Foxhunter:

(a) For registered horses in Grade C that have not won a total of 700 points. Four double clears will qualify – in accordance with rule 310.6

(b) For all registered horses born on or after 1 January 2018, irrespective of points. Horses will be eligible for double clear qualification to attend second rounds providing they reach the age of seven years or under in the same calendar year as the Foxhunter Final - in accordance with rule 310.6 Four double clears will qualify. Four double clears will qualify for the Senior Foxhunter Second Rounds.

Qualifying period: The Senior Foxhunter Second Round qualifying period 1st May – 30th April (subject to revision). Those horses that have qualified for the Senior Foxhunter Championship in 2024 are not eligible for qualification to the 2025 Championship.

CLASS 3. THE SCAFFOLDING MDS NATIONAL ACCUMULATOR

**Rule 274. Table A - speed 375mpm - Start Height 1.25m - 1.40m Joker Fence - 1.50m
Limited to 30 Entries - Drawn Order**

Six, eight or ten obstacles, which are progressively more difficult. No combination obstacles are allowed. The progressive difficulty is not solely due to the height and spread of the obstacles but also to the difficulty of the track. Points are awarded as follows:

One point for obstacle No 1 cleared, two points for No 2, three points for No 3 etc, with a total of 21,36 or 55 points. No point is awarded for an obstacle knocked down. Faults other than knock-downs are penalized as for Table A and any of these faults, including time faults are converted into points and deducted from any jumping points scored.

In the event of equality of points for first place, there will be a jump-off against the clock over a shortened course, over obstacles that may be increased in height and/or spread. The obstacles in the jump-off must be jumped in the same order as in the first round and retain their respective points allotted in the first round.

This competition may also take place directly against the clock.

For the last obstacle of the course, an alternative obstacle may be provided, of which one part may be designated the Joker. The Joker must be more difficult than the alternative obstacle and carry double points. If the Joker is knocked down, the points must be deducted from the total.

Open to members and pre-registered non-members, 15 years and over, eligible under Rising Star Amateur rules.

Classes (21, 22, 23, and 24) qualify for LIHS BSHA Rising Star Supreme Finals at the London International Horse Show, highest placed unqualified in top 5 to qualify. A results points table will run for all qualifying classes and a 'wild card' will be awarded to those unqualified with the highest points in each section following the final qualifier.

The Judge will NOT ride exhibits in these classes or at the Finals.

Mare or Gelding, 4yrs old and over, Mountain and Moorland registered ponies and non-registered Mountain and Moorland type ponies not exceeding 128cms. Ridden by a child to have attained their 5th birthday on the 1st of January in the current year and not to attain their 10th birthday by 1st January in the current year. Any suitable snaffle bridle.

In Lead Rein WSP classes the Judges will be looking for a pony suitable for a child to begin their future in Working Sports Pony classes.

Criteria

- The Leader must be 16 years old or over and may only lead one pony in a class.
- The rein **MUST** go directly from the bit to the rider's hand, with no extra aids or attachments to or on the saddle.
- Handles on saddles are permitted but the reins must not be attached to the handle or to the saddle. The Lead Rein must be affixed to the noseband on which it must remain while the pony is in the ring.
- Whilst in the ring ponies must always be led by the leader.
- The Leader must lead on the near side with the lead rein in the left hand.
- RIDERS - Hats in accordance with BSPS Rules, Tweed Jackets, Beige or cream jodhpurs, Shirt, tie, boots and gloves.
- No Buttonholes

- LEADERS Country attire, Gentlemen Trilby Hats or Caps, Ladies modest hats.
- Body protectors are compulsory in this class.

Method of Judging

Ponies will enter the ring at the walk, they may be trotted altogether at the Judges' discretion. They will be pulled into line and asked to perform an individual test around obstacles including jumping a maximum of three small upright fences not exceeding 30cms. No spread fences. Water will not be included. Ponies will not be asked to walk on artificial material e.g. plastic sheeting during the test. *Riders will not be asked to dismount.*

Judges will penalise refusals, knockdowns or taking the wrong course at their discretion.

A stride or two of canter over the fences will not be penalised.

There will be NO conformation marks. **Ponies must be shown unplaited and in accordance with their breed standards.**

Method of Judging

Ponies will enter the ring at the walk, and then trotted altogether at the Judges' discretion. They will be pulled into line in any order and asked to perform an individual test around obstacles including jumping a maximum of three small upright fences not exceeding 30cms. At the end of the test, they will canter down one side of the arena to finish. No spread fences. Water will not be included. Ponies will not be asked to walk on artificial material e.g. plastic sheeting during the test. *Riders will not be asked to dismount.* Judges will penalise refusals, knockdowns or taking the wrong course. Cantering over the fences will not be penalised. There will be NO conformation marks.

Method of judging

Exhibitors enter the ring as a whole class on the right rein. (Classes may be split on the go round dependent on numbers at the judge's discretion). Exhibitors will walk, trot and canter, including change of rein and canter on the left rein before coming back to walk. No galloping on the go round. In the 128cm Performance Pony Class, NO CANTERING on the go round. NO PULL IN. In the event of a tie performance marks take precedence.

Exhibitors will perform an individual display, this must include a walk, trot and canter on both reins, a free walk on a long rein, canter circle, extension at canter (not a gallop) on one rein, and a halt. Canter transitions must be executed on the straight, (not at a corner)

No stripping, exhibitors will be asked to walk away and trot back to the judge before commencing their display. Any suitable bridle, including a Micklem bridle, flash or grackle, nosebands etc, and a correctly fitted running martingale can be used. Coloured or plain brow bands can be used. Bit-less bridles and Running Gags are not permitted.

Shows may put on a Championship for the two highest exhibits.

In the 128cm Performance Pony Class, NO CANTERING on the go round. NO PULL IN. In the event of a tie performance marks take precedence.

HORSE SECTION RULES AND CONDITIONS

- 1. HEALTH AND SAFETY:** The Organisers of this event have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective everyone must take reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey all signs and the instructions of the Organiser, Officials and Stewards.
- 2. CONDITIONS:**
 - 2.1** The organisers reserve the right to eliminate or refuse any entry or limit the number of entries in any class and to cancel, merge or alter any class.
 - 2.2** All jumping classes will be run under current British Show Jumping rules.
 - 2.3** The organisers will not be responsible for any accident or loss of property or otherwise arising from any cause connected with the show and it is a condition of entry that each competitor shall hold the organisers blameless and shall indemnify them against any loss, damage or legal proceedings.
 - 2.4** No entry fee will be refunded in any class without the submission of a valid Doctor/Veterinary Surgeons certificate.
 - 2.5** Every exhibitor making entries for the show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by these Rules and it is on this understanding only those entries are accepted.
- 3. EQUINE PASSPORTS:** All horses entering the showground **MUST** have a valid equine passport with them. Inspections of passports may be carried out.
- 4. EQUINE INFLUENZA & TETANUS:** Equine Influenza and Tetanus vaccinations are a compulsory requirement for all horses attending the Hanbury Countryside Show. Vaccinations certificates may be subject to spot checks by the Society's appointed Veterinary Surgeons. The Society's Veterinary Surgeons may carry out random checks of the horse lines. The Stewards, at the direction of the Society's Veterinary Surgeons, are empowered to require any horse or pony showing clinical signs of equine influenza to be immediately removed from the showground.

VACCINATION PROTOCOL: The requirement for the first 3 vaccinations is as follows: the first 2 vaccinations 21 – 92 days apart, a third booster between 150 - 215 days, and an annual booster vaccination within 365 days thereafter. No horse should enter competitions within 7 days of an EI vaccination. Foals should commence vaccinations at 6 months old. This Rule may be subject to change from guidance from the FEI/BEF and any changes will be notified via the Showing Council and ASAO websites.
- 5. DISEASED ANIMALS:** Every exhibitor shall indemnify the Society against all actions, claims, proceedings and demands by any person, company or other representative body of whatsoever nature in respect of any matter, directly or indirectly connected with the bringing onto the Society's showground of any animal which may have been suffering from any contagious or infectious disease or which develops such a disease whilst on the showground and in addition the exhibitor shall pay all costs and expenses incurred by the Society in connection with any such claim. The Society's Veterinary Officers are authorised to refuse permission for any animal to be admitted to or have removed from the showground any animals affected with contagious or infectious disease. The exhibitor or such animal may obtain a certificate from the Show Secretary, stating the nature of such disease or infection. The onus of proving the freedom of any such animal from contagious or infectious disease shall rest on the exhibitor of the animal concerned.
- 6. BIOSECURITY:** We urge all owners to adhere to strict biosecurity protocols at all times. Please remember **"BE SEEN TO BE CLEAN"**.
- 7. OFFICIALS DECISIONS:** The Committee, or officials appointed by them, shall be empowered to disqualify and demand the removal from the showground of any animal which, in their

opinion, is suffering from or affected with, a contagious or infectious disease or is considered dangerous. All entrance fees for such animals will be forfeited. If an animal is deemed to be unfit for competing by the Society's appointed veterinary surgeon; they reserve the right to deny entry to the ring and can request that animal/s be removed from the showground. The Society's veterinary officer's decision is final

- 8. CONDUCT OF EXHIBITORS AND THEIR EMPLOYEES:** All persons in charge of animals will be subject to the instruction of the Society's appointed officials. Exhibitors will be held responsible for the behaviour of their employees and for the consequence of any misconduct of such employees. Should Security deem an exhibitor or their employee's behaviour to fall below that expected by the Societies appointed officials that person or persons will be escorted from the showground.
- 9. BREED SOCIETY REGULATIONS** All persons entering, competing or exhibiting an animal in a class affiliated to a Breed Society shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the relevant Breed society and be subject to its constitution and rules (including disciplinary procedures).
- 10. ANIMAL WELFARE:** The Society expects all exhibitors to observe best practice at all times.
- 11. RIDER WEIGHT:** All horses ridden anywhere on the Showground, rings or lorry park, must only be ridden by a rider whose size and weight does not compromise the animal's welfare. We are operating under the 20% rider weight guideline where the rider in full riding attire with full tack must be less than 20% of the animal's bodyweight. This is based on a relatively fit, healthy animal, as an overweight animal is also a welfare concern.
- 12. APPOINTED VETERINARY SURGEON:** A Veterinary Surgeon will be available all day on the showground. If, for whatever reason, they may be required please inform a steward and they will get the vet to you. The owner/exhibitor is responsible for the cost of any veterinary advice and/or treatment and agrees to indemnify the Society in respect of that cost.

- 13. APPOINTED HORSE AMBULANCE:** In the unfortunate event of an animal dying or being destroyed on the Showground, the owner/exhibitor is responsible for the cost of disposal and agrees to indemnify the Society in respect of that cost.

- 14. APPOINTED FARRIER:** The farrier will be in attendance from 8.00am until 6.00pm.

- 15. PUBLIC LIABILITY INSURANCE:** All exhibitors should ensure they have adequate public liability insurance cover. By submitting an entry you indemnify the HCSS that on or from the date of application up to and including the end of the Hanbury Countryside Show the applicant will hold valid insurance to insure against loss or damage caused to any person or property to a minimum value of £2 million.
- 16. THE JUDGE'S DECISION IS FINAL.**
- 17. OBJECTION PROTOCOL:** Any objection or protest to be lodged with the Horse Secretary within 30 minutes of the event in writing, together with the sum of £100 as deposit, such amount to be forfeited if the objection is overruled. The matter will be referred to the objection panel. Objections may not be settled on the day. Objections will be handled following the BS Rule Book.
- 18. JUDGES:** Should a Judge be unable to officiate, a substitute will be appointed. Any judge substitutions will be listed on the website and at the horse secretaries' trailer.
- 19. AGE REGULATIONS:** Horses and ponies must be over four years of age on the day of the show if taking part in ridden classes. All ages to be taken from 1st January unless otherwise stated.

- 20. ENTRY FEES:** Entry fees vary, all fees are stated in the Schedule. The Society is VAT registered. Receipts available on request. Failure to exhibit any animal entered will entail forfeiture of entry fees.
- 21. PRIZE MONEY** that is not collected in horse rings can be collected on Show Day from the Secretaries trailer; before 5.30pm. Prize money not collected at the Show will be deemed a donation to the Society.
- 22. PASSES & TICKETS:** All entries to be made in advance unless otherwise stated. **Show entrance tickets will be emailed. On arrival at the Showground please go to the Secretaries to collect your number/s.**
- 23. TIMETABLE OF CLASSES:** available from www.hanburyshow.co.uk
- 24. CHAMPIONSHIPS:** The first and second prize winners in each class are invited to compete for the Championship.
- 25. ACCESSING THE SHOWGROUND:** It is recommended to set off in good time before your class/s are scheduled to start. Please follow the yellow AA directional signs.
- 26. DOGS:** Dogs are welcome; however, they must be kept under control & on a short lead at all times. Please ensure all dog waste is picked up and placed in the bins provided. Please note that all 'banned breeds' of dogs are not permitted on the Showground. Banned breeds are those designated on the 'banned breed' list by the UK Government; the full list of 'banned breeds' can be viewed on the Gov.uk website. Furthermore, 'banned breed' dogs with certificates of exemption are also not permitted entry to the Show. The owner / handler of any dog deemed to be behaving aggressively will be asked to leave the showground. The Show organisers will not tolerate dangerous or out of control dogs.
- 27. STALLIONS:** Stallions must have a red, white and blue ribbon displayed on their tail and a disc on their bridle. The owner/handler must take all precautions to ensure the safety of fellow competitors and the general public.
- 28. DRESS CODE:** Grooms/Attendants appearing with animals in judging rings must be of smart appearance and in proper dress code (not jeans), with appropriate headwear.
- 29. NO LUNGEING**
- 30. HAT REGULATIONS:** Any person riding a horse/pony anywhere on the showground is to wear a correctly fitted hat and ensure the chin strap is properly fastened and adjusted. The Society advises hats of the standard PAS 015: 1998 or 2011, VG1 01-04: 2014-12 provided they are BSI Kitemarked or Inspec IC marked, unless otherwise stated by their appropriate governing body. Exhibitors are advised to wear a correctly fitted hard hat whilst handling horses/ponies.
- Riders in BSPS classes must comply with rule 43 in the 2025 BSPS rulebook with regard to hat specification.**
- 31. BODY PROTECTORS & FOOTWEAR:** The wearing of a correctly fitting body protector is advised for adults and strongly recommended for under 16s. Correct and appropriate footwear with heels must be worn.
- 32. TROPHIES:** All trophy winners must sign for them at the secretary's trailer before leaving the showground. All trophies, unless stated, are perpetual and are to be held for the period between shows. Trophies must be returned cleaned, in good condition and returned no less than six weeks before the Show. Trophies must be insured – guidance available from Trophy Secretary. Please note some trophies cannot be removed from the showground and will be retained by the Society. These trophies are available for photographs.
- 33. CANCELLATIONS:** If the Show is cancelled due to poor weather (where the field is considered unusable by the committee) or any other reason outside the Society's control, the Society will refund the entry fee minus £2.50 to cover administration costs.
- 34. DATA STORAGE:** Information from entry forms may be stored on computer; information about results may also be published and/or provided to the Press and Breed Societies for

publication. Information about exhibitors and their animals may also be provided to DEFRA, Trading Standards, Depts. of County Councils, BCMS, SAC, and others having regulatory functions as well as the Society's Veterinary, Environmental Health, Legal and Safety Advisers. The making of an entry is irrevocable consent for the storage and disclosure of information in this way.

- 35. BSHA AMATEUR DEFINITION:** To be classed as a BSHA Amateur, competitors must not:
- Engage in breeding, livery, buying, selling, dealing or hiring horses in a commercial capacity, or as a means of deriving a main source of income.
 - Receive remuneration, whether it be monetary or goods in kind, for employment in the connection with horses in racing, showing, livery stable or riding school (instruction at Pony Club and Riding Club excepted). This does not include the suppliers of ancillary services such as farriers and vets.
 - Own/Part own an equestrian establishment including but not limited to riding schools, events centre, stud or livery yard in any capacity, or receive any form of remuneration for employment at an equestrian establishment. For the avoidance of doubt for the purpose of this rule, immediate family members of an owner or part owner of an equestrian establishment who work or are howsoever otherwise engaged or involved in any capacity, whether or not for remuneration at the equestrian establishment, will be treated as being an owner or part owner of that equestrian establishment.
 - Show a Horse owned or sponsored by a company or a commercial firm, or act as a Brand Ambassador, in any showing classes, BSHA or otherwise, or a Horse for which his/her immediate family accepts livery or training charges from a person outside the immediate family concerned.
 - A member is not eligible to compete in Amateur classes on an Exhibit, which has been ridden by a Professional Rider in any Open classes, BSHA or otherwise, with the exception of Open Working Show Horse and Side Saddle classes, during the current year and the previous year. If an Amateur wishes to ride/compete on behalf of another Amateur, who is not an immediate family member, then this should be declared with the BSHA office who will decide whether to sanction the request or refer to the board for a decision. (This will not apply if a ride is offered by an Amateur that may have more than one horse in a Championship). If you do not disclose to the office that you ride/compete equines on a regular basis, which you do not stable at home, your Amateur status will be reviewed by the Board, if you ride/compete multiple equines or ride regularly for one or more owners, you could be deemed professional and your amateur status will be revoked. In some instances, a 'Statement of Fact' will be required from the member on request of the Board. Amateur Owner/Rider: Open to horses owned and ridden by an Amateur, (the rider need not be the owner of the horse). Horses either kept in a professional producers yard or at home where a full, or part time, groom is employed. A member is not eligible to compete in Amateur Classes on an Exhibit, which has been ridden by a Professional Producer or Groom (as deemed by the BSHA) in any OPEN classes, BSHA or otherwise, with the exception of open working horse and side saddle classes, during the current year and the previous year. On the day that a horse is competing in Amateur classes, non-amateurs, Professional Producers and Professional Grooms (deemed as such by the BSHA) are NOT allowed to compete the Amateur Exhibit, the same day in ANY classes (BSHA or otherwise). Because of the professional involvement, these horses may not compete in Home Produced Classes. No Professional Producers or Professional Grooms (deemed as such by the BSHA) are allowed to ride, work in (in any form), compete, or enter the ring to groom/strip the horse. Amateur Home Produced: Open to Horses that are either stabled at Home or in a DIY yard (assisted livery accepted) and which since the 1st of January in the current year, have not been shown by a professional during the current season, or stabled in a professional yard at any time in the current year. To be ridden by an Amateur only. This does not exclude Amateur Home Produced Riders having lessons at any time with an instructor, providing the Horse remains stabled at home. Amateur Home-Produced Horses are eligible for Amateur classes. No Professional Producers or Professional Grooms (deemed as such by the BSHA) are allowed into the ring to groom/strip the Horse.
