar in a bowl together.• Mix bicarbonate of soda in small dish with 1 tablespoon of water.• When butter is cool, add the bicarb mix, and then stir into the dry ingredients.• Place scoops of mixture onto a baking tray, leaving at least 2cm between them.• Bake in oven at 180° (160° fan) for 8-10 minutes until golden.• Leave on tray to cool for 5 minutes before transferring to wire rack to cool completely.

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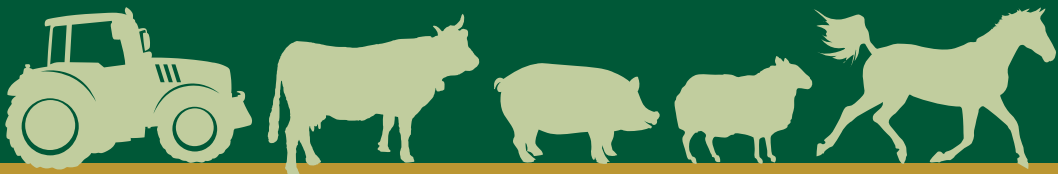
