Prize-money: £2, £1.50, £1

One entry per class only.

One admission wristband to be allocated to each exhibitor entering a minimum of 5 entries.

Exhibits to be in place by 9.00am

Prize-winners are asked to collect their prize money from the Secretary's Tent - see General Rules below.

- 300. Pot of Lemon Curd.
- 301. Pot of Raspberry Jam.
- 302. Pot of Blackcurrant Jam.
- 303. Pot of jam, any other variety.
- 304. Pot of Jelly, any variety.
- 305. Pot of Marmalade.
- 306. Pot of Chutney, any variety, cooked and at least 3 months old.
- 307. 5 Sausage Rolls.
- 308. A savoury Flan, not exceeding 9" in diameter and removed from the tin.
- 309. 5 pieces of Flapjack.
- 310. Five Cheese Scones.
- 311. Bottle of homemade fruit cordial or squash.
- 312. 5 Shortbread Biscuits.
- 313. Victoria Sandwich, jam filled.
- 314. 5 Slices of Chocolate Tray Bake.
- 315. Orange TeaBread

Recipe:

Finely grated rind of 2 Oranges.	5oz currants.
5oz soft brown sugar.	5oz raisins.
1 Egg.	10oz SR Flour
Half Pint Hot Tea	

Method.

Put the fruit, sugar & orange rind in a heatproof bowl and pour over the tea. Stir very well, cover with a plate and leave to stand until cold.

Grease and line a 2lb loaf tin.

Beat the egg and mix into the soaked fruit. Stir in the flour. Pour mixture into prepared tin and bake for approx.. 1 hour – 300F/150C; Gas Mark 3.

- 316. 6 hens eggs, brown, displayed on white plate.
- 317. 6 hens eggs, tinted, displayed on white plate.
- 318. Hand knitted garment, double knitting (not to be worn before competition).

- 319. Handicraft using any soft material.
- 320. Handicraft using a medium of painting, metal or wood.
- 321. Cushion, any medium.
- 322. Soft Toy (not to be donated)
- 323. An up-cycled item.
- 324. Collection of four coloured photographs, subject 'This Farming Life', not exceeding 10cm x 15cm each, mounted on card/cardboard not exceeding 42cm x 30cm.
- 325. A single black and white photograph, subject 'Water', with a caption, mount not exceeding A3 size.
- 326. A single coloured photograph, subject 'Nature', mount not exceeding A3 size.

GENERAL RULES AND CONDITIONS

- 1.All Horticulture/Homecraft/Childrens'/Arable and Young Farmer exhibits must be delivered and placed by 9am with vehicles OFF SITE.
- 2.All exhibits must remain on the field until 5pm. The Show reserves the right to withhold any prize money which may have been awarded to anyone failing to comply.
- 3.Competent Judges will be selected, who may not be competitors at the Show. Their decision is final.
- 4.The Judges will be empowered to withhold the prizes including trophies/cups in any of the classes where they are of the opinion there is not sufficient merit in competition.
- 5.In case of protest or dispute, the same shall be stated in writing to the Show Secretary immediately the exhibit in dispute has been judged and the sum of £10 must be deposited with the Show Secretary by the person(s) raising the objection. All questions of protest or dispute will be decided by the Show, whose decision shall be binding and final on all parties.
- 6.In all cases where three prizes are offered, unless the exhibits exceed the number of prizes by two, one or more prizes may be withheld at the discretion of the Show.
- 7.In all cases where there are insufficient entries in any class, the Show reserves the right to cancel the class.
- 8.While the Officials take every care, the Show will not in any case or under any circumstances be responsible for any accident, loss, damage or injury to the competitors, exhibitors and to the public attending the Show, or for stock or produce which may be exhibited at the Show.
- 9.Owners, competitors and riders are under obligation at all times when mounted to ensure that they are wearing protective head gear complying with

current British Standards.

10. All cups and trophies must be returned by 31st July to the Cup Secretary and must be kept fully insured by the prize winners while in their possession. All cups and trophies must be looked after in a careful manner and returned in the same condition as when awarded/collected, failing which the exhibitor will be responsible for repair at their own cost and may lead to disqualification from entering future shows.

Failure to return cups and trophies may lead to the Show taking legal action for their recovery and a financial penalty being imposed. Cups remain the property of Kingsbridge Show at all times.

11. Prize winners in ALL CLASSES are asked to collect their prizemoney from the Secretary's Tent on show day from 12 Noon. Prize monies will be paid upon receipt of the winners ticket(s). Prizes not claimed on the day may be claimed by sending the winner ticket(s) and a stamped addressed envelope to the Show Secretary at 38 Lyte Lane, West Charleton, Kingsbridge TQ7 2BW by no later than 30th September. Monies not claimed by this date are forfeit.
