

ADMISSION TO THE SHOWGROUND: All persons wishing to gain access to the Showground on Saturday and Sunday must produce a valid entry ticket. Vehicle passes do not admit the driver or any passengers. Exhibitor tickets will be issued prior to the Show as per the allocation noted below. Additional discounted Exhibitor Tickets are available, these must be **purchased in advance**. Please contact the Show Office or add the required amount to your entry. Please ensure that you have adequate passes for your individual requirements.

PASSES: Exhibitors may purchase advance Show passes at a reduced rate of £17 per ticket (please see note under admission). Children under 16 enter the Show for FREE.

EQUINE PARKING & CAR PARKING:

Equine Parking:

Equine exhibitors will be issued with vehicle passes as illustrated in the above table. Parking will be accessed through Gate 4. Heavy Horses will access the Showground via Gate 1. Vehicle passes do not admit the driver or any passengers.

Public Car Parking:

Public car parking is available free of charge.

Disabled Parking:

There will be a designated area for Disabled parking at the front of the Public Car Park, please show your Disabled Parking Badge to the car parking attendant.

PHOTOGRAPHY:

Photographs and/or film footage will be taken at the event. These images may be used by Dorchester Agricultural Society in print, online and across social media. Please speak to the photographer on the day if you would prefer for you and/or your child not to be photographed and images to be used in the methods described above.

STABLING:

Limited on-site stabling is available at £45 per box/night or £82 for 2 nights.

Stables are available from 17.00 Friday 1st September and must be vacated by 11.00 on Monday 4th September. Stables booked may be occupied from 17.00 on the day booked until 16.00 the following day. Straw bedding is provided free of charge. No feed or fodder is provided.

Stabling fees for entries in the Coaching Marathon, Scurry, Private Driving and Heavy Horses will be refunded following the Show if entries are forward.

EQUINE PASSPORTS - Exhibitors are reminded that all equines should travel with their current equine passport. DEFRA officials will be on site and inspections may be made.

EQUINE INFLUENZA – All Equines attending Dorset County Show must have been vaccinated for Equine Influenza. The requirement of the primary course (1st vaccination and then 2nd vaccination between 21 - 92 days later), followed by the first booster (150 - 215 days) and all subsequent annual boosters within 365 days thereafter.

Horses may compete having received the primary course and prior to the first booster but not within 7 days of receiving a vaccine dose. Foals: In-foal mares that have already had vaccinations of primary Equine Influenza course should be vaccinated 4-6 weeks before the foal is due to be born. Foals should be vaccinated for Equine Influenza at 6 months to commence their primary course. We urge all owners to always adhere to strict biosecurity protocols. Vaccinations are subject to local risk assessments by the attending veterinarians. Please note that neither vaccination certificates nor passports should be sent to the show office. Officials will be on site and random inspections will be carried out. Please ensure that all equines travel with their current documentation.

PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR - Any person riding a horse or pony, anywhere on the showground must wear a hard hat of a standard approved by their appropriate governing body. **Headgear must be worn with the chin strap correctly and securely fastened at all times.**

VETERINARY, FARRIER & FIRST AID - Vet in attendance: Dorset Equine Vets, Whitcombe Racing Stables, Dorchester 01305 262295. A Farrier will be in attendance. Medical and an Honorary Doctor will be in attendance from 07:00 on Show days.

AFFILIATION RULES

NPS SILVER MEDAL ROSETTE CHAMPIONSHIPS

These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the

owner of the champion pony is a **Qualifying or Life** member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the rider's/handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the owner of the Champion pony is not a member, or the owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette, but the qualification card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the owner of that pony is a member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the qualification card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve (third). Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Championships. Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the final of the Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show in 2024.

NPS QUALIFYING ROUNDS

These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective Mountain & Moorland Stud Books. Part breds are not eligible (other than Open Part Bred Ridden & Open Part Bred in Hand). Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS Qualifying or Life members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show in 2024. The highest placed pony, if owned by an NPS member, in each class will qualify for the final. Qualification may pass down to third place if the first and second ponies are already qualified. The Owner's Membership cards must be produced in the ring when requested or the qualification will be forfeit.

THE BRITISH SHOW HORSE ASSOCIATION

Held under the rules of the British Show Horse Association. Owners, Riders, In Hand Handlers & Horses must be registered or have temporary membership with a Day Ticket. Horses registered with the Association must be Owned, Exhibited and Ridden by current BSHA Members. Riders must be 15 years of age or older. Registration numbers must be quoted on entry form.

DAY TICKETS

Non-Members may purchase up to a maximum of 2 Day Tickets per Exhibitor, per Horse, per Rider, per season. A Day Ticket will allow entry into Amateur, Home Produced, In-Hand, Novice, Working, Young Rider and Open Affiliated classes only, but will NOT allow entry into RIHS or HOYS qualifying classes. Horses registered on a Day Ticket do not require a JMB height certificate. Competitors can apply for a Day Ticket by downloading an application form or apply online on the BSHA website. Horses competing in the Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain classes at their Affiliated Shows cannot compete in Hack, Cobs, and Riding Horse classes at the same show, on the same day and vice versa. This does not apply to SHB (GB) Ridden Sport Horse classes.

BSHA RISING STAR QUALIFIERS & FINAL AVAILABLE TO MEMBERS AND NON-MEMBERS AGED 15 YEARS AND OVER

DIRECT QUALIFIERS FOR FINALS AT LONDON INTERNATIONAL HORSE SHOW

Class/es for Rising Star qualify for BSHA Rising Star Supreme Finals at the London International Horse Show, highest

placed unqualified in top 3 to qualify. If second and third are unqualified, they will qualify for the BSHA qualifier (semi-final)

at Addington Equestrian Centre on the Sunday 10th September. Qualification for Rising Star Supreme Final or BSHA National

Championship Semi-Final will not go beyond third place.

RULES:

- Available to amateur members and non-members (aged 15 and over), please see Rule 6A-C in 2023 BSHA Rulebook.
- Open to horses which have never been placed in the top 9 in any BSHA class at Horse of the Year Show Finals (including all Hunter Sections, Working Hunters & Ladies Side Saddle) (not including SFAS or SEIB R2R Final); and riders not to have competed as an adult in any classes at Horse of the Year Show in the current season and two years prior. Open to horses which have never been placed in the top 9 in any RIHS BSHA Open Finals at Hickstead (excluding the current season).
- Open to horses which have never been placed in the top 9 in any RIHS BSHA Open Final at Hickstead.

- No competitor previously deemed a showing Professional / Producer, may be permitted to enter these classes.
- Competitors do not have to be members to compete in the direct qualifiers, however all competitors who
 receive their qualification to the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Supreme Final must complete their membership
 and registration with the BSHA within 7 days for their qualification to stand or this will pass down the line.
- JMB certificates will not be required to compete in these classes.
- The Judges decision is final.
- The Judge will NOT ride exhibits in these classes.

COLOURED HORSE & PONY SOCIETY (CHAPS)

This Show is affiliated to The Coloured Horse & Pony Society (UK). Affiliation No. 23-193 Both owner and the rider/exhibitor need NOT be a member of CHAPS (UK), nor must the horse or pony be registered with CHAPS (UK) to compete. However, in order to qualify both owner and rider/exhibitor need to be a current showing member and have a valid qualifier card. Members to apply in to CHAPS (UK) for appropriate qualifier card.

The CHAPS (UK) Championship Show will be held on 10 - 12th August 2023, Shows held after 6th August will count as 2024 qualifiers

For full rulings and information on competition/qualification, please refer to the CHAPS (UK) Members' Handbook; or visit www.chapsuk.com. Only "coloured" horses and ponies (as defined in the current CHAPS UK Members' Handbook) may compete in these classes.

All stallions, 4 yrs old and over entering these classes must be graded with CHAPS (UK). All stallions must wear Stallion ID discs in the ring without exception.

SENIOR SHOWING AND DRESSAGE LEAGUE (SSADL)

Qualifier system: All SSADL members will hold their own qualification card which will need to be signed in the ring by the Judge if eligible. This Show is the final qualifier for the Members Challenge Championships held at the SSADL National Championships Show on the 9th & 10th September 2023.

Class Sections: There are three sections to qualify for In Hand and four sections to qualify for Ridden.

First to Sixth in each age group will qualify for the London International Horse Show/ SSAAL Second Round. First and Second from each age group will qualify for the above Open Members Challenge (no lead rein/first ridden ponies)

Two highest placed Mountain and Moorland ponies within a class will qualify for the Members Mountain and Moorland Challenge (no lead rein/first ridden ponies)

The two highest placed foreign breed horse/ponies within a class will qualify for the Members Foreign Breeds Challenge (no lead rein/first ridden ponies)

The two highest placed Lead Rein/ First Ridden ponies within a class will qualify for the Lead Rein / First Ridden Ponies Challenge.

The winner from each class will qualify for the preliminary judging of the Senior of the Year Championships New SSADL Super Stars Championship to be eligible to compete in this championship, the competitor must be a member of a Pony Club or Riding Club, Membership numbers are required to be put on a qualification card. The competitor must have competed in two events/classes at your Pony Club or Riding Club.

The Two highest placed Non-members in each class will receive a qualification card – The competitor will then have 10 days to join and send all paperwork to SSADL Head Office

If a competitor has already qualified, then qualification must be handed down the line

WELSH PONY & COB SOCIETY

This show is affiliated to the Welsh Pony & Cob Society. Affiliation No AF000096. Animals must be entered correctly in line with the rules, detailed in the WPCS Judging and Showing Handbook which can be found on the Society Website or requested from the Society Office. Failure to comply with the rules may result in the

withholding of awards. Exhibitors will need to provide the WPCS with certain personal information. Your privacy is extremely important to WPCS, so they want you to know how this information will be used. HEAVY HORSE CHAMPIONS

To be held on Sunday 24th September 2023 at Turnpike Showground.

Championship Classes: Heavy Horse Champion In-Hand and Heavy Horse Champion in Show/Decorated Harness.

Rules of Qualification: Qualifiers must be from **Recognised Heavy Horse Breeds** of any age; Stallions, Colts, Mares, Fillies and Geldings. (a) The In-Hand Qualifier must be the Show Champion of the day. If the Champion is already qualified at a previous Qualifier Show then the Qualifier position can go down the line to 4th place, at the Judge's discretion. If the top 4 horses have already qualified then no Qualifier can be awarded. (b) The Show Harness and/or Decorated Harness Qualifier must be the highest placed on the day, down to 4th position at the Judge's discretion. If a Qualifier is subsequently unable to attend the Championships then the Championship Secretary must be notified no later than 14th September 2023. The Qualification can then be passed to the next eligible horse. Each horse that qualifies will receive a Qualifier rosette. Horses qualifying for the Championship and others from the same stables may enter and take part in the Wessex Heavy Horse Society's Annual Show on the same day. Schedules are available from the Championship Secretary at the address above. Overnight/day stabling will be available at the Show.

SMALL MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND PONIES IN HAND (Excluding Welsh)

All ponies to be registered in the Approved Section of the Stud Book of their respective breeds. Name of breed and registration number must be put on the entry form. Broodmares must be four years old and over. Foals accompanying mares must be at least three weeks old on the day of the Show. Three year old fillies with foals are NOT eligible. Stallions and colts, three years old and over must have DEFRA or appropriate Breed Society Stallion licences (except Shetlands). All entire males aged 2 years and over must display a stallion disc. Children

under 14 years old may not show colts (excluding foals) or entire males in in-hand classes. In the interests of safety, hard hats must be worn by all handlers aged 14 years or under in in-hand classes. Exhibitors should not kneel but remain standing while in the ring.

RULES & REGULATIONS

This Society is a member of the Association of Shows and Agricultural Organisations (ASAO), and endeavours to run its competitions in line with similar shows.

Competitors are reminded to leave adequate time to enter and leave the Showground as traffic delays are possible.

Unless otherwise stated classes will be run under the relevant society rules.

HORSE RULES

- 1. Local rule Horse/Pony must be the property of a resident living within Dorset.
- 2. Horse numbers one number will be issued per animal, which must be used for all classes
- 3. HSE and HARD HATS British Standard hard hats must be worn complying with EN 1384, ASTMF 1163, PAS015 with Kite Marks or SEI marks. Protective head gear similar to the above which offers a higher level of protection is acceptable. Chin straps must be securely fastened at all times whilst mounted on the Showground
- 4. It is recommended that horses and ponies are not left unattended at any time whilst on the Showground.

CAMPING RULES

4. Livestock attendants - The Society permits livestock attendants to "camp/sleep" in their vehicles in the livestock parking area

- 5. Camping Field A separate camping field is provided adjoining the main showground where a charge of £40 is made per vehicle or tent
- 6. Gas & cooking arrangements for fire safety reasons, gas cylinders should not be stored within your sleeping accommodation


GENERAL COMPETITION RULES

- 7. Entries all entries must be on an official entry form and signed by exhibitor, owner, agent or if under 16 years of age, the exhibitor & parent/guardian. All exhibits must be owned by the exhibitor at the time of making entries. This rule obviously is superseded where exhibits are required to be bred, made, or produced by the exhibitor
- 8. Closing dates no entries will be accepted after the relevant closing date
- 9. Membership fully paid up Members are entitled to reduced entry fees in most classes.
- 10. Refunds no refunds can be made for any entry after the relevant closing date
- 11. Accidents the Society will not be responsible for any loss, illness, damage, or accident that may occur to any animal or article exhibited at the Show. It is a condition of entry that the exhibitor shall hold the Society harmless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from any such accident, loss, or illness. All accidents must be reported to the Secretary's Office or Horse Steward's Tent
- 12. Prizes as printed in the schedule except where the Judge or Section Chairman reserves the right to change for whatever reason. The Judge need not award a first prize
- 13. Objections an exhibitor making an objection shall do so in writing to the Secretary before 4.00p.m. (or at close of judging) on the relevant day of the Show and shall deposit the sum of £25. The objector must be an exhibitor in the same class. The Appeals Committee will decide the outcome by 5.00p.m. that day and in the event of an objection being held invalid the said sum of £25 shall be forfeited to the Society
- 14. Prize Money This can be collected on Show Day. No prize money is given unless the relevant prize money card is handed in. No prize money is sent out, unless requested in writing with the relevant prize money card attached
- 15. Judging no public will be allowed in the judging rings while judging is in progress. The Judges decision is final
- 16. Entry tickets each person must give up an admission ticket when entering the Showground on Show days. Should exhibitors be entitled to exhibitor or vehicle passes these will be dispatched, along with horse numbers. The Society asks all exhibitors to only give free passes to 'bona fida' assistants or handlers
- 17. Showground facilities refreshments, toilets and showers are provided on the Showground. Exhibitors are allowed to use the Members facilities after 6.00pm each show day where the catering and bars operate until 10.30pm
- 18. Access to the Showground exhibitors are asked to follow the directional signs to the Showground and to allow adequate time for entry to the show site, parking and unloading of their entries. Any vehicle attempting to enter the Showground without a vehicle pass will be charged £50 which is refunded if the vehicle is removed from the Showground before 8.00am on the morning of each show day
- 19. Opening hours public opening hours are from 8.30am to 6.00pm. A security and noise curfew are in place after 11.00pm on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday of Show weekend
- 20. Car & Lorry Parks spaces will be allocated by the car parking steward and should any vehicle be discovered parked in any other area it will be towed away to the car parking area
- 21. Stockmen and grooms all stockmen and grooms must follow the appropriate dress code when parading/riding their animals for judging i.e., white coats, hard hats etc.
- 22. Smoking the Society operates a no smoking rule in all tents, judging rings and in the Main Ring
- 23. Veterinary & Medical Cover Are on site via the Secretary's Tent between 8.00 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. on Show days, after which a call out service is available. Exhibitors are responsible for any treatment costs incurred.
- 24. Public Liability Insurance all exhibitors must have a minimum of £2 million Public Liability Insurance cover.


