Rules & Regulations

- No horse or pony may be exercised other than in a collecting ring or the designated exercise
 area.
- No horse or pony should be left unattended other than when securely contained within a horse vehicle.
- All children 16 years and under and any rider jumping must wear safety hats which conform
 to the current regulations. Such headgear must be worn with the chin strap securely and
 correctly fastened at all times. It is recommended that they be worn by everyone when riding
 or handling horses and ponies at the show.
- No Exhibitor or their groom may ride one horse or pony and lead another or if on foot lead more than one horse or pony. The bringing of companion horses/ponies is strongly discouraged but if such animals are present their behaviour and all matters relating to safety are the sole responsibility of the exhibitor bringing such animals to the show.
- All stallions at the show must be handled and ridden by someone 16 years and over and exhibitors must take adequate precautions to ensure the safety of other people and animals.
- All horses and ponies that are ridden at the show must be 4 years and old and over.

Equine Influenza

- Equine Influenza vaccinations are recommended for all equines (horses and ponies) attending the Cornwall Equestrian Show.
- All horses and ponies are required to have the first two primary vaccinations prior to being shown and if sufficient time has elapsed the third vaccination (first booster) must have been received, with the annual booster then being received on a yearly basis. No horse or pony can be shown within seven days of receiving any vaccination, the seven days includes the day of competition. Foals should commence vaccinations at 6 months old.

Entry & General Information

- The decision to ride horses or ponies in any ridden class is solely at the discretion of the judge.
- There will be no prize money awarded at this show, quality rosettes will be awarded for 1st to 4th place, with Championship sashes.
- There will be no national qualifying classes within this show.
- All entry fees include first aid cover, provided by FLEET (Front Line Emergency Equipment Trust)
- Please note there will be no farrier on site however, there will be a vet on call during the day from Kernow Farm & Equine, 01208 76403.
- There will be no stabling available at this show.
- Well behaved dogs are allowed, but must be kept on a lead at all times.
- All entries are being taken online through Showing Scene, there will be no on the day entries.
- Entry fee for all classes is £10 per class, except class 30, the Tiny Tots Stakes which has an entry fee of £5 and classes 1a and 4a, where there is no entry fee.
- Showing numbers to be collected on arrival.

In Hand Horse Classes

For hunter, riding horse, hack or sports horse youngstock. To exceed 153cms (15.0 hh) at maturity.

Judging to commence at 9am in Ring A – The Showing Scene Show Ring

- 1. Brood Mare, exceeding 153cms (15.0 hh) with own foal at foot.
- **1a. Foal,** progeny of a mare in class 1.
- 2. Yearling, colt, gelding or filly foaled in 2020.
- 3. Two or Three Year Old, colt, gelding or filly foaled in 2019 or 2018.

In Hand Pony Classes

For all pony youngstock not to exceed 153cms (15.0 hh) at maturity.

Judging to follow the In Hand Horse classes in Ring A – The Showing Scene Show Ring

- **4. Pony Brood Mare**, not exceeding 153cms (15.0 hh) with own foal at foot.
- 4a. Foal, progeny of a mare in class 4.
- 5. Yearling, colt, gelding or filly foaled in 2020.
- **6. Two or Three Year Old**, colt, gelding or filly foaled in 2019 or 2018.

The Penbode Equine Vets In Hand Horse & Pony Championship – for the winners of classes 1 to 6.

Mountain & Moorland Classes

These classes are open to ponies fully registered with one of the Native Pony Breed Societies.

Small Breeds - Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetland, Welsh A and B

Large Breeds – Connemara, Dales, Fell, Highland, New Forest, Welsh C and D

Judging to follow the In Hand Horse & Pony Championship in Ring A – The Showing Scene Show Ring

- 7. In Hand Small Breeds, any age.
- 8. In Hand Large Breeds, any age.
- **9. 'The Dumpy Bag Man' Lead Rein**, open to mares or geldings. Rider 8 years old and under. Snaffle bridles must be worn with the lead rein attached to the noseband.
- **10. First Ridden**, open to mares or geldings. Rider 12 years old and under. No lead reins. Competitors will not be asked to canter as a group but may canter during their individual show.
- 11. Ridden Small Breeds, open to stallions, mares or geldings. Rider any age. No lead rein.
- 12. Ridden Large Breeds, open to stallions, mares or geldings. Rider any age.

The Showing Scene Mountain & Moorland Championship – for the winners of classes 7 to 12. The champion will receive £50 prize money and a jacket generously provided by Showing Scene.

Coloured Horse & Pony Classes

Judging will not commence before 12.30pm in Ring A – The Showing Scene Show Ring

- **13.** In Hand Pony, open to stallions, mares or geldings, any type or colour, not exceeding 153cms (15.0 hh).
- **14.** In Hand Horse, open to stallions, mares or geldings, any type or colour, exceeding 153cms (15.0 hh).
- **15. Ridden Pony**, open to stallions, mares or geldings, any type or colour, not exceeding 153cms (15.0 hh).
- **16. Ridden Horse**, open to stallions, mares or geldings, any type or colour, exceeding 153cms (15.0 hh).

Coloured Championship – for the winners of classes 13 to 16.

Best Combination of Pony & Rider Classes

Classes will be judged on manners, conformation and way of going of the pony and ability of the rider. Spurs may be worn in class 22 only. A rosette to be given to the best rider in each class.

- **17.** 'The Savills' Best Combination Lead Rein, open to mares or geldings. Rider 8 years old and under. Snaffle bridles must be worn with the lead rein attached to the noseband.
- **18.** 'The Savills' Best Combination First Ridden, open to mares or geldings. Rider 10 years old and under. No lead reins. Competitors will not be asked to canter as a group but may canter during their individual show.

The Savills Mini Championship – for the winners of classes 17 & 18.

- 19. Best Combination, rider 12 years old and under, open to mares or geldings.
- **20.** Best Combination, rider 14 years old and under, open to mares or geldings.
- 21. Best Combination, rider 16 years old and under, open to mares or geldings.
- **22.** Best Combination Open, open to stallions, mares or geldings.

The Wynnstay Best Combination Championship – for the winners of classes 19 to 22.

Ridden Horse Classes

Judging to follow the Best Combination Championship and commence not before 11am in Ring B - The Penbode Equine Vets Show Ring

- **23. Small Hunter**, open to mares or geldings, exceeding 148cms (14.2 hh) but not exceeding 158cms (15.2 hh).
- **24.** 'The Barnwell Equestrian Centre' Open Ridden Hunter, open to mares or geldings, exceeding 158cms (15.2 hh).
- **25.** 'The Dumpy Bag Man' Open Riding Horse, open to mares or geldings, exceeding 148cms (14.2 hh).
- **26. Open Hack**, open to mares or geldings.

Classes 25 and 26 may be amalgamated if insufficient entries.

- 27. 'The Masters Family' Ridden Cobs, open to cobs and maxi cobs, mares or geldings, any height.
- **28. Retraining of Racehorses**, open to all former racehorses, mares or geldings. Rider 15 years or over.

- **30. Tiny Tots Stakes**, open to mares or geldings, not exceeding 122cms (12.0 hh). Rider 8 years old and under. **To be led**.
- **31.** Cradle Stakes, open to mares or geldings, not exceeding 122cms (12.0 hh). Rider 10 years old and under. Fences approx. 40cms.
- **32. Nursery Stakes**, open to mares or geldings, not exceeding 133cms. Rider 12 years old and under. Fences approx. 60cms.
- **33. Working Hunter Pony**, open to mares or geldings, not exceeding 133cms (13.0 hh). Rider 14 years old and under. Fences approx. 70cms.
- **34.** Working Hunter Pony, open to mares or geldings, exceeding 133cms (13.0 hh) and not exceeding 143cms (14.0 hh). Rider 17 years old and under. Fences approx. 80cms.
- **35. Working Hunter Pony**, open to mares or geldings, exceeding 143cms (14.0 hh) and not exceeding 153cms (15.0 hh). Rider 20 years old and under. Fences approx. 90cms.

- **37. Working Show Horse**, open to Hacks, Cobs, Maxi Cobs and Riding Horses, mares or geldings, exceeding 148cms (14.2 hh). Fences approx. 80cms.
- **38. Open Working Hunter**, open to mares or geldings, exceeding 148cms (14.2 hh). Fences approx. 1m.

The Penmellyn Equine Vets Working Championship – for the winners of classes 36 to 38.

Supreme Championship

The champions from the eight championships are eligible to come forward to compete for the Cornwall Equestrian Show Supreme Champion. Judging will follow the completion of all classes and individual championships.

The Cornwall Equestrian Show 'PKF Francis Clark' Supreme Champion will receive £50 and a champion rosette and sash, the Reserve Supreme Champion will receive £25 and a reserve champion rosette.
