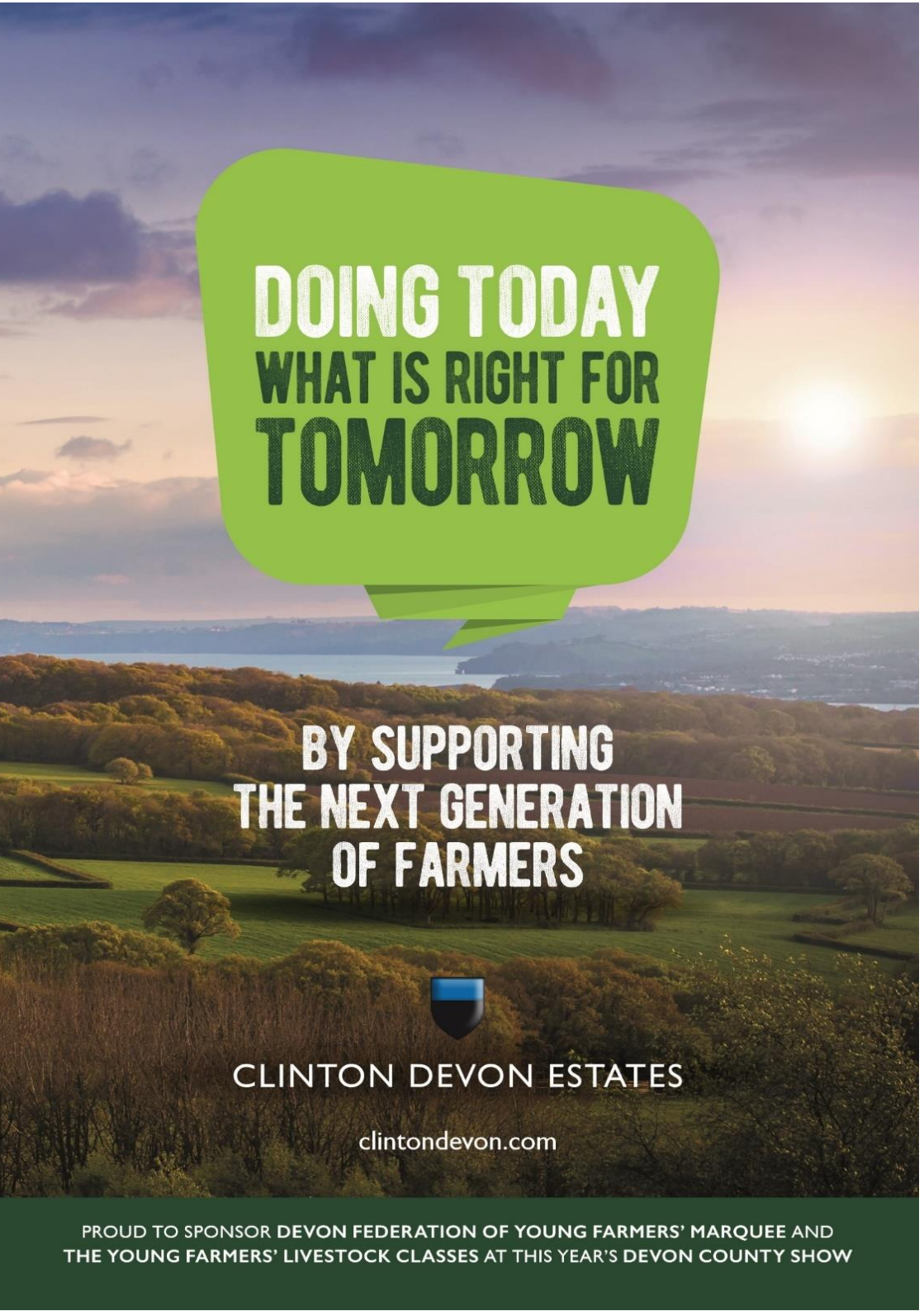

*The entry must be staged by 7.00 pm on Tuesday 13th May and must not be removed before 6.00 pm on Saturday 17th May. **Class 1 – Club Collective Exhibit must have someone of membership age present whilst setting the display.***

1 Club Collective Exhibit.

Prizes: 1st £75; 2nd £50; 3rd £25; 4th £15

Clubs to provide and stage a **1 metre cubed** cubicle to the theme of **‘Animals’**. **TO**

NOTE - each Club will be allocated a specific title of their cubicle.

Contents of the exhibit: To be made up of **five** individual craft items, **one** from **each** category.

- Craft 1 - Floral Art. Any item using cut flowers and accessories in a suitable container. Exhibits to be composed of natural plant material, with or without accessories
- Craft 2 – Cookery/Baking. This craft will be tasted so must be covered with cling film.
- Craft 3 – Textile Handicraft. Knitwear, tailored or crochet for example.
- Craft 4 – Natural Handicraft. Any item using wood, metal, clay, glass, stone or shell for example.
- Craft 5 – Art. An item that could include photography, a graphic or a picture in any medium.

Marks:	5 Individual Craft Items x 50 points each	250
	Attractiveness of Exhibit	50

The five crafts included in the exhibit must be clearly numbered 1 to 5 together with the heading the craft comes under. The items are marked separately and the member who made the highest placed item in each of the categories will receive a trophy for Best Individual Item. These items must have been made/produced by YFC members since the 2024 Show. Any other items/materials may be used in the display to interpret the theme.

A separate form must be completed by competitors, listing the items for judging, together with the names of the members responsible for making/producing those items. Both the form and the numbered stickers for the individual items will be available on arrival to the YFC Marquee.

Tables on which to place the cubes will be supplied, but not the cubes themselves, and an electric socket can be provided and animation will be taken into account in the overall judging.

Cubicles may be partially set up, at the Club's own risk, on Monday 12th May, between 2pm and 7pm and must be completed on **Tuesday 13th May** **between 12pm and 7pm.** Please note that **cubes must not exceed 1 metre measured externally** in any direction, including any drawing pins, other decoration or part of the structure. Cubes that are oversized will be disqualified immediately and no part of the cube or its contents will be judged. Clubs must have their cubes signed off by the Cubicle Steward (to check size and that individual items are numbered) before leaving the marquee.

It is hoped that all Clubs will try to enter this competition and make every effort to stage their exhibit, complying with the above specifications. If a Club Collective Exhibit is not staged the Club will be fined £25.

Please Note: Exhibits are to be removed on Saturday 17th May between 6pm and 8.30pm after the presentation of trophies.

2. Club Promotion Board

Clubs to decorate a 1m x 1m board to promote their Club's activities covering the period September 2024 to May 2025. To be ready for judging by 7pm on Tuesday 13th May.

3. Club Scrapbook

Clubs to prepare and present one scrapbook of their Club's activities and events covering the period September 2024 to April 2025. To be handed into County Office by **Thursday 24th April 2025** (date of Members' Meeting) for judging.

4. Animal Sculpture

A sculpture to depict an animal to be made from re-cycled materials. Sculpture to be displayed outside the marquee. Power permitted e.g. batteries (no generators). To be ready for judging at 7pm on Tuesday 13th May.

5. TikTok or Instagram Reel entitled 'Club Life'

Video to be no longer than 60 seconds. A link to the published video or the video itself will need to be submitted by **Thursday 24th April 2024** to scarlett@devonyfc.co.uk.

Men's & Ladies Tug of War (catch weight)

6. Butter Making

Competitors to provide their own bowl, wooden spoon, spatula and whisk. Cream and other utensils will be provided.

Competitors to make a Junket from one pint of milk in individual containers (supplied). Competitors to supply their own nutmeg, grater, dessert spoon, sugar and milk. Other utensils and rennet will be provided. Time allowed 30 minutes, to include preparation and washing up of utensils.

Travel Reports

Ingredients:

- 2 Eggs (at room temperature)
- 85g Caster Sugar (plus extra for finishing)
- 85g Self-raising Flour
- 4 tbsp Strawberry Jam

Instructions:

1. Pre-heat your oven to 200°C (180°C for fan assisted ovens or Gas Mark 6). Generously grease a 30cm x 22cm Swiss Roll Tray and line the bottom with greaseproof paper. Set aside.
2. In a large bowl, gently whisk the eggs until the whites and yolks are combined, before adding the caster sugar. Whisk the eggs and sugar until you have a pale and thick mixture. This is much easier when using an electric hand whisk but can also be done by hand.
3. Sift the flour into the mixture and gently fold together to create a light batter, being careful not to over mix. Pour the batter into your prepared tin and evenly spread to the sides and corners.
4. Bake in your pre-heated oven for 7-8 minutes until a light golden colour and dry in appearance.
Whilst the sponge bakes, place an additional piece of greaseproof paper on a flat surface and dust with a little caster sugar. Warm the jam, either in the microwave or over a bain marie - this isn't essential but it will make your jam easier to spread.
5. Take the sponge from the oven, run a knife around the edges of the cake to loosen it from the tray and gently tip it from its tray onto the sugared greaseproof paper. Trim the edges of the sponge and remove the baked-on greaseproof paper.
6. Spread the jam on the sponge, right to sides but leaving a little gap at the shorter ends. Gently fold one about 1cm of one of the shorter ends over (gently press with a knife to mark first, if required); this is the start of your rolling.
7. Using the greaseproof paper, continue to roll the sponge over itself, using gentle pressure to make sure there is no big gaps. Finish by ensuring the end is on the underside of the Swiss Roll; the weight of the rest will stop it from unravelling.
8. Dust with a little more sugar if desired and allow to cool completely before cutting.

During judging the member will be asked some questions about the breeding, rearing and training of the animal from birth. The animal must be shown by the member that has reared the animal. Any animal must remain registered on the same holding between the close of entries date and the 2025 Show.

Exhibits must comply with Cattle TB regulations and Goats will need correct CAE requirements.

YFC Beef and Dairy Classes to be exhibited by a member of a Young Farmers' Club. Any animal entered must remain registered on the same holding between close of entries date and the 2025 show.

58. Beef Cattle Steer or Heifer of any Beef Breed or cross-bred born on or after 1st January 2025

59. Beef Cattle Steer or heifer of any Beef Breed or cross-bred born on or before 31st December 2024

60. Dairy Heifer from any recognised Dairy or Dual Purpose Breed in milk having calved. Under 36 months old on the day of the show

Regulations Applicable to all Classes

1. All entries must be made online and accompanied by the appropriate entry fees if applicable. One entry form per competitor.
2. Every exhibitor and competitor will be held responsible for the correctness of their entry form.
3. Unless otherwise stated, all classes will be OPEN to competitors who are 28 years of age and under as at 1st September 2024.
4. The closing date for entries is **Monday 21st April for entries online at www.devoncountyshow.co.uk and Monday 28th April for Livestock entries (Classes 57-66).**
5. No exhibits may bear any identification as to origin.
6. All exhibits to be the Bona Fide work of the exhibitors.
7. Exhibits not complying with the conditions laid down will be disqualified.
8. Substitution will not be allowed.
9. Exhibitors will be restricted to **one** entry per class.
10. **Where TEN or more classes are entered and staged by a member an entrance ticket valid for one day's admission to the Show will be given, unless already allowed for as a competitor. Tickets to be collected by the competitor on Tuesday 13th May once all their entries in classes are staged. Stockjudging entries can count towards the ten classes.**
11. The Judges are instructed to withhold prizes where the entry is not of sufficient merit and in awarding prizes; they are further instructed to make their awards according to the relevant merits of the exhibit.
12. The Judge's decision will be final.
13. Exhibits in classes 1, 2, 4, 10-48, 50-56 must be staged between 12noon and 7.00 pm on **Tuesday 13th May.**
14. For any exhibits in classes 1 – 5, 8 – 48, 50 – 56 that are not staged there will be one point deducted from the competitor/Club
15. **Trophies** will be presented at 5.30pm on Saturday 17th May in the YFC marquee.
16. **Prize Money** will be forwarded to clubs for distribution to individuals after the show.
17. **Collection of Exhibits.** Entries **must not** be removed before **6.00 pm** on Saturday 17th May. **Any items not claimed by 8.30 pm will be disposed of** unless prior arrangements with Devon YFC show team have been made.
18. Whilst every care will be taken of the exhibits, neither the Association nor the Devon YFC will be liable for compensation for loss or damage from any cause whatsoever.
19. All exhibits in static classes must not have been shown at any previous Devon County Show and to have been made/produced since the 2024 Show.
20. **TB PRE MOVEMENT TESTING**
ALL cattle coming to the Show must have had a pre movement test with a negative result within 60 days of the commencement of the Show. This requirement will NOT apply to calves under 42 days of age on the day of arrival at the Show.
