TICKETING

All exhibitors will be required to have an e-ticket or wristband to gain entry to the show field. Adult exhibitors whose entry fees total £10 or more (£9 for Sheep exhibitors) or children whose entry fees total £1 or more (unless otherwise stated) will receive an exhibitor's e-ticket to the showground per £10 spent, up to a maximum of 5 tickets.

Additional prepaid e-tickets can be purchased at the time of class entry (maximum 4 per exhibitor) at £10 for adults (£15 on gate) and £3 for children aged 3 and over (£5 on gate). Children under 3 are admitted free of charge and do not require a ticket. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to bring a valid e-ticket or wristband with them on the day.

GENERAL REMARKS AND STIPULATIONS

Exhibitors are responsible for complying with all regulations from all statutory bodies including all movement licenses and restrictions. We also reserve the right to cancel any classes or indeed the show, should it be necessary. Refunds will not be made. Exhibitors enter the show field at their own risk. The Garstang Agricultural & Horticultural Society and its members, secretary and directors accept no responsibility for any losses incurred on the show field. Exhibitors should ensure that they have adequate insurance.

Any exhibitors wishing to donate their produce to be sold off for show funds should mark their entry form accordingly. RECIPE FOR CLASS 247 - Bagels

500g bread flour, 7g dried yeast, 1 teaspoon caster sugar, 1 teaspoon salt, 250g warm water

Mix dry ingredients, make a well and mix to a dough with the water. You may need to add a little more water if mixture too dry. Cover with clean tea towel. Prove for 1 hour in a warm place.

Divide into 8 pieces and shape into rounds. Push a hole through the middle of each. Boil the kettle. Preheat the oven to gas mark 6/ 200c.

Boil each side for about 45 seconds. Lightly oil and sprinkle with salt, caraway or sesame seeds if you like. Bake for 20 minutes on a sheet of baking parchment. Cool on a wire rack.
