# When does it take place?

The last full weekend in July, this year on Saturday 26th and Sunday 27th.

# When do I need to enter by

If you enter online on the Show website, (QR code P1) entries must be completed by midnight on Tuesday July 22nd.

The paper entry form can be handed in at Heckington or Helpringham Schools by Friday 4th July or at Heckington Village Hall on Wednesday 23rd July between 5.30pm and 8.00pm.

You don't need to have your exhibit ready then, you just need to enter to say you will be bringing one to be included in the competition.

#### How much is it to enter?

£1.00 for unlimited entries. Running, cycling and the obstacle course are free.

# When do I take my entry to the show?

Take your exhibit to the horticulture marquee on the Showground. It is open from 6.00pm to 9.00pm on Friday 25th July and from 7.00am to 8.30am on Saturday 26th July.

# Where do I need to go for the cycling, running and obstacle course?

If you have received your numbers, bring these and come along to the Show-ground on Saturday morning to the Children's Sports Tent near the Grandstand. If you haven't received them, they will be at the Children's Sports Tent waiting for you. Arrive at

9.20am. - with your bike and helmit if you are cycling or

9.35 am. - if you are running or doing the obstacle course.

#### What if I win?

Prizes for the sports will be given out straightaway. Prizes for exhibits will be given out in the Horticulture Marquee between 2.30pm and 5.00pm on Sunday 27th July.

A board at the front of the Horticulture Marquee displays who has won the trophies. If you have won, there is a special presentation at 3.30pm in the Concert Marquee.

Yes, it can be collected between 5.00pm and 6.30pm on Sunday 27th July.
