Exhibitors must enter for the Pair classes at the time of entry.

No children are allowed in the judging rings except for the calf handling & showmanship classes.

The show DOES NOT have exemption from pre-movement testing for cattle entries from Annually Tested herds.

TB Testing: The Show is located in a Low-Risk Area and is a Non-Exempt Show for the purpose of TB

Movement requirements. Cattle entries can only be accepted from areas with low risk of TB (4-year testing herds), except with DEFRA approval following a pre-movement test. For more information, please see TB

LATE ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED

IF ENTRIES IN ANY SECTION ARE LOW, WE RESERVE THE RIGHT TO AMALGAMATE CLASSES AND SECTIONS, AS DEEMED APPROPRIATE BY THE COMMITTEE IN BOTH THE BEEF AND DAIRY SECTIONS.

FACILITIES ON SITE

There will be catering and bar amenities open until 10pm on Friday 23rd May, catering units will open from 6am on Saturday 24th May 2025. Toilet and washing facilities will be provided for exhibitors staying on the Friday evening.

PENNING AND WASHING OF STOCK.

Cattle Section Exhibitors are required to book stalls sufficient to accommodate all animals they intend to have forward at the Show, please indicate the number of stalls required on the entry form. All cattle will be stalled under cover and be allotted named stall space. All livestock entered in the competitive classes must remain in the accommodation provided for them in the livestock area. Exhibitors must ensure that their exhibits are securely penned. Washing areas will be provided for cattle. The use of pressure washers by exhibitors will be at the discretion of the Cattle Chief Steward.

Pressure washers can only be used if set to RSPCA requirement.

LIVESTOCK HANDLING

When livestock are taken to a show they are away from their normal farm environment and are exposed to different premises, sights and sounds which can make them potentially less predictable. The handler's skills are paramount in putting them at ease and ensuring they are under control. Consequently livestock should only be moved and shown by competent people who are capable of restraining them. Children under 13 years old should not normally be allowed to handle cattle without close adult supervision. The exhibitor is responsible for ensuring that whoever is handling their animal is competent and has the physical ability to control the animal if required.

GRAND PARADE

The parade of prize-winning Dairy Cattle, Beef Cattle, Heavy Horse, Pigs, Horses, Sheep, Goats and Alpacas will take place at 3:30 in the Main Arena. Exhibitors must ensure that their exhibits are ready for the parade 30 minutes prior to the time shown in the official program. **WHITE COATS** or RELEVANT CLOTHING AND SUITABLE FOOTWEAR **MUST BE** worn by all persons in charge of such exhibits.

It is a condition of entry that all stock handlers and especially children should only handle animals where they have the necessary strength and experience to cope with the said animal. Children must always be under the direct supervision of and accompanied by a competent adult. No child under the age of 13 may lead an animal in the Grand Parade – except entrants in the Junior Handler Classes who must be under the supervision of an adult.

In the event of any Exhibitor or employee refusing to bring their exhibit on parade at the specified time, or in the specified manner when requested by the Stewards to do so, prize money, whether sponsored or not, will be forfeited.

DEPARTURE

In the interests of Health & Safety of the public, stock must not leave the Show before 5.00pm. Livestock cannot be removed earlier without the written consent of the Chief Steward/the Veterinary Officer and the Northumberland County Show Cattle Secretary. Such consent will only be granted under exceptional circumstances. Please keep within the 5mph speed limit on the site.

NORTHUMBERLAND COUNTY SHOW RULES

No overstocking, sealing of teats, taping or additional shaping of udders of cows or heifers in milk is allowed and any animal overstocked may be disqualified at the discretion of the Chief Steward and/or Veterinary Surgeon present. The infusion of drugs in any form or to any part of the animal are not permitted (unless under the strict guidance and permission of the attending Veterinary Surgeon whom is part of the Northumberland County Show Veterinary Staff). The judge may require any animal to be milked out in his presence so that he may form an opinion of the udder after milking.

The Veterinary Surgeon has a right to ask for any quarter of any udder to be drawn at any time to check for the presence of teat sealants or other products.

Cattle lines will be monitored throughout the show by the Chief Steward and the Veterinary Team and full co-operation is expected with any requests made by them to any exhibitor.

Any artificial contrivance or device of any description (this includes filling with air) found on or proved to have been used on any animal at any time whilst that animal is at the showground, either preventing the flow of milk or for any other improper purpose, will disqualify that animal from being awarded a prize, and any prize awarded prior to discovery will be forfeited. The exhibitor or owner of said animal may be prohibited from entering stock for the Northumberland County Show for such a period as the Committee see fit.

The Society will not tolerate the administration to show exhibits of tranquillisers or other drugs which may in any way affect performance of the animal in question to have the effect of making it behave in the show ring in a manner which is not natural. Any person or exhibitor who is found to have administered or permitted the administration of any such tranquilliser or sedative drugs to any animal will be reported to the organising committee and dealt with at their discretion. In the addition the matter will be referred to the appropriate Breed Society or Organisation.

Animals entering the show-ground area, in all respects, are at the risk of the owner.

Tynedale Agricultural Society will not be responsible for any accident which may occur through any animal exhibited, and it shall be a condition of entry that each Exhibitor shall hold the Society harmless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from such accident. You are strongly advised to check your insurance cover on this point.
