#### **Apple Cake Recipe**

### **Ingredients**

275g (2 Medium) eating Apples, peeled, cored and diced

125ml Apple Juice or Cider

175g Muscavado Sugar

70g Soft Butter

1/2 Teaspoon Mixed Spice

2 Eggs

200g Self Raising Flour

1 Eating Apple, peeled, quartered and sliced thinly

Pre-heat the oven to gas mark 3, 325F (170C) An 8 inch (18-20cm) Round tin greased and lined

#### Method

- 1. Cook the diced apple with the apple juice or cider until soft and the liquid has evaporated.
- 2. Place sugar, butter and spice in a bowl and beat well until pale.
- 3. Gradually beat in the eggs.
- 4. Fold in the flour.
- 5. Stir in the cooked apple.
- 6. Place in prepared tin and arrange the apple slices around the edge overlapping slightly.
- 7. Bake for approximately 1 hour.
- 8. Cool and turn out.


## **RULES AND REGULATIONS**

- 1. Entries are to be made on the application form and must be received no later than 1st May 2025.
- 2. Entry is £1.50 No prize money will be awarded, however 1<sup>st</sup> to 4<sup>th</sup> place prize cards will be awarded in each class and a Champion rosette for the winner of the baking classes and a Champion rosette to the winner of the Preserve classes. Home Cooking Competition entrants are not entitled to free admission tickets on any of the Show days.
- 3. Competition will be staged in the Crafts & Flowers Pavilion. Exhibits must be delivered on Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> May between 9.00am and 2.00pm. Judging will take place from 3.00pm on Wednesday 14th May. Vehicles can be parked in the Yellow Car Park and access to the Showground will be on foot through the Yellow Entrance (the Feature is just inside the Entrance).
- 4. All exhibits must remain on display for the three days of the Show and must be collected between 4.30pm and 6.00pm on Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> May 2024. Any exhibit left after 7.00pm on the last evening will be disposed of.
- 5. All exhibits must have been made by the exhibitor.
- 6. Badly deteriorated food will be discarded at the discretion of the competition Stewards.
- 7. The Judges decision will be final.
- 8. The Devon County Agricultural Association (DCAA) organiser of the Devon County Show operates to a high Health and Safety standard. All Show personnel are expected to meet that standard and comply with the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974.
- 9. Neither the DCAA (Devon County Show), nor any of its Officers or Servants shall be in any way responsible or accountable for anything that may happen from any cause or circumstance whatever to Exhibitors or their Servants, or to any article exhibited or property brought into the Showground; or otherwise for anything else in connection with, or arising out of or attributable to, the Show, or these or any other condition or regulation prescribed by the DCAA (Devon County Show) in relation thereto; each Exhibitor shall be solely responsible for any consequential or other loss, injury, or damage done to, or occasioned by, or arising from, any article exhibited by him, and shall indemnify the DCAA (Devon County Show) against all legal and other proceedings in regard hereto.
- 10. All Exhibitors and other persons admitted to the Showground shall be subject to rules, the orders, regulations (including Health and Safety) of the DCAA (Devon County Show) and the Council of the Devon County Agricultural Association (DCAA).
- 11. Force majeure
  - If an event defined hereafter as Force Majeure occurs the DCAA (Devon County Show) will not be responsible for the financial consequences or any losses or any actions claims or demands caused to or made by an exhibitor or their servants or agents caused by the failure of the DCAA (Devon County Show) to be held on one or more of the days but for the event of Force Majeure on which it would otherwise to be held. Force Majeure means for the purposes of this clause exceptionally inclement weather; flooding of the whole or any part of the Devon County Showground or the whole or any part of the car parks associated with it; an act of God including but not limited to fire, flood, earthquake, windstorm or other natural disaster; act of any sovereign including but not limited to war, invasion, act of foreign enemies, hostilities (whether war be declared or not), civil war, rebellion, revolution, insurrection, military or usurped power or confiscation, nationalisation, requisition, destruction or damage to property by or under the order of any government or public or local authority or imposition of government sanction embargo or similar action; law, judgment, order, decree, embargo, blockade, labour dispute including but not limited to strike, lockout or boycott; interruption or failure of utility service including but not limited to electric power, gas, water or telephone service; failure of the transportation of any personnel equipment, machinery supply or material required by DCAA to run the Devon County Show; breach of contract by any essential personnel; any other matter or cause beyond the control of DCAA (Devon County Show).
- 12. Photographs and/or film footage will be taken at this event. These images may be used by the Devon County Agricultural Society, its subsidiaries (including but not limited to Devon County Show) and show sponsors in the following ways:
  - Printed publicity
  - Online publicity (including but not limited to Facebook, Instagram & Twitter)
  - Website use (DCAA, its subsidiaries or sponsors)
  - Any other fair use in marketing and promoting the Devon County show by ourselves and our sponsors

They will be stored securely and will not be kept for longer than they are needed for the purposes listed above.
