CONDITIONS FOR ENTRY

- 1. ALL JUMPING COMPETITIONS WILL BE HELD ACCORDING TO THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF BRITISH SHOWJUMPING.
- 2. ENTRIES IN CLASSES 250 262 ARE RESTRICTED TO HORSES REGISTERED WITH BRITISH SHOWJUMPING AND RIDDEN BY MEMBERS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE 2025 BRITISH SHOWJUMPING RULE BOOK.
- 3. ENTRIES CLOSE MONDAY 30TH JUNE 2025 OR EARLIER IN COMPETITIONS WHERE ENTRIES ARE LIMITED. ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED AFTER THE CLOSING DATE.
- 4. EACH ENTRY MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY THE APPROPRIATE ENTRY FEE, WHICH INCLUDES VAT. ENTRY CANCELLATIONS MUST BE MADE IN WRITING TO ALICE.BENNETT @ KCAS.ORG.UK. ENTRY CANCELLTAIONS MADE WITHIN ONE MONTH OF THE SHOW WILL ONLY BE ACCAPTED IF A VET CERTICATE IS PROVIDED. PLEASE NOTE THAT STABLE CHARGES ARE NOT REFUNDABLE.
- 5. NOMINATION ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.
- 6. EXHIBITORS/OWNERS/RIDERS BRITISH SHOWJUMPING MEMBERSHIP NUMBERS MUST BE SHOWN ON THE ENTRY FORM TOGETHER WITH THE HORSE'S REGISTRATION NUMBER.
- 7. A TIME LIMIT WILL BE ADOPTED FOR ALL JUMPING COMPETITIONS AND WILL BE ANNOUNCED BEFORE THE COMPETITION STARTS. AUTOMATIC TIMING APPARATUS WILL BE IN OPERATION.
- STARTS. AUTOMATIC TIMING APPARATUS WILL BE IN OPERATION. 8. WHEN A STANDARD HAS BEEN REACHED COMPETITORS MAKING MORE THAN A CERTAIN NUMBER OF FAULTS MAY BE RETIRED.
- 9. IN THE JUMPING CLASSES A SUBSTITUTE ENTRY WILL BE ACCEPTED ONLY IN ACCORDANCE WITH BRITISH SHOWJUMPING RULES
- 10. THE COMMITTEE RESERVES THE RIGHT TO ALTER OR AMEND THE PROGRAM IF IT SHOULD BE NECESSARY.
- 11. RAPPING IN THE COLLECTING RING OR ANYWHERE ON, OR IN THE VICINITY OF THE SHOWGROUND IS STRICTLY PROHIBITED.
 ANY ABUSE OF HORSES WILL NOT BE TOLERATED IN ACCORDANCE WITH BRITISH SHOWJUMPING RULE 103.
- 12. DRESS. ALL COMPETITORS MUST WEAR UNIFORM, HUNTING COSTUME OR APPROPRIATE HATS AND COATS TO COMPLY WITH BRITISH SHOWJUMPING RULE 101.
- 13. THE DRAWN ORDER OF JUMPING FOR EACH COMPETITION WILL BE DONE BY 6PM WEDNESDAY 2ND JULY. THIS ORDER OF JUMPING WILL BE DISPLAYED ON WWW.KCAS.ORG.UK AND FACEBOOK, COMPETITORS MUST JUMP IN THIS ORDER. ANY COMPETITION MISSING HIS TURN MAY BE ELIMINATED FROM THE COMPETITION.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR ALL EQUINE ENTRIES AND EXHIBITIONS

Please ensure that you have fully read and understand the terms and conditions before confirming your entry.

In these showing rules:

Equine means horses and ponies.

Exhibitor means the person responsible for entering any animal in the Show at point of entry and thereafter.

Inspector means a person authorised by the Society to carry out inspections and other duties in accordance with the schedule regulations.

Participants means all owners, exhibitors, fitters, agents, attendants, handlers, riders and other participants in the showing of an animal.

Show means the Kent County Show.

Showground means the property on which the Kent County Show is held, including all associated car parks, camping grounds etc

Showing Rules means the rules and regulations as listed in the Schedule.

Society means Kent County Agricultural Society.

Steward means a volunteer appointed to support the running of the Show by the Kent County Agricultural Society.

ENTRIES

1. CLOSING DATE FOR ENTRIES

SHOWING FRIDAY 30TH MAY 2025
SHOWIUMPING MONDAY 30th JUNE 2025

Any classes where the closing date differs from the above will have the closing date listed at the start of the section / class description. The Society reserves the right to close entries early where places are limited.

For an entry to be accepted the following must be completed and received in the Show Office prior to or on the deadline for the appropriate section.

- · All entry forms (including those for further competitions if required) which must be signed by the exhibitor or his agent.
- · Entry fee in full.

All entries must be made in writing by post, scanned copy, by email or online. Late entries will be accepted up to a week post entry closing date, these can be made by telephone. A £10 fee will be added to each late entry after the closing date.

2. ENTRY FEES

Please see details on class lists for specific entry fees

3. ACCURACY OF ENTRY DETAILS

Every exhibitor shall be held responsible for the correctness of their entry and the correctness of documentation brought to the Show. If when queried, correctness cannot be proven, the entry in question shall not be accepted. If already accepted the entry may be cancelled or the exhibitor may be disqualified, and any award made to it cancelled.

No refunds will be given if the incorrect class is listed on the entry form.

If any wilful misstatement or incorrectness shall at any time be proved to have been made in any certificate, either in connection with the Shows of this Society or any other Breed Society, the offenders shall (at the discretion of the Show Manager) be disqualified from exhibiting at the Shows of this Society. If such certificate relates to an animal which has been or shall be awarded a prize at this Society's Show, the prize shall be withheld.

Entry will not be granted to any animals that have not provided the correct information prior to the Show or to any animals that have arrived without correct documentation.

4. AGE OF ANIMAL ON ENTRY

The year of birth of horses and ponies must be correctly stated on the entry form. Should any question arise as to the age of any equine the Stewards may, at the request of the Judge, have the state of dentition of the equine examined by a competent authority. If in the opinion of such authority the stated age of any animal does not agree with the dentition test, the Stewards shall have power to disqualify such animal. Any animal having failed to pass the dentition test at any other show shall forthwith be disqualified.

5. DATA PROTECTION - GDPR

All data given upon entry into classes with the Kent County Agricultural Society may be provided to Breed Societies or appropriate authority for the checking of eligibility and publication of results. Name, contact details and results will be published in the catalogue and online. Details may also be provided to the press and Breed Societies for publication. Information about exhibitors will be forwarded to the appropriate regulatory authority, as well as the Society's veterinary advisers. By making an entry to a class with the Kent County Agricultural Society you are providing consent for the storage and disclosure of information in this way.

6. REJECTION

The Show Manager, supported by the Council reserves the right to reject or cancel the entry or entries made by any person if they shall deem fit to do so. No reason must be provided.

7. AMALGAMATION OR CANCELLATION OF CLASSES

Classes may be cancelled or amalgamated unless there are at least three entries. All class changes will be published at least 5 days before the show. Refunds will be issued to those whose classes have been cancelled by the Society.

8. SUBSTITUTION AND ELIGIBILITY TO COMPETE

No substitution of showing entries will be permitted after the closing date for entries and only entries actually printed in the official show catalogue are eligible to compete. It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure that they are eligible to compete in each class.

9. REFUNDS

Refunds will only be considered if an animal is medically unable to compete. If exhibitors are unable to compete, a refund request will have to be completed within one month of the Show. No refunds will be considered after this time. A valid vet's certificate must support the refund request. There will be no refunds prior to the Show, all requests will be considered after the Show.

 $Stables, \ additional \ passes \ and \ support \ vehicle \ passes \ are \ not \ eligible \ for \ refunds \ under \ any \ circumstances.$

TICKETS

10. SHOW PACKS

Show information will be issued via EMAIL to exhibitors approximately 1 week prior to the Show. Please ensure you submit the correct email address when making your entry. If you have ordered a separate supporting vehicle pass, this will be posted out to the address submitted on your entry form.

Wristbands, passes and competitor numbers to gain access to the Showground must be collected from the Secretary tent located in Horsebox Parking Area where all passes and numbers will be.

SHOW PACKS WILL NOT BE SENT OUT VIA POST.

11. EXHIBITOR'S TICKETS

In case of the transfer or improper use of a ticket it will be immediately cancelled, and the full price of admission charged. Exhibitors will be expected to pay the full price for admission to the Show if tickets are lost, stolen, or not presented at the gate for whatever reason. No refunds will be issued.

Equine and Showjumping exhibitors will be allocated four entry passes for the first horse, and one additional pass for each horse thereafter.

Scurry competitors will be allocated four entry passes for the first pair of horses and two additional passes for each pair thereafter.

Fancy dress entries will be allocated the appropriate amount of wristbands for the number of people exhibiting, along with 2 extra passes.

ARRIVAL AND TRANSIT OF ANIMALS

12. PARKING FOR HORSE BOXES AND TRAILERS

Horseboxes and trailers will have automatic access to the horsebox park without a pass. No cars will be allowed access into the horsebox park unless a Green E support vehicle pass has been purchased upon entry. This will allow access into the horsebox park, however it is NOT guaranteed you will be parked next to the horsebox or trailer you are accompanying.

13. ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE

Horses and ponies will be admitted and may depart from the Horsebox park at any time during the Show. Gates onto the showground will be closed after 6pm. Entrance and exit gates into the Horsebox park will be closed after 7pm but can still be accessed, they must be left as found.

14. STABLES

Stables are available at the rental charge of £55 each per night and will be reserved from 6.30pm on the day for which they were ordered until 6.00pm the following day. Stabling charges are not refundable, except under the conditions stated in Shire and Heavy Horse Turnout classes.

15. BEDDING

Horse bedding for stables will NOT be supplied. The Heavy Horse village will be supplied with bedding. Used bedding must be cleared and removed to the muck heap before departure.

16. SAFETY

All animals must be brought to the Show in a safe manner.

17. WELFARE OF ANIMALS (IN TRANSIT) ORDER 2006

All exhibitors must ensure that they comply fully with the current legislation issued by the Department for Environment, Food & Rural Affairs regarding the UK Welfare of Animals in Transport Regulation and are able to provide the appropriate documentation at the Show to the relevant governing authority.

For the purposes of this article, animals shall not be considered fit for transport if they are.

- a) Unfit animals (see DEFRA website Annex 1 Chapter 1 of Council Regulation 1/2005).
- b) Pregnant female animals that have reached the latest stage of gestation (within 10% of the estimated time of the gestation before birth) and for a period of one week after giving birth.
- c) Females who have given birth during the previous seven days
- d) Very young animals except if the journey is less than 100 km

VETERINARY

18. VETERINARY TREATMENT

It is a condition of entry that the Society's veterinary officers may treat any animal in an emergency and agree the best course of action (including dispatch if necessary) whether or not the owner/exhibitor is present. If emergency veterinary treatment is required at the Show, exhibitors will be responsible for the cost of any medication or drugs used in the treatment of their animals and payment must be made direct to the veterinary officer at the time of treatment.

Any animal that is receiving veterinary treatment at the time of the Show should not be entered unless the owner has had the animal examined by their own Vet and it is safe for them to enter the Show. However, animals still showing evidence of disease will not be permitted to be shown; the ultimate decision will rest with the Kent County Show Veterinary Officers.

19. CONTAGION

Every exhibitor of any animal which to their knowledge is suffering from any contagious or infectious disease, or which has been in contact with any animal suffering as such, shall pay the Society £100 as compensation and for liquidated damages for each and every animal so sent. In addition, in the event of the Society's Veterinary Inspector certifying that any animal sent for exhibition is in his opinion a possible source of danger, such animal shall be removed with due speed by the Participant, from the Showground, or be otherwise managed as per the Veterinarian's direction with a view to averting the spread of contagion.

20. EQUINE PASSPORTS AND INFLUENZA

It is obligatory for all equines to be accompanied by a valid equine passport whenever they are transported to and from Showgrounds. There will be spot checks carried out by an Inspector.

The declaration on the application form about the proper vaccination of horses and ponies against equine influenza must be signed by the Exhibitor or his/her agent. A passport showing a single vaccination only will not be acceptable unless it is clearly shown as a booster administered within 12 MONTHS. Foals under six months of age are exempt from vaccination.

21. HANDLERS AND RIDERS

All handlers, riders and drivers must be competent and experienced to compete at the level of competition in which entered.

Riders should be the appropriate weight for the horse or pony they are riding. Any riders not deemed the appropriate weight may be asked to leave the class at the discretion of the Kent County Show veterinary officer. There will be 2 welfare stewards on site across the duration of the show, who will be assessing suitably mounted riders and the welfare of the horses and ponies competing, and spot checking throughout the Showground on each day.

22. WHISKERS

Horses will not be permitted to compete if their sensory hairs have been clipped and/or shaven or in any other way removed unless individual sensory hairs have been removed by a veterinarian to prevent pain or discomfort for the horse.

23. MISUSE OF DRUGS

The Society reserves the right to take blood and urine samples from any animal at the Show to test for the presence of illegal or banned substances.

HEALTH & SAFETY

24. HEALTH & SAFETY

The Organisers of this Show have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the Organisers and all the Officials and Stewards.

25. LUNGING

There should be no lunging in the Showground, including all collecting rings and public areas, except for the dedicated warm-up area provided in the Horse Box Park.

26. RING GATES

Horses or ponies will enter the show rings at walk. For safety reasons it may be necessary to close and reopen the ring gate before all competitors have entered. A steward will advise the judge when the class is ready to start.

27. NO SMOKING

Strictly no smoking in any buildings or marquees on the Showground.

28. EVICTION

The Stewards shall have power to remove from the Showground the animal belonging to (and cancel the tickets of) any participant who does not comply with the instructions given by the Stewards, without any responsibility attaching to the Stewards or the Society in consequence of such removal.

29. DOGS

Exhibitors must ensure that their dogs are kept quiet, under strict control and on leads at all times whilst on the Showground itself, the Stable Area or the car parks.

JUDGING

30. JUDGING

Only the Stewards and authorised officials (including the official photographer) shall enter any of the rings or have any communication with the Judges during the time the judging is taking place. All participants acting in opposition to this rule shall forfeit such premiums as may be awarded to their exhibits.

The Judges may withhold any prize where there is evident want of merit. Where there is only one entry shown in a class, the judges may award the first, second, third or fourth prize according to the merit of that entry.

Once a class has started, late competitors will only be allowed entry into the ring if the Judge(s) is/are prepared to accept them.

It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to ascertain the class is running on time and the schedule has not been changed since the time of entry.

It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to note the name of the Judge(s) appointed for the classes they wish to enter and are advised, in the interests of all concerned, not knowingly to enter an animal bred by, previously owned by or has any connections with the Judge appointed.

The decision of the Judge(s) is final.

31. PROGENY

All foals must be the offspring of the mares with which they are exhibited and accompany them into the judging ring.

32. TEMPORARY ACCIDENT

Any animal suffering from an accident, having temporary consequences only, will not be disqualified on that account.

33. PROTESTS

Any exhibitor wishing to make a protest, having reference to any exhibit at the Show, must make it in writing to the Show Office and deposit the sum of £20.00, which may, at the discretion of the Council, be forfeited to the funds of the Society if the protest should appear to them to be frivolous or unreasonable. All protests must be delivered to the Show Manager before 5.00pm on the day of judging. After that hour no protest will be received unless a special and satisfactory reason can be given for the delay. A Council meeting will be called to consider any such protests at 10.30am on the following day at which time any person making a protest, or their authorised agent must be available to answer questions if required. Protests lodged against awards made on the third day of the Show will be considered at a time and place which will be fixed by the Council. The decision of the Council shall be final.

34. DRESS CODE

All those entering the rings with horses or ponies, or to attend to horses or ponies must be properly dressed wearing hats, jackets, and the appropriate exhibit number where applicable. Anyone riding a horse or pony on the Showground, practice areas or car parks must wear a hat of a standard approved by the governing body of the competitors respective horse/pony society, association, or discipline and under whose rules the competitor is exhibiting

RESULTS AND PRIZES

35. PRIZE MONEY

Please see individual class for details of prize money for equine and showjumping classes.

All prize money will be paid to the exhibitor by BACS as listed on the entry form within four weeks of the Show date. Details for payments must be entered on the entry form, at time of entry.

In all cases where the prizes are offered conditionally, they shall be withheld until the exhibitor shall have proved to the satisfaction of the Council that the conditions have been fulfilled.

36. TROPHIES

Trophies will be presented in the ring at time of presentation, where there will be a photo opportunity. Trophies will be engraved; however trophies will be kept in the possession of the Kent County Agricultural Society, and will no longer be sent to exhibitors after the show.

37. RESERVE AWARDS

In awarding prizes, the Judges are instructed to add a reserve number in each instance (provided there is sufficient merit), stating the next best animal, in case any animal to which a prize has been awarded should be disqualified.

In the case of any prize animal being disqualified, the winner of the next succeeding prize in that class shall take the prize that has been awarded to the disqualified animal.

38. ROSETTES

No animal will be allowed to wear rosettes or ribbons and no prize cards may be displayed other than those issued by the Society.

In awarding prizes, the judges have been requested to award six rosettes in each class, provided there is sufficient merit.

39. RESULTS AND MARK SHEETS

Results and mark sheets will be displayed the day after the last show day. Any queries regarding results should be sent in writing to the Show office within four weeks of the date of the Show. No amendments to results and prize money will be made after this time.

GENERAL

40. DISCLAIMER

Exhibits, the public and all participants are subject to the Rules and Regulations of the Society.

Neither the Society nor any of its officials will be responsible for anything that may happen from any cause or circumstances whatsoever to visitors or participants attending the Show, or through or to any animal or article exhibited at the Show and it shall be considered a condition of entry or admission to the grounds that each person shall hold the Society harmless and that they shall indemnify the Society against any legal proceedings arising from any such case or circumstances.

41. EXHIBITOR BEHAVIOUR

Respectful language and attitude will be expected at all times towards volunteer stewards, judges, and other competitors.

42. ADVERTISING AND SPONSORSHIP

No person shall be allowed to fix any placard in the Showground without the written permission of the Show Manager and no exhibitor shall be allowed to distribute flyers anywhere in the Showground. Any exhibitor who would like to advertise should speak to the Show Office regarding sponsorship at the Show which would provide the exhibitor with advertising opportunities.

43. DISPUTES

All disputes respecting the Rules and Regulations of the Society together with all questions, the consideration of which is not otherwise provided for, shall be referred to the Stewards or Council, whose decision shall be final.

44. AMENDMENTS

The Society reserves the right to review and amend their rules and regulations prior to the Show. Any amendments will be listed on the Society website www.kcas.org.uk
