Please do not attend the show if you are classified as being in a vulnerable category as per Government Guidelines

Events will only take place when Government Guidance allows them to do so

Do not attend if you are displaying any Corona Virus symptoms

Riding Hats - Safety hats to present safety standards must be worn and fastened by all competitors 18 years old and under. Adults who wish to ride with a non-safety hat should supply signed disclaimer to the Show Secretary.

General Rules

Please socially distance from members other than your family group by the current government guidelines

Must use hand sanitisers on regular basis.

Wash hands thoroughly on arrival and after using any facilities and throughout the day.

Toilets will NOT be provided at the venue. Please provide your own toilet facilities in lorries and/or trailers.

Obey orders given regarding social distancing.

Wear face coverings wherever possible to avoid spreading the virus. Temperature checks may be taken during the show.

Ensure you arrive in the designated vehicle on your entry and be prepared to give names of occupants on arrival at the Show.

Ensure you park horseboxes and cars safely with a minimum of 3 metres between vehicles. All registrations must be prior recorded.

Abide by the rules in the schedule.

Only animals competing at the show be allowed on the showground. No dogs please!

Show Organisers have taken responsibility to set safeguards in place for exhibitors but attendance at the Show is at your own risk.

No galloping anywhere on the showground

There will be no ambulance on site, we rely on the 999 ambulance service

Horses are dangerous – all persons entering the show ground do so at their own risk

All classes to be held on grass arenas

Here's how it's going to run

Ridden Classes – the standard showing class format will be used starting with a 'go round'

Judges will NOT ride, you will need to do an individual show.

Your ridden show should show walk away from the judge, trot, change of diagonal, and canter with a change of rein and NO galloping as we all must stay safe.

In hand classes – the usual format, walk away and trot only. A correctly fitting riding hat is compulsory.

Exhibits will NOT be stripped for conformation

After your classes, you must return to your lorry/trailer and implement the stay safe social distancing as recommended at the time of the show.

Rosettes will be presented if able to maintain social distancing measures in place at the time or will be available to collect from the Secretary's Tent after the class.

Please remember that the possession of a sense of humour, fair play and good sportsmanship are mandatory for all involved at this show. Please try and remember that a smile and a good word demonstrates the height of humility and good manners, which are always in fashion.
