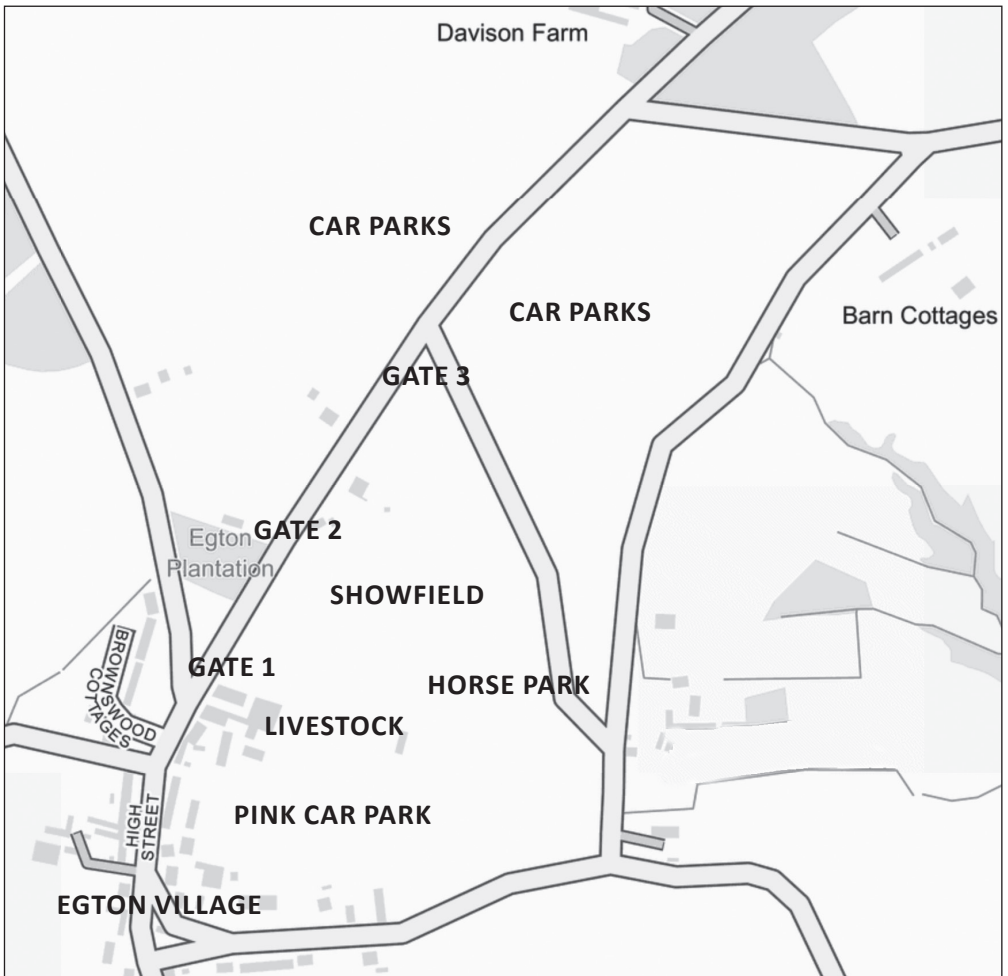
TRAFFIC PLAN FOR PARKING ON THE SHOWFIELD

Due to the Limited Parking Space we can only allow 1 Car Parking Ticket Per Entrant.

The Main Gate (Gate 1) should be used to enter the Showfield for All Livestock Exhibitors.

HORSEBOXES & HORSE TRANSPORT should park at the Far Side (RED HORSEBOX PARK) of the Main Ring. There should be NO CARS parked in that area to comply with health and safety regulations. It will be monitored all day by STEWARDS who have the right to ask any illegally parked vehicles to leave. If people object, vehicles maybe wheel clamped or removed from the area

CATTLE, SHEEP & GOAT EXHIBITORS should enter the field by Gate 1 then turn right to Livestock area, unload their stock and proceed to the usual PINK CAR PARK AREA.



GENERAL REGULATIONS

- 1 All Entries to be made before Wednesday 12th August to the appropriate Section Secretary, after which NO ENTRY WILL BE TAKEN: ALL ENTRIES MUST APPEAR IN THE CATALOGUE.
- 2 Entry Fees stated. ALL ENTRY FEES TO BE PAID AT THE TIME OF ENTRY. Subscriptions do not include entry fees. Exhibitors will receive one Admission ticket for entry fees totalling £10.00 or over. Cheques to be made payable to Egton Horse & Agricultural Society and crossed. BACs payments: Account No: 28007499 Sort Code: 05-09-79
- 3 Donations of £35 or more will constitute a Vice Presidency in 2026 for one person. This will provide a Vice President's Badge giving one free entry to Showfield, one car park ticket and one luncheon voucher.
- 4 All animals must be the bona-fide property of the Exhibitor at the time of entry.
- 5 All exhibits to be on the Showfield in time for the commencement of Judging from 8.45 a.m prompt
- 6 No Person will be allowed to enter the ring except the Secretary and her assistants, and one attendant in charge of each animal, which must not be distinguished by the name of the owner, or ribbons, or medals. Any person making any dissenting remark to the Judge whilst the stock is under inspection will be liable to be expelled from the field.
- 7 All objections to be made to the General Secretary, in writing, within half an hour of the Class in question, and each objection must be accompanied by a deposit of £25, this deposit money to be returned if the objection is upheld by the Trustees and no entry will be accepted unless the exhibitor agrees at the time of entry to abide by the decision of the Show Committee in all matters of dispute without appeal to the law.
- 8 The Society will use every reasonable precaution to prevent accidents to exhibits and the public, but should any injury happen, they will not hold themselves responsible for damages.
- 9 The Society will not be responsible for any losses, mistakes or accidents of any description that may occur to any entry and entries will be received subject to this condition (See special note on entry forms).
- 10 The Trustees reserves the right to cancel or amalgamate classes at their discretion.
- 11 In a class with three entries or less, the prizes will be awarded according to the Judges discretion.
- 12 No prize winning stock shall leave the Showfield until 4p.m. (4.45 p.m. from tents).
- 13 The Public will be admitted to the Showfield on payment of £12.00 each school children £7.00.
- 14 All Brood Mares must be the dams of living foals at the time of entering, or certified to be stunted, in which latter case the premium awarded will be withheld until the owner satisfies the Trustees that the mare is in foal. Except Class 6.
- 15 The Trustees reserve the right to disqualify any exhibitor found breaking any of the above Rules.
- 16 Points system for trophies throughout the Show: 1 - 3 points, 2 - 2 points, 3 - 1 point.
- 17 All returnable trophies to the General Secretary by closing Entries date or by arrangement with the section Secretary

TROPHIES MAY BE COLLECTED FROM THE GENERAL SECRETARY'S TENT AT THE END OF JUDGING OF EACH SECTION.

SPECIAL NOTE:- No person, whether in charge of Stock or otherwise, will be admitted to the Show Field without producing an Admission Ticket.

HEALTH AND SAFETY GUIDELINES

EGTON HORSE AND AGRICULTURAL SHOW

The Society is a non-profit making Charity and the Trustees and helpers all give their services voluntarily. Stewards and Gatekeepers are on hand to assist at all times and wear Hi Vis Egton Show tabards for identification.

Traffic management: For the safety of all people attending Egton Show NO VEHICLES will be allowed to enter the Showfield after 10.30am

ALL HORSE TRANSPORT VEHICLES must exit the Showfield using the rear (East) gate.

Horse and Livestock transport MUST park in their colour coded designated areas (shown on map of showfield at the farside of the main ring) and as directed by Stewards.

First Aid: The Society employs Medics UK who have an ambulance and qualified medical professionals on the Showfield all day.

Animal Welfare: The Society has two Honorary Veterinary Surgeons who between them cover the whole day.

Water: Mains water is available at the Cattle Section, at the Show Hut and near the Collecting Ring.

WCs: Portable WCs are located throughout the Showfield. Disabled facilities are near Cattle Section and near the "Fur & Feather" tent.

Fire: Fire extinguishers are located in the General Secretary's tent, and in each Section tent on the Showfield.

Electrical and gas appliances: It is the user's responsibility to ensure that all such appliances and equipment have been appropriately tested and meet all current regulatory standards.

Protective headgear: All riders of horses & ponies must at all times when mounted wear head protection (hard hat) which must be securely fastened with chin straps.

The current safety standards (updated February 2025) for horse riding helmets are Kitemark PAS015:2011, Kitemark VG1 01.040 2014-12 and SEI ASTM F1163:2023.
