

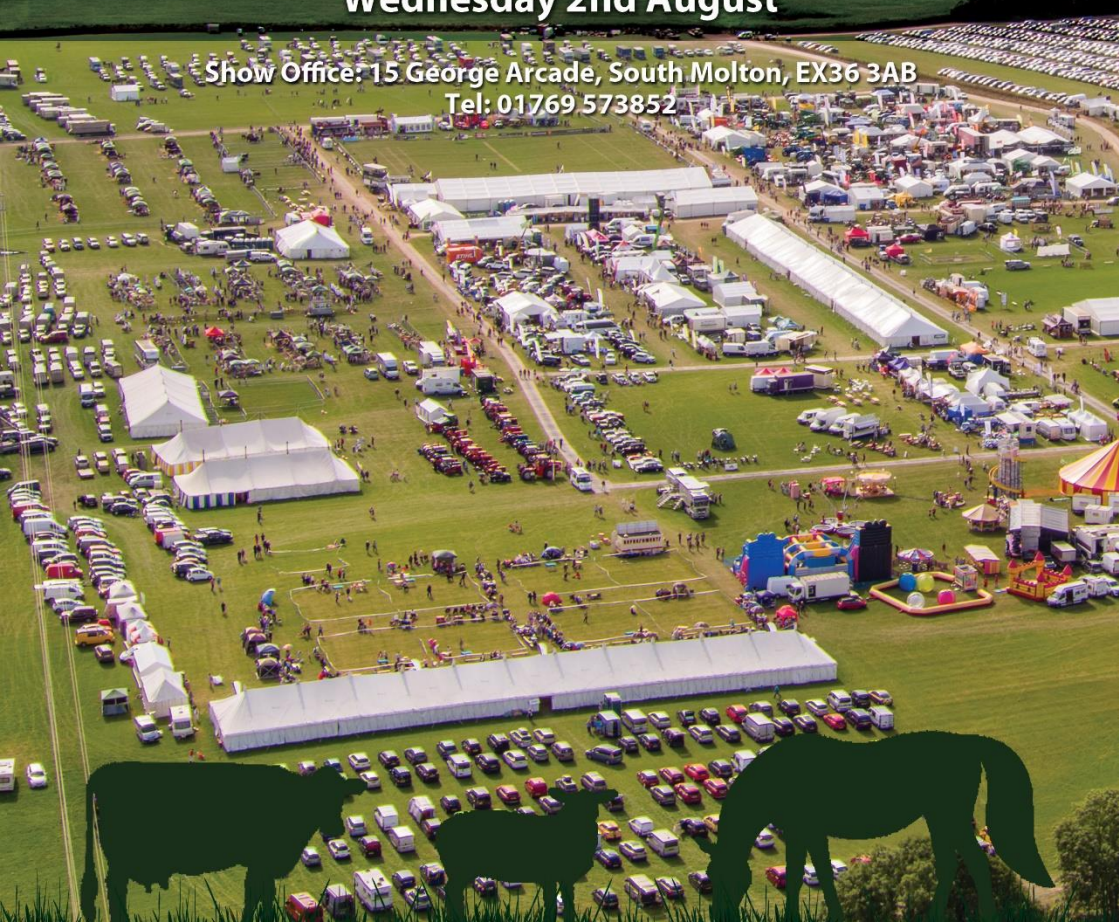

AFFILIATIONS

BSHA RISING STAR FINALS

Rising Star Hacks & Riding Horses: Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, height must exceed 148cm but must not exceed 160cm for hack type. Rising Star Ridden Cobs: Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, height must exceed 148cm with a recommended height limit of 160cm for cob type.

Rising Star Ridden Hunter: Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, exceeding 148cm.

Rising Star Racehorse to Show Horse: Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, exceeding 148cm. Open to thoroughbred horses retired from training.

The two highest placed Horses, not already qualified in the Rising Star classes, will qualify for the Rising Star Finals, to be held at The BSHA National Championship Show 7th – 9th September 2023. The Judges will not ride the exhibits in qualifiers but the judge will ride at the finals. There will be regional clinic days offering training from BSHA accredited trainers. Rules for BSHA Rising Star Classes which must be entered into the spirit in which they are intended: 1. Open to Non-Members and amateur members, 15 years old and over.

Owners, Riders and Horses, are not required to be Members of the British Show Horse Association in-order to compete in the BSHA Rising Star qualifying classes, the Rising Star Finals will require a day ticket. 2. These classes are specifically aimed at those Horses and Riders who are not regularly qualifying for the major Championship Shows and wish to improve. 3. Riders must not have competed at The Royal International Horse Show or The Horse of the Year Show, with the exception of the BSHA RIHS Amateur classes pre-2023 or SEIB Search for a Star. 4. Open to Horses which are stabled at home or in a DIY or non-show yard. 5. Horses to be ridden by an Amateur, please see the current BSHA Rule Book; this does not exclude receiving lessons from a Professional showing person. 6. No Professional is allowed to ride, to work-in (in any form), compete, or enter the Ring to groom/strip the Horse. 7. Failure to abide by the Rules may result in ineligibility to compete at the BSHA National Championship Show in any class. 8. The Judge will ride ALL the exhibits in the final. 9. To register for the Supreme Final at the BSHA National Championships Show in September you must upload your details on our website using the details on the back of the qualifying rosette. The Supreme Final will be held at the BSHA National Championship Show, with a prelim judging and final championship. A bursary of £200 kindly donated by the Talbot Family will be presented to the winner to be used with a BSHA Accredited Trainer of their choice

DIRECT QUALIFIERS FOR FINALS AT LONDON INTERNATIONAL HORSE SHOW Class/es (insert class numbers) qualify for BSHA Rising Star Supreme Finals at the London International Horse Show, highest placed unqualified in top 3 to qualify. If second and third are unqualified, they will qualify for the BSHA qualifier (semi-final) at Addington Equestrian Centre on the Sunday 10th September. Qualification for Rising Star Supreme Final or BSHA National Championship Semi-Final will not go beyond third place.

RULES

- Available to amateur members and non-members (aged 15 and over), please see Rule 7 in 2023 BSHA Rulebook.
- Open to horses which have never been placed in the top 9 in any class at a HOYS Final (not including SFAS, but to include the top three placings in the SEIB R2R Final); and riders not to have competed at HOYS in the current season and two years prior to the current season (not including SFAS).
- Open to horses which have never been placed in the top 9 in any RIHS BSHA Open Final at Hickstead
- No competitor previously deemed a showing Professional / Producer, may be permitted to enter these classes.
- JMB certificates will not be required to compete in these classes.
- The Judges decision is final.
- The Judge will NOT ride exhibits in these classes.

CHAPS UK – 22-175

This show is affiliated to The Coloured Horse & Pony Society (UK). Affiliation No. 22-175. Both owner and the rider/exhibitor need not be a member of CHAPS (UK) nor must the horse or pony be registered with CHAPS (UK) to compete. However, in order to Qualify both Owner and Rider/Exhibitor need to be a current showing member and present their valid Qualifier card IN THE RING for signing by the judge. Members to apply in writing to CHAPS (UK) for appropriate qualifier card. The CHAPS (UK) Championship Show will be held on 9th – 12th August. Shows held on or after the Postal Entry closing date of Championship Show will count as 2024 qualifiers. The following classes are CHAPS (UK) Qualifiers - Classes 32 - 37. For full rulings and information on competition/qualification, please refer to the CHAPS (UK) Members' Handbook; or visit www.chapsuk.com for rulings. Only Skewbalds/Piebalds may compete these classes. All stallions, 4 years old and over entering these classes must be graded with CHAPS (UK). All stallions must wear Stallion ID Discs in the ring without exception.

EXMOOR PONY SOCIETY - Devon & Cornwall Area Show, Held at The North Devon Show (kindly supported by ExieFest.co.uk)

This section of the show will be run as a standalone section and will not be incorporated into the North Devon Show Results.

Open to all ponies registered in Section 1 of the EPS Studbook

Ridden ponies must be 4 years old and over.

This show is a qualifier for the Exmoor Pony of the Year to be held at the Midlands Area Show on Sunday 10th September 2023, at the Rugby Riding Club, Warwickshire.

This show will be run in accordance with the rules of the Exmoor Pony Society. Full details can be found on the EPS website:

You will be sent Qualifying Cards for the Horses/Ponies registered.

Please Note:

Registration fee for 2022/23 is £20 to include all members of the family and equines owned by the family. This will increase to £25 after 31 January 2023.

TSR NAF Five Star Showing Finals. – This show is a qualifier for the 2023 **TSR NAF Five Star Showing Finals – 8th October 2023**. Qualify and enter ANY of the Finals Central, East Anglia, North West, North East, South East, South, Wales & South West or Scottish. You Do Not have to be a TSR member to qualify or enter a final. The Rider/Handler qualifies and can enter any horse/pony in any number of Finals!

TSR NAF Five Star Riders Finals – 1st & 2nd riders qualify and will receive a qualification flyer in the ring. **TSR NAF Five Star In Hand Finals** – The two highest placed Handlers with a TSR In Hand sheet will qualify in any In Hand class. Handlers MUST have their sheet signed in the ring by the judge/steward, cards are available FREE from the TSR website. Full details at www.theshowingregister.co.uk

VETERAN HORSE SOCIETY

EQUINE INFLUENZA AND TETANUS VACCINATION

Equine Influenza and Tetanus vaccinations are compulsory requirements for all horses attending the North Devon Show. The requirement for the first three EI vaccinations is as follows: the first two vaccinations 21-92 days apart, a third booster between 150-215 days, and an annual booster vaccination within 365 days thereafter. No horse should enter competitions/arrive on the showground within seven days of an EI vaccination. Tetanus vaccination and boosters should be administered in line with the requirements of the corresponding datasheet for the licensed vaccine used by the horse owner/keeper's veterinary practice.

Foals should commence vaccinations at 6 months old. This rule may be subject to change from guidance from the FEI/BEF and any changes will be notified via the Showing Council and ASAO websites.

We urge all owners to adhere to strict biosecurity protocols at all times. Vaccinations are subject to local risk assessments by the attending veterinarians.

PLEASE NOTE THAT NEITHER VACCINATION CERTIFICATES NOR PASSPORTS SHOULD BE SENT TO THE SHOW OFFICE PRIOR TO THE EVENT. HOWEVER, RANDOM CHECKS WILL BE CARRIED OUT ON THE SHOWGROUND DURING THE SHOW

SECURITY/EVENT STAFF WILL BE CHECKING ALL EXHIBITORS ADMISSION PASSES AT ENTRANCES TO THE SHOWGROUND

HORSES AND PONIES

- ALL PRIZE WINNERS ARE TO PARADE IN THE GRAND PARADE [General Rule 1 will apply]
- RULE 7 APPLIES TO CLASSES 1 TO 52
- LOCAL AREA - The Society's "local" area includes all the parishes in the North Devon District Council and the Torrington District Council areas.
- HORSE PASSPORTS – All exhibitors must ensure that they have the relevant passports ready for inspection on show day.

EACH HORSE EXHIBITOR WILL RECEIVE:

VEHICLE PASSES: 1 Vehicle pass sent per entry form - Vehicle passes are for vehicles transporting horses only.
There is no ringside parking and vehicles that are not towing horse boxes will be redirected to the public car park.

EXHIBITOR PASSES: Individual pass per rider – names must be completed on entry form.
(children 5-15 years will receive a child's pass - please state age on form).

If Rider and Driver are separate individuals please state drivers name on entry form. (an additional entry ticket will be included for the driver).

ALL OCCUPANTS OF VEHICLES ARE REQUIRED TO HAVE AN INDIVIDUAL PASS. Security personnel will be on duty to ensure all entrants have tickets. Without an entry pass the individual will be required to pay the Full Show Day price of £18.00.

Please ensure you request the number of extra passes you require on your entry form. Extra Individual passes £16.00 per pass, Children's passes (5 – 15 years) £3.00 per pass.

Entry fees for Classes 1 to 52 : Members £7.00 (with general membership only)/Non-members: £12.00

Prize Money for Classes 1 to 52 – Rule 7 applies: 1st - £20, 2nd - £17, 3rd - £13, 4th - £10, 5th - £7, 6th - £6

In addition to normal prize money: Supreme Champions receive £50.00 Reserves £30.00
Section Champions receive £20.00 Reserves £15.00

CLASS 13 Tattersalls RoR OPEN In Hand Show Series Qualifier 2023

Open to all RoR and NR **competition registered** horses, 3yrs and over, fillies, mares and geldings. Blemishes caused through racing will be ignored. Horses do not need to be shod to compete in the RoR Open In-Hand class. Horses can be shown in a Bitless/In Hand Bridle. All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force.

This class is a qualifier for the RoR OPEN In Hand Showing Series FINAL

The first three go forward to the final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships at Aintree in August 2024.

RoR prizes will not be awarded to RoR qualifiers with numbers forward of two or less, however qualification for the final will stand.

Rosettes 1st - 4th.

Prizes - 1st £30 plus RoR Prize, 2nd £20, 3rd £10

Amateur definition:

The rules are as in the rulebook with the following addition that an amateur may not show a horse owned or sponsored by a company or commercial firm. In addition, a person classed as amateur must not be supported by a company in any way or act as brand ambassador whether financially or in-kind. An amateur is a person who for the purpose of RoR classes does not/has not during the current season or previous season:

Engage (d) in breeding, livery, buying or selling, dealing or hiring horses in a commercial capacity.

Horses must not have been stabled at or reside in a Professional Producer's/Trainer's yard from January 1st 2023.

Riders must not have ridden any animals produced by a Professional/Trainer in the current or previous season.

Horses and riders must not receive any help from a Professional Producer/Trainer at a SHOW in the current season. A rider who has ridden for a Professional/Producer Trainer in the current or previous season must not have ridden horses at a show.

Any breaches of this ruling will be taken seriously and will result in disqualification from future classes
All entrants to RoR classes must have RoR competition membership. It is £10 per year and can be done online

The Judge will not ride at the qualifiers.

The first three go forward to the final to be held at the Hickstead Derby Meeting June 2024.

Rosettes 1st - 4th.

Prizes - 1st £30 plus RoR Gift 2nd £20, 3rd £10

RoR prizes will not be awarded in RoR qualifiers with numbers forward of two or less, however qualification for the final will stand.

CLASS 14 Tattersalls AMATEUR Ridden Show Series Qualifier 2023

Open to all RoR and NR competition registered horses, 4yrs and over, mares and geldings, owned, produced and ridden by an Amateur. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January 2023. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, Pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavasson noseband. Horses should be plaited.

The Series is open to AMATEURS only – those employed in racing will be allowed to compete. Class will be judged under 'riding horse' format without 'type' being taken into consideration. Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series

This class is a qualifier for the Tattersalls RoR Amateur Ridden Show Series FINAL.

Horses and Ponies are to be in the field by 8.00 a.m. or 1 hour before their class is due in the ring. All prize winners to parade in the Grand Parade unless written permission is first obtained from the Secretary.

- 2 The Committee disclaims any responsibility for accidents or loss to any person or animal attending the Show and no claims can be entertained for anything that may happen to Exhibitors, Competitors, Onlookers, their property, servants, exhibits or goods in connection with anything arising out of the Show. It shall be considered a Condition of Entry that each Entrant shall agree to indemnify the promoters and/or any Official against any legal action arising from any accident and/or occurrence whatsoever.
- 3 All the Exhibitors of livestock will receive a Free Exhibitors Vehicle Pass and the appropriate number of Individual Passes.
- 4 The Committee will adhere as closely as possible to the published Schedule and Programme. However, it reserves the right in its absolute discretion to put forward or alter any Class without notice if expedient to do so and the right to refuse an Entry. Furthermore, it reserves the right to cancel any Class through lack of entries or otherwise without necessarily giving a reason.
- 5 Other than Competitors for that particular competition only Officials appointed by the Committee shall be permitted to enter the Show Ring.
- 6 It is a condition of entry that all stock handlers and especially children should only handle animals where they have the necessary strength and experience to cope with the said animal. Children must always be under the direct supervision of and accompanied by a competent adult. No child under the age of 11 may lead an animal in the Grand Parade – except entrants in the Junior Handler Classes who must be under the supervision of an adult.
- 7 Every animal entered for competition shall be entered or accepted for entry in the Herd Book, Grading Register, Flock Book or their Breed or other official register of its breed in this country under conditions as laid down in each breed section/society in the prize list.

PRIZE MONEY

- 8 Prize Money may be withheld, or having been awarded, shall be refunded if an Exhibit is found subsequently not to be represented. Prize Money will be awarded according to the following scales of forward entries:-
 - 1, 2 or 3 entries 1, 2 or 3 prizes
 - 6 catalogued entries 4 prizes
 - 10 catalogued entries 5 prizes
 - 15 catalogued entries 6 prizes

The judge may withhold a prize if not satisfied with the quality of the entry. Show Jumping, Junior Cattle Showman, Junior Sheep Showman, YFC are excluded from the general conditions of Rule 7. In awarding the Breed Champions only the 1st place animal in each class shall initially be paraded. When the judge has decided on the Breed Champion he/she shall then call for the 2nd place animal from the Breed Champions Class to stand forward so that it may be considered with the other 1st place animals for the Reserve Breed Champion. This rule will NOT apply to the Inter Breed Championships. For the Inter Breed Championships only the Breed Champion in each section shall parade from which the Champion and Reserve Champion Awards will be made. The Commercial Beef Champion shall NOT be eligible to go forward to the Inter Breed Championship.

- 9 In the Horse Championships only the Champion in the Hand Hunter, Sport Horse, Champion Ridden Hunter, Champion in Hand Horse & Pony, Champion Veteran, Champion Ridden Pony, Champion Show Hunter Pony, Champion Mountain and Moorland, Champion Coloured and Appaloosa Horse, Champion Exmoor, Champion Hack or Riding Horse and Champion Heavy Horse shall contest the Championship.
- 10 It should be noted that Cup Winners are responsible for having trophies engraved and if this is not done by them the Committee cannot undertake to keep the cups up to date.
- 11 All Ponies are to be measured before being shown unless a Veterinary's Certificate is produced; if not, the Ponies will be measured with shoes, and the half inch will not be allowed for.

PROTESTS AND DISPUTES

- 12 All protests must be made in writing. The protest must state the grounds of objection and must be lodged with the Secretary within one hour from the time the Award is made together with the deposit of £25.00, this will be forfeited to the Funds of the Society unless the protest is upheld.
- 13 All disputes shall be settled by any FIVE Members of the Committee or by any Referee whom they may appoint and such decisions will be final.

HORSE AND PONY CLASSES (INCLUDING JUMPING)

- 14 (a) NOMINATIONS will not be accepted
(b) SUBSTITUTIONS will only be allowed where occasioned by sickness or injury of or to the animal entered and only then if

evidenced from a Qualified Veterinary Surgeon. Any substitutions in the jumping classes must comply with the BSJA rules.

(c) ALL riders must wear appropriate dress.

(d) HORSE PASSPORTS must be available for inspection on Show Day.

Special Rules

16. Anyone on a horse at the show must wear a hard hat.
17. All Riders must wear protective headgear, according to the current standards as listed: All PAS 015, VG1, (BS) EN1384 2017, ASTM F1163 04a onwards, SNELL E2001, SNELL E2016, AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards.
Skullcaps must be of, or worn with, a dark coloured plain peaked cover. Refer to your Society/ Association Rule Book for further clarification. Correctly secured Skull Caps / Riding Hats that meet one of the following current Safety Standards / Specifications MUST be worn by all Riders between the ages of 15 to 17 inclusive. All PAS 015, VG1, (BS) EN1384 2017, ASTM F1163 04a onwards, SNELL E2001, SNELL E2016, AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards. The most recent updates to the list are the additions of SNELL E2016 and EN1384 (2017); the newest version of the SNELL Standard could have begun to appear in 2017 and is accepted to the list; the newest version of the EN1384 Standard will begin to appear during 2018 and is also accepted to the list.
18. No late entries can be accepted in the Horse Classes

CATTLE

19. All animals entered for special prizes or cups must be entered in their appropriate class.
20. Cows must not appear in the Ring in an overstocked condition.
21. Should any Contrivance or Device of any description be found on, or proved to have been used on a Cow or Heifer at any time during the Show either for preventing or influencing abnormally the flow of milk, blistering, bandaging, and/or boarding of udders, the suckingteats, or any other purposes the Committee at their absolute discretion shall have the power to disqualify the cow or heifer so concerned from any Award or Trophy at the Show.
22. The Society reserves the right to remove from the ring or Grand Parade any exhibitor or stockman who is deemed incompetent.
