Veterinary Certification of the above BVD status is required with the entry form.

In addition, Cattle must also be at Level 1 or 2 for Johnes as part of a CHECS Scheme. Veterinary Certification of the above is required with the entry form.

# NB: It is a requirement of DEFRA that all livestock on arrival is inspected by the show vet.

All bulls over 12 months must have nose rings or bull clips. They must be double tied in cattle stands.

It is advisable that in the interest of safety all bulls and beef cows over 12 months of age have nose rings or bull clips going to and from the rings. All cattle to be double tied.

Handlers must be suitably attired and deemed competent to handle the animal, bearing in mind the age and temperament of said animal.

Show Challenge Cup presented by Farm Industries Limited for the Exhibitor who obtains the highest number of points in the cattle classes, on the basis of 3,2,1 for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> respectively. (Won by: Mrs S Fildes 2024).

The Peter Mingo Perpetual Challenge Cup will be presented at Kingsbridge Show in September to the Exhibitor gaining the most points in the Cattle Classes at the three Agricultural shows of Yealmpton, Totnes and Kingsbridge during the season. Competitors must compete at all three shows to be eligible for this cup.

First will be awarded 3 points, Second awarded 2 points and Third awarded 1 point for each class.

#### RULES FOR CATTLE AND SHEEP EXHIBITORS

All classes are open except where stated and all stock must be from TB and Brucellosis Accredited Herds. In addition, cattle must be either (i) from a certified BVD Accredited Herd (ii) the herd must have undergone a negative BVD Antigen test plus BVD vaccination. Veterinary Certification of the above BVD status is required with the entry form.

In addition, for 2025 Cattle must also be at Level 1 or 2 for Johnes as part of a CHECS Scheme. Veterinary Certification of the above is required with the entry form.

- 1.Separate penning for MV accredited flocks and scrapie monitored flocks. A valid MV Health Status Form must be presented for inspection before unloading in the MV accredited area on the Show day. If this is not available then as per the scheme rules, the stock may be refused entry or segregated. This will be at the sole discretion of the Chief Sheep Steward. The Show has to retain this form in line with current scheme rules and submit to the scheme organisers. Please enclose a copy of the valid MV Health Status Form with your entry form. NB: Please ensure you have indicated on your form whether you are scrapie monitored.
- 2.All cattle and sheep must be on the Show field by 8.45am or otherwise stated in the Schedule..
- 3.All cattle and sheep shall be inspected on arrival to the showground by the veterinary officer acting on behalf of the Show. No livestock may leave its means of transport until such inspection has taken place.
- 4. Any animal showing signs of sickness shall be isolated and shall be inspected by the Show's Veterinary surgeon. If the animal is suspected of showing signs of a notifiable disease then APHA will be contacted.
- 5. The Biosecurity Officers (Chief Stewards) and Show Stewards have the authority to deny access to the showground to any exhibitor/livestock handler who arrives in dirty clothing and does not have a change of clothes/footwear.
- 6.All exhibitors/livestock handlers must use the disinfectant footbath on passing through the cattle and sheep areas; these areas to be signed appropriately by the Show.
- 7. Vehicles transporting sheep and cattle to the Show must stay parked in the animal areas of the showground once livestock have been unloaded for the duration of the Show.
- 8. No vehicle which is visibly contaminated with animal excreta shall be authorised onto the showground.
- 9. The Show shall provide sufficient facilities for Judges, Stewards, Exhibitors and livestock handlers to use when they need to change their protective clothing, wash their hands, disinfect their footwear or dispose of protective clothing within the animal areas.
- 10. The animal areas shall mean the area for judging, penning of sheep and tethering of cattle, unloading and loading of sheep and cattle and the parking of

vehicles transporting the same.

- 11. The Exhibitor shall supply the name and address of all livestock handlers assisting the exhibitor in showing livestock at the Show so that they may be traced in the event of a suspect or confined notifiable disease.
- 12. The Exhibitor shall [on the entry form] provide the passport number/ ear tag of all livestock being exhibited at the Show for tracing purposes in the event of a suspected or confirmed notifiable disease.
- 13.Entry to the Show sheep classes is not restricted to pedigree sheep, however special prizes are subject to confirmation and may be subject to restriction. 14.It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to ensure that any handler of livestock is of suitable experience, age and physical capability to be in charge of the animal. Any junior exhibitors who lead livestock in the grand parade must be accompanied by a competent adult who is NOT handling other animals. Use of mobile phones etc is prohibited when leading animals in the grand parade. 15.In the event of the livestock classes being cancelled due to a notifiable disease outbreak exhibitors entry fees will be refunded by the Show.

Thank you for noting these conditions, which have enabled Kingsbridge Show to obtain a licence to permit the exhibition of livestock.

#### GENERAL RULES AND CONDITIONS

- 1.All Horticulture/Homecraft/Childrens'/Arable and Young Farmer exhibits must be delivered and placed by 9am with vehicles OFF SITE.
- 2.All exhibits must remain on the field until 5pm. The Show reserves the right to withhold any prize money which may have been awarded to anyone failing to comply.
- 3. Competent Judges will be selected, who may not be competitors at the Show. Their decision is final.
- 4. The Judges will be empowered to withhold the prizes including trophies/cups in any of the classes where they are of the opinion there is not sufficient merit in competition.
- 5.In case of protest or dispute, the same shall be stated in writing to the Show Secretary immediately the exhibit in dispute has been judged and the sum of £10 must be deposited with the Show Secretary by the person(s) raising the objection. All questions of protest or dispute will be decided by the Show, whose decision shall be binding and final on all parties.
- 6.In all cases where three prizes are offered, unless the exhibits exceed the number of prizes by two, one or more prizes may be withheld at the discretion of the Show.
- 7.In all cases where there are insufficient entries in any class, the Show reserves the right to cancel the class.
- 8. While the Officials take every care, the Show will not in any case or under

any circumstances be responsible for any accident, loss, damage or injury to the competitors, exhibitors and to the public attending the Show, or for stock or produce which may be exhibited at the Show.

- 9.Owners, competitors and riders are under obligation at all times when mounted to ensure that they are wearing protective head gear complying with current British Standards.
- 10.All cups and trophies must be returned by 31<sup>st</sup> July to the Cup Secretary and must be kept fully insured by the prize winners while in their possession. All cups and trophies must be looked after in a careful manner and returned in the same condition as when awarded/collected, failing which the exhibitor will be responsible for repair at their own cost and may lead to disqualification from entering future shows.

Failure to return cups and trophies may lead to the Show taking legal action for their recovery and a financial penalty being imposed. Cups remain the property of Kingsbridge Show at all times.
