#### **EQUINE INFLUENZA**

In order to attend the 2024 Melplash Show all equines must have been vaccinated for Equine Influenza.

The requirement for the first 3 vaccinations is as follows:
first 2 vaccinations 21 - 92 days apart;
third booster between 150-215 days;
annual booster vaccination within 365 days thereafter.
No horse should enter competitions within 7 days of an El vaccination.

No horse should enter competitions within / days of an El vaccination Foals should commence vaccinations at 6 months old.

We urge all owners to adhere to strict biosecurity protocols at all times. Vaccinations are subject to local risk assessments by the attending veterinarians. Please do not send vaccination certificates or passports to the show office prior to the event.

Random checks will be carried out on the showground during the day.

#### SHOW REGULATIONS

The Melplash Agricultural Society Show and its ancillary activities are organised and run by the Melplash Agricultural Society Limited.

The Committee shall have the power to interpret these rules and the regulations if there should be any ambiguity or difference of opinion concerning the purport or intention of any rule or regulation. The Committee shall have power to deal with any matter not provided for in these rules.

## Subscribers' Rates of Entry

- 1. All members of the Society and all persons subscribing £35 and upwards are 'Subscribers' and may take advantage of reduced entry fees as mentioned in the Prize Lists as follows:
  - Subscribers of up to £35 (£65.00 Double): Four entries at Subscriber's Rates each. Subscribers of £45 (£80.00 Double) or more: Unlimited number of entries at Subscribers' Rates.
  - a) No Member, while his subscription is unpaid shall enjoy any privileges of this Society, and no person, formerly a member of the Society but resigning whilst standing indebted to the Society, shall be permitted to make Subscribers' Rate Entries.
  - b) The privilege of entering at Subscribers' Rates is strictly limited to members of the Melplash Agricultural Society.
  - c) No entry will be accepted unless the correct fee accompanies it, and if the Exhibitor is a Member of the Society the subscription for the year, unless previously paid, together with any arrears that may be due.

#### Classes

 The Society reserves the right to cancel any breed section with three or less exhibitors and to amalgamate or cancel classes in which there are less than 6 entries. In the event of a class having to be cancelled the entry fee will be returned.

## **Entries & Closing Date**

All Subscriptions and Entry Fees must be paid to the Secretary at the time of entry, or the entries will not be accepted. All entries must be made on the printed forms to be obtained from the Show Secretary or available to download from our website: www.melplashshow.co.uk. Completed Forms must be received in the Show Secretary's Office by the closing date of entries. If any animal is entered in more than one class this must be clearly stated on the entry form. No refunds can be made for any entry after the relevant closing date.

### Ownership of Exhibits

4. Except where otherwise stated in the Schedule all exhibits must be the bona fide property of the Exhibitor.

## Ages of Animals

The ages of all animals exhibited must be stated at time of entry. The judges have the liberty of asking the Hon Veterinary Surgeons to apply the dentition test to any animal.

#### Local Class

6 Entries in Local Classes must come from within a radius of 12 miles of Melplash Church. Rule 4 concerning ownership also applies. The exception to this rule in class 1 - Local Hunter, entries must come from a radius of 20 miles.

#### Time of Arrival of Exhibits

7 Exhibits must be on the Show Field and be ready to be judged as per the timetable

#### **Bearer Entrance Tickets**

8 Bearer Entrance Tickets will be issued to enable Exhibitors to bring animals into the Show Field. Bearer tickets will be issued at the discretion of the Committee.

## Rejection of Entries

The Committee reserves the right to reject an entry.

## Entry Fees Forfeited/Travelling Expenses

Subscribers and Non-Subscribers making an entry and not sending their proposed exhibits to the Show shall forfeit their entry fee, except as stated in Jumping Classes. The Committee reserve the right to limit the number of entries if necessary, where travelling expenses are offered.

## Prizes may be withheld

All Prize Winners in the classes for Cattle, Sheep and Goats must parade at the Parade of Winners or forfeit their prize money.

#### Substitution and Nomination

All entries in classes for Hunters, Ponies and Livestock are to be made by name and no substitution will be allowed. Nomination entries will not be accepted.

#### **Protests**

Any person making a protest must make the same in writing within 30 minutes of completion of the judging of the class concerned and at the same time deposit £50.00 with the Secretary, which amount will be forfeited if the Chairman of Committees consider the objection frivolous. If the objection be on the grounds of unsoundness, the particular character of unsoundness must be stated, and any objection not made in the manner and within the time mentioned in this rule will be inadmissible, unless the Chairman of Committees shall otherwise direct.

#### **Disputes**

14 All disputes will be settled by a Committee and their decision will be final.

## The Judging Ring

No one will be allowed in the rings or near the Judges whilst they are engaged upon the awards, except those who have duties to perform, and any Steward being an exhibitor or interested in any exhibit must withdraw from the ring whilst the class in which he/she has entered or is interested in is being judged.

## **Departures**

All winners, including Heavy Horses but **excluding Horses and Ponies** must stay at the Show Field to parade in the Grand Parade or they will forfeit their prize. Exhibits in the Horticultural, Home Produce, Woodcraft & Handicraft Sections must not be moved until 5pm or at the Section Chairman's discretion.

#### Accident or Illness

The Society will not be responsible for any illness or accident from any cause whatsoever that may occur to any person (whether an exhibitor or not) or animal or damage to or loss of any article exhibited in the Show, and it shall be a condition of entry that any exhibitor shall indemnify the Society against any claim and cost arising from any such illness, accident, damage or loss.

## Conditions of Judging

In awarding prizes to cattle, Judges are instructed to decide according to the merits of the animals for breeding purposes so that an animal in 'store' condition may compete on equal terms with one which is fat.

#### Extra Stock

Spaces will be allotted for extra stock not shown for prizes, if asked for previously.

#### Animals Not Entered for Exhibition

20 If any animals are brought into the Show Field without having been entered for exhibition, unless prior consent has been obtained from the Show Secretary, the owner shall be liable for a fine of up to £15 and the forfeiture of any prize awarded to them.

#### Rosettes

No animal shall be decorated in colours other than the Society's Prize Rosettes and other rosettes awarded at the Show.

The Melplash Agricultural Society Limited has taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid or prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of all Officials and Stewards. All dogs should be kept under strict control on the Showground particularly around the Livestock Areas. Stewards and Officials reserve the right to reject any animal deemed to be unsafe.

To comply with Health & Safety Executive guidelines the Society has provided Horse Walks. It is a condition of entry that all exhibits keep within these designated routes, and that all reasonable precautions are taken to prevent accidents and that guidance is taken from Officials & Stewards at crossing points etc.

## Riders' Headgear

Protective headgear must be worn by riders of horses and ponies when mounted anywhere on the Showground. All riders aged 18 years and under must wear headwear to the current standard. When jumping in the ring, the practice or collecting areas all riders must wear protective headgear according to the current standards: All PAS 015; VG1; (BS) EN1384 2017; ASTM F1163 04a onwards; SNELL E2001; SNELL E2016; AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards. Skullcaps must be of, or worn with a dark coloured plain peaked cover. Correctly secured skull caps / riding hats that meet one of the following current safety standards/specifications MUST be worn by all riders between the ages of 15 to 17 inclusive: All PAS 015; VG1; (BS) EN1384 2017; ASTM F1163 04a onwards; SNELL E2001; SNELL E2016; AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards.

## **Body Protectors**

Body Protectors may be worn and are STRONGLY recommended whilst competing in WHP & WH classes.

## Equine Influenza

All equines must have been vaccinated for Equine Influenza. The requirement for the first 3 vaccinations is as follows: First 2 vaccinations 21 - 92 days apart; third booster between 150-215 days; annual booster vaccination within 365 days thereafter. No horse should enter competitions within 7 days of an El vaccination. Foals should commence vaccinations at 6 months old. We urge all owners to adhere to strict biosecurity protocols at all times. Vaccinations are subject to local risk assessments by the attending veterinarians.

## Passports & Vaccination Certificates

Neither the vaccination certificates nor passports should be sent to the show office prior to the show. However random checks will be carried out on the showground during the show so please ensure they accompany the animal to the show

#### **Bridles**

In the interest of safety, all horses and ponies aged 3 years old or over must wear a bit or Chifney whilst moving around the show ground.

## Young Handlers

All handlers in horse and pony classes must have attained their eight birthday on show day with the exception of class 11.

#### **Awards**

No second prize will be awarded in classes of less than three catalogued entries, no third prize will be awarded in classes of less than five catalogued entries.

The highest placed horse not exceeding 158cms to come forward to the championship for the H18 trophy Horses need not be registered with any society. Entry Fee Member £12.00; Non Member £14.00
- OPEN HUNTER, mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, exceeding 153cms, riders to have attained their 16<sup>th</sup> birthday by 1<sup>st</sup> January of the current year. The highest placed horse not exceeding 158cms to come forward to the championship for the H18 trophy. Horses need not be registered with any society.

(Fences not to exceed 2'9".) Horses need not be registered with any society.

Entry Fee: Member £12.00 Non Member £14.00

- **OPEN WORKING HUNTER,** for Working Hunters, any weight, mares, 4 geldings or stallion (competing stallions must have a red, white and blue ribbon displayed in their tail) four years old and over, exceeding 148cms, to be ridden. Grade A show-jumpers and advanced event horses not eligible to compete in Working Hunter classes. (Fences to not exceed 3'3"). This class will be judged in two parts. Part one (jumping) will be judged first, without a jump-off. All clear rounds and any other horses the judges may require will go forward to the next part. Horses need not be registered with any society. Entry Fee: Member £12.00 Non Member £14.00
- H4 D. H. Morey Memorial Perpetual Challenge Trophy, presented by Mrs. Morey and Family, for the Best Working Hunter. The Working Hunter Championship open to 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> prize winners in classes 3 and 4.

Rising Star Open Riding Horse, Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms. The highest placed unqualified SMALL RIDING HORSE and LARGE RIDING HORSE will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Supreme Small or Large Riding Horse Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. In addition, two highest placed unqualified horses, regardless of section, will qualify for the Rising Star Associate Finals at the BSHA National Championship Show in September.

Entry Fee: Member £23.00 Non Member £25.00

## Rising Star Ridden Hunter

Small/Lightweight Hunter, Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over exceeding 158cms, (small hunter not to exceed exceeding 158cms). Capable of carrying up to 79.5kgs (12 stone 7lbs). The highest placed unqualified in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Small/Lightweight Hunter Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. In addition, two highest placed unqualified horses will qualify for the Rising Star Associate Finals at the BSHA National Championship Show in September.

Entry Fee: Member £23.00 Non Member £25.00

Middleweight/Heavyweight Hunter, Mare or gelding, 4 years old or over, exceeding 158cms. Capable of carrying over 89kgs (14 stone). The highest placed unqualified in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Middleweight/Heavyweight Hunter Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. In addition, two highest placed unqualified horses will qualify for the Rising Star Associate Finals at the BSHA National Championship Show in September.

Entry Fee: Member £23.00 Non Member £25.00

Rising Star Open Cob, Mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms. The highest placed unqualified LIGHTWEIGHT COB and HEAVYWEIGHT COB will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Lightweight or Heavyweight Cob Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. In addition, two highest placed unqualified horses, regardless of section, will qualify for the Rising Star Associate Finals at the BSHA National Championship Show in September.

Entry Fee: Member £23.00 Non Member £25.00

Rising Star Working Show Horse, Open ONLY to Hacks, Cobs, Maxi Cobs and Riding Horses, mare or gelding four years old and over, exceeding 148cms. The highest placed unqualified in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Working Show Horse Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. Any horse which is Grade B showjumper, Intermediate Eventer, or above as at 1st January of the current year, is not eligible. Height of fences: minimum 2'6", maximum 2'9", maximum spread 2'9". Please note the height of the fences may be raised at the final at the discretion of the Course builder/ BSHA Representative.

Entry Fee: Member £23.00 Non Member £25.00

Rising Star Working Hunter, Open to Hunters, mare or gelding four years old and over, exceeding 148cms. The highest placed unqualified in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Working Hunter Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. Any horse which is registered / previously registered as a Grade A showjumper, Advanced Eventer, or above as at 1st January of the current year, is not eligible. Height of fences: minimum 3'0", maximum 3'3", maximum spread 3'3". Please note the height of the fences may be raised at the final at the discretion of the Course builder/ BSHA Representative.

## Tattersalls RoR OPEN Ridden Show Series Qualifier 2025,

Thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4years old or over, any height. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January 2024. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, Pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavasson noseband. Horses should be plaited. The first THREE ao forward to the championship at Hickstead in June 2025. All entries MUST be competition registered with the RoR and include their competition registration number on entry form and have RACED in GB. All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force'. Please be aware that the show will split the class on the horse's last run in a race (NH or Flat) or will provide 2 ride judges should the entries exceed 20. Please mark your entry form accordingly. Competitors must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap. Racina injuries and blemishes will NOT be janored in this series RoR rosettes 1st – 4th and a RoR branded prize to the winner to be redeemed from the RoR Office. The winner also qualifies for the Tattersalls RoR Open Ridden Show Series Special at the RoR National Championships 2025 at Aintree

Veteran prize (15+) - a RoR branded prize to be redeemed from RoR office and qualification for the Veteran Final at the RoR National Championships 2025 at Aintree.

Entry Fee: Member £12.00 Non Member £14.00

12 Tattersalls RoR Former Racehorse Challenge 2025, Mare or gelding 4yrs old or over and of any height. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January 2024. Horses to be ridden in any suitable bridle and should be plaited. All entries must be Competition Registered with RoR and HAVE raced in GB or been IN TRAINING in GB. Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series. The first four go forward to the final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships, Aintree, August 2025. The Judge will NOT ride. Horses may be stripped for conformation at the discretion of the judge. Competitors must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap. All those entering horses

and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force. The class to be judged 50% jumping, 20% Style while jumping and performance and 30% awarded for show, manners and suitability to be retrained.

#### PHASE 1

Jumping to be judged:

8 rustic jumps 70cm to 80cm with a maximum spread of 75cm. The following points to be deducted at the end of each jumping round: 10 points to be deducted for a knock down, 15 points to be deducted for a refusal, 20 points for second refusal. Elimination for third refusal or fall or Error of Course.

#### PHASE 2

Class returns without boots and judged for an individual show/conformation. (In some classes, at the judge's discretion, horses might be asked to do a 'show' following their jumping without leaving the ring. This is often the case with a large number in the class) Each horse to complete an individual show of no longer than 1 ½ minutes. Show to include the following movements: walk, trot, canter showing change of leg, extended canter (gallop) halt and stand, walk off on long rein. Total marks out of 30% for Show, manners and suitability to be retrained. Fences for the final at Aintree can be up to a maximum of 85cm with a spread of 80cm.
