Each exhibitor will be provided with an 80cm x 80cm base to display their crafts. Each year, a new theme will be given and exhibitors will display a range of 5 different crafts linked to this theme. The base will be plain black but exhibitors can personalise the base with temporary decoration that must be removed when exhibits are taken down. The items are marked separately as well as given a total of points overall.
