Notes to Sheep Exhibitors

Due to declining numbers we are no longer able to accommodate MV Accredited Sheep No dogs allowed in the Society building.

Smoking is not permitted in the Society building for safety reasons

Please note the Newbury & District Agricultural Society is not a central point recording center (CPRC). You will therefore be required to list all the individual tag numbers of the entries attending the Show on your movement license.

Every animal entered in breed classes must be entered in, or certified as eligible, or accepted for entry in the flock book of its breed. Where the animal is entered by the exhibitor as eligible or accepted for entry in the flock book, proof of such eligibility or acceptance must be furnished to the secretary, if required. Exhibitors are requested not to use bloom dip or bloom powder on exhibits. Judges will be asked to deduct marks/points from animals so treated.

Docking: you are reminded that the welfare of Livestock (prohibition operations) reg. 1982 requires that sheep must have sufficient tail retained to cover the vulva of the female sheep and the anus of male sheep. In the event of a formal complaint being received for infringement of this requirement the matter will be referred to the Society vet.

Reception of animals

The Showground will be open for the reception of animals from 8am until 8pm on the Friday prior to the Show and 6am until 8am on Saturday. Vehicles must be removed from the Society building area by 8:30am Saturday.

Please note all sheep to be on the Showground all weekend.

Sheep must be penned by 8.30am on Saturday

Departure of Livestock

Gates to allow loading will be opened after the end of show (5pm) Sunday.

Lorries/trailers will not be permitted to leave the Showground until Sunday 22 September 2024 at approximately 5.30pm unless by authorisation of a veterinary surgeon.

A plan is in place for the exit of all Livestock vehicles on the Sunday afternoon, this will entail letting vehicles out in batches, please follow the instructions of the stewards to allow a swift egress from the Showground. You may be exiting with public vehicles however Livestock will be given priority where possible.

Under no circumstances are Exhibitors allowed to walk their Livestock out of the Showground for loading. Competitors not complying with this rule will be disqualified.

Please bring copies of movement licenses to the Show for arrival & departure to hand in to the stewards.
