CATTLE EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE:

All cattle must arrive at the Showground on **Friday 22 May 2026 after 5pm and before 8pm**. (If required, entries for Commercial Beef will be weighed at 6:30am on Saturday 23 May 2026)

Covered accommodation will be provided.

For health and safety reasons, no equipment is to be kept in alleyways. Extra stalls will be provided for each exhibitor for this purpose.

CATTLE RULES AND CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

EXHIBITORS MUST HAVE PUBLIC LIABILITY INSURANCE COVER IN EXCESS OF £1,000,000 TO EXHIBIT CATTLE AT THE HEATHFIELD AGRICULTURAL SHOW.

As a TB exempt Show, exhibitors are not required to pre or post movement TB test. The maximum time cattle are permitted on the showground is 24hrs. 5pm Friday before Show Day – 5pm Saturday on Show Day.

In the event of Show cancellation entry fees will be refunded less 10% to cover administration costs.

All exhibitors must warrant that the animals entered have been in a fit and healthy condition for the last six months and comply with the current TB and Brucella regulations.

1. The Heathfield Agricultural Show reserves the right to disqualify or refuse the entry of any animal for any reason they may deem unfit.
2. Exhibitors must comply with all current APHA Rules and Regulations.
3. It is the responsibility of exhibitors to have suitable insurance for all property and livestock on the Showground or elsewhere which is their own, or for which they are responsible. The Show requires exhibitors to effect Employers Liability insurance where this is required by statute. The Show also requires exhibitors to effect Public Liability and Products Liability. The Show therefore recommends all exhibitors to make sure they have the appropriate insurance cover.
4. Cattle at the Show which abort or calve or show evidence of doing so must not be exhibited and must be placed in the approved isolation immediately. The isolation accommodation will be easily accessible from the cattle lines and clearly marked.
5. In the event of an animal aborting on the showground the APHA should be contacted immediately for further advice and the animal isolated, including, if possible, a placental smear, has been taken. The suspect animal should be isolated during transit.
6. No animal in the last 10% of gestation will be allowed onto the showground or seven days post calving as per the Welfare of Animals in Transit Order 2006. In the unlikely event that an animal calves at the showground then advice will be sought from APHA's DVO and a special movement license may need to be issued.
7. The Show organisers reserve the right to refuse entry to the Show to any animal deemed unfit by the Show Veterinary Inspection.
8. When milking, udder cloths, hands or milking machine units must be suitably disinfected between each cow.
9. Dams may suckle their calves but otherwise calves must be fed only reconstituted dried milk.
10. Any cow or heifer that, in the opinion of the Hon. Veterinary Surgeon, is bagged to such an extent as to cause the animal undue suffering, must be eased in their presence and to their satisfaction.
11. The Show Committee reserves the right to amalgamate any class where the entries are insufficient, i.e. 4 entries or under.
12. Exhibitors may make an unlimited number of entries in any class on payment of the appropriate fees.
13. The Committee reserves the right to reject or cancel the entry or entries made by any person, if they should deem fit to do so and the right to amalgamate classes or cancel any class or classes, refunding any fees paid in respect thereof.
14. In the interest of public safety, all public must leave the cattle area by 15:45 on Show Day to allow time for cattle to depart between 16:00 – 17:00.
15. Objections – Notice of objection to any entry or decision must be made in writing to the Cattle Secretary as soon as possible and in any case, not later than 60 minutes after the judging is completed. A deposit of £25 must be made; if on investigation the objection is not sustained, the deposit will be forfeited to the funds of

the Show. Any objections will be considered by the Show organisers with two members of the Cattle Committee.

16. Substitution of animals in the cattle section will be allowed after the closing date of entries provided the animal substituted is in the same class as the original entry. Details of the substitute entry must be given to the Cattle Secretary on arrival at the showground and this information must be displayed above the stall. Failure to notify the Cattle Secretary will result in disqualification and any prizes won will be forfeited.
17. Veterinary: The Heathfield Show Veterinary Officer's (Vet) decision is final.
 - Contagion: Every exhibitor of any animal which to their knowledge is suffering from any contagious or infectious disease, or which has been in contact with any animal suffering as such, shall pay the Show £50 as compensation and for liquidated damages for every animal sent for exhibition. In addition, in the event of the Show's Vet certifying that any animal sent for exhibition is in his opinion a possible source of danger, such animal shall be removed with due speed by the Participant, from the Showground, or be otherwise managed as per the Vet's direction with a view to averting the spread of contagion.
 - It is a condition of entry that in the event of a serious accident to an animal and on the recommendation of the Show Vet that the animal be euthanised. All efforts will be made to contact the animal's owner for consent. If emergency veterinary treatment is required at the Show, exhibitors will be responsible for the cost of any medication or drugs used in the treatment of their animals and payment must be made direct to the veterinary officer at the time of treatment.
 - Any animal that is receiving veterinary treatment at the time of the Show should not be entered unless the owner has had the animal examined by their own Vet and it is safe for them to enter the Show. However, animals still showing evidence of disease will not be permitted to be shown.
18. Championship: To be eligible for a championship, all cows must have calved within 14 months of the show date. Date of last calving must be stated on the entry form.
19. Exhibitors must be aware of judging Special Awards and be ready with their animals when called.
20. In all cases, the Judge's decision is final.
21. Push chairs, wheelchairs and mobility aids are only allowed in Cattle lines and cattle walkways during public access times.

The Show Council has written the following notes to explain what they mean by each cattle class and what animals are considered eligible.

- Bulls of three years of age or upwards, at the closing date of entries, must have sired at least three living calves born within twelve months prior to that date.
- Cows and Heifers in milk will be expected to be shown with milk production potential demonstrated.
- In-calf animals. It is expected that the Judges can reasonably satisfy themselves that an animal is in calf and in the case of cows, satisfy themselves about the soundness of the udder.
- No animal may be judged on the same lactation in successive years at this Show.
- The exhibitor must supply all bedding and feed. Drinking and washing water are available on the showground.
- Beef Breeds. Although the object of the junior heifer classes is to cater for the empty heifer, an animal that has been served qualifies, provided it is within the specified age group.
