All exhibitors and participators will be expected to adhere to the legislation and must obey instructions of the show organisers. Failure to comply with the regulations may result in livestock or trade entries being declined and or persons being refused access to some or all of the show field. This policy will be strictly adhered too.

The Association has the legal right to make changes to its conditions of entry if Defra regulations change.

RESPONSIBILITY

Neither the Association, or its officers or servants, shall be in any way responsible or accountable for anything that may happen from any infectious or contagious disease, or any other cause, or circumstance whatever to exhibitors or their servants, or to any animal or article exhibited or property brought into the show-yard, or otherwise for anything else in connection with, or arising out of or attributable to, the Association's Show. Each exhibitor shall be solely responsible for any consequential or other loss, injury, or damage done to, or occasioned by, or arising from, any animal or article exhibited by him, including any infectious or contagious disease and shall indemnify the Association against all legal or other proceedings in regard hereto.

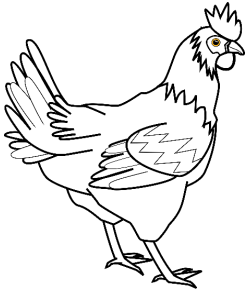

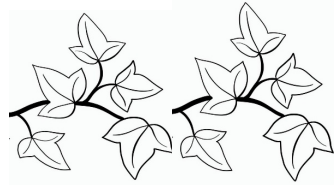

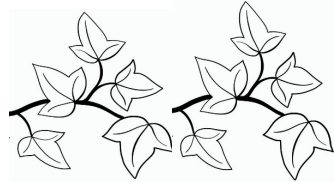

4. Entrance Fees: The Entry Fee for Horses is £8.00 unless otherwise stated in the Schedule. Cattle £4.00, Sheep £3. Junior Classes £2.00. Entry fees are non-refundable
5. In the interest of the Exhibition, it is a condition of entry that all cattle and sheep entries be in the Showfield by **8.30a.m.** and must remain until **5.30p.m.** No exhibit to leave the Showfield without authorisation from the Secretary or Showfield Director. Horse exhibitors competing in the morning must be on the Showfield by **9.00am**. Horse exhibitors competing **in the afternoon only** must arrive by **1.00pm**. Horse exhibitors may leave with permission from the Senior Horse Steward. **The Committee will withhold all prize money until after the Grand Parade. All prize money is to be collected on Show day, no payments will be made after the Show.**
6. The Judges will be instructed not to award any prize in classes where Exhibits do not warrant sufficient merit.

16. All animals brought into the Show field shall be subject to Rules of the Associations and its representatives. All exhibitors to be punctual and abide to the Show timings for judging and parades.
17. All Exhibitors and their handlers must have the physical ability, relevant experience and be competent to handle the animal that they are in charge of at all times. Handlers must be properly trained in safe work methods and be in good health.
18. Animal Welfare – The Association expects all exhibitors to observe best practice at all times. Any malpractice i.e. udder tampering, overstocking of udders, non-compliance with sheep tail docking regulations and use of medicine without Veterinary authorisation or prescription will disqualify that animal from being awarded a prize. Such behaviour may prohibit the Exhibitor from entering in the future.
19. All riders should be height/weight appropriate for the size of the pony/horse.
20. **The Committee reserve the right to cancel or alter any class at their discretion.**
21. All disputes shall be settled by the Stewards, whose decision shall be final or may be referred to the Executive Committee, if desired by them.
22. The Honorary Veterinary Surgeon is also the Bio-Security officer – their word is final.

23. Exhibitors will be expected to bed their own stock subject to DEFRA regulations and provide sufficient feed for the time on the Showfield.
24. **ALL prize winning Animals if requested will be required to parade.**
Exhibitors are particularly requested to have their animals ready at the time ordered. The Committee will withhold Prize Money until after The Grand Parade.
25. The Association will allocate what it considers to be an appropriate number of entry passes to exhibitors, and it is a condition of entry that exhibitors accept the number of passes allocated and agree to pay admission charges on entering the Show Field for all other persons accompanying them. Additional tickets at a rate of £13.00 per adult & £3 per child available from Secretary until closing date 10th July 2025 – please purchase online or contact the Secretary – 07988 479452.
26. Bio Security Regulations. The Show is being held in accordance with The Animal Gatherings (Interim Movements) (England) Order 2003 (as amended) re Agricultural Shows regulations, copies of which are available for inspection. All exhibitors and participators will be expected to adhere to the legislation and must obey instruction of the show organisers. Failure to comply with the regulations may result in livestock or trade entries being declined and or persons being refused access to some or the entire show field. This policy will be strictly adhered too. The Association has the legal right to make changes to its conditions of entry if DEFRA regulations change.

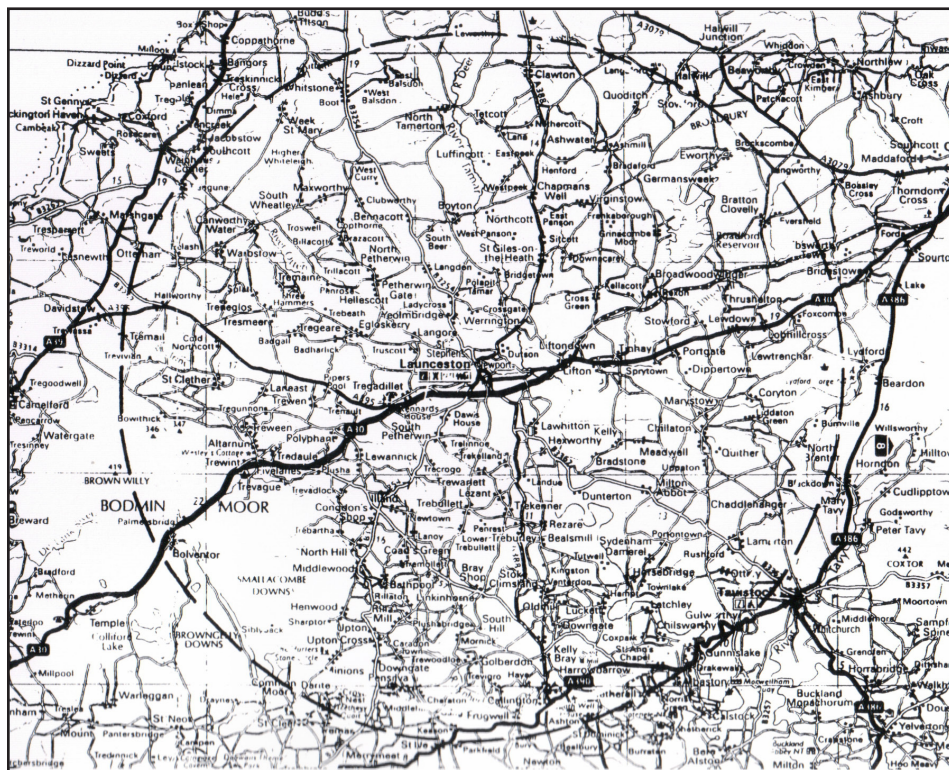
