NOTES TO ENTRANTS

STAGING OF EXHIBIT: Entries drop off is permitted between 16:00 and 18:00 on Friday 2nd May, and between 7:00 and 9:15 on Saturday 3rd May. Exhibits must be **staged by 9:15** on Saturday 3rd May 2025. Judging will commence prompt at 9:30.

Vehicles for the dropping off of exhibits must park in the Public Car Parks and exhibits carried to the marquee. The marquee is based just inside the main Show Visitors Entrance. Please follow signs for Gate B (Friday) and Public Parking (Saturday).

COLLECTION OF EXHIBITS: You can collect your entries from 16:00 on Sunday 4th May 2025. All entries that have not been collected by 18:00 on Sunday 4th May 2025 will be disposed of.

55 FIVE SAUSAGE ROLLS, own recipe

- 59 VICTORIA SPONGE CAKE
- **A LOAF OF BREAD,** not made in a bread maker

Cooking time: 1 hour Oven: 180C (350F)

Ingredients

% tsp nutmeg 100 g (4oz) butter

100 g (4oz) roughly chopped dried apricots.
75 g (3oz) soft brown sugar
2 medium eggs – lightly beaten.

4 x tablespoons milk

Method

- 1. Well grease a 400g (1lb) loaf tin.
- 2. Sieve the flour, salt and nutmeg into a bowl.
- 3. Rub in the butter until the mixture resembles fine breadcrumbs.
- 4. Add the apricots, nuts and sugar.
- 5. Make a well in the centre, pour in the eggs and milk and mix to a soft dropping consistency adding a little extra milk if necessary.
- 6. Turn into prepared tin and level off.
- 7. Bake for about an hour until a skewer inserted into the centre of the loaf comes out clean.
- 8. Leave in the tin for 5 minutes, then turn out and cool on a wire rack.

62 MARMALADE CAKE

Cooking time: 40-45 minutes Oven: 180C (350F)

Ingredients

Cake: Glaze:

225g (7.9oz) self-raising flour 2 tablespoons warmed, orange marmalade

175g soft margarine2 tablespoons orange juice175g caster sugar50g sifted icing sugar

3 large eggs

3 tablespoons orange marmalade

1 teaspoon baking powder

2 tablespoons milk

Orange zest from 1 orange

Method

Grease and line a 20cm (8 inch) cake tin – Preheat oven to 180C – 160 fan/350F/Gas mark 4

- 1. Cream the margarine and sugar until fluffy.
- 2. Add the eggs and marmalade: Beat in the eggs one at a time, followed by the orange marmalade and orange zest.
- 3. Fold in the dry ingredients: Sift the self-raising flour and baking powder into the mixture, folding it in gently with a spatula until fully combined. Add the milk to loosen the batter.
- 4. Pour the batter into the prepared tin and smooth the top. Bake for 40-45 minutes, or until a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean.
- 5. Allow the cake to cool in the tin for 10 minutes before transferring it to a wire rack to cool completely.
- 6. In a small bowl, combine the warmed marmalade, orange juice and icing sugar. Stir until smooth and well combined.
- 7. While the cake is still warm, use a pastry brush to spread the glaze evenly over the top of the cake. Allow the cake to cool completely before serving.

COMPETITION RULES


- 1. Entries All entries must be on an official entry form and signed by exhibitor. All exhibits must be owned by the exhibitor at the time of making entries.
- 2. Closing Dates No entries will be accepted after the relevant closing date.
- 3. Refunds No refunds can be made for any entry after the relevant closing date.
- 4. Safety Exhibitors are reminded to comply with all safety regulations relating to themselves, their exhibits, and the public.
- 5. Accidents The Society will not be responsible for any loss, illness, damage, or accident that may occur to any article exhibited at the Show or an individual. It is a condition of entry that the exhibitor shall hold the Society blameless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from any such accident, loss, or illness. All accidents must be reported to the Show Secretary.
- 6. Prizes As printed in the schedule except where the Judge or Section Chairman reserves the right to change for whatever reason. The Judge need not award a first prize.
- 7. Prize Money This can be collected on Show Day or sent out after the Show by cheque.
- 8. Judging No public will be allowed in the Marquee while judging is in progress. The Judge's decision is final.
- 9. Objections An exhibitor making an objection shall do so in writing to the Show Secretary before 3.00 p.m. on the day of the Show and shall deposit the sum of £5. The objector must be an exhibitor in the same class. The Appeals Committee will decide the outcome by 4.00 p.m. that day and in the event of an objection being held invalid the said sum of £5 shall be forfeited to the Society.
- 10. Flower, Pot Plant and Propagation classes will be run under the Royal Horticultural Society rulings. Vegetable classes will be run under National Vegetable Society rulings.
- 11. The Show organisers reserve the right to combine or amalgamate classes at its discretion.
