Staging of Exhibits:

Friday 5th July 2024

Entries may arrive between 5.00pm and 7.00pm. Importantly, exhibitors wishing to directly unload into the marquee from their vehicles must do so on the Friday, there will be NO vehicular access to the marquee on the Saturday.

Saturday 6th July 2024

Entry declarations will be taken between 8.00am and 8.45am (strictly). All exhibits arriving on the Saturday will have to be carried from the public car park as no cars will be admitted onto the showground.

Judging:

Judging will commence at 9.00am. The marquee will be closed whilst the judging is being carried out. The marquee will open to the public at approximately 11.30am, after the judging has been completed.

General Information and Regulations

- 1. Entry Fees: Classes 1 to 56 are £1.00 per exhibit per class. Classes 57 to 65 are 25p per exhibit per class.
- 2. Prize Money: 1st £5.00, 2nd £2.00, 3rd £1.00 (unless otherwise stated). Prize cards awarded to fourth place.
- 3. There will be a prize giving at 4.30pm. At this point, the marquee will only be open to exhibitors and their guests.
- 4. Please collect prize money after the prizegiving (5.00pm approx.). Prize money will not be awarded subsequent to the show. Uncollected prize money will be deemed a donation to charity.
- 5. Exhibitors who qualify for trophies may be asked for a deposit in order that they may be removed from the showground.
- 6. Entries: **ONLINE ENTRIES ONLY**. Entries close on Monday 1st July 2024. Some classes may close sooner if the limit on numbers is reached. Early entry is advised to avoid disappointment.
- 7. Exhibitors may only enter two exhibits in one single class.
- Exhibitors entering Six or more exhibits will receive **One** free Show Ticket and exhibitors entering Twelve or more exhibits will receive **Two** free Show Tickets (This applies to classes 1 to 56). Children under 16years enter the Show For Free (No free wickets will be issued to entries for classes 58 – 65).
- 9. The Committee have the right to refuse entries.
- 10. The Judges decision is final.
- 11. Protests or objections to be made in writing by the Exhibitor to the Show Secretary by 13.30pm on the day of the Show, accompanied by a deposit of £20, returnable if the objection is held.
- 12. ALL ENTRIES ARE FOR EXHIBITION ONLY AND NO ARTICLE MAY BE SOLD.
- 13. Exhibitors are responsible for their exhibits.
- 14. The Society will employ overnight and Show day security; all precautions possible will be taken to try and safeguard exhibits. However, The Hanbury Countryside Show Society accepts no responsibility for loss or damage to exhibits or any loss of property belonging to the exhibitor.
- 15. All exhibits in sections 4 and 5 and classes 57, 60 and 63 must be sealed or covered by cling film.
- 16. No dogs allowed in the marquee, except for assistance dogs.

No exhibitors' packs will be posted. All correspondence will be via email. Your exhibit numbers can be collected from the Horticultural Section Stewards upon arrival to the marquee.

SCHEDULE 2024

HANBURY HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY CHALLENGE CUP will be awarded to the exhibitor gaining the highest number of place points in Horticultural and Homecraft classes.
Points will be awarded as follows: 1st – 4 points, 2nd – 3 points, 3rd – 2 points, 4th – 1 point.
In the event of two or more competitors gaining equal points the trophy will be awarded to the competitor with the highest number of first prizes.

Section 1: Produce

Judge: Mr B. Oliver

The Vernon Rose Bowl - will be awarded to the 'Best In Section'

- Class 1 4 Potatoes of one variety
- Class 2 3 Stalks of Rhubarb
- Class 3 8 Raspberries
- Class 4 A Vase of Mixed Herbs (at least 3 different sorts)
- Class 5 8 Gooseberries
- Class 6 Basket of Vegetables (at least 4 different varieties, basket no bigger than 40cm x 40cm
- Class 7 Broad Beans (any variety)
- Class 8 Any other produce (please state what type of produce on entry form)

Section 2: Flowers

All flowers must be in water, in a suitable container. Maximum footprint of any vase is 20cmx20cm

- Class 9 A Vase of One Kind of Flowering Shrub
- Class 10 A Vase of Mixed Garden Flowers
- Class 11 Vase of Sweet Peas
- Class 12 1 Single Rose, with a single flower
- Class 13 1 Single Rose, with multiple flowers
- Class 14 5 Different Roses
- Class 15 Any other flower(s) not covered in classes 9-14

Section 3: Floral Art Judges: Ms A. Brian & Mrs J Harper

The Bearcroft Cup will be awarded to the 'Best In Section'

Unless otherwise stated, competitors will be allocated a 60cm x 60cm staging space. No max height. Competitors are strongly encouraged to use biodegradable alternatives to florist foam.

- Class 17 Miniature Arrangement, not to exceed 12cm in any direction
- Class 18 An arrangement in a Basket
- Class 19 A Table Arrangement for a circular table

- Class 22 Novice Class competitor to be entering a floral art class for the first time

Section 4: Home Baking

The Muriel Liddle Cup will be awarded to the 'Best In Section'

Plates must be provided by exhibitors; exhibits must be covered with clear plastic or cling film. Baked items must be free from fresh cream, meat, fish, rice and raw eggs. Please advise if your exhibit contains nuts or any other allergens.

- Class 24 4 Pieces of Shortbread
- Class 25 4 Pieces of Chocolate Brownie

Jars must be covered or sealed. Liqueur can be displayed in a glass covered with Cling Film OR in a stoppered bottle next to an empty glass.

- Class 38 A Glass of Sloe Gin (any size glass)

- Class 40 A Glass of a Named Homemade Liqueur (any size glass)

Section 6: Handicrafts

In classes 41-43, competitors must state the size and type of space they require to stage their exhibits. Hanging space, table space and floor space are all available.

- Class 41 A Knitted of Crocheted Item
- Class 42 A Home-Sewn Item
- Class 43 An Upcycled/Recycled Item for the home
- Class 44 An item of Jewellery. Max 30cm in any direction
- Class 45 A Painted Stone. Max 20cm in any direction
- Class 46 A Greetings Card. Maz size A5
- Class 47 A Length of Bunting, any medium. Maximum 3m. A length of rope and pegs will be provided for staging.

Section 7: Photography

The Harry Ford Memorial Cup will be awarded to the 'Best In Section'

Maximum exhibit size is A5. Photos may be mounted on A5 card to prevent 'curling' – the marquee can get damp with the extremes of temperatures day/night.

Section 8: Childrens' Classes

Children are encouraged to include their age on exhibits. All exhibits should be the unaided work of the child. It can make judging very tricky when parents help too much.

Entry Fee 25p per exhibit per class.

Prize money 1st - £1.50, 2nd - £1.00, 3rd - 50p. A prize will be given to all exhibitors.

Competitors 5 years and under on the day of the Show:

- Class 57 3 Decorated Digestive Biscuits
- Class 58 Create a Gold Medal maximum size 20cm, can be made from anything paper plate, card, salt dough etc.

Competitors 10 years and under on the day of the Show:

- Class 59 Make a representation of the Olympic 5 Rings symbol. The same colours are to be used (red, green, yellow, blue and black). Max size 100cm, can be made from anything including lego, cake, paper, paint, printing etc.
- Class 60 3 Decorated Fairy Cakes
- Class 61 Miniature Farm in a Standard Seed Tray
