SHEEP, GOAT & HORSE EXHIBITORS TO BE IN THE SHOWYARD BY 8.30AM PROMPT. ALL OTHER STOCK TO BE IN THE SHOWYARD BY 8AM.
A TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT PLAN WILL BE PUBLICISED IN THE ORCADIAN PRIOR TO THE SHOW AND MUST BE FOLLOWED BY ALL EXHIBITORS.

CATTLE – JUDGING AT 9.30am PROMPT • HEAVY HORSE – JUDGING AFTER LL RIDDEN
SHEEP – JUDGING AT 9.00am PROMPT • ALL OTHER SECTIONS – JUDGING AT 9.00am PROMPT

PARADE OF PRIZE WINNERS – It is compulsory that all Champions and Reserve Champions from each section (i.e. Horses, Ponies, Cattle, Sheep and Goats) and Trophy winners go forward to the Parade, otherwise all prize money and trophies for that animal shall be forfeited.

Members only admitted free to Showyard on production of their band. IF HORSE EXHIBITORS REQUIRE SEPARATE PENS FOR STALLIONS, THEY MUST COME TO SHOWPARK AT 12 NOON ON FRIDAY, 9th AUGUST, 2024, TO SET UP OWN PENS • SECRETARY TO BE INFORMED OF ANY ENTRY NOT COMING TO THE SHOW.

COPY OF YOUR UP TO DATE BVD ACCREDITATION CERTIFICATE, PROOF OF NEGATIVE HERD STATUS OR PROOF OF INDIVIDUAL ANIMAL TESTING RESULTS MUST BE PROVIDED WITH ENTRY FORM FOR CATTLE ENTRIES. WE NOW REQUIRE MV HEALTH STATUS REPORTS/CERTIFICATES TO BE VALIDATED PRIOR TO UNLOADING STOCK, AND GIVEN TO CHIEF STEWARD.

REGULATIONS OF SHOWS

The undernoted Regulations apply to all Shows organised by Orkney Agricultural Society and apply to all Show Parks within which such Shows are held:-

- Members are entitled to entry to show yard without payment. No member shall be admitted unless there is produced a member's band.
- Only members of the society can exhibit, with the exception of those entering "children's pets" or "open dogs". Intending exhibitors must submit their entry form to the secretary no later than 20th July 2024, with details of all stock they intend to exhibit.
- No late entries will be accepted.
- Mares with Foal at Foot will be judged irrespective of Foals.
- Horses and Ponies must wear neck numbers issued and remain in stalls until judging completed.
- Stock must be the "bona fide" property of the exhibitor, and in their actual possession within the County for at least six weeks previous to the show, except in the case of Pets, or except in the case of going off the island for medical reasons, breeding purposes or competitions.
- To qualify for any breed special prizes, all pedigree livestock must be entered or eligible for entry in their respective breed registers.
- Any jointly owned animal must be entered in names of all owners.
- Stock must not have any distinguishing mark on them.
- All former Cup, Medal and First Prize takers are eligible to compete for money prizes.
- All Dairy Cattle to be milked before coming to the show.
- Cows must be in milk, or along with Two-year-old Heifers, must produce a calf within nine months of the Show, and Ewes must have fostered lambs this season.
- All Pedigreed Cattle must be entered, or eligible for entry, in Herd Books.
- The Society shall not be liable for any livestock entered into any of the society's competitions, or otherwise brought into the Bignold Park, Kirkwall, or such other areas of ground adjacent thereto or in proximity thereof and used for such competitions they are so entered or brought entirely at the risk of the owners and exhibitors of such livestock. The society shall not be liable for any loss, injury or damage which may be sustained by livestock, nor shall the society bear any liability whatsoever for loss, damage or injury caused to any person or property by such livestock — **it is therefore required that every exhibitor has public liability insurance and the Society shall be entitled at any time to demand sight of such policy from each member.** In the event of any claim against the society by any person in respect of any claim for loss, injury, damage or other sustained by reason of the presence in the Showyard of livestock introduced by a member, that member shall indemnify the society in respect of any such claim and all expenses connected therewith.
- Exhibitors or stockmen must be in attendance on the Stock and must also be ready to lead them into the Judging Ring when required. Each Stockman must have an assistant who will be responsible for taking stock into the Collection Ring when instructed by the Stewards.
- No animal can be entered in more than one class except horses, which can be entered in multiple classes. If a horse exhibitor is entering multiple classes, please be aware that classes may clash. Unfortunately due to judging time restraints classes cannot be held for you and you may be asked by a steward to make a decision of which class to go forward for if this issue arises.
- North Country Cheviot Sheep must not be clipped before 1st March prior to the Show and must be machine clipped.
- Sheep tails must be docked according to law.
- The violation by an exhibitor of any of the Society's Rules or Regulations will involve the immediate suspension of the Member as a Member together with forfeiture of all premiums awarded to them. Such member will be reported to the first General Meeting of the Society. The Member shall be entitled to attend that meeting and make representation thereto. If the Meeting determine that there has been a violation, they shall be entitled, in their sole discretion, to prohibit that Member from again entering stock at any future Show of the Society.

- Any complaints or protests by exhibitors must be made in writing not later than seven clear days after the show, accompanied by £10 deposit, which will be forfeited if the objection be not upheld. The decision of the Directors of the Society shall be final.
- The prizes to be awarded at any of the Shows of the Society shall be regulated by the Society and the Society's determination/decision shall be final.
- Holders of Long Service Medals of the Highland and Agricultural Society will be admitted free to showyard on production of medals.
- All stands will be regulated by the Directors of the Society and their decision shall be final.
- Each member/exhibitor warrants that the livestock introduced to the showyard by them is fit and healthy and free of infectious disease. The Society shall be entitled at any time: (i) to refuse to allow entry to the Showyard, or (ii) to require immediated removal from the Showyard, of any livestock deemed by an official of the Society or a veterinary practitioner to be a risk to other livestock for any reason whether through health or behaviour.
- All members/exhibitors agree, if so required, to produce to the Society a certificate from a recognised veterinary practitioner in respect of any livestock introduced to the showyard by the member/exhibitor and the member/exhibitor agrees, if so required, to submit livestock introduced to the showyard by them for veterinary or other examination and to sign such applications, declarations or other deeds as may reasonably be required by the Society.

POULTRY SECTION

To adhere to the APHA General Licence all exhibitors must strictly abide by the following rules.

- The premises of origin for any Galliformes or Anseriformes attending the Orkney County Show must be registered with the Animal and Plant Health Agency (APHA) on the GB Poultry Register, and the keeper of the birds attending the gathering will need to provide evidence of registration before they are granted entry. APHA recommend that all other birds should be registered on the GB Poultry Register before attending a gathering.
 - Exhibitors bringing Galliformes, Anseriformes or other poultry species to the show must complete and sign a declaration form before being allowed entry to the show. This form will confirm:
 - you have read and will fully comply with all biosecurity information provided;
 - to the best of your knowledge, your birds have not been in contact with any notifiable avian disease agents and do not show any signs of infection; and
 - your address of the premises of origin of your birds, with confirmation that the birds do not originate from a premises within a Protection Zone, Surveillance Zone, Restricted Zone, Temporary Control Zone, Temporary Movement Restriction Zone or Avian Influenza Prevention Zone.Poultry Exhibitors must read, sign and return a declaration form prior to show day. You will not be allowed entry to the showpark if you have not completed this form prior. Please contact the secretary for a form
 - Birds must be inspected for signs of illness before travelling to the show, and APHA recommend that any birds exhibiting should be kept separated from wild birds, isolated from other birds at that premises and monitored for signs of illness for at least fourteen days.
 - When you arrive at the showpark, all birds must remain isolated from all other birds on the event site until all birds have been individually inspected by a named bird expert designated by the Orkney Agricultural Society.

This current licence has been issued by the Scottish Minister and applies to Scotland. It is valid from noon on 26 April 2024 and may be varied, suspended or revoked at any time.

1. Classes must be confined to SPS-BS registered ponies. Ponies must be named on the entry form and in the catalogue if one is produced. Society rosettes must only be given to ponies registered with the Society or to foals eligible for registration.

2. Three-year-old fillies with foals at foot may not be shown. All foals must be a minimum of three weeks old on the day of the Show.

3. IN ORDER TO ENTER A STALLION CLASS AT AN AFFILIATED SHOW, ENTIRE MALES AGED 4 YEARS OLD AND OVER MUST HAVE AN "S" NUMBER AND HAVE BEEN

SUCCESSFULLY THROUGH EITHER THE SPS-BS STALLION ASSESSMENT PRIOR TO 2006 OR THE CURRENT SPSBS VOLUNTARY VETERINARY EXAMINATION. Ridden stallions MUST display a stallion bridle badge. Inhand entire males 2 years and over are advised to display a stallion bridle badge.

4. There must be no colts or entire males in Young Handlers classes. Children under 14 years old may not show colts (excluding foals) or entire males in In-hand classes. Children under 12 years old on the day of the show may not show entire males in ridden classes. In the interests of safety, hard hats must be worn by all handlers aged 14 years or under in In-hand classes. Exhibitors should not kneel but remain standing while in the ring. Hard hats must be worn by all exhibitors, irrespective of age, in ridden classes. Ridden and driven ponies must be 4 years old or over. In ridden Classes, if a rider falls off at any time whilst in the ring, both pony and rider must leave the ring, rider dismounted, and take no further part.
