Entrants are invited to enter a live professional and student blacksmithing competition to copy an example piece of work which will be supplied. Steel for the competitions will be supplied and the time allowed is 2 hours using coke forges. Competitors to bring own tools.
Entries close Monday 14 September or sooner if entries reach capacity.

- Clothes:
- Participants must wear:
- Stout boots - preferably with steel toecaps. Leather hiking boots or Dr Martin style boots can be worn if steel toecap boots are not available.
 - Long sleeve shirt to protect arms – preferably all cotton.
 - Jeans or cargo trousers to protect legs – preferably all cotton.
- The clothes may get burnt while forging. A Leather apron and gloves will be supplied. You will need to wear these while blacksmithing.
Protective eye wear will be provided and you will need to wear this at all times in the forging area.
Ear plugs will also be available.

All participants are to meet at the Farriers and Blacksmiths Marquee at 9am to book in.
All participants will be asked to sign the Terms and Conditions before competing.

Students will have the chance to forge a steel flower using a coke or gas forge.

Please ensure you enter each student who wishes to attend.

Entries will close on 13th September or sooner if entries reach capacity.

Clothes:

Students must wear:

- Stout boots - preferably with steel toecaps. Leather hiking boots or Dr Martin style boots can be worn if steel toecap boots are not available.
- Long sleeve shirt to protect arms – preferably all cotton.
- Jeans or cargo trousers to protect legs – preferably all cotton.

The clothes may get burnt while forging. A Leather apron and gloves will be supplied. You will need to wear these while blacksmithing.

Protective eye wear will be provided and you will need to wear this at all times in the forging area.

Ear plugs will also be available.

All School students are to meet at the Farriers and Blacksmiths Marquee from 9am to 11am book in. They will be given a time slot to forge a flower or flowers.

Students will be required to sign the Terms and Conditions, as stated above, prior to making the flower.
