For anyone wishing to become a member of Garstang & District Agricultural & Horticultural Society, you may either purchase a Membership online or through an application form to our Show Secretary. Individual Memberships are available at £20.00 and include admission to the Show and Members' Marquee.

TICKETING

All exhibitors will be required to have an e-ticket or wristband to gain entry to the show field. Adult exhibitors whose entry fees total £10 or more (£9 for Sheep exhibitors) or children whose entry fees total £1 or more (unless otherwise stated) will receive an exhibitor's e-ticket to the showground per £10 spent, up to a maximum of 5 tickets.

Additional prepaid e-tickets can be purchased at the time of class entry (maximum 4 per exhibitor) at £10 for adults (£15 on gate) and £3 for children aged 3 and over (£5 on gate). Children under 3 are admitted free of charge and do not require a ticket. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to bring a valid e-ticket or wristband with them on the day.

GENERAL REMARKS AND STIPULATIONS

Exhibitors are responsible for complying with all regulations from all statutory bodies including all movement licenses and restrictions. We also reserve the right to cancel any classes or indeed the show, should it be necessary. Refunds will not be made. Exhibitors enter the show field at their own risk. The Garstang Agricultural & Horticultural Society and its members, secretary and directors accept no responsibility for any losses incurred on the show field. Exhibitors should ensure that they have adequate insurance.

HEAVY HORSE SPECIFIC REMARKS AND STIPULATIONS

Entry Fees for Classes 1 to 14 - First entry £8.00 subsequent entries £7.50

Entry Fee for Class 15 (HOYS) - £10.00 plus £16.00 HOYS Contribution

All exhibitors MUST be members of their respective Heavy Horse Society and all animals must be registered or eligible for registration.

RULES & REGULATIONS

All Exhibitors who enter shall be considered to have read the following Rules & Regulations as laid down by the Show Committee. Anything not covered but brought into question will be decided by the relevant authority.

The decision of the Show Chairman & Committee will be final.

1. Entries must be lodged in a proper manner on the enclosed form, signed by the Exhibitor an authorized agent, and complying in full with these Regulations and any other conditions as may be specified in the current Rule books of Societies to which this Show has affiliated.
2. Animals must be entered under the name by which they are registered with their Breed Society (if applicable) and the name of the Owner(s) must be stated if different from the Exhibitor.
3. The appropriate Entry Fee MUST accompany the entry and must be received by the Closing Date. Entry Fees will only be refunded on receipt of a Veterinary Certificate. £5.00 will be retained from cancelled entries for administration charges. Entries will not be accepted by telephone – POSTAL ENTRIES or ENTRIES ONLINE at www.garstangshow.org Changes to Entries must be received in writing before the Closing Date.
4. The Society reserves the right to refuse or cancel any entry already accepted without any reason for so doing. Should this occur, refund of Entry Fees shall be at the discretion of the relevant Committee.
5. Stallions MUST NOT be led by Juniors who have not attained their 14th birthday before 1st January, 2022.
6. Any animal deemed to be out of control or presenting danger to other exhibits must be removed from the ring at the request of the Judge, Steward or Committee.
7. The Committee, any of its Officers, Assistants & stewards shall not in any way be responsible for any loss, injury or damage that may happen to exhibitors or their assistants, or any other members of the public or to any animal or property, or to any vehicle brought into the showground or to any premises used in conjunction with the show, or while entering or leaving the same.
8. Exhibitors shall be responsible for the behavior of their assistants & riders/handlers & all persons in charge of exhibits shall be subject to the orders of Stewards or Judges.
9. DOGS – All dogs must be kept on a lead at all times. Please clean up after your dog.
10. OBJECTIONS shall be made in writing with the Objector's full name & address within 1 hour of the class concerned and lodged at the General Secretary's Office together with the sum of £50 deposit. The sum will be refunded if the objection is sustained, but if it is not sustained the deposit will be forfeited to the funds of Garstang & District Agricultural & Horticultural Society. The Committee reserves the right to refer the objection to the Society or Association under whose rules the class is being run.
11. It is strongly recommended that all exhibitors carry adequate Public Liability Insurance. The Society does not accept any liability for any injury or damage sustained by any third party whatsoever.
12. The Judge's decision is FINAL. The Committee reserves the right to substitute, add or remove any Judge from any class or championship.
13. The number of animals which will give an individual show in any class shall be entirely the decision of the Judge(s).
14. All animals must be sound. All Judges have the right to request an examination of an animal by the Official Veterinary Surgeon. If, in his / her opinion the animal is not deemed fit to continue, it will be led from the ring & will not be presented for judging in any ring for the remainder of the day.
15. DISEASE - Any animal found to be suffering from any contagious or infectious disease shall be removed from the showground immediately at the request of the Official Veterinary Surgeon. Any animal found to be affected in this manner will be further disqualified from competing & must be removed from the show field by the exhibitor without delay.
16. FLU VACCINATIONS - It is recommended that all exhibitors ensure that horses & ponies have an up to date certificate of vaccination against equine flu which should be available for examination if required. FULL PASSPORT MUST ACCOMPANY EVERY EQUINE IN TRANSIT.
17. There will be NO provision of Farrier services on the field. Exhibitors are recommended to ensure all farrier work is carried out prior to the show.
18. NO MUCKING OUT ON THE FIELD – Please take home all waste – livestock will be returning to graze the field within 2 days of the show.
19. Competitors are requested NOT to telephone the Show Office with queries concerning times of commencement of classes or numbers of entries. This information WILL NOT BE GIVEN due to pressure of time. Please allow plenty of time for your arrival prior to your first class.

All Entry Forms must be completed in full. HOYS Declaration Forms must accompany entries to Class 15.

Young Handler Accumulator Competition

The Shire Horse Society will once again be running the SHS Young Handler's Accumulator Award in 2022. Points relative to placings will be awarded to those young handlers who are 2022 members of the Shire Horse Society. The winner will be announced at the end of the year. Points will be awarded to the top five, with points awarded as follows - 1st-5 points, 2nd-4 points, 3rd- 3 points, 4th-2 points, and 5th- 1 point.

The Champion Young Handler with the most points at the end of the year will win the trophy.

Affiliated shows must submit the results of the Young Handler classes when they submit their Silver Spoon award forms.

Those taking part in the above should be Junior members of the Society and are able to join mid-season if they are not already members. Points will only count once membership is taken up and points will not be back dated. Junior memberships are £12 per annum and are open to those aged from 12 years to those that have not attained their 18th birthday.

15.	BRITISH RIDDEN HEAVY HORSE OF THE YEAR - HOYS QUALIFIER

This class is a qualifier for the Horse of the Year Show, NEC, Birmingham, 5th - 9th October 2022.

This competition is open to purebred mares, geldings and stallions 4 years old and over that are registered in the main British Stud Books of the Shire, Clydesdale, Suffolk or British Percheron Society at the time of qualification. Part-breds are not eligible to compete.

All Riders and Owners must be Members of either the Shire Horse Society, The Clydesdale Horse Society, The Suffolk Horse Society or British Percheron Horse Society.

This class will be run in accordance with the British Ridden Heavy Horse Society guidelines, which for the avoidance of doubt will be considered rules for Horse of the Year Show and its qualifiers, however the general rules as set out within this rulebook will take precedence, a copy of which can be downloaded from www.hoys.co.uk.

This is a Horse of the Year Show Qualifier, all data given upon entry of this class is provided to Grandstand Media Limited and stored on the Grandstand Entries System. For full policy details please visit www.grandstandentries.com.

Additional Rules as follows:

- i) Qualification will not pass below 5th place.
- ii) Horses will be required to gallop at the final.
- iii) Riders of stallions must have obtained their 16th Birthday before 1st January in the current year.
- iv) Horses must be entered in the name and ownership they are registered.
- v) Horses should be turned out in a traditional manner as per their breed society rules, flights/standings are not permitted.
- vi) For Clydesdale horses, they are to hold a Clydesdale Horse Society passport with full pedigree details, stallions and mares are to appear in the main section of the Clydesdale Horse stud book. Geldings are to have appeared as produce of their dam if they have not been issued with a Clydesdale Horse Society Passport.

Judging Guidelines:

- i) Ride judges may be selected from the BSHA full judge's panel or one of the appropriate Heavy Horse Breed Panels (Suffolk Horse Society, Clydesdale Horse Society, The Shire Horse Society and The British Percheron Horse Society).
- ii) Conformation judge to be selected from those on one or more of the appropriate Heavy Horse Breed Panels (Suffolk Horse Society, Clydesdale Horse Society, The Shire Horse Society and The British Percheron Horse Society).
- iii) Judges may only judge one qualifier during the current year.
- iv) At the final marks must be awarded in the following way. **Qualifiers will be marked in the following way:**

Ride - 50 maximum

Breed type and conformation - 50 maximum

In the case of equality, the horse with the highest conformation mark will be deemed the winner. If there still be equality at this point, then the judges' decision will be final.

Qualification will be verified by the Horse of the Year Show office.
