5	5 Stems of rhubarb
6	3 onions, 250g or less
7	3 onions that exceed 250g
8	4 Potatoes white

10	5 standard tomatoes
11	1 truss of cherry tomatoes, ripe or green

12	1 Marrow
13	6 pods of the same variety of any type of pea
