

EXHIBITORS ENTRANCE PASSES

Exhibitors Entrance Passes to the show on Saturday will be handed out to those who qualify during staging on Friday evening or by prior arrangement with the Secretary. Late entries cannot be assured of a pass.

To qualify, Exhibitors must enter 6 or more classes from the schedule. Under 14's qualify on entering 3 or more classes. Exhibitors in the Floral Art section qualify on entering 3 floral art classes. Exhibitors in the Group Section can qualify for 2 passes. Each exhibitor is classed as an individual so multiple passes are not given out to those who enter more than one section.

STAGING

All Exhibitors are kindly asked to stage their exhibits on Friday 11th July from 6pm until 10pm.

Please follow the signs to unload.

DO NOT UNLOAD VIA THE FESTIVAL OF FOOD AREA.

The Marquee will re-open at 6.30am on Saturday morning for final staging and items must be in position for 8.00am when the Marquee will be closed for judging. No exhibitor cards will be issued after 7.45 am.

VEHICLE DEPOSIT SYSTEM

RULES

- All exhibits must be the property of the exhibitor and, with the exception of classes 301 onwards, must have been grown on his/her property.
- 2. All entries should be written on one side of the Entry Form, complete with address, email address and contact number and entry fees should be shown.
- 3. All plates, vases, stands, etc must be provided by the exhibitor. Jam jars, milk bottles, tin cans, etc. MUST NOT BE USED FOR FLOWERS UNLESS SPECIFIED
- 4. All exhibits must not have won a prize at Newport Show before.
- 5. Dirt, unnecessary leaves etc. must be removed from vegetables. Handicraft items must be clean.
- 6. All exhibits to be staged by 7.50 am prompt. No exhibitor cards will be issued after 7.45 am.
- All Exhibitors to be in the marquee at 4.30 pm for presentation of trophies. EXHIBITS MAY BE REMOVED AFTER PRIZEGIVING. NO VEHICLES WILL BE ALLOWED ON TO THE SHOWGROUND BEFORE 5.30pm. FOR COLLECTION OF EXHIBITS.
- All exhibits, personal property, etc. shall be at the risk of the Exhibitors and the Society shall not be liable for compensation for loss or damage from any cause whatsoever. Should the Show for any reason not be held, no exhibitor shall have any claim on the Society.
- Exhibitors shall be issued with an exhibitor card corresponding to each of their entries
 and this must be placed with each exhibit. Failure to do so may lead to disqualification
 of the exhibit. EXHIBITORS ARE TO MAKE SURE THAT EXHIBITS ARE IN THE CORRECT CLASS WITH CORRECT CARDS.
- 10. Objections by Exhibitors must be lodged, in writing, to the Secretary by 2.00 pm on Show day with a deposit of £1.00 for each objection. If the Committee, whose decision is final, does not uphold the objection the exhibitor shall forfeit his/her deposit.
- 11. NO EXHIBITOR WILL BE ALLOWED MORE THAN ONE ENTRY IN ANY ONE CLASS.
- 12. The Judges may disallow any prize if they consider an exhibit to be of insufficient standard. They may also award an extra prize for High Standard of Merit. THE JUDGE'S DECISION WILL BE AT ALL TIMES FINAL.
- 13. Where the Judges award prizes of equal merit, the Exhibitors are to understand that such prize money will be added together and divided equally. All ADULT prize money etc. will be PAID OUT BY BACS AFTER THE SHOW AND BY THE FOLLOWING SAT-URDAY. CHILDRENS PRIZEWINNERS WILL RECEIVE CASH ON THE DAY. This will be given out from the Secretary's table in the marquee from 4.15 pm to 5.15 pm.
