UTILITY PONY CLASSES

Judge: Miss L. Booth

The pony & handler/rider must complete a set number of tasks and will be judged according to how well they are executed. All obstacles have been designed to be able to be adapted to most situations and available equipment. They can be executed in any order in the video. Get creative!

15. Utility Pony In-hand
 1. A small jump/raised pole (Perhaps a wooden fencing stake or a piece of old guttering?).
 2. Throw an object into a bucket from 2 metres away (We should all know how far 2m is by now!).
 3. Stand for 10 seconds in a scary corner (decorate a corner of the yard with bunting or plastic carrier bags?)
 4. Open and close a gate (I'm sure everybody has a gate to their field or their yard!)
 5. Wave a flag or open an umbrella (the flag can be homemade!).
 6. Bending poles (small barrels, road cones, plastic fencing stakes or even plastic milk bottles filled with water!)
 7. A trot on a loose rein.
 8. Walk over a tarpaulin (Perhaps use old feed sacks or a dumpy bag?).
16. Utility Pony Ridden (small children may be led).
 1. A small jump/raised pole (Perhaps a wooden fencing stake or a piece of old guttering?).
 2. Throw an object into a bucket from 2 metres away (We should all know how far 2m is by now!).
 3. Stand for 10 seconds in a scary corner (decorate a corner of the yard/field with bunting or plastic carrier bags?)

CREATING YOUR VIDEOS & PHOTOGRAPHS

We are aware that everybody will have different facilities and equipment available to them. We'd like to welcome you to have a go regardless of your situation – just do your best! ☺ We welcome those that wish to wear showing attire and for those that don't, all we ask is that you are safe and smart. We'd like this show to be accessible to everybody and welcome any questions or anybody requiring support (Show Secretary's contact details below). We have provided a helpful video for those new to showing which is available to view here: <https://youtu.be/D9s9wjgRGDg>.

Professional photographs are not permitted.

Photographs & videos should be taken especially for this event.

Classes 1-6 (In-hand Classes) require two photographs; one taken from the side of the pony and one taken from in front of the pony and a short video of your individual show (walk away, trot back towards the camera and a trot viewed from the side). For lone handlers, please do the best you can for the judge to assess your pony's movement (pony on the lunge, moving loose in a small enclosure).

Classes 7 & 9 (Pairs) require one photograph of each pony taken from the side and a short video showing the ponies performing together (to include trot, canter is option if ridden in class 9).

Class 8 (Young Handler) requires two photographs - one from the side and one from in front (to include the young handler) and a short video of your individual show (walk away, trot back towards the camera and a trot viewed from the side).

Class 10 (Family Pony) requires two photographs that best represent your pony's personality and a short video showing what makes your pony suitable for all the family.

Class 11 (Leading Rein) requires two photographs - one from the side and one from in front (with or without a rider) and a short video of your individual show - walk and trot only.

Class 12 (Junior Ridden) requires two photographs - one from the side and one from in front (with or without a rider) and a short video of your individual show – canter is optional.

Class 13 (Novice Ridden) requires two photographs - one from the side and one from in front (with or without a rider) and a short video showing your individual show to include a canter on each rein.

Class 14 (Open Ridden) requires two photographs - one from the side and one from in front (with or without a rider) and a short video showing your individual show to include a canter on each rein, an extension/gallop on one rein is optional.

Class 15 & 16 (Utility Pony) requires a video of the pony undertaking as many of the obstacles as possible. You'll need to be creative in building your obstacles with what equipment you have available to you – any queries, please contact the Show Secretary. You'll need to upload two photographs as a requirement of the host website, but these will not be included in the judging.

Class 17 (Best Mascot) requires two photographs that show your mascot's personality and a video which shows why your mascot should win this class!

Upload your photographs and videos to our show on www.ShowingScene.com.

The judges will be able to remotely log into the website in order to view your photographs and videos after the closing date and place them accordingly. All entries will be anonymous to the judge.
