In the event of equality of penalties for first place there will be a jump-off against the clock, in which the starting order will be the same as for the first round.

For registered ponies not exceeding 148cm, to be ridden by Junior Members. Only those pony /rider combinations qualified may enter, confirmation of qualification will be made by British Showjumping.

Numbers to qualify:

- 5 Pony/Rider combinations from the Pony European Championships 2026.
- Top 2 Pony/Rider combinations from the National 148cm Championship at The British Showjumping National Championships 2026
- Top Pony/Rider combination from the Pony 148cm Gold League, ending 30th September 2026
- Top 2 Pony/Rider combinations from the Pony Showjumper of the Year Championship at Horse of the Year Show 2026.
- Top 2 Pony/Rider combinations from the 148cm Grand Prix at the English Home Pony 2026 (South View E C).

Any combinations in a qualifying place that have not jumped clear in the first round will not qualify and this place becomes a wildcard. Qualification to be confirmed by British Showjumping.

Riders may only compete with one pony in the Final.

In the event of equality of penalties for first place there will be a jump-off against the clock, in which the starting order will be the same as for the first round.

For registered ponies in Grades: JA, JC & JD to be ridden by junior members, ages in accordance with Rule 77.13. Ponies must not exceed 128cm. Only those pony /rider combinations qualified may enter, confirmation of qualification will be made by British Showjumping.

Numbers to qualify:

- Top 4 Pony/Rider combinations from the National 128cm Championship at The British Showjumping National Championships 2026
- Top Pony/Rider combination from the Pony 128cm Gold League ending 30th September 2026
- Top 4 Pony/Rider combinations from the Horse of the Year Show 128cm Championship at Horse of the Year Show 2026.
- Top 3 Pony/Rider combinations from the 128cm Grand Prix at the English Home Pony 2026 (South View E C).

Any combinations in a qualifying place that have not jumped clear in the first round, will not qualify and this place becomes a wildcard.

Qualification to be confirmed by British Showjumping.

Riders may only compete with one pony in the Final.

THE EVOKE UNDER 25 BRITISH CHAMPIONSHIP

SUNDAY MORNING, 20TH DECEMBER - 0950 hrs approx

CLASS 14 - THE EVOKE UNDER 25 BRITISH CHAMPIONSHIP

Rules: Table A9. Start height: 1.45m. Maximum height of fences in the first round; 1.45m-1.50m. Speed: 350 metres per minute. Drawn order.

Maximum spread: 1.60m; Triple Bar 1.90m.

The best five scores, or all clear rounds, will go forward to the second round, which will be against the clock. In the event of equality, faults and time will decide i.e. the fastest four faulters will qualify. All scores in the first round will be carried forward to the second round. Competitors in the second round will start in the reverse order of merit according to faults and time in the first round. If necessary, those who do not reach the second round, faults and time in the first round will determine their placings.

If a competitor withdraws from the second round, they will not be replaced and they will receive the placing from the first round, however they will be placed after those who compete in the second round.

The qualification criteria for the twenty-five riders who will be invited to compete in the 2026 Championship is as follows:

- The five riders from the Junior team at the FEI European Championships 2026
- The five riders from the Young Rider team at the FEI European Championships 2026
- Five Under 25 riders that have competed on any Senior Nations Cup or Senior European Championships (To be selected following the final Senior Nations Cup of 2026).

* If there are more than five riders eligible for qualification through this route, the riders results from the Nations Cup competitions will be taken into consideration and spaces will be decided by the Performance Manager. Double clears, single clears and 4 faults will take priority and 5* and Division 1 Nations Cups will take president over 4*/3* and EEF. If any of the 5 selected riders are unable to attend the place will pass down to any other U25 riders from senior teams based on Nations Cup results or revert to a wild card allocated by the Performance Manager.

- The top three Under 25 combinations (disregarding those riders already qualified) from the Under 25 British Championship Qualifiers at the following Winter Classic Shows** -

- Aintree International Equestrian Centre - 1 to 4 October 2026
- Kelsall Hill 29 October to 1 November 2026
- Morris Equestrian 12 to 15 November 2026

** Combinations must have jumped for 4 faults or less in the first round of the qualifier. Any places not filled will become Wildcards to be allocated by the Performance Manager.

- One wildcard to be awarded by the Performance Manager based on combinations results throughout 2026

FEI tack and boot rules apply. Padded Baton, Spurs must comply to national rules 101.9 & 102.9. Standing martingales are permitted in line with rule 102.3.

CONDITIONS

The London International Horse Show is managed by The HPower Group Ltd and presented by Clarion Events Ltd

1. EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION

Horses / Ponies competing at FEI Events must comply with the current requirements for Equine Influenza vaccination in accordance with the FEI Veterinary Regulations and as summarised below.

VACCINATION	PROTOCOL	ELIGIBILITY TO ENTER VENUE
Primary Course	1st Vaccination: day 0 (e.g. 1 January) 2nd Vaccination: day 21-60 (e.g. 1 February)	Horses that have only received Vaccination 1 of the primary course are not allowed to compete or enter the stables. Horses that have received the primary course can compete provided that Vaccination 2 has not been given within 7 days of arriving at an event venue.
First Booster	Within 6 months and 21 days of 2nd Vaccination	Horses must have been vaccinated to comply with the requirements for the Primary Course Horses can compete for up to 6 months +21 days after V3, however they cannot compete if they have been vaccinated within 7 days of arriving at an event venue
Boosters	MINIMUM: within one year of previous booster vaccination IF COMPETING: must be competing in the 6 months +21 days of the previous booster vaccination	Horses must have been vaccinated to comply with the requirements for the Primary Course, First Booster and all subsequent boosters. Horses must have been vaccinated within 6 months +21 days of arriving at the Event however they cannot compete if they have been vaccinated within 7 days of arriving at an event venue.

ALL HORSE AND PONIES WILL BE INSPECTED ON ARRIVAL. ANY HORSE OR PONY WITHOUT THE CORRECT CERTIFICATE WILL NOT BE ADMITTED TO THE SHOW UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES.

Do not send the certificate to the Organisers but it should accompany the horse / pony on arrival at the show.

2. EHV

Due to the increased risk of EHV infection, we shall be putting in place a strict biosecurity policy, including an increased frequency of examination of horses on arrival. We ask that owners/riders take their horse's/pony's temperature for the three days leading up to arrival at the Show, and on the morning of travel to ensure that it is not above 38.5 degrees.

Please do not arrive on site if you are at all concerned about the health of your horse or pony before leaving home. If, upon arrival, you are concerned about anything, please speak to an official who will raise one of the Veterinary Team to assist you and make a decision about whether access to the site will be permitted. Please take great care with all your tack and anything associated with your horse/pony and ensure that there is no contact or possibility of cross contamination with other entrants and their belongings.

We are requesting for all horses' competing in national competitions at the show to complete and bring with them the BEF Equine Health Status Declaration for Competition form, which we will provide competitor's with their notes on the run-up to the Show.

3. ACCREDITATION

National competitors will receive 3 passes per day they are competing/stabled at the show. Passes will be sent as e-tickets pre-show to the Billing Contact email on the entry.

Additional passes will be available to purchase.

Please note Sunday's Rider Accreditation WILL NOT give access to the Rider's seating during the FEI World Cup Jumping Class. These seats will be solely reserved for those with FEI Riders Accreditation.

4. PHOTOGRAPHY

(a) No professional photography is allowed at the venue except with permission obtained from the Press Office.

(b) It is understood and agreed by any Competitor attending the Show that permission is granted to HPower International Ltd (organisers of The London International Horse Show) for any photographs and/or film footage taken at the Show by any official photographer or film company to be used by them for security, promotional, live streaming and/or broadcasting purposes, furthermore the Competitor agrees that permission is without any payment.

5. DATA PROTECTION

Here at HPower International Ltd (organisers of The London International Horse Show) we take your privacy seriously. Your personal information, including details of this transaction, your name, address, email address and telephone number will be held securely on Showing Scene (<https://showingscene.com/>).

HPower International Ltd will only use your personal data to administer your entry and to contact you regarding your entry and general information about the show. HPower International Ltd will also send your data to any relevant society for registration confirmation. As part of this transaction, each entry may be included in the Show Programme and Results published on the Longines Timing website and The London International Horse Show website and social media. By completing your entry, the account holder, owner and rider are giving their consent for their personal data to be used as stated above.

6. EXERCISING AND WORKING IN

The welfare of all equine competitors participating at the Show is of paramount importance to the London International Horse Show Committee. The Show will be strictly enforcing that all Riders should be of an appropriate size and weight for the horse/pony being ridden in the International Arena and collecting ring. Riders deemed oversized for their mount will be asked to dismount by a Show Official or Steward; and may be ineligible to compete as a combination.

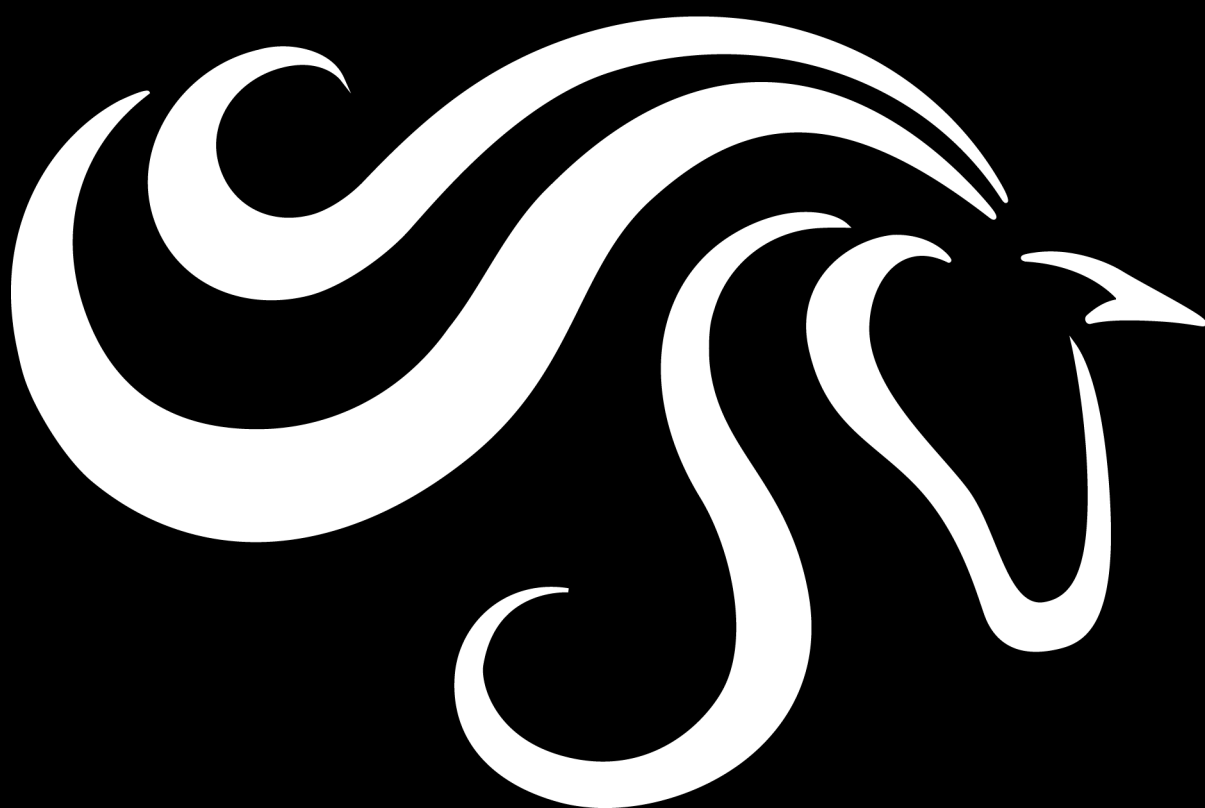
An overweight or underweight animal would be of concern under veterinary grounds. Following veterinary advice from the Show's onsite Veterinary Team the Rider may be asked to dismount the animal, and under these circumstances the animal may not be eligible to compete at the Show.

7. ABUSIVE BEHAVIOUR

No competitor shall behave in an offensive or abusive manner to any Judge/Show Official. The Show Committee reserves the right to disqualify offenders from taking part in the Show.

8. COMPETITION

No competitor will be allowed to compete the same horse/pony in the International Arena and the The Thomas Family London Arena on the same day. If an entry is submitted via the relevant Showing Society for an International Arena class, the entry in the London Showing Series class will automatically be withdrawn and refunded.
