

FLORAL ART

Judge: Jenny Young

Entrance Fee: 50p per entry

Prize-money: £5, £3, £2

Exhibits to be in place by 9.00am

One wristband to be allocated to each exhibitor entering a minimum of 3 entries.

Prize-winners are asked to collect their prize money from the Secretary's Tent on show day. Prize monies will be paid upon receipt of the winners ticket(s). Prizes not claimed on the day may be claimed by sending the winners ticket(s) and a stamped addressed envelope to the Show Secretary by no later than 30th September. Monies not claimed by this date are forfeit.

ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED UP TO AND INCLUDING SATURDAY 30th AUGUST 2025.

NB: An exhibit is plant material with or without accessories. No artificial plant material to be used. Height is not restricted except where stated. Open staging on off white surface and against side of marquee. All classes will be viewed and judged from the front.

Exhibitors may choose to bring exhibits pre-done or assemble on site by 9.00am.

- 600 Razzmatazz – it's party time! - an exhibit. Space allowed 75cm width, 60cm depth
- 601 "I must go down to the sea again, to the lonely sea and the sky" – an exhibit. Space allowed 60cm width, 60cm depth
- 602 A Fascinating Fascinator – a decorated item made of plant material. Space A4.
- 603 Moorland Magic – a miniature exhibit. Space allowed 10cm width, 10cm depth, 10cm height
- 604 Candle power – an exhibit. Space allowed 60cm width, 60cm depth
- 605 "A garden is a lovesome place" – an exhibit to include a basket. A NOVICE CLASS for anyone who has not won a first prize in the Floral Art Section in past Kingsbridge Shows
- 606. Wild about wood – a modern exhibit. Space allowed 60cm width, 60cm depth.

The Phyllis Bond Memorial Perpetual Rose Bowl for the best Floral Art exhibit (Won by Helen Reeve 2023, Cynthia Morgan 2024).

A Perpetual Challenge Cup presented by **Kingsbridge Flower Club** to the exhibitor with the most points in the Floral Art Section. (Won by Cynthia Morgan 2023/2024).

RULES FOR HORTICULTURAL & FLORAL ART

NB: Rules 4 – 10 relate to Horticulture Section only

Exhibitors must themselves be responsible for the proper placing of their own exhibits.

Exhibits may be staged at the place of exhibition between 7am and 8.45am on Show day or on the previous evening between 6pm and 8pm.

All Exhibits must remain on the field until 5pm. The Show reserves the right to withhold any prizemoney which may have been awarded to anyone failing to comply.

All horticultural exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor and have been in his or her possession for at least two months prior to the date of the Show.

Where the quantity to be exhibited is stated in the Schedule it must be adhered to and any excess or deficiency in the number shown will disqualify.

The Judges have the power to reduce or withhold prizes where the exhibits are deficient in merit and number. They have discretionary power to cut and taste any vegetables.

The gardens of all horticultural exhibitors must be open for inspection by the Show after entries have been made.

In Sections A and B only one entry of the permissible two entries will count for points for the Challenge Cup and in the event of a tie the one with the least number of entries shall be the winner.

Competent judges shall be selected to judge in both Vegetable and Flower sections.

Shallot and Onion classes where stated to be tied, should be tied with natural raffia only.
