Rule 274. Table A - speed 375mpm - Start Height 1.25m - 1.40m Joker Fence - 1.50m Limited to 30 Entries - Drawn Order

Six, eight or ten obstacles, which are progressively more difficult. No combination obstacles are allowed. The progressive difficulty is not solely due to the height and spread of the obstacles but also to the difficulty of the track. Points are awarded as follows: One point for obstacle No 1 cleared, two points for No 2, three points for No 3 etc, with a total of 21,36 or 55 points. No point is awarded for an obstacle knocked down. Faults other than knock-downs are penalized as for Table A and any of these faults, including time faults are converted into points and deducted from any jumping points scored.

In the event of equality of points for first place, there will be a jump-off against the clock over a shortened course, over obstacles that may be increased in height and/or spread. The obstacles in the jump-off must be jumped in the same order as in the first round and retain their respective points allotted in the first round.

This competition may also take place directly against the clock.

For the last obstacle of the course, an alternative obstacle may be provided, of which one part may be designated the Joker. The Joker must be more difficult than the alternative obstacle and carry double points. If the Joker is knocked down, the points must be deducted from the total.

Competitors and horses must hold a minimum of LIHS Qualifier-Eligible Membership/ Horse Registration with the Association to be eligible to compete in the LIHS BSHA Showing series. Any competitor who qualifies for a LIHS Showing Series Supreme Final, must then complete full LIHS Qualified registration within 14 days of qualification for their qualification to stand, or it will pass to the next eligible exhibit (the nominal cost of Qualifier-Eligible membership will be taken off the cost of Full LIHS registration). Any competitors/ horses which have existing BSHA membership/ registration for 2026 will not be required to complete any LIHS Membership / Registration for these classes.

LIHS RISING STAR CLASSES 2026

Please note: Rising Star Amateur Rules 2026 are separate from BSHA Amateur rules in the main BSHA Rulebook. Please see the separate Rising Star Rulebook in the Rising Star section available on the BSHA website.

A results points table will run for all qualifying classes, and a 'wild card' will be awarded to those unqualified with the highest points in each section following the final qualifier.

The Judge will NOT ride exhibits in these classes or at the Finals.

CLASS 5. BSPS 148 WORKING SPORTS PONY

DIRECT QUALIFIER FOR LONDON INTERNATIONAL HORSE SHOW

The BSPS/LIHS Working Sports Pony 148cm, for mares or geldings, 4 years old and over, not exceeding 148cm. Riders not to have attained their 18th birthday on the 1st January in the current year. (Height of fences 85cm) Ponies must be shown plaited, running plaits providing the forelock is plaited, are permissible. To be ridden in any suitable bridle, including a correctly fitted running martingale.

Competitors may compete two ponies in each qualifying class. The highest placed pony will count for final placings. The same pony/rider combinations can only qualify in one class. Competitors can compete in both classes, but will qualify for the final in the first class they qualify in. Riders can only qualify one pony in each class.

There will be 15 qualifying rounds. The highest placed pony not already qualified will qualify for the final providing the pony, owner and rider are registered with the BSPS within seven days. A JMB height certificate is not required.

All other rules for competing in WHP classes apply in these classes. All BSPS rules apply to these classes.

BSPS LIHS Working Sports Pony Method of Judging.

- The class will be judged by one judge.
- At the final the height of fences will remain at 85cm for class 1 and 95cm class 2.
- The course will consist of a minimum of 10 fences, maximum of 12 fences.
- Riders will enter the ring individually, and present their pony to the judge, who will assess the pony's conformation, freedom of movement, (asking the rider walk and trot back before commencing their jumping round) type and athleticism. Awarding a mark out of 10.

The **BSPS/LIHS Working Sports Pony 158cm** for stallion, mare or gelding, 4 years old or over not exceeding 158cm. Riders any age. (To ride a stallion, refer to rule 62 for age of riders in LIHS Performance Class) (Height of fences 95cm) Ponies must be shown plaited, running plaits providing the forelock is plaited are permissible. To be ridden in any suitable bridle including a correctly fitted running martingale.

Competitors may compete two ponies in each qualifying class. The highest placed pony will count for final placings. The same pony/rider combinations can only qualify in one class. Competitors can compete in both classes, but will qualify for the final in the first class they qualify in. Riders can only qualify one pony in each class.

There will be 15 qualifying rounds. The highest placed pony not already qualified will qualify for the final providing the pony, owner and rider are registered with the BSPS within seven days.

A JMB height certificate is not required.

All other rules for competing in WHP classes apply in these classes. All BSPS rules apply to these classes.

Any horse which is registered / previously registered as a Grade A showjumper, Advanced Eventer, or above, on the 1st January of the current year, is not eligible. Rider to be 15yrs or over.

Height of fences: minimum 3'0", maximum 3'3", maximum spread 3'3". Please note, the height of the fences may be raised at the final at the discretion of the Course Builder / BSHA Representative.

A Rider may ride up to two Horses in the jumping phase only and then must select one Horse to take through to the Individual Show & Conformation stage. No change of Rider is allowed.

The highest placed unqualified horse in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Working Hunter Type Supreme Final at the LIHS in December.

Please note the height of the fences may be raised at the final at the discretion of the Course builder/ BSHA Representative.

A Rider may ride up to two Horses in the jumping phase only and then must select one Horse to take through to the Individual Show & Conformation stage. No change of Rider is allowed.

The highest placed unqualified horse in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Working Show Horse Supreme Final at the LIHS in December.

CLASS 12. TATTERSALLS RoR FORMER RACEHORSE CHALLENGE 2026



Tattersalls

Open to all RoR and NR competition registered horses, Mare or gelding 4yrs old, any height. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January 2026. Horses to be ridden in any suitable bridle and should be plaited. All entries must have current RoR Competition Registered. Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series.

The first three go forward to the final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships, Aintree, August 22nd 2026

Prizes – RoR rosettes 1st – 4th plus RoR official merchandise voucher 1st £20, 2nd £10, 3rd £5, Highest placed Veteran (15+) £10.

The Highest Placed Veteran also qualifies for the Tattersalls RoR Ridden Veteran Show final at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships in August 2027

The Judge will NOT ride. Horses may be stripped for conformation at the discretion of the judge. **Competitors must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.**

All those entering and/or participating in RoR classes agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force.

The class to be judged **50%** jumping, **20%** Style while jumping and performance and **30% awarded** for show, manners and suitability to be retrained.

PHASE 1

Jumping to be judged:

8 rustic jumps 70cm to 80cm with a maximum spread of 75cm.

The following points to be deducted at the end of each jumping round:

10 points to be deducted for a knock down, 15 points to be deducted for a refusal, 20 points for second refusal. Elimination for third refusal or fall or Error of Course.

PHASE 2

HORSE SECTION RULES AND CONDITIONS

1. **HEALTH AND SAFETY:** The Organisers of this event have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective everyone must take reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey all signs and the instructions of the Organiser, Officials and Stewards.
2. **CONDITIONS:**
 - 2.1 The organisers reserve the right to eliminate or refuse any entry or limit the number of entries in any class and to cancel, merge or alter any class.
 - 2.2 All jumping classes will be run under current British Show Jumping rules.
 - 2.3 The organisers will not be responsible for any accident or loss of property or otherwise arising from any cause connected with the show and it is a condition of entry that each competitor shall hold the organisers blameless and shall indemnify them against any loss, damage or legal proceedings.
 - 2.4 No entry fee will be refunded in any class without the submission of a valid Doctor/Veterinary Surgeons certificate.
 - 2.5 Every exhibitor making entries for the show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by these Rules and it is on this understanding only those entries are accepted.
3. **EQUINE PASSPORTS:** All horses entering the showground **MUST** have a valid equine passport with them. Inspections of passports may be carried out.
4. **EQUINE INFLUENZA & TETANUS:** Equine Influenza and Tetanus vaccinations are a compulsory requirement for all horses attending the Hanbury Countryside Show. Vaccinations certificates may be subject to spot checks by the Society's appointed Veterinary Surgeons. The Society's Veterinary Surgeons may carry out random checks of the horse lines. The Stewards, at the direction of the Society's Veterinary Surgeons, are empowered to require any horse or pony showing clinical signs of equine influenza to be immediately removed from the showground.
5. **VACCINATION PROTOCOL:** The requirement for the first 3 vaccinations is as follows for any horse receiving a new primary course as of 1st January 2024: the first 2 vaccinations 21 – 60 days apart, a third booster within 6 months and 21 days of V2, and an annual booster vaccination within 365 days thereafter. No horse should enter competitions within 7 days of an EI vaccination. Foals should commence vaccinations at 6 months old. There is no requirement for horses that have received their primary course and first booster before 1 January 2024 to be re-vaccinated provided they have been vaccinated in compliance with the 2023 Veterinary Regulations. This Rule may be subject to change from guidance from the FEI/BEF and any changes will be notified via the Showing Council and ASAO websites.
6. **DISEASED ANIMALS:** Every exhibitor shall indemnify the Society against all actions, claims, proceedings and demands by any person, company or other representative body of whatsoever nature in respect of any matter, directly or indirectly connected with the bringing onto the Society's showground of any animal which may have been suffering from any contagious or infectious disease or which develops such a disease whilst on the showground and in addition the exhibitor shall pay all costs and expenses incurred by the Society in connection with any such claim. The Society's Veterinary Officers are authorised to refuse permission for any animal to be admitted to or have removed from the showground any animals affected with contagious or infectious disease. The exhibitor or such animal may obtain a certificate from the Show Secretary, stating the nature of such disease or infection.

The onus of proving the freedom of any such animal from contagious or infectious disease shall rest on the exhibitor of the animal concerned.

7. **BIOSECURITY:** We urge all owners to adhere to strict biosecurity protocols at all times. Please remember **“BE SEEN TO BE CLEAN”**.
8. **OFFICIALS DECISIONS:** The Committee, or officials appointed by them, shall be empowered to disqualify and demand the removal from the showground of any animal which, in their opinion, is suffering from or affected with, a contagious or infectious disease or is considered dangerous. All entrance fees for such animals will be forfeited. If an animal is deemed to be unfit for competing by the Society's appointed veterinary surgeon; they reserve the right to deny entry to the ring and can request that animal/s be removed from the showground. The Society's veterinary officer's decision is final
9. **CONDUCT OF EXHIBITORS AND THEIR EMPLOYEES:** All persons in charge of animals will be subject to the instruction of the Society's appointed officials. Exhibitors will be held responsible for the behaviour of their employees and for the consequence of any misconduct of such employees. Should Security deem an exhibitor or their employee's behaviour to fall below that expected by the Societies appointed officials that person or persons will be escorted from the showground.
10. **BREED SOCIETY REGULATIONS** All persons entering, competing or exhibiting an animal in a class affiliated to a Breed Society shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction or the relevant Breed society and be subject to its constitution and rules (including disciplinary procedures).
11. **ANIMAL WELFARE:** The Society expects all exhibitors to observe best practice at all times.
12. **RIDER WEIGHT:** All horses ridden anywhere on the Showground, rings or lorry park, must only be ridden by a rider whose size and weight does not compromise the animal's welfare. We are operating under the 20% rider weight guideline where the rider in full riding attire with full tack must be less than 20% of the animal's bodyweight. This is based on a relatively fit, healthy animal, as an overweight animal is also a welfare concern.
13. **APPOINTED VETERINARY SURGEON:** A Veterinary Surgeon will be available all day on the showground. If, for whatever reason, they may be required please inform a steward and they will get the vet to you. The owner/exhibitor is responsible for the cost of any veterinary advice and/or treatment and agrees to indemnify the Society in respect of that cost.

14. **APPOINTED HORSE AMBULANCE:** In the unfortunate event of an animal dying or being destroyed on the Showground, the owner/exhibitor is responsible for the cost of disposal and agrees to indemnify the Society in respect of that cost.

15. **APPOINTED FARRIER:** The farrier will be in attendance from 8.00am until 6.00pm.

16. **PUBLIC LIABILITY INSURANCE:** All exhibitors should ensure they have adequate public liability insurance cover. By submitting an entry you indemnify the HCSS that on or from the date of application up to and including the end of the Hanbury Countryside Show the applicant will hold valid insurance to insure against loss or damage caused to any person or property to a minimum value of £5 million.
17. **THE JUDGE'S DECISION IS FINAL.**
18. **OBJECTION PROTOCOL:** Any objection or protest to be lodged with the Horse Secretary within 30 minutes of the event in writing, together with the sum of £100 as deposit, such amount to be forfeited if the objection is overruled. The matter will be referred to the objection

panel. Objections may not be settled on the day. Objections will be handled following the BS Rule Book.

- 19. JUDGES:** Should a Judge be unable to officiate, a substitute will be appointed. Any judge substitutions will be listed on the website and at the horse secretaries' trailer.
- 20. AGE REGULATIONS:** Horses and ponies must be over four years of age on the day of the show if taking part in ridden classes. All ages to be taken from 1st January unless otherwise stated.
- 21. ENTRY FEES:** Entry fees vary, all fees are stated in the Schedule. The Society is VAT registered. Receipts available on request. Failure to exhibit any animal entered will entail forfeiture of entry fees.
- 22. PRIZE MONEY** that is not collected in horse rings can be collected on Show Day from the Secretaries trailer; before 5.30pm. Prize money not collected at the Show will be deemed a donation to the Society.
- 23. PASSES & TICKETS:** All entries to be made in advance unless otherwise stated. **Show entrance tickets will be emailed. On arrival at the Showground please go to the Secretaries to collect your number/s.**
- 24. TIMETABLE OF CLASSES:** available from www.hanburyshow.co.uk
- 25. CHAMPIONSHIPS:** The first and second prize winners in each class are invited to compete for the Championship.
- 26. ACCESSING THE SHOWGROUND:** It is recommended to set off in good time before your class/s are scheduled to start. Please follow the yellow AA directional signs.
- 27. DOGS:** Dogs are welcome; however, they must be kept under control & on a short lead at all times. Please ensure all dog waste is picked up and placed in the bins provided. Please note that all 'banned breeds' of dogs are not permitted on the Showground. Banned breeds are those designated on the 'banned breed' list by the UK Government; the full list of 'banned breeds' can be viewed on the Gov.uk website. Furthermore, 'banned breed' dogs with certificates of exemption are also not permitted entry to the Show. The owner / handler of any dog deemed to be behaving aggressively will be asked to leave the showground. The Show organisers will not tolerate dangerous or out of control dogs.
- 28. STALLIONS:** Stallions must have a red, white and blue ribbon displayed on their tail and a disc on their bridle. The owner/handler must take all precautions to ensure the safety of fellow competitors and the general public.
- 29. DRESS CODE:** Grooms/Attendants appearing with animals in judging rings must be of smart appearance and in proper dress code (not jeans), with appropriate headwear.
- 30. NO LUNGEING**
- 31. HAT REGULATIONS:** Any person riding a horse/pony anywhere on the showground is to wear a correctly fitted hat and ensure the chin strap is properly fastened and adjusted. The Society advises hats of the standard PAS 015: 1998 or 2011, VG1 01-04: 2014-12 provided they are BSI Kitemarked or Inspec IC marked, unless otherwise stated by their appropriate governing body. Exhibitors are advised to wear a correctly fitted hard hat whilst handling horses/ponies.
Riders in BSPS classes must comply with rule 43 in the 2025 BSPS rulebook with regard to hat specification.
- 32. BODY PROTECTORS & FOOTWEAR:** The wearing of a correctly fitting body protector is advised for adults and strongly recommended for under 16s. Correct and appropriate footwear with heels must be worn.

- 33. TROPHIES:** All trophy winners must sign for them at the secretary's trailer before leaving the showground. All trophies, unless stated, are perpetual and are to be held for the period between shows. Trophies must be returned cleaned, in good condition and returned no less than six weeks before the Show. Trophies must be insured – guidance available from Trophy Secretary. Please note some trophies cannot be removed from the showground and will be retained by the Society. These trophies are available for photographs.
- 34. CANCELLATIONS:** If the Show is cancelled due to poor weather (where the field is considered unusable by the committee) or any other reason outside the Society's control, the Society will refund the entry fee minus £2.50 to cover administration costs.
- 35. DATA STORAGE:** Information from entry forms may be stored on computer; information about results may also be published and/or provided to the Press and Breed Societies for publication. Information about exhibitors and their animals may also be provided to DEFRA, Trading Standards, Depts. of County Councils, BCMS, SAC, and others having regulatory functions as well as the Society's Veterinary, Environmental Health, Legal and Safety Advisers. The making of an entry is irrevocable consent for the storage and disclosure of information in this way.
