## Club and Group Entries

*The entry must be staged by 7.00 pm on Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> May and must not be removed before 6.00 pm on Saturday 23<sup>rd</sup> May. **Class 1 – Club Collective Exhibit must have someone of membership age present whilst setting the display.***

### 1 Club Collective Exhibit.

This is a National Qualifier; for the full set of rules please see the NFYFC website (under competitions) or contact the Devon YFC Office.

**Prizes: 1<sup>st</sup> £75; 2<sup>nd</sup> £50; 3<sup>rd</sup> £25; 4<sup>th</sup> £15**

Clubs to provide and stage a **1 metre cubed** cubicle to the theme of ‘**Our Favourite Place**’. **TO NOTE** - each Club will need to email their title of their cubicle to [dcsecretary@devonyfc.co.uk](mailto:dcsecretary@devonyfc.co.uk) to approve their theme prior to starting construction as we will be limiting the amount of the same themes.

**Contents of the exhibit:** To be made up of **five** individual craft items, **one** from **each** category.

- Craft 1 - Floral Art. Any item using cut flowers and accessories in a suitable container. Competitors may use floral foam.
- Craft 2 – Cookery/Baking. This craft will be tasted so must be covered with cling film.
- Craft 3 – Textile Handicraft must include British Wool. Knitwear, tailored or crochet for example.
- Craft 4 – Natural Handicraft. Any item using wood, metal, clay, glass, stone or shell for example.
- Craft 5 – Art. An item that could include photography, a graphic or a picture in any medium.

The five crafts included in the exhibit must be clearly numbered 1 to 5 together with the heading the craft comes under. The items are marked separately and the member who made the highest placed item in each of the categories will receive a trophy for Best Individual Item. These items must have been made/produced by YFC members since the 2025 Show. Any other items/materials may be used in the display to interpret the theme.

A separate form will be sent with your tickets and must be completed by competitors, listing the items for judging, together with the names of the members responsible for making/producing those items. This is to be handed in on Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> May. The numbered stickers for the individual items will be sent in advance.

Tables on which to place the cubes will be supplied, but not the cubes themselves, and an electric socket can be provided and animation will be taken into account in the overall judging.

Cubicles may be partially set up, at the Club's own risk, on Monday 18<sup>th</sup> May, between 2pm and 7pm and must be completed on **Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> May** **between 12pm and 7pm**. Please note that **cubes must not exceed 1 metre measured externally** in any direction, including any drawing pins, other decoration or part of the structure. Cubes that are oversized will be disqualified immediately and no part of the cube or its contents will be judged. Clubs must have their cubes signed off by the Cubicle Steward (to check re size and that individual items are numbered) before leaving the marquee.

It is hoped that all Clubs will try to enter this competition and make every effort to stage their exhibit, complying with the above specifications. If a Club Collective Exhibit is not staged the Club will be fined £25.

**Please Note:** Exhibits are to be removed on Saturday 23<sup>rd</sup> May between 6pm and 8.30pm after the presentation of trophies.

## 2. Club Promotion Board

Clubs to decorate a 1m x 1m board to promote their Club's activities covering the period September 2025 to May 2026. To be ready for judging by 7pm on Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> May.

## 3. Club Scrapbook

Clubs to prepare and present one scrapbook of their Club's activities and events covering the period September 2025 to April 2026. To be handed into County Office by **Thursday 23<sup>rd</sup> April 2026** (date of Members' Meeting) for judging.

## 4. Pallet Art

Focus on the artistic side of pallet wood. Members could create sculptures, items or art including painting pallets. Additional recycled materials are also permitted to be used in the item. Item to be displayed outside the marquee. Power permitted e.g. batteries (no generators). To be ready for judging at 7pm on Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> May.

## Travel Reports

Competitors will be required to submit a report on their scholarship which may take the form of a video or written report and may include as well as text, photographs, illustrations, mementos etc. **Reports to be handed into County Office by Thursday 23<sup>rd</sup> April 2026** (date of Members' Meeting) **for judging**. Reports from members who have been on County Scholarships in 2025 will be entered automatically.

**Ingredients:**

- 225g/8oz plain flour
- 20g/¾oz cocoa powder
- 1 tsp bicarbonate of soda
- ½ tsp baking powder
- pinch salt
- 175ml/6fl oz buttermilk, at room temperature
- ½ tsp red food colouring paste
- 150g/5½oz unsalted butter, softened
- 225g/8oz caster sugar
- 3 free-range eggs
- 1 tsp vanilla extract

**For the frosting:**

- 300g/10½oz full-fat cream cheese



- 75g/2½oz unsalted **butter**, softened
- 3 tbsp clear honey or **maple syrup**
- 1 tsp vanilla extract or **vanilla bean paste**

## Method

1. Preheat the oven to 180C/160C Fan/Gas 4. Grease two 20cm/8in cake tins and line the bases with baking paper.
2. Sift together the flour, cocoa, bicarbonate of soda, baking powder and salt. In a jug, whisk together the buttermilk and food colouring.
3. Cream the butter and caster sugar together in a stand mixer until really pale and light, this will take at least 2–3 minutes.
4. Lightly beat the eggs and vanilla together. Gradually add the eggs to the creamed mixture, mixing well between each addition and scraping down the bowl from time to time with a rubber spatula.
5. Add the dry ingredients to the bowl in batches, alternating with the red buttermilk, mixing until well combined. Divide between the prepared tins and bake for 20–25 minutes or until a wooden skewer inserted into the middle comes out clean.
6. Leave the cakes to cool in the tins for 2–3 minutes, then turn out onto a wire rack and leave until completely cold.
7. To make the frosting, beat the cream cheese and butter together until smooth. Gradually add the honey or maple syrup to taste. Add the vanilla and mix until smooth.
8. If the cake tops are domed, slice off the top of one, using a long serrated knife, to make it level. Crumble the off-cuts and set aside.
9. Place one cake layer on a serving plate and spread the top with 3 tablespoons of the frosting. Top with the second cake layer and lightly press together. Using a palette knife, cover the top and sides of the cake with the remaining frosting. Scatter the reserved cake crumbs around the top edge of the cake.

## Regulations Applicable to all Classes

1. Entries for all classes with exception to Stock Judging may be entered by Devon Federation YFC members only.
2. All entries must be made online and accompanied by the appropriate entry fees if applicable. One entry form per competitor.
3. Every exhibitor and competitor will be held responsible for the correctness of their entry form.
4. Unless otherwise stated, all classes will be OPEN to competitors who are 28 years of age and under as at 1<sup>st</sup> September 2025.
5. The closing date for entries is **Monday 20<sup>th</sup> April for entries online at [www.devoncountyshow.co.uk](http://www.devoncountyshow.co.uk) and Monday 27<sup>th</sup> April for Livestock entries (Classes 56-67).**
6. No exhibits may bear any identification as to origin.
7. All exhibits to be the Bona Fide work of the exhibitors.
8. Exhibits not complying with the conditions laid down will be disqualified.
9. Substitution will not be allowed.
10. Exhibitors will be restricted to **one** entry per class.
11. **Where TEN or more classes are entered and staged by a member an entrance ticket valid for one day's admission to the Show will be given, unless already allowed for as a competitor. Tickets to be collected by the competitor on Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> May once all their entries in classes are staged. Stockjudging entries can count towards the ten classes.**
12. The Judges are instructed to withhold prizes where the entry is not of sufficient merit and in awarding prizes; they are further instructed to make their awards according to the relevant merits of the exhibit.
13. The Judge's decision will be final.
14. Exhibits in classes 1, 2, 4, 5, 10-47, 49-55 must be staged between 2.00 pm and 7.00 pm on **Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> May**.
15. **Trophies** will be presented at 5.30pm on Saturday 23<sup>rd</sup> May in the YFC marquee.
16. **Prize Money** will be forwarded to clubs for distribution to individuals after the show.
17. **Collection of Exhibits.** Entries **must not** be removed before **6.00 pm** on Saturday 23<sup>rd</sup> May. **Any items not claimed by 8.30 pm will be disposed of** unless prior arrangements with Devon YFC show team have been made.
18. Whilst every care will be taken of the exhibits, neither the Association nor the Devon YFC will be liable for compensation for loss or damage from any cause whatsoever.
19. All exhibits in static classes must not have been shown at any previous Devon County Show and to have been made/produced since the 2025 Show.
20. **TB PRE MOVEMENT TESTING**  
**ALL** cattle coming to the Show must have had a pre movement test with a negative result within 60 days of the commencement of the Show. This requirement will NOT apply to calves under 42 days of age on the day of arrival at the Show.
