# **SAFETY NOTICE TO ALL EXHIBITORS AND ACCOMPANYING PERSONS**

The Organisers and Show Committee will take any necessary precautions to ensure the Health and Safety of persons on the Showground. It is a condition of entry to the Showground that all persons will act on any instruction given to them by the Show Committee, in so far, that it can affect the Health and Safety of others.

All persons attending have a responsibility under Section 7 of the Health and Safety Act that they have due regard to others.

**EXHIBITORS MUST ONLY LEAD OR RIDE THEIR HORSE IN ANY AREA, OR ON ANY ROAD, RING OR WALKWAY WHICH IS MARKED:-**

**“STOCK AND HANDLERS ONLY”**

Anyone on a horse at an affiliated show must wear a hard hat. Correctly secured British Standard Skull Caps/Riding Hats that meet current safety standards **MUST** be worn by riders at all times when mounted.

Grooms & Handlers entering show rings must be suitably attired and wearing a hat.

**HORSES TETHERED TO VEHICLES MUST HAVE A RESPONSIBLE PERSON (Over 16 years) IN ATTENDANCE AT ALL TIMES!**

## **Equine Welfare**

Welfare is of paramount importance and all riders should be of an appropriate size and weight for the horse/pony being ridden, anywhere on the showground. The Society reserves the right to take further action against any competitor or exhibitor whose animal is being ridden by anyone whose size or weight compromises the welfare of the horse/pony being ridden; this would be based on the recommendations of the on-site veterinary team, who will use the 20% ratio as a guideline (this means the combined weight of rider plus their saddle should be less than 20% of the animal's weight). This would be based on a relatively fit, healthy animal, as an overweight animal is also a welfare concern.

**DO NOT PUT FINGERS IN MOUTHS WHILE PETTING ANIMALS**

**DO NOT EAT OR DRINK WHILE TOUCHING ANIMALS  
OR WALKING AROUND THE ANIMAL AREA**

## **ENTRIES**

Online entries will open Friday 1st May via Showing Scene, our entry system. A link will be available to enter on our website [www.newportshow.co.uk](http://www.newportshow.co.uk) on that day.

Please enter early. It is recommended that all horse entries have current equine influenza vaccination certificates at all times.

It is the responsibility of exhibitors to acquaint themselves with any current Ministry regulations concerning their entries, and to comply with them.

Please note the names of the entry Secretaries to whom the entry forms should be returned.

## **SPECIAL NOTE**

The Society reserves the right to cancel any section, which has less than three exhibitors when the entries are finally closed. (See By-laws 10 & 16).

Exhibitors are required by DEFRA to carry with them Official Identity Documents for all horses/ponies when competing or travelling. Competitors are reminded that it is a DEFRA requirement that the Official Identity Documents must be in the name of the legal owner within 30 days of ownership. This must be registered with the breed society, relevant studbook or ID issuing agency, dependant on breed/type of animal. Spot checks may be carried out at qualifying shows and by breed societies.

*When jumping in the Ring, the practice or collecting areas, all Riders must wear protective headgear, according to the current standards as listed below:*

*Skullcaps must be of, or worn with, a dark coloured plain peaked cover. Refer to your Society/ Association Rule Book for further clarifications.*

It is the sole responsibility of riders to ensure that whilst on horseback, they wear correctly fitting, 3-point protective headgear which complies with the latest British Standard. The Society Accepts no responsibility for any injury arising from a failure to comply with this regulation.


Please note all riders in BSPS classes will be required to have their hats checked, before numbers are handed out.

Hats to current British Standard should be worn at all times when mounted. All equines, except Geldings, must be entered in the Shire Horse Society's Stud Book or its Grade A or B Register, and exhibited in accordance with the Shire Horse Society Regulations. Stallions to be pedigree, registered with the Breed Society and have a Society Stallion Licence.

Membership

All owners, handlers and exhibitors must be members of the Shire Horse Society for the HOYS qualifier, class 10.

The Shire Horse Society reserves the right to share your membership data with Grandstand Media Limited in compliance with the Horse of the Year Show (HOYS) Rules and Regulations. This sharing is for the purpose of HOYS matters to include, but not limited to, qualification or disciplinary. **Class 9** **Heavy Horse In Hand**  
**Class 10** **Shire Horse of the Year supported by the Shire Horse Society, Qualifying Class.**  
This class is a qualifier for the Shire Horse of the Year Championship, to be held at the NEC, Birmingham, 7th - 11th October 2026. This class is open to pure bred fully registered shires of two years old and over that are entered and exhibited in their appropriate breed classes at Qualifying Shows. Qualification will go to the highest place unqualified exhibit within the top five placings.

## SHIRE HORSE OF THE YEAR

The class is open to purebred Shire Horse stallions, mares and geldings, 2 years old and over that are registered in, and complying with the showing requirements of the Shire Horse Society.

All Owners, Handlers and Exhibitors must be Members of the Shire Horse Society.

This class will be run in accordance with the Shire Horse Society guidelines, which for the avoidance of doubt will be considered rules for Horse of the Year Show and its qualifiers, however the general rules as set out within this Rule book will take precedence.

Additional Rules:

- i. Qualification will not pass below 5th place.
- ii. Horses must be entered in the name and ownership in which they are registered.
- iii. Horses should be turned out in a traditional manner, with flights.
- iv. Horse's docks must be covered with a fan of hair in accordance with the Shire Horse Society rules.
- v. The turning up of coats is not permitted, in accordance with the Shire Horse Society rulebook.
- vi. At the final and qualifiers, horses may have foot inspections carried out by a Shire Horse Society farrier and vet. Horses must be correctly shod in accordance with the shoeing standards, as detailed in The Shire Horse Society rulebook. Horses may be shown unshod.
- vii. Horses that are part bred or from the Grade A, B or C Registers of the Shire Horse Society are not eligible to compete. Geldings must be registered in the Shire Horse Society Non-Breeding Register and must be pure bred e.g. not out of Grade B mares, and parentage verified.

Judging Guidelines:

- i. Judges must be selected from the Shire Horse Society panel.

Qualification will be verified by the Horse of the Year Show office.

The Shire Horse Society is pleased to award to any Affiliated Society, a Spoon and Rosette for the Best Mare or Filly and a Spoon and Rosette for the Best Stallion at their Annual Show.

Conditions of the Award are as follows: -

1. A Spoon and a Rosette for the Best Mare or Filly and a Spoon and Rosette for the Best Stallion (providing there is a separate class(es) for Stallions) exhibited in the Shire classes.
2. The winner of the Special Prize must be a member of the Shire Horse Society.
3. Entries cannot be accepted at Affiliated Shows in classes for Shires or Heavy Horses from any person who has been either suspended or removed from membership of the Shire Horse Society or has been excluded from exhibiting for prizes at Shows, Sales or Exhibitions or from taking part in any Show organised by the Shire Horse Society.
4. No animal to be eligible to take more than one Silver Spoon during any one year except for the Shire Horse Society National Spring and Summer Shows.
- 5.. THE WINNING ANIMAL MUST BE REGISTERED OR ELIGIBLE FOR REGISTRATION IN THE STUD BOOK OR GRADE B REGISTER.
6. The Judge invited to officiate must be on the Society's Official Panel and has the right to withhold the award of the Silver Spoon and Rosette if an exhibit does not show sufficient merit.
7. The Council reserves the right in offering Spoons, to award them only to persons approved by the Shire Horse Society.

Shire Horse Society's Young Handler's Accumulator Award 2026 - Points will be awarded to the top five, with points awarded as follows: - 1st-5 points, 2nd-4 points, 3rd- 3 points, 4th-2 points, and 5th-1 point.

The Champion Young Handler with the most points at the end of the year will win the trophy. Affiliated shows must submit the results of the Young Handler classes when they submit their Silver Spoon award forms. Those taking part in the above should be junior members of the Society and are able to join mid-season if they are not already members. Points will only count once membership is taken up and points will not be back dated. Junior memberships are £15 per annum and are open to those that have not attained their 18th birthday.

To be awarded to the Exhibitor of the BEST ANIMAL in classes 1-9

### SP5. LLOYDS BANK CHALLENGE TROPHY

Presented by Lloyds Bank plc, and will be awarded to the Exhibitor of the BEST YOUNG HANDLER in Class 8.

### SP6. THE MORRIS BELCHER MEMORIAL CHALLENGE CUP

Presented by the Belcher family in memory of the late Mr J. Morris Belcher, J.P., Honorary Life Member and President of the Society in 1956.

Open to all exhibitors for the highest number of points gained in the Agricultural Horse Section, Classes 1 to 7. The points to be calculated as follows: Four for a First Prize, Three for a Second Prize, Two for a Third Prize, and One for a Fourth Prize or Reserve Number not lower than fourth. No specials to count. In the event of a tie the highest number of First Prizes will determine the winner.

**Class 11**      **Unaffiliated Junior Working Hunter Pony**, open to plaited and Mountain & Moorland ponies. (not to have won an open novice working hunter), WHP Mare or Gelding 4 years and over. Rider under 18. Ponies not to exceed 148cms. Maximum height of fence 70cms

**Class 12**      **Open Working Hunter Pony**, open to plaited and Mountain & Moorland ponies. Unaffiliated Working Hunter Pony. Mare or Gelding 4 years and over. Rider any age. Ponies not exceeding 148cms. Maximum height of fence 75cms.

**Class 13**      **Novice Working Hunter**, (not to have won an open novice working hunter), Unaffiliated working hunter, mare, gelding or stallion and ribbon in the tail of a stallion. 4 years or over, exceeding 153cms. Riders 16 years and over. Max height of fence 80cms.

**Class 14**      **Open Working Hunter**, unaffiliated Open working hunter, mare, gelding or stallion and ribbon in the tail of a stallion. 4 years or over, exceeding 153cm. Rider 16 years or over. Max height of fence 90cms.

All Handlers of Stallions must be 16 years or above.

## Championship

1st and 2nd Prize Winners from Classes 11 - 14 to compete for Championship and Reserve Championship. 1st Prize Winners will be eligible for Supreme Championship.

Competitors and horses must hold a minimum of LIHS Qualifier-Eligible Membership/Horse Registration with the Association to be eligible to compete in the LIHS BSHA Showing series. Any competitor who qualifies for a LIHS Showing Series Supreme Final, must then complete full LIHS Qualified registration within 14 days of qualification for their qualification to stand, or it will pass to the next eligible exhibit (the nominal cost of Qualifier-Eligible membership will be taken off the cost of Full LIHS registration). Any competitors/horses which have existing BSHA membership/registration for 2026 will not be required to complete any LIHS Membership / Registration for these classes. Please note: Rising Star Amateur Rules 2026 are separate from BSHA Amateur rules. The Judge will NOT ride exhibits in these classes or at the Finals.

## Class 15

**Rising Star Working Hunter:** Open ONLY to Hunters, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over exceeding 148cm (14.2hh approx.) Any horse which is registered / previously registered as a Grade A showjumper, Advanced Eventer, or above, on the 1st January of the current year, is not eligible. Rider to be 15yrs or over. Height of fences: minimum 3'0", maximum 3'3", maximum spread 3'3". Please note, the height of the fences may be raised at the final at the discretion of the Course builder/ BSHA Representative. A Rider may ride up to two Horses in the jumping phase only and then must select one Horse to take through to the Individual Show & Conformation stage. No change of Rider is allowed. The highest placed unqualified horse in the top 5 will qualify for the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Working Hunter Type Supreme Final at the LIHS in December. **QUALIFICATION WILL BE CONFIRMED BY EMAIL ONCE FULL LIHS QUALIFIED MEMBERSHIP & HORSE REGISTRATION IS COMPLETED WITHIN 14 DAYS OF QUALIFICATION.** Please note LIHS Qualifier-Eligible membership must be in place before entering any BSHA LIHS qualifying class. In addition, the two highest placed unqualified horses will qualify for the Associate Rising Star Working Hunter final at the BSHA National Championships Show in September. Associate Rising Star Qualification Cards will be awarded in the ring.

## Class 16

**Rising Star Working Show Horse:** Rising Star Working Show Horse: Open ONLY to Hacks, Cobs, Maxi Cobs and Riding Horses, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms. Any horse which is Grade B showjumper, Intermediate Eventer, or above on the 1st January of the current year, is not eligible. Rider to be 15yrs or over. Height of fences: minimum 2'6", maximum 2'9", maximum spread 2'9". Please note the height of the fences may be raised at the final at the discretion of the Course builder/ BSHA Representative. A Rider may ride up to two Horses in the jumping phase only and then must select one Horse to take through to the Individual Show & Conformation stage. No change of Rider is allowed. 4. Horses to be well turned out and shod, with the rider a compatible weight for the horse etc.

Times and locations will be forwarded to the Chef d'Equipe, who will assist in the administration in running this event on the day.

This competition will be judged at 11.30am prompt, in the Main Ring.

1. Teams must comprise of four (Master or Hunt Servant, Subscriber, Hunting Farmer) members of their hunt.
2. The team must comprise of mixed gender. All team members must be 16 years old or over and horses must exceed 15hh.
3. Entry Fee will be £40 per team.
4. Teams will jump in the drawn order.
5. No team or competitors will be allowed to inspect the course. There will be a practice jump in the collecting ring. Once competitors have completed the course they will leave the ring in an orderly manner and no exhibition jumping will be tolerated. Only the two competing teams drawn against each other and their Chef d'Equipe to be allowed in the ring at one time, one jumping in the Members' Enclosure side and the other in the Trade Stand side as allocated. The two teams in the final will toss for choice of side, after the semi final.
6. Start will be by the hunting horn.
7. The hand over will take place between the last and first jumps by the transfer of a hunting whip from one member to the next.

8. It is permissible for both incoming and outgoing members of a team to jump fence one together.
9. In the event of the incoming competitor dropping the whip during the changeover he/she must dismount, but is allowed to hand the whip to the outgoing member from the ground.
10. In the event of a fall the rider will be eliminated and cannot remount. Another team member will then be allowed to jump twice.
11. Penalties of five seconds will be imposed for knocking down each jump.
12. In the case of dead heat, the team with the least number of fences down will qualify.
13. If a team member fails to complete the course through retirement or horse having three refusals, the following team member must jump the course from the start, then take the whip from the retired person and continue to finish his/her round before doing his/her own. It is permissible for a member to jump twice, in the case of a lame horse.
14. Any team member considered by the judges to be riding in a dangerous manner, ie deliberately taking the opposing competitors line/ground at a jump or unruly behaviour, the team will be disqualified as we would ask all competitors to consider this competition a public relations exercise.
15. The Chief Steward/Judges' decision is final.
16. In the event of any accident the veterinary surgeon and paramedics will be in attendance and we ask that all competitors abide by their instructions. Neither the organisers nor any person acting on their behalf accept any liability for any loss, damage, accident, injury or illness to competitors, spectators or any other persons whatsoever.

# IT IS STRONGLY RECOMMENDED THAT HORSES SHOULD BE SHOD AND WEAR STUDS.

## **RULES**

**1. HARD HATS** – It is the sole responsibility of riders to ensure at all times whilst on horseback correctly fitted protective headgear with a 3 POINT HARNESS which complies with the latest British Standard is worn. The Society accepts no responsibility for any injury arising from a failure to comply with this regulation.

**2. \*DRESS** – Teams must be correctly dressed for a day's hunting. In the event of extreme heat and subject to relay judges approval, riders may compete in the relay section in either 'Ratcatcher' or without a jacket. SHIRTS however, for reasons of safety **MUST** have long sleeves and be correctly fastened at the cuff.

**3. SIDE SADDLES** are permitted but must be worn for both Turn Out and Relay sections.

**4. The** competition is a Drawn Order, against the clock with two teams jumping a mirror image course. In the event of insufficient entries the organisers may decide to take the fastest 16 teams from Round One forward to Round Two which will revert to a knockout competition to determine placings. (Only applicable if 4 teams enter) Time penalties of five seconds will be added for each fence down. Refusals and errors of course will increase the time taken to complete the course.

**5. Team** members must hand a hunting whip to the next member of the team, the lash may be taped up (no longer than the solid length of the crop) or removed - No other whip is to be used or carried. If the whip is dropped the rider handing over must dismount and may from the ground hand to the next member, however in all cases all obstacles must be completed carrying the whip by each member – penalties will not be incurred for riders re-jumping a fence to rectify an error as failure to rectify will result in elimination. Changeover must be carried out by fence one, penalties will not be added if the rider handing over jumps the first fence again but the next rider must have the whip in hand when jumping the first fence.

**6. A Holding Area** will be included within the course – team members must stay inside the area and remain mounted at all times. Five penalties will be added for any team members not inside the area unless they are the member awaiting change over. Only the next combination waiting to start is permitted at the start line, outside assistance from

team members is not permitted at this point. Once

a round has been completed the combination must return to the holding area – failure to do so will incur further penalties

**7. If** a team member fails to complete the course either through retirement due to injury or a horse having three refusals, the next member must complete the round from the point of retirement and then continue to jump their own round. A team member may not rescue and complete a previous member's round until they have had three clear refusals on the course or have retired from injury. In the event of a serious accident to either horse or rider, a bell will sound and clocks stopped for both teams. Competitors will not be allowed to start the course until the injured rider / horse have left the arena. The competition will then recommence from the point stopped.

**8. Should** a horse or rider be injured **once the competition has commenced**, they must first be seen by a Veterinary Surgeon or a Paramedic/Doctor. If the horse or rider is ruled un-fit to continue, the Team may remain in the competition but one team member must complete the course twice – each time with the appropriate change of whip. The Judges **must** be notified before the start of the round **and a 10 second time penalty will be imposed on the Team**. A competitor who falls at any stage of the competition must be checked by the event doctor

**9. OBJECTIONS** – Any Team or Team Member with a grievance must make their protest in writing within 30 minutes of the completion of the class and pay a deposit of **£50.00**. An Appeals Tribunal will consider the objection and the person making the objection must be available to attend. The decision of the Appeals Tribunal shall be final and if the protest is not substantiated the deposit may be forfeited.

**10. STALLIONS** - No person may bring a stallion to compete without ensuring, at all times competitors, ponies/horses and members of the public are not put at risk. A stallion disc should be displayed on each side of a stallion's bridle and they must be lead from a bit.

**11. Refunds** are at the organiser's discretion – withdrawals will only be given a refund if a replacement team can be found.

**12. The Chief Steward's** decision is final.

# BY-LAWS

## Conditions under which entries are accepted

- 1 Entries close as follows: Horses - Sunday 21st June 2026. The Society reserves the right to extend any closing date.
- 2 Exhibitors shall be responsible for the accuracy and eligibility of their entries, which must be lodged with the appropriate Section Secretary on or before the dates published. Entries should be made on the forms provided and an entry will not be accepted unless accompanied by the correct entry fees and, if not already paid, subscriptions.
- 3 All exhibits must have been the bona-fide property of the exhibitor for two calendar months previous to the date of entry.
- 4 The Society reserves the right to refuse any entry and also to accept entries provisionally.
- 5 All entries must be on the showground at least one hour before their judging time. Exhibitors' admission tickets must be produced at the entrance to the showground to gain entry to the show.
- 6 All exhibitors must bring their stock into the rings and not allow exhibits to remain in their lorries. Exhibitors not conforming to this rule may forfeit the prize money.
- 7 Attendants in charge of exhibits will be required to remain with the same and exhibits shall not be left unattended.
- 8 Exhibitors or their assistants not obeying the directions of the Society's officers will render themselves liable to expulsion from the showground.
- 9 Water will be available for stock but exhibitors must provide any food or litter required.
- 10 The Society reserves the right to cancel or amalgamate classes unless there is a minimum of three entries in the class. The Society reserves the right to amend the judging times of classes but the order and timing published will be adhered to as far as possible. The Society will not accept responsibility for any exhibitor missing their class(es) and under no circumstances will fees be refunded.
- 11 The Society reserves the right to sanction a judge to withhold any of the prizes offered if in the judge's opinion the exhibits do not possess sufficient merit.
- 12 A veterinary inspector will be appointed and if required, will examine each exhibit selected by the judges for a prize to ascertain that such exhibit is practically sound for the purpose for which it is exhibited.
- 13 2 and 3 year old Colts and Stallions must be handled by a capable adult and bitted at all times.
- 14 The Society's veterinary surgeons may on their own authority give to an animal such emergency treatment, as they may consider appropriate in the event that the owner or his representative cannot be found immediately. Exhibitors are required to meet the full cost of this treatment and any other costs involved in connection with any veterinary treatment given on the showground.
- 15 The Main Committee or officials appointed by them shall be empowered to disqualify and demand the removal from the showground of any animal which, in their opinion, is suffering from, or affected with, a contagious or infectious disease, and all entry fees for such animals shall be forfeited.

- 16 Any person who wishes to lodge an objection against any exhibitor must do so in writing and hand it in to the Show Manager's marquee on the showground before 3pm on show day or, if later, within half an hour of completion of the judging of the class involved. A deposit of £50 must accompany each objection, which sum will be forfeited to the Society in cases where the objector does not sustain the objection. The Society's Main Committee shall consider the objection at its next meeting and its decision shall be final.
- 17 A Grand Parade of cattle, sheep and horses, as placed 1st and 2nd, will take place in the Main Ring, time to be confirmed. Prize winners are responsible for their exhibits being paraded. Failure to do so will render them liable to forfeit the respective prize. The Chief Steward of each section has discretionary powers to excuse the parading of an animal where it is unruly and likely to upset or cause damage to other animals, attendants, the general public or property. No stock shall be removed from the showground until after the Grand Parade.
- 18 Prize money will be paid after show day via BACS. This information is required to be inputted when entering online using Showing Scene. If you do not provide these details online you will need to see Francis Edwards, the Horse Secretary in the Horse Secretary Marquee to make alternative arrangements.
- 19 The Society takes all reasonable measures to ensure the health and safety of everyone present on the showground. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instruction of the organisers and all officials and stewards. The Society, its officers and servants or agents shall not be responsible for any loss, injury or damage however caused to the exhibitor and the exhibitor agrees to indemnify the Society in respect of any costs in connection with any claims made upon the Society as a result of action or omission of the exhibitor or any employee of the exhibitor. Each exhibitor shall be solely responsible for any loss, injury or damage that may be done to, or occasioned by, or arising from, any animal, article or property exhibited or brought on to the showground by him and he shall indemnify and hold harmless the Society from and against all actions, suits, expenses and claims on account of or in respect of any such damage or injury which may be so caused or occasioned.
- 20 If it is proved to the reasonable satisfaction of the Main Committee that any person has attempted to gain a prize in the show by false certificate or by misinterpretation of any kind, such person shall at once be disqualified and excluded from again exhibiting at the Society's show, and be expelled therefrom and forfeit all prizes he would have been entitled to.
- 21 In the case of any differences of opinion as to the meaning or construction of the by-laws, such differences shall be decided by the Main Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 22 By completing the entry form or entering online, you warrant to Newport & District Agricultural Society that on or from the date of application up to and including the end of Newport Show the applicant will hold valid insurance to insure against loss or damage caused to any person or property to a minimum value of £2million.
- 23 The society operates a zero tolerance policy.
