Rules & Regulations of the Show

All Exhibitors who enter shall be considered to have read the following Rules & Regulations as laid down by the Show Committee. Anything not covered but brought into question will be decided by the relevant authority.

The decision of the Show Chairman & Committee will be final.

- 1) Entries must be lodged in a proper manner on the enclosed form, signed by the Exhibitor an authorized agent, and complying in full with these Regulations and any other conditions as may be specified in the current Rule books of Societies to which this Show has affiliated.
- 2) Animals must be entered under the name by which they are registered with their Breed Society (if applicable) and the name of the Owner(s) must be stated if different from the Exhibitor.
- 3) The appropriate Entry Fee MUST accompany the entry and must be received by the Closing Date. Entry Fees will only be refunded on receipt of a Veterinary Certificate. £5.00 will be retained from cancelled entries for administration charges. **Entries will not be accepted by telephone POSTAL ENTRIES or ENTRIES ONLINE at www.garstangshow.org** Changes to Entries must be received in writing before the Closing Date.
- 4) The Society reserves the right to refuse or cancel any entry already accepted without any reason for so doing. Should this occur, refund of Entry Fees shall be at the discretion of the relevant Committee.
- 5) Stallions MUST NOT be led by Juniors who have not attained their 14th birthday before 1st January, 2023.
- 6) Any animal deemed to be out of control or presenting danger to other exhibits must be removed from the ring at the request of the Judge, Steward or Committee.
- 7) The Committee, any of its Officers, Assistants & stewards shall not in any way be responsible for any loss, injury or damage that may happen to exhibitors or their assistants, or any other members of the public or to any animal or property, or to any vehicle brought into the showground or to any premises used in conjunction with the show, or while entering or leaving the same.
- 8) Exhibitors shall be responsible for the behavior of their assistants & riders/handlers & all persons in charge of exhibits shall be subject to the orders of Stewards or Judges.
- 9) DOGS All dogs must be kept on a lead at all times. Please clean up after your dog.
- 10) OBJECTIONS shall be made in writing with the Objector's full name & address within 1 hour of the class concerned and lodged at the General Secretary's Office together with the sum of £50 deposit. The sum will be refunded if the objection is sustained, but if it is not sustained the deposit will be forfeited to the funds of Garstang & District Agricultural & Horticultural Society. The Committee reserves the right to refer the objection to the Society or Association under whose rules the class is being run.
- 11) It is strongly recommended that all exhibitors carry adequate Public Liability Insurance. The Society does not accept any liability for any injury or damage sustained by any third party whatsoever.
- 12) The Judge's decision is FINAL. The Committee reserves the right to substitute, add or remove any Judge from any class or championship.
- 13) The number of animals which will give an individual show in any class shall be entirely the decision of the Judge(s).
- 14) All animals must be sound. All Judges have the right to request an examination of an animal by the Official Veterinary Surgeon. If, in his / her opinion the animal is not deemed fit to continue, it will be led from the ring & will not be presented for judging in any ring for the remainder of the day.
- 15) DISEASE Any animal found to be suffering from any contagious or infectious disease shall be removed from the showground immediately at the request of the Official Veterinary Surgeon. Any animal found to be affected in this manner will be further disqualified from competing & must be removed from the show field by the exhibitor without delay.
- 16) FLU VACCINATIONS It is recommended that all exhibitors ensure that horses & ponies have an up to date certificate of vaccination against equine flu which should be available for examination if required. FULL PASSPORT MUST ACCOMPANY EVERY EQUINE IN TRANSIT.
- 17) There will be NO provision of Farrier services on the field. Exhibitors are recommended to ensure all farrier work is carried out prior to the show.
- 18) NO MUCKING OUT ON THE FIELD Please take home all waste livestock will be returning to graze the field within 2 days of the show.
- 19) Competitors are requested NOT to telephone the Show Office with queries concerning times of commencement of classes or numbers of entries. This information WILL NOT BE GIVEN due to pressure of time. Please allow plenty of time for your arrival prior to your first class.

All Entry Forms must be completed in full.

EXHIBITORS' PASSES: Exhibitor numbers, e-tickets and horsebox passes will be sent PRIOR to the show. If you have not received these by Wednesday 30th July please contact the Secretary.

One e-ticket will be issued to each exhibitor, further e-tickets will be issued at the discretion of the Secretary for larger numbers of exhibits. Further discounted e-tickets can be purchased when entering at a cost of £10.00 each for adults - Max. 4 (£15 on the gate) and £3 for children over 3 years of age.

PLEASE NOTE: ALL EXHIBITORS MUST HAVE A PRINTED E-TICKET WITH THEM OR THEY WILL NOT BE PERMITTED ONTO THE SHOWGROUND UNLESS THEY PRODUCE PAYMENT FOR THE FULL GATE PRICE.

The Organizers of this Show have taken all reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and to prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the Organizers and all Officials and Stewards.

Throughout the duration of the show Lanes Veterinary, Green Lane are the Society's on duty vets - should any Horse require emergency care by our named Vets, the exhibitor of that animal will be expected to cover this cost.

All gas cylinders used on site must adhere to all safety regulations.

Should your vehicle/s and/or equipment require towing onto/ from the show field in the event of inclement weather, the trustees, organizing committee, nor any of their servants shall be held responsible for any loss, injury or damage sustained by the applicants, their property, or their assistants. The Society accepts no liability whatsoever and should the applicant not agree to the terms then they will be left to organize their own entrance/exit onto the show field.

Exhibitors enter the show field at their own risk. The Garstang Agricultural & Horticultural Society and its members, secretary and directors accept no responsibility for any losses incurred on the show field. Exhibitors must have Public Liability Insurance which covers which covers them when away from the holding.

SILVER-PLATED SPOONS AND ROSETTES FOR MARES, FILLIES AND STALLIONS

The Shire Horse Society is pleased to award to any Affiliated Society, a Spoon and Rosette for the Best Mare or Filly and a Spoon and Rosette for the Best Stallion at their Annual Show.

Conditions of the Award are as follows: -

- 1. A Spoon and a Rosette for the Best Mare or Filly and a Spoon and Rosette for the Best Stallion (providing there is a separate class(es) for Stallions) exhibited in the Shire classes.
- 2. The winner of the Special Prize must be a member of the Shire Horse Society.
- 3. Entries cannot be accepted at Affiliated Shows in classes for Shires or Heavy Horses from any person who has been either suspended or removed from membership of the Shire Horse Society or has been excluded from exhibiting for prizes at Shows, Sales or Exhibitions or from taking part in any Show organized by the Shire Horse Society.
- 4. No animal to be eligible to take more than one Silver Spoon during any one year. The Shire Horse Society Spring Show being excepted.
- 5. THE WINNING ANIMAL MUST BE REGISTERED OR ELIGIBLE FOR REGISTRATION IN THE STUD BOOK OR GRADE B REGISTER.
- 6. The Judge invited to officiate must be on the Society's Official Panel and has the right to withhold the award of the Silver Spoon and Rosette if an exhibit does not show sufficient merit.
- 7. The Council reserves the right in offering Spoons, to award them only to persons approved by the Shire Horse Society.

Young Handler Accumulator Competition

The Shire Horse Society will once again be running the SHS Young Handler's Accumulator Award in 2025. Points relative to placings will be awarded to those young handlers who are 2025 members of the Shire Horse Society. The winner will be announced at the end of the year. Points will be awarded to the top five, with points awarded as follows:-1st-5 points, 2nd-4 points, 3rd-3 points, 4th-2 points, and 5th-1 point.

The Champion Young Handler with the most points at the end of the year will win the trophy.

Affiliated shows must submit the results of the Young Handler classes when they submit their Silver Spoon award forms.

Those taking part in the above should be Junior members of the Society and are able to join mid-season if they are not already members. Points will only count once membership is taken up and points will not be back dated. Junior memberships are £12 per annum and are open to those aged from 12 years to those that have not attained their 18th birthday.
