In the event of 30 or more starters the class will be split and two sets of prize money awarded. Horses (or ponies in pony competitions) may compete in one section only.

Foxhunter:

- (a) For registered horses in Grade C that have not won a total of 700 points. Four double clears will qualify in accordance with rule 310.6
- (b) For all registered horses born on or after 1 January 2016, irrespective of points. Horses will be eligible for double clear qualification to attend second rounds providing they reach the age of seven years or under in the same calendar year as the Foxhunter Final in accordance with rule 310.6 Four double clears will qualify. Four double clears will qualify for the Senior Foxhunter Second Rounds.

Qualifying period: The Senior Foxhunter Second Round qualifying period for the 2023 second rounds is 1 May '23 – 30 April '24 (subject to revision). Those horses that have qualified for the Senior Foxhunter Championship in 2022 are not eligible for qualification to the 2023 Championship.

Rule 274. Table A - speed 375mpm - Start Height 1.15m - 1.30m Joker Fence - 1.45m Limited to 30 Entries - Drawn Order

Eight obstacles which are progressively more difficult. No combination obstacles are allowed. The progressive difficulty is not solely due to the height and spread of the obstacles but also to the difficulty of the track. Points are awarded as follows:

One point for obstacle No 1 cleared, two points for No 2, three points for No 3 etc, with a total of 36 points.

No point is awarded for an obstacle knocked down. Faults other than knock-downs are penalized as for Table A and any of these faults, including time faults are converted into points and deducted from any jumping points scored.

In the event of equality of points for first place, there will be a jump-off against the clock over a shortened course, over obstacles that may be increased in height and/or spread. The obstacles in the jump-off must be jumped in the same order as in the first round and retain their respective points allotted in the first round.

This competition may also take place directly against the clock.

For the last obstacle of the course, an alternative obstacle may be provided, of which one part may be designated the Joker. The Joker must be more difficult than the alternative obstacle and carry double points. If the Joker is knocked down, the points must be deducted from the total.

Class 16 (Novice Working Hunter) qualifiers for MIDARC UK National Championships on 28th August 2023

Class 20 qualifies for the BSHA Supreme of the Year Finals at the BSHA National Championships. The highest placed unqualified exhibit in each Open Affiliated class will qualify to compete in the BSHA Supreme of Year Final. The Finals will be held at the BSHA Hunter & National Championship Shows in September 2023. Held under the rules of the British Show Horse Association. Owners, Riders, In-Hand Handlers & Horses must be registered or have temporary membership with a Day Ticket. Horses registered with the Association must be Owned, Exhibited and Ridden by current BSHA Members. Riders must be 15 years of age or older. Non-Members may purchase up to a maximum of 2 Day Tickets and two Show Tickets per Exhibitor, per Horse, per Rider, per season. Horses registered on a Day / Show Ticket do not require a JMB height certificate. Competitors can apply for a Day / Show Ticket by applying online on the BSHA website.

This Show is affiliated to **EQUIFEST**, taking place at the **Arena UK**, **Grantham**, **LincoInshire on** the 2nd – 5th **August 2023**. The <u>two</u> highest placed eligible exhibits not already qualified in classes 15a and b, 17, 19 and 20 will qualify.

CLASS 18. TATTERSALLS ROR FORMER RACEHORSE CHALLENGE 2023

RoR eligibility: Horses must have raced in GB. Horses must have current RoR Competition Membership and riders must be 15 years old on the 1st of January of the current year. Mare or gelding 4yrs old or over and of any height. Horses to be ridden in any suitable bridle and should be plaited. Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series.

The first three go forward to the Final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships at Aintree in August 2023. The Series Champion automatically qualifies for the RoR Ridden Show Series Supreme Championship at Aintree.

The judge will NOT ride. Horses may be stripped for confirmation at the discretion of the judge. Competitors must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap. All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force. The class to be judged 50% jumping, 20% Style while jumping and performance and 30% awarded for show, manners and suitability to be retrained.

PHASE 1: Jumping to be judged: 8 rustic jumps 90cm to 100cm with a maximum spread of 95cm. The following points to be deducted at the end of each jumping round: 10 points to be deducted for a knock down. 15 points to be deducted for a refusal. 20 points for second refusal. Elimination for third refusal or fall.

PHASE 2: Class returns without boots and judged for an individual show/conformation. (In some classes, at the judge's discretion, horses might be asked to do a 'show' following their jumping without leaving the ring. This is often the case with a large number in the class).

Each horse to complete an individual show of no longer than 1 ½ minutes. Show to include the following movements: Walk, Trot, canter showing change of leg, extended canter (gallop) halt and stand, walk off on long rein. Total marks out of 30% for Show, manners and suitability to be retrained. Fences for the final at Aintree will be up to a maximum of 1.05 metre.

HORSE SECTION RULES AND CONDITIONS

- 1. HEALTH AND SAFETY: The Organisers of this event have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective everyone must take reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey all signs and the instructions of the Organiser, Officials and Stewards.
- 2. COVID-19 REGULATIONS: All exhibitors and other persons admitted to the Showground shall be subject to any COVID-19 regulations applicable at the time of the Show and any additional regulations advised by the Society. Exhibitors will be notified of these prior to attending the Show.

3. CONDITIONS:

- **2.1** The organisers reserve the right to eliminate or refuse any entry or limit the number of entries in any class and to cancel, merge or alter any class.
- 2.2 All jumping classes will be run under current British Show Jumping rules.
- **2.3** The organisers will not be responsible for any accident or loss of property or otherwise arising from any cause connected with the show and it is a condition of entry that each competitor shall hold the organisers blameless and shall indemnify them against any loss, damage or legal proceedings.
- **2.4** No entry fee will be refunded in any class without the submission of a valid Doctor/Veterinary Surgeons certificate.
- **2.5** Every exhibitor making entries for the show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by these Rules and it is on this understanding only those entries are accepted.
- **4. EQUINE PASSPORTS:** All horses entering the showground **MUST** have a valid equine passport with them. Inspections of passports may be carried out.
- 5. EQUINE INFLUENZA & TETANUS: Equine Influenza and Tetanus vaccinations are a compulsory requirement for all horses attending the Hanbury Countryside Show. Vaccinations certificates may be subject to spot checks by the Society's appointed Veterinary Surgeons. The Society's Veterinary Surgeons may carry out random checks of the horse lines. The Stewards, at the direction of the Society's Veterinary Surgeons, are empowered to require any horse or pony showing clinical signs of equine influenza to be immediately removed from the showground.
 - **VACCINATION PROTOCOL:** The requirement for the first 3 vaccinations is as follows: the first 2 vaccinations 21 92 days apart, a third booster between 150 215 days, and an annual booster vaccination within 365 days thereafter. No horse should enter competitions within 7 days of an EI vaccination. Foals should commence vaccinations at 6 months old. This Rule may be subject to change from guidance from the FEI/BEF and any changes will be notified via the Showing Council and ASAO websites.
- 6. DISEASED ANIMALS: Every exhibitor shall indemnify the Society against all actions, claims, proceedings and demands by any person, company or other representative body of whatsoever nature in respect of any matter, directly or indirectly connected with the bringing onto the Society's showground of any animal which may have been suffering from any contagious or infectious disease or which develops such a disease whilst on the showground and in addition the exhibitor shall pay all costs and expenses incurred by the Society in connection with any such claim. The Society's Veterinary Officers are authorised to refuse permission for any animal to be admitted to or have removed from the showground any animals affected with contagious or infectious disease. The exhibitor or such animal may obtain a certificate from the Show Secretary, stating the nature of such disease or infection. The onus of proving the freedom of any such animal from contagious or infectious disease shall rest on the exhibitor of the animal concerned.
- **7. BIOSECURITY:** We urge all owners to adhere to strict biosecurity protocols at all times. Please remember "BE SEEN TO BE CLEAN".
- 8. OFFICIALS DECISIONS: The Committee, or officials appointed by them, shall be empowered to disqualify and demand the removal from the showground of any animal which, in their opinion, is suffering from or affected with, a contagious or infectious disease or is considered dangerous. All

entrance fees for such animals will be forfeited. If an animal is deemed to be unfit for competing by the Society's appointed veterinary surgeon; they reserve the right to deny entry to the ring and can request that animal/s be removed from the showground. The Society's veterinary officer's decision is final

- 9. CONDUCT OF EXHIBITORS AND THEIR EMPLOYEES: All persons in charge of animals will be subject to the instruction of the Society's appointed officials. Exhibitors will be held responsible for the behaviour of their employees and for the consequence of any misconduct of such employees. Should Security deem an exhibitor or their employee's behaviour to fall below that expected by the Societies appointed officials that person or persons will be escorted from the showground.
- **10. ANIMAL WELFARE:** The Society expects all exhibitors to observe best practice at all times.
- **11.APPOINTED VETERINARY SURGEON:** A Veterinary Surgeon will be available all day on the showground. If, for whatever reason, they may be required please inform a steward and they will get the vet to you. The owner/exhibitor is responsible for the cost of any veterinary advice and/or treatment and agrees to indemnify the Society in respect of that cost.

- 15. THE JUDGE'S DECISION IS FINAL.
- **16. OBJECTION PROTOCOL:** Any objection or protest to be lodged with the Horse Secretary within 30 minutes of the event in writing, together with the sum of £100 as deposit, such amount to be forfeited if the objection is overruled. The matter will be referred to the objection panel. Objections may not be settled on the day. Objections will be handled following the BS Rule Book.
- **17. JUDGES**: Should a Judge be unable to officiate, a substitute will be appointed. Any judge substitutions will be listed on the website and at the horse secretaries' trailer.
- **18. AGE REGULATIONS:** Horses and ponies must be over four years of age on the day of the show if taking part in ridden classes. All ages to be taken from 1st January unless otherwise stated.
- **19. ENTRY FEES:** Entry fees vary, all fees are stated in the Schedule. The Society is VAT registered. Receipts available on request. Failure to exhibit any animal entered will entail forfeiture of entry fees.
- **20. PRIZE MONEY** that is not collected in horse rings can be collected on Show day from the Secretaries trailer; before 5.30pm. Prize money not collected at the Show will be deemed a donation to the Society.
- 21. PASSES & TICKETS: All entries to be made in advance unless otherwise stated. Show entrance tickets will be emailed. On arrival at the Showground please go to the Secretaries to collect your number/s.
- 22. TIMETABLE OF CLASSES: available from www.hanburyshow.co.uk
- **23. ACCESSING THE SHOWGROUND:** It is recommended to set off in good time before your class/s are scheduled to start. Please follow the yellow AA directional signs.
- **24. DOGS:** Dogs are welcome, however they must be kept under control & on a short lead at all times. Please ensure all dog waste is picked up and placed in the bins provided.
- **25. STALLIONS:** Stallions must have a red, white and blue ribbon displayed on their tail and a disc on their bridle. The owner/handler must take all precautions to ensure the safety of fellow competitors and the general public.
- **26. DRESS CODE:** Grooms/Attendants appearing with animals in judging rings must be of smart appearance and in proper dress code (not jeans), with appropriate headwear.
- 27. NO LUNGEING

- 28. HAT REGULATIONS: Any person riding a horse/pony anywhere on the showground is to wear a correctly fitted hat and ensure the chin strap is properly fastened and adjusted. The Society advises hats of the standard PAS 015: 1998 or 2011, VG1 01-04: 2014-12 provided they are BSI Kitemarked or Inspec IC marked, unless otherwise stated by their appropriate governing body. Exhibitors are advised to wear a correctly fitted hard hat whilst handling horses/ponies.
- **29. BODY PROTECTORS & FOOTWARE:** The wearing of a correctly fitting body protector is advised for adults and strongly recommended for under 16s. Correct and appropriate footwear with heels must be worn.
- **30. TROPHIES:** All trophy winners must sign for them at the secretary's trailer before leaving the showground. All trophies, unless stated, are perpetual and are to be held for the period between shows. Trophies must be returned cleaned, in good condition and returned no less than six weeks before the Show. Trophies must be insured guidance available from Trophy Secretary. Please note some trophies cannot be removed from the showground and will be retained by the Society. These trophies are available for photographs.
- **31. CANCELLATIONS:** If the Show is cancelled due to poor weather (where the field is considered unusable by the committee) or any other reason outside the Society's control, the Society will refund the entry fee minus £2.50 to cover administration costs.
- **32. DATA STORAGE**: Information from entry forms may be stored on computer; information about results may also be published and/or provided to the Press and Breed Societies for publication. Information about exhibitors and their animals may also be provided to DEFRA, Trading Standards, Depts. of County Councils, BCMS, SAC, and others having regulatory functions as well as the Society's Veterinary, Environmental Health, Legal and Safety Advisers. The making of an entry is irrevocable consent for the storage and disclosure of information in this way.
- **33. BHSA AMATEUR DEFINITION:** To be classed as a BSHA Amateur, competitors must not: Engage in breeding, livery, buying, selling, dealing or hiring horses in a commercial capacity, or as a means of deriving a main source of income.
 - Receive remuneration, whether it be monetary or goods in kind, for employment in the connection with horses in racing, showing, livery stable or riding school (instruction at Pony Club and Riding Club excepted). This does not include the suppliers of ancillary services such as farriers and vets.
 - Own/Part own an equestrian establishment including but not limited to riding schools, events centre, stud or livery yard in any capacity, or receive any form of remuneration for employment at an equestrian establishment. For the avoidance of doubt for the purpose of this rule, immediate family members of an owner or part owner of an equestrian establishment who work or are howsoever otherwise engaged or involved in any capacity, whether or not for remuneration at the equestrian establishment, will be treated as being an owner or part owner of that equestrian establishment.
 - Show a Horse owned or sponsored by a company or a commercial firm, or act as a Brand Ambassador, in any showing classes, BSHA or otherwise, or a Horse for which his/her immediate family accepts livery or training charges from a person outside the immediate family concerned. A member is not eligible to compete in Amateur classes on an Exhibit, which has been ridden by a Professional Rider in any Open classes, BSHA or otherwise, with the exception of Open Working Show Horse and Side Saddle classes, during the current year and the previous year. If an Amateur wishes to ride/compete on behalf of another Amateur, who is not an immediate family member, then this should be declared with the BSHA office who will decide whether to sanction the request or refer to the board for a decision. (This will not apply if a ride is offered by an Amateur that may have more than one horse in a Championship). If you do not disclose to the office that you ride/compete equines on a regular basis, which you do not stable at home, your Amateur status will be reviewed by the Board, if you ride/compete multiple equines or ride regularly for one or more owners, you could be deemed professional and your amateur status will be revoked. In some instances, a 'Statement of Fact' will be required from the member on request of the Board. Amateur Owner/Rider: Open to horses owned and ridden by an Amateur, (the rider need not be the owner of the horse). Horses either kept in a professional producers yard or at home where a full, or part time, groom is employed. A member is not eligible to compete in Amateur Classes on an Exhibit, which has been ridden by a Professional Producer or Groom (as

deemed by the BSHA) in any OPEN classes, BSHA or otherwise, with the exception of open working horse and side saddle classes, during the current year and the previous year. On the day that a horse is competing in Amateur classes, non-amateurs, Professional Producers and Professional Grooms (deemed as such by the BSHA) are NOT allowed to compete the Amateur Exhibit, the same day in ANY classes (BSHA or otherwise). Because of the professional involvement, these horses may not compete in Home Produced Classes. No Professional Producers or Professional Grooms (deemed as such by the BSHA) are allowed to ride, work in (in any form), compete, or enter the ring to groom/strip the horse. Amateur Home Produced: Open to Horses that are either stabled at Home or in a DIY yard (assisted livery accepted) and which since the 1st of January in the current year, have not been shown by a professional during the current season, or stabled in a professional yard at any time in the current year. To be ridden by an Amateur only. This does not exclude Amateur Home Produced Riders having lessons at any time with an instructor, providing the Horse remains stabled at home. Amateur Home-Produced Horses are eligible for Amateur classes. No Professional Producers or Professional Grooms (deemed as such by the BSHA) are allowed into the ring to groom/strip the Horse.
